Moore said this will be the best way to warn people of an emergency, since 80 percent of the citizens in Cisco and Eastland are cable viewers.

Moore said there has to be a confirmed tornado sighting before the emergency alert system can be used. Moore said the city will still activate the sirens in case of such an emergency.







#### From Janet Thomas, County Agent-

Families spend numerous hours a week doing laundry and ironing. This week I received some research information that I find personally helpful and will pass on to you.

SETTING DYES:

There are a variety of "home remedies" for setting dyes in fabrics. Did you know that none of them is effective?

The two most popular methods recommend using salt water or vinegar. These methods probably have their origins in the old dying processes where salt was used in the dying procedures for cotton and linen, and vinegar was used during the dying of wool.

The University of Nebraska recently investigated a variety of these treatments. They researched the effectiveness of salt and washing soda; salt and vinegar; salt vinegar and alum; Epsom salts; salt; and a detergent prewash.

None of the treatments were effective. Some actually increased the amount of color loss in the fabrics following laundering. Home dve-setting treatments. although widely recommended, do not work.

Fish is one of Texas greatest natural resources. High in nutrition and low in calories, fish is a wonderful food to prepare.

SPICY BAKED FISH 3 pounds of fish fillets or small pan-dressed fish

11/2 teaspoons paprika ½ teaspoon salt

1/4 teaspoon dry mustard ½ teaspoon pepper 1/4 teaspoon onion powder

3 tablespoons melted diet margarine Lemon wedges Cut fillets into 11/2 inch

strips. Combine dry ingredients in a shaker. Sprinkle fish with dry mixture. Arrange on prepared baking sheet. Drizzle with margarine and bake at 350° for 10 minutes per inch of fish thickness. Serve with lemon wedges and Fisherman's tartar sauce.

#### FISHERMAN'S TARTAR SAUCE

1 cup of "lite" mayonnaise ½ cup plain yogurt 2 tablespoons chopped dill pickle

2 tablespoons minced

2 tablespoons chopped pimiento-stuffed olives 1 teaspoon lemon juice

Dash pepper Combine all ingredients and chill. Makes 2 cups sauce.

Lake Fork fishing guide

Dennis Canada pulled a remarkable feat when he became the first angler donating a fish to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department's Share A Lone Star Lunker program two years in succession. What's really unusual is that it was the same fish both times.

Canada caught the 15.8 pound largemouth last spring and donated it to the lunker program at the departments Tyler Fish Hatchery. The big female spawned and later was affixed with a transmitter and returned to Lake Fork.

Although Canada used electronic tracking equipment to follow the fish's movements for several months after the release, he was not using any tracking gear when he re-caught the lunker.

The fish was somewhat lighter after its second capture, probably because it was taken later in the spring and probably had spawned at least once in the lake. It weighed 14.92 pounds upon arrival at the Tyler hatchery, according to Bill

Rutledge, hatchery chief. The lunker program offers anglers opportunity to loan 13-pound-plus bass for hatchery research. Participating fishermen receive a fiberglass replica of their catch, and they are encouraged to return the fish to

the lake alive. The program is having a successful second year, Rutledge said, with six of the 11 fish already having spawned. About 70,000 fry are in rearing ponds. When grown to fingerling size, they will be stocked in Big Creek Reservoir near Sulphur Springs. Genetic marking will allow monitoring of the

nunker offspring's growth over time, Rutledge said.

For youngsters, an hour or two of fishing provides quite a thrill. And, you needn't be a fishing expert to teach a child to fish. Simply follow these fishing guidelines offered by the fishing specialists at Berkley.

Begin with spincast equipment. Spincast reels are easy to use and are generally trouble free. Choose a fishing rod that is lightweight and flexible, but yet rugged enough to survive hard use. A beginners rod should bend freely when shaken

Select a premium grade fishing line. Beginning fishermen, especially kids, seem to catch the largest fish in the lake. Usually it's something nearly impossible to unhook like a 50 pound catfish. A clear, flexible line like Trilene XL rated to break between 8 and 12 lbs. performs admirably. A 275 yard spool is plenty.

Other items you'll need to complete a fish-catching system include bobers (112" diameter), a few sinkers (1/8-12 oz. size), a package or two of hooks (sizes 6-10), some bait and a few

cooperative fish. To rig your equipment tie a sinker to the end of your line. Attach a snelled hook (a hook with a 6" pice of line pre-attached) one foot above the sinker. Add a bobber a food above the hook.

If after a few minutes of fishing you haven't caught anything, move the bobber deeper at about one foot intervals. Cast to different places, testing each new depth. If you still haven't caught anything after adjusting the bobber to six feet, remove it and try fishing on

the bottom. When bottom fishing, hold the line between your fingers to feel bites. Or, keeping the line taut, prop your rod in a forked stick and watch for the rod tip to jiggle in-

dicating a bite. The size of fish you catch isn't important, and its better to fish for abundant fish such as bluegill, crappie or bullheads. Catching 10 bullheads is more fun than catching one small bass.

The best places to fish are small uncrowded waters close to home. Try in the shallows, around docks, rocky spots, weedy shorelines, places where trees overhang the water, or where submerged trees, brush other shade is found. Contrary to the practice of many beginning anglers. fish are not found in trees or

on telephone wires. Worms and wigglers will catch an endless variety of fish, and are available at most bait stores. Or, send the kids out near home to find grasshoppers, crickets, or other small critters that scurry about where kids play. This provides good entertainment the day before you go fishing, too.

Make your first few fishing trips short and interesting. Fish in places that have lots of fish, and don't feel too bad when your child catches the biggest fish. It always seems
