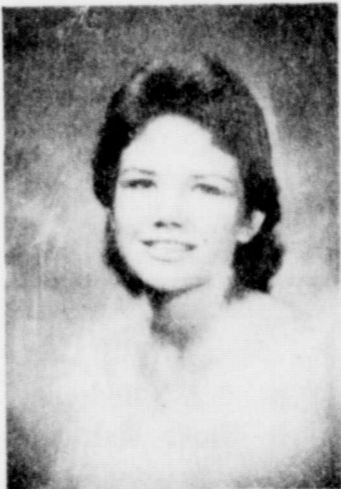

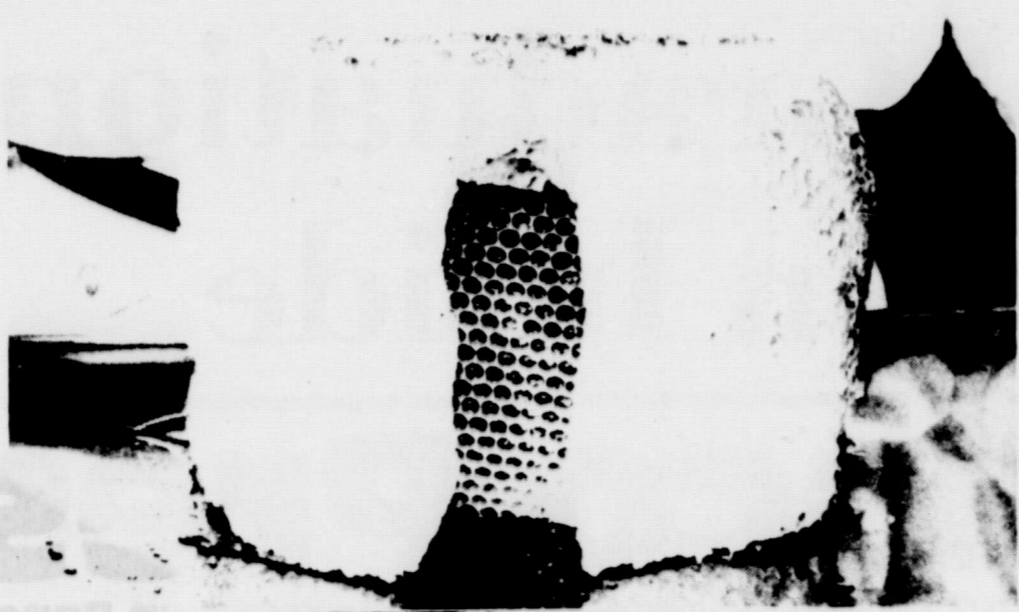

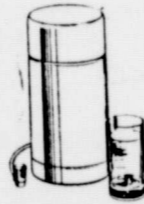

WHAT IS THE NURSE'S ROLE?
The last days in a terminally ill patient's life present the nurse with one of the greatest, most difficult challenges in her nursing career, according to nurses Claire Hoffman, Gladys Lipman, and Ella Thompson in their book, "Simplified Nursing."
The nurse, in fact, may well be the person who gives the last comforting services to the dying patient and be a source of great comfort to his family as well. She knows and recognizes the needs of the patient and learns to anticipate his requirements for comfort (i.e., a change of position, etc.) She is also alert to sense a patient's wish to talk to the clergyman or particular family members.
She is schooled in dealing with the emotional stresses the patient (and family) is undergoing, and, like the doctor, the clergyman and funeral director, is a very important member of the care giving team. Very often she takes special study classes in the care of the very ill for the sake of the patient and her own well-being.

Pharmacy Topics

Long-term study in Finland of a cholesterol-lowering drug, Gemfibrozil, shows that it reduces the rate of heart attacks by 34 percent. While total cholesterol were lowered only slightly, levels of high-density lipoproteins increased markedly. Gemfibrozil causes fewer side effects than other anti-cholesterol drugs.

Diabetics seem to get fewer calluses when they wear cushioned running shoes. A Salt Lake City podiatrist reported on an 18-month survey.

Relatively new surgical instrument, a hysteroscope, enables doctors to examine the uterus without making an abdominal incision. Used mostly for diagnosis and biopsy now, the scope is expected to simplify certain surgical procedures.

A large dose of magnesium, given as soon as a heart attack victim gets to the hospital, seems to protect against dangerous arrhythmia, an Israeli study found. Normally, the heart loses magnesium -- and stable electrical activity -- at the time of an attack.

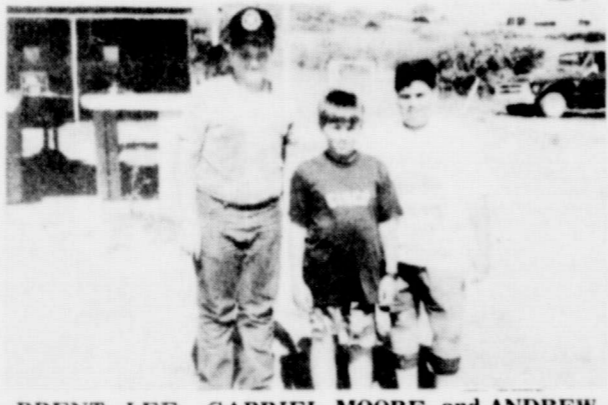

Clois Purvis Gives Slide Presentation To Club

The Cisco Rotary Club has picked the recipient for this year's Rotarian scholarship, it was announced last Thursday at their regular meeting held at Tradition's Restaurant. The name of the winner will be announced at the graduation ceremony.

Clois Purvis, Rotarian, was in charge of the program. He presented a slide show with pictures taken on a United States Air Force KC-135 tanker.

Purvis was asked to join 35 other people, and fly to three strategic Air Force bases in the western United States in the tanker. They left out of Dyess AFB on April 12.

The first stop they made was at Malstrom Air Force Base in Great Falls, Montana. He said the area looks like Midland, Texas. There are 300 minute man missiles based there. These missiles were designed and installed in the mid 1960's. Purvis said the computers there requires an extensive cooling system.

Purvis said the largest military police force is located at Malstrom. Each of the 200 missile silos have an extensive security system. When the security is broke, police have to stay at the silo for at least 24 hours to keep an eye out for trouble. Gophers in the area are the main reason for the security breaks.

The second stop for the group was at Beale AFB, north of Sacramento, California. This is where the U-2 and SR-71 Spy planes are kept. The SR-71, built in 1974, is the fastest and highest flying air plane in the world today. The skin of the plane is made out of titanium. The plane leaks fuel, but one pilot told Purvis that, "The fuel won't burn. Even if you put a torch to it, it won't burn." He added, "But I've never tried."

The two planes are spy planes and fly regularly over Iran and Iraq. The group was told there was not a day when they are not challenged, but no one has been able to catch them. The planes can fly 2,500 miles per hour and up to 80,000 feet. The pilots are treated like astronauts, using the space suits and have their oxygen on before they are put on the plane.

The next stop was at March AFB in Riverside, California, base of the 15th Air Force. They control the area from Mississippi to Hawaii. The combat control area is located at the base. Purvis said they have three screens with a general sitting in there, just like in the movies. He said there is also a "looking glass" plane that takes off from the base and flies over the U.S. at all times. The plane carries a general in case Washington D.C. is destroyed by a surprise attack, then the general can command the U.S. to send a retaliation attack.

Air Force personnel moral is high now, even though they haven't had a raise in the last four years. Purvis said the moral was low in the 1970's after the Viet Nam conflict, but it has been built back up. They don't want to see it go back down again.

The tanker Purvis flew on refueled a B-1 Bomber and a B-52 Bomber during the trip. They do the refueling over non-populated areas of the United States.

Otto Urban will be in charge of next week's program. Ken Diehm gave the invocation. Jerry Morgan led the group in the pledge of Allegiance. Billy Reynolds encouraged members to attend the next meeting and invite other members to do the same. He said at the last two meetings the Rotary Club lacked only one member having 100 percent attendance.
