





## Cisco Writers' Club Contest Deadline Nears

Writers, awake! If you like to write, seize this chance to show your talent. The 12th annual Cisco Writers' Club Contest is nearing its deadline.

With 11 categories - ranging from amusing anecdotes to unpublished books - the contest has a place for every style and form.

Be sure to mail your entry before the August 1st deadline.

The categories and maximum word length are as follows:

Article: general interest, 2000 words; inspirational - Lou Prange Award, 2000 words; Texas History, 2000

words. Book: Synopsis and two chapters of unpublished work.

Columns: general interest, 750 words.

Short Shots: filler or anecdote, 200 words.

Short Story: 2500 words. Juvenile Story: 1200 words.

Poetry: free or modern, 30 lines; traditional, 30 lines; light verse, 30 lines.

First, second and third, and honorable mention places will be awarded in each category at the Writers' Club meeting Sept. 8. A David Autry Memorial Award is given to the person

winning the overall highest rating, including one first place. Each category must have a minimum of four entries or material will be returned and fees refunded.

No more than two entries per person in any one category, but a person may enter as many different categories as desired. The fee is \$2 per entry, payable to the Cisco Writers' Club with submission. An SASE should accompany all entries. Entries remain the property of the author, but retain a copy of your entry.

Material submitted must be original, unpublished and typewritten. It must not have received a first, second or third award in any previous contest anywhere.

On the cover sheet, place your name, address and telephone number in the upper left corner. In the upper right corner, state category and word length. Place title in center of the page. Do not put your name elsewhere on the manuscript. On the first page of the manuscript, place category, word length and page number in the upper right hand corner. Center title on the page. Type on one side of the paper, double-spacing with one-inch margins. Poems may be single-spaced. Place title and number of page at the top right corner of each following page.

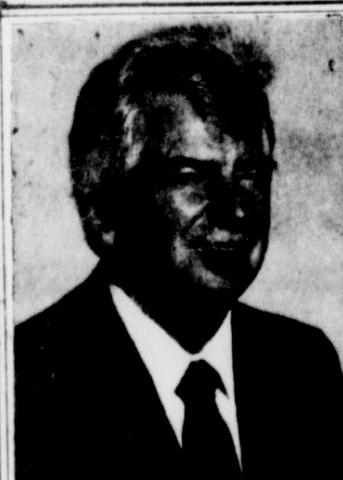

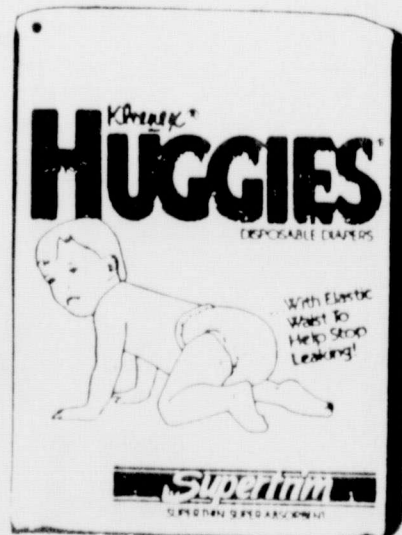

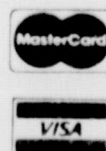

**CLUB MEETINGS**

We welcome news of all area club meetings, times, dates, etc. Write the name of the group, the meeting time and date and location and the title of the program on a postcard and mail to Eastland County News, P.O. Box 29, Eastland, TX 76448. Deadlines are Monday, 5 p.m. for the Thursday edition, and Thursday, 5 p.m. for the Sunday edition.

**SPECIAL EVENTS**

Planning a festival in your neighborhood? A charity ball? An art show? PTO carnival? Send the information about the event (who, what, when, where, why) to Eastland County News, P.O. Box 29, Eastland, TX 76448.

**ENGAGEMENTS, WEDDINGS, ANNIVERSARIES**

Researchers are testing a new drug that prevents severe jaundice in newborn babies by blocking the formation of the yellow pigment bilirubin. Current treatment requires long hospital stays under special lights. Much of the work was done at Rockefeller University.

Removing coffee from the diet seems to help victims of severe eczema when other treatments do not work, the journal *Cutis* reports.

Modern cardiac pacemakers can adjust heart rhythm to meet the needs of active people. The circuitry senses vibrations that indicate activity or changes in body temperature, breathing rate, or carbon dioxide content of blood.

New mouthwash contains even more minerals than saliva, is said to harden teeth and protect them from decay. Researchers at Tufts University School of Dental Medicine tested the product, and it should be on the market this year.

New research confirms the value of zinc gluconate lozenges to ease sore throat and cold symptoms. Recommended dosage for adults is one 23-mg. tablet every two hours, no more than 12 a day for a week.

## Five Arrested, Drugs Seized In Ranger Raid

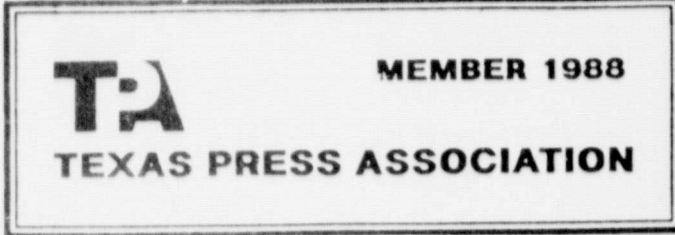

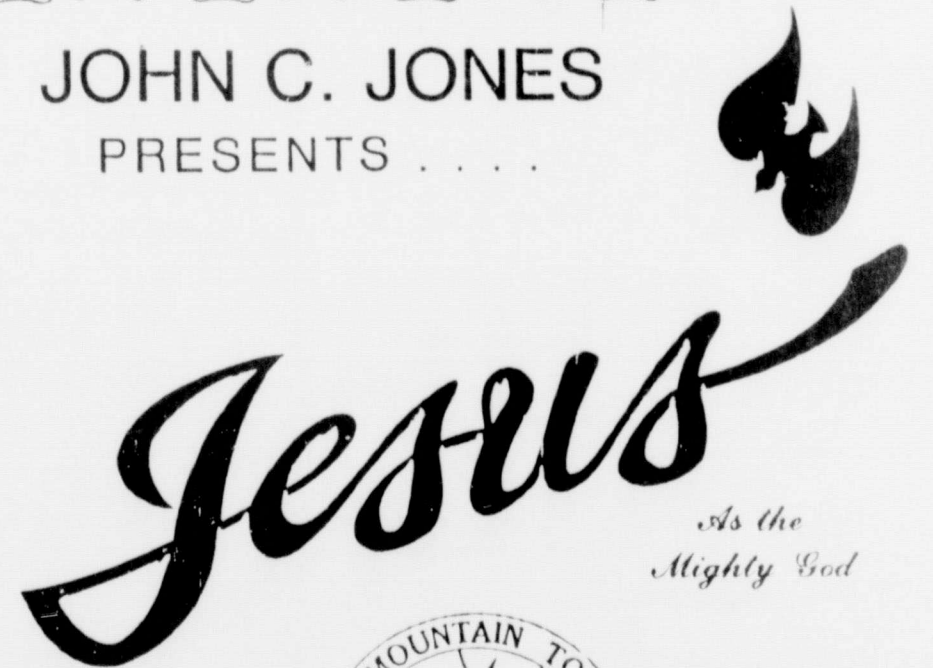

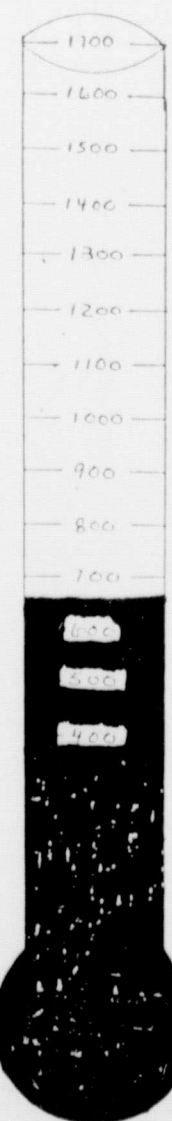
