## Weekend Will Be Full Of Fun For Everyone At Folklife Festival

Plans for the 15th Annual Cisco Folklife Festival scheduled for Saturday and Sunday have been completed by the Cisco Civic League. It will be held in the historic Rockwell Lumberyard.

The weekend's festivities will kick off Friday evening with the annual Kiwanis Club barbecue. Kiwanis Club President Don Shepard said the barbecue will be a "Big Blowout". Shepard said food will be served from 5:30 until 8 p.m. at the Corral Room, 400 Conrad Hilton. The meal will include barbecue, cooked by Oscar's Barbecue, and delicious coleslaw, beans, and drinks, served by the Kiwanians.

Tickets are priced at \$4.00 for adults and \$2.00 for children under 12. Tickets can be bought at the door or from Don Shepard at the Cisco Chamber of Commerce or Joe Wheatley at Cisco Lumber and Supply, or from any other Kiwanis Club member. Delicious desserts of homemade pies and cakes will also be sold at the barbecue dinner.

Saturday morning, May 2, at 7 a.m. there will be an outdoor chuck wagon breakfast at Lake Cisco Park before the "World's Shortest Trail Ride." The riders will reach Cisco in time to join the parade which is scheduled to begin at 10 a.m.

Leading the parade will be Bill Chaney, weatherman on KTAB-TV. Mr. Chaney will be the Parade Grand Marshal. The parade will feature several riding clubs, floats, bicycles and other groups. The Cisco Junior College Wrangler Band and Belles will perform in the parade along with the Cisco High School Band. John Hounshell, of Cisco, and Gary Henry, of Stephenville, will ride their Texas Longhorn Steers in the parade.

The Folklife Festival will open immediately following the parade. A new feature at this year's festival will be an ice cream freeze-off. Local teams will be competing to see who can make ice cream the "Bestest and Fastest," the old fashioned way by cranking the ice cream. The Freeze off will be held on Sunday, April 24, at 2:30 p.m., in the entertainment tent.

Another feature of the Festival will be the style show, to start at 4 p.m., Saturday and at 2 p.m., on Sunday. The style show will feature styles from 1888 to the present.

A large variety of delicious foods will be available in the food tent throughout the two day Folklife Festival. Organizations and churches will prepare and serve dif-

ferent foods such as sausage on a stick, hot dogs, hamburgers and cookies, baked potatoes and much more.

The Cisco Civic League will have a food booth so everyone can enjoy their famous strawberry short-cakes. The Cisco Senior Class will have a hamburger booth, with hamburgers cooked on an outside gas grill, and the Project Graduation will have a baked potato booth.

Rust Country Meats will demonstrate sausage stuffing from 1-3 p.m. on Saturday. Other demonstrations of quilting, tating, hairpin lace, rush lights, apple peeling, wheat grinding, corn meal grinding, clay pots, noodle making, and corn husk dolls will be given all day long on Saturday and Sunday. The Longhorn bulls will also be on display and everyone can have their picture made while sitting on the bulls. Western wear will also be available to wear in the picture.

The Cisco Cub Scouts will have greased pig races beginning at 1:00 p.m., on Saturday and Sunday. There will be baby ducks and geese in the children's section of the festival. There will also be a children's treasure hunt in the sand pile and several other activities for the children.

Ricky Whatley will demonstrate sheep shearing and goat milking in the children's section. Ricky and his daughter Kelly will also compete in the ice cream freeze off Sunday.

Demonstrations for chair rushing will be held on Saturday and Sunday beginning at 1 p.m., both days.

Several dance groups will perform during the festival and the Saturday night street dance will be held from 8 to 11 p.m. Saturday. The Festival will close at 5 p.m., Sunday.

Cisco Firemen were called out at 6:30 a.m., last Sunday morning to keep an eye on the thunderstorms that passed through this area during the early morning hours. The Cisco Fire Department volunteers were stationed around the countryside of Cisco.

The main purpose of the weather watchers in a thunderstorm is to be able to advise the Fire Station if a tornado is travelling toward Cisco. If any weather watcher spots a tornado they will call in to the Fire Station and the siren will be sounded

to warn the citizens of Cisco of the approaching danger so they can take cover.

Cisco received almost half an inch of rain Sunday. The rain helped to relieve some of the dry conditions that have been plaguing this area recently. But there was not enough rain to prevent more grass fires.

Cisco firemen were called out to a grass fire six miles west of town Sunday afternoon. A train passing through the area started two small grass fires. Cisco firemen were able to extinguish the blaze quickly.

Sam Houston State University signed Naidene Tiemann of Cisco Junior College to a national letter of intent. Naidene will give Sam Houston immediate strength at the forward position and should step right in at a starting position. Sam Houston is a member of the Southland Conference which includes such universities as Stephen F. Austin, North Texas State and the University of Texas at Arlington.

Naidene had an outstanding career at Cisco Junior College. She was a two year starter and team captain her sophomore year. She was the

leading scorer, field goal percentage and free throw percentage shooter on the team. She was voted the MVP on this year's Lady Wrangler team. Tiemann was on the Northern Texas All-Conference team and the Region V All-Regional team. She was also selected to play in the Texas Junior College All-Star game. This year she averaged 18 points, 7 rebounds and 6 assists. Her field goal percent was 56 percent and her free throw percent was an outstanding 87 percent.

Tiemann played her high school basketball at Priddy

High School where she took her team to the state tournament and was first team All-State her junior and senior year. She was the MVP of the Regional Tournament her sophomore and junior year. She was selected the Player of the Year in Class A and Miss Basketball for the State of Texas. Naidene also played in the Hall of Fame All-Star Game.

Naidene was also awarded the Campbell Trophy, presented by the Cisco Junior College Faculty Association to the outstanding sophomore Lady Wrangler. Naidene has a 3.2 grade point average at CJC.

The greatest gift we, as parents, can give our children is a strong self-esteem. Tell them:

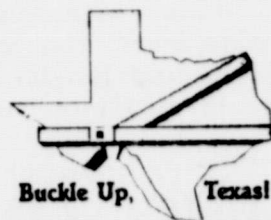

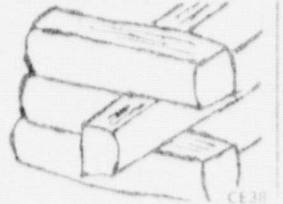

## Exemption Deadline Nears For Eastland County Residents

Residential property owners within Eastland County are reminded that the deadline to apply for a residential homestead exemption is May 2, 1988.

If a person owned and resided in a residence on January 1, 1988; he or she may qualify for this type of exemption. The homestead

exemption is in the amount of \$5,000 of taxable value for homeowners under the age of 65. For those homeowners over sixty-five years of age or who are disabled, the exemption amount is an additional \$10,000.

It is emphasized that only those homeowners who have never applied for an exemp-

tion or who have changed residences since their original application need apply. If you have been receiving a homestead exemption and have not changed the status of your residence in anyway; there is no need to submit a new application. Owners of mobile homes are eligible for the

homestead exemption; even if the home is located on a leased or rented lot. A copy of the title to the mobile home must be filed along with the homestead application.

If you have questions concerning the exemption, special valuation of land (ag-use) or other ad valorem tax related matters; please contact the Eastland County Appraisal District for assistance. The office is located on the second floor of the Eastland County Courthouse and the telephone number is 629-8597.

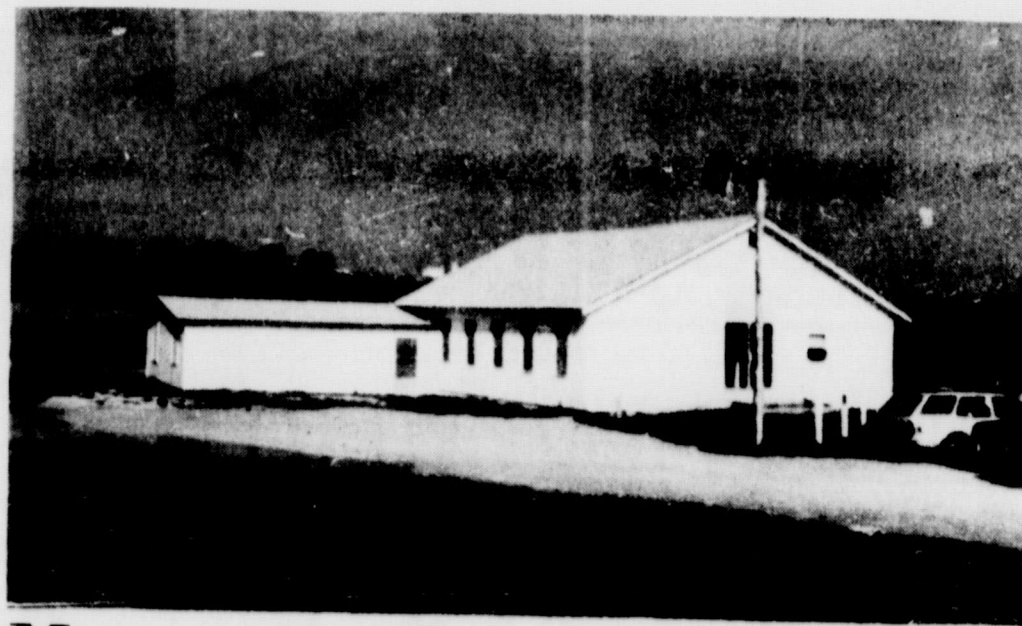
The couple's three sons grew up in Desdemona, attending schools in Desdemona and Stephenville. They went to college in Stephenville, Lubbock and Austin.

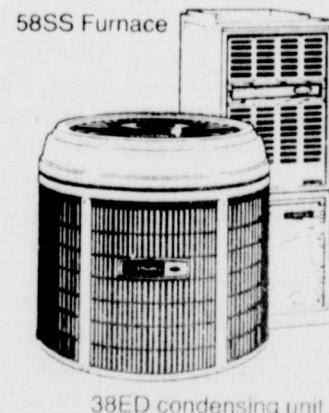

## CISCO

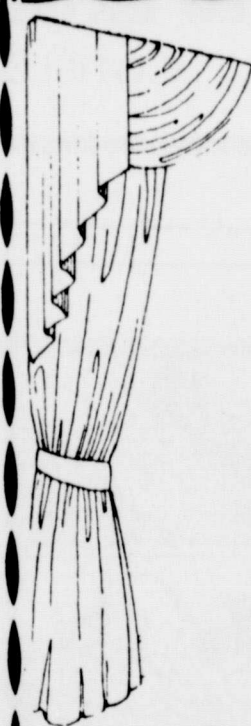
