Reward Funds Being Collected At Cisco Bank

Funds for a reward for information leading to the arrest and conviction of persons responsible for the vandalism at Oakwood Cemetery are being collected at the First National Bank. Contributions may be made to Mrs. Linda Walton, Secretary to President Dick Woolley.

The mutilation, damage and destruction of monuments occurred some three weeks ago. The first estimate of 59 markers overturned or damaged has risen to more than 100 as more and more damaged monuments have been discovered.

Stones were pushed over or toppled from pedestals, and many broke as they fell. It appeared that chains or ropes must have been used to overturn some of the larger stones.

Although the vandals scattered their hand-

diwork widely, hardest hit was the old section of the cemetery where many monuments are tall, tiered and ornate in design, and bear inscriptions of poems and Biblical quotations. Included were some of the small stones marking children and infants' graves of which the cemetery has many, testifying to the high mortality rate of babies during the pioneer days of this community. In some areas where the ground was soft from recent rains, deep ruts were left where cars had been driven across grave sites.

Under Texas laws, desecration of a cemetery is a Class A misdemeanor that is punishable by a fine of up to \$2,000 or one year in jail or both.

The city is having its share of vandalism, but this desecration of the cemetery is in a class by itself. It is an intolerable situation that needs the attention of the community and whatever assistance can be given to the Police Department. Any information pertaining to this vandalism should be reported to Chief of Police C. Ingram.

Russell-Newman Mfg. Co., Inc. Celebrates 40th Anniversary

Russell-Newman Manufacturing Company, Inc., is celebrating its 40th Anniversary this spring, and the local plant in Cisco presented awards to several of its employees Thursday morning in its own celebration.

R.B. Newman, guest of honor, was present for the ceremony and presented awards for six years of service to Jane Bridges, Janie Garcia, Dessie Otts and Mike Blaikley. Bob Ford, production supervisor, received an award for 16 years service in the company.

The newly started program presents employees awards for longevity and loyal support to Russell-Newman. Awards will be presented two times a year, in the spring and the fall, and are presented on the basis of 5-10-15-20-25 and 30 years service.

Eleven awards were presented this year at the company's plant in

Denton to employees who have over 30 years with the company. One lady in Denton has 38 years in the Russell-Newman Company.

Mr. Newman stated that Thursday was the first time he had been in the Cisco plant and he is "darned proud of this plant." He went on to say it is the "newest and best looking" of the company's plants.

Dick Woolley, president of the Cisco Chamber of Commerce and First National Bank in Cisco, said the Chamber is proud to have the Russell-Newman plant in Cisco and it is "one of the finest things to happen to Cisco." He went on to say "we are looking forward to more expansion" in Cisco.

Other persons attending the ceremony, besides local Russell-Newman employees, were Frank Martino, president of Russell-Newman; Gayland Howell, also with the Russell-Newman Company; Dick Woolley;

Gene Abbott, Chamber of Commerce manager; Beverly Cooksie, the new director of personnel; and Joan Young, former director of personnel.

From a brochure distributed by the Russell-Newman Manufacturing Company, Inc., comes the following information:

"It was spring, 1939, when Mr. Newman and his wife, Samye, selected Denton to begin a manufacturing operation. It was something he'd always wanted to do, since he'd worked in it some. As for coming to Denton, well, he thought that if he couldn't make a living, at least his daughter could attend school. So, with plenty of determination that he could make a go of manufacturing in Denton, Mr. Newman approached the Chamber of Commerce and asked for two years free rent, which they gave him at once.

"The Chamber of Commerce manager, Otis Fowler, took the hopeful new manufacturer in tow, introducing him around the business community. And that is how Mr. Newman met Mr. Russell -- Holford Russell -- who suggested they become partners. While Mr. Newman had not considered a partner, still it gave the business a little more money to start. So, on June 1st, 1939, with three thousand dollars capital, they incorporated Russell-Newman Mfg. Co.

"One important ingredient remained -- the product! As it happened a plant in Denison, Texas, had discontinued making

lingerie, so they bought them out for five hundred dollars. The "buy" included cutting tables, sewing machines, and a bunch of piece goods and trims which could be used to practice on.

"During the first six months, they used everything that came from the Denison plant, and just broke even. However, it was just the thing for Rowe and Samye to learn to cut, sew, repair machines, and subsequently, teach these skills to the company's first employees.

"For those first few critical months, the Newmans did most all of it themselves -- designing, cutting, sewing, selling, and shipping, as well as struggling to keep the old used machines in good repair. Mr. Newman has been heard to declare, 'That was the last time we bought used sewing machines -- too much fixin' on 'em!'"

The first year's goods were panties only, but the end of the first year brought two important changes to the company. They moved to a larger building and expanded their lingerie line into gowns, robes, pajamas and slips. "The expanded line sold well not only in those towns within a day or two from Denton, but throughout Texas. In a few short years, Russell-Newman goods were sold in Oklahoma, Louisiana, Arkansas, etc., until finally we pushed on-ward into all 50 states and even recorded sales abroad."

"At one point, in the 1950's the parent company brought in a foster child -- manufac-

turing of bras and girdles. After several years, it seemed more complicated than worthwhile, and was discontinued to allow full concentration on the well-known and popular lines for ladies and girls.

"Time, hard work, and constant adherence to Mr. Newman's philosophy of doing business, have brought tremendous expansion from that tiny company that began 40 years ago. In 1958, the Denton plant began its move from the Masonic Building to its present location in the Record Chronicle building on East Hickory, and a second plant was built in Pilot Point, which would become our "pantie plant". Cutting and shipping moved to the Loop location in 1966 and corporate headquarters followed in 1972. The Saint Jo plant opened in 1965, followed by Seymour's plant in 1969. The plant in Stamford began operations in 1973, and 1977 saw another plant constructed in Cisco. That plant was expanded to three times its original size in 1978. This anniversary year will see an addition to the Stamford plant, as well as a new facility to house the Seymour operation.

"Yearly the company purchases some 15,000,000 yards of fabric, as well as the trims and lace to go with it, and our designers and pattern-makers 'try-out' more than 1300 different styles. From these, more than 300 are actually produced and sold. Sales have expanded to all 50 states as we continue among the top lingerie manufacturers in the country. Our goods sell through nationally-known chain stores, as well as under our own brand: TEXSHEEN.

"On our fortieth anniversary, then, we pause to recognize that we have much. Moreover, we owe much. To those who have made the Russell-Newman of today possible, we acknowledge this debt of gratitude; and, we re-dedicate our efforts to a quality product for our customers and a quality life for our entire production family."

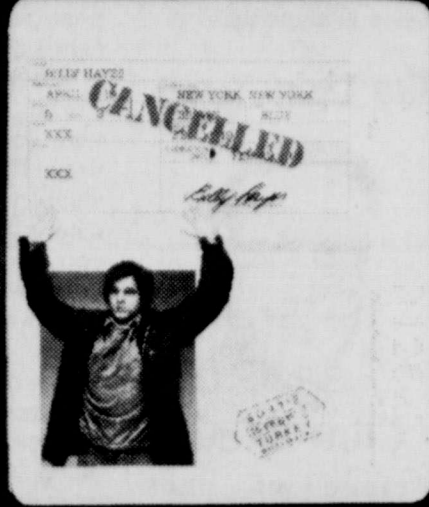

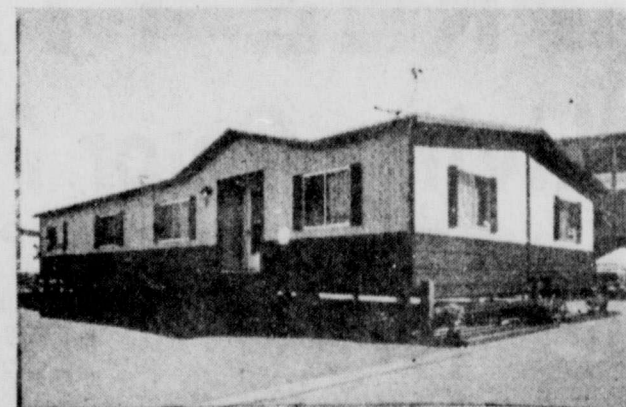

Involved Young Man

During pioneer days many young people assumed adult responsibilities earlier than the youth of the '60's and '70's. But Terry Edwards of Strawn-age 22-is a contemporary person who leaped right into the adult world. Furthermore, he finds it an absorbing place to be. Although dark-haired Terry moves with the quick energy of a tennis player, he has more weighty matters on his mind than chasing a ball. For he is involved in two community-service type professions: that of Director of the Edwards Funeral Home in Strawn, and a position as Justice of the Peace. He is also the Secretary of the Strawn Recreation Club, a member of the Lion's Club, and a member of the Volunteer Fire Department. He is involved with coordinating the new Ambulance Service for the Strawn area, and works with Civic Defense for Palo Pinto County. He is a member of the First Baptist Church in Strawn, and believes that religion plays an important part in life. When asked what he does for recreation, he replies that he likes to ride motorcycles and fly airplanes! He has fond memories of airplane trips into various areas of the Southwest.

"My wife, Phyllis," he smiles, "is not only a Secretary at the Funeral Home, but she helps schedule all my time and keep it straight!" "Many young people," he reflects, "have let the older generation run things. But I think things are beginning to change. More young people are becoming involved in life, and making major decisions."

Sometimes Terry drives over to Ranger to assist his parents, Pat and Jerry Edwards, with duties at the Killingsworth Funeral Home, which they purchased in 1977. The Edwards were living near Matador, Texas, when Terry was born in 1957. Pat was a cotton and grain farmer, but sold out shortly afterward. He attended the Institute of Mortuary Science in Dallas, then accepted a position with Bell and Seale Funeral Home in Snyder. In 1963 he purchased the Funeral Home in Strawn, which has been operated by the family since that time. Besides their son Terry, the Edwards are the parents of three daughters.

Terry has always enjoyed the Strawn area. "It has fine people, dust-free air, and good scenery," he comments. "I can't imagine waiting to live anywhere else!"

While Terry was growing up in Strawn, he had opportunities to work in several businesses. Besides the Funeral Home, his father helped operate J. and J. Supply Company and a Laundry. Terry also worked for a pipeyard, a Welding Supply Company, and hired out as a cowboy on ranches.

"I had absolutely no pressure from the family to go into the Funeral Home Business," he states. "That was my own decision. By the time I was a Sophomore in High School, I knew that was what I wanted to do."

Upon his graduation in 1975, he enrolled in the School of Mortuary Science in Dallas. He began work as a Mortician after his graduation there in 1976.

"Each time a person comes to our Funeral Home," he says, "They come because of one of the worst situations of their lives. Sometimes they are at a loss as to how to handle things. It is hard to cope with death. I believe that religion is the only thing that really has any answers."

"It is usually about three days from each death until final burial. We try to help families get through that time. These people need personal service."

The Funeral Home in Strawn, Terry says, probably handles more Catholic funerals than other towns in the area. A number of coal miners from Thurber and that vicinity were Catholic, and some remained in the County after the mines closed.

All the recent years of Terry's life have been crammed with events. In 1977 he married lovely Phyllis Johnson of Gordon. In 1978 he was elected to serve as Justice of the Peace over about a ten by fifteen mile area of Palo Pinto County. Then he was appointed to serve out the vacated term of an incumbent, making him one of the youngest Justices in the State.

But Terry isn't the only young person around the City Hall of Strawn. Mike Smiddy, County Judge, age 26, is one of the youngest Judges in the State.

Terry's duties as Justice of the Peace include acting as a Registrar for Vital Statistics, performing marriage ceremonies, and dealing with Class C misdemeanors such as petty theft and traffic violations of the time!

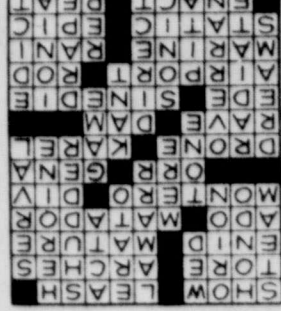
Perhaps that is the kind of independence many young people crave. But the people of Strawn know that Terry Edwards is not just talking. He has earned his place as an adult.

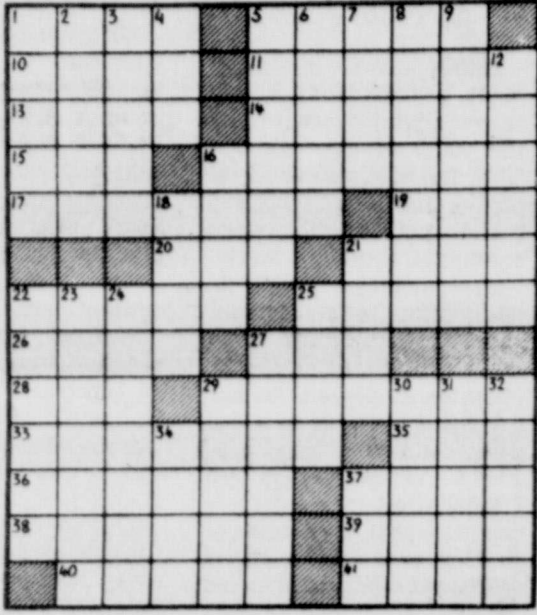

Bride's Cake & Frosting

This is a lovely wedding cake and has been made for so many couples. File this recipe for now or that soon to be wedding.

1 cup shortening
2 cups sugar
2 teaspoons vanilla
4 cups sifted flour
4 teaspoons baking powder
1 cup milk
10 egg whites
pinch of salt

Cream shortening, adding gradually sugar then vanilla. Beat well. Sift flour three times with baking powder and add alternately with milk. Beat vigorously for a better cake. Add a little salt to the egg whites and beat until stiff but not dry; fold into mixture. Place in a round well greased paper-lined pan — Bake at 350 degrees. For a large bottom tier use the recipe doubled.

1/2 cup white Karo
1/2 cup water
2 egg whites

Boil sugar, water, and Karo to 242 degrees. Beat egg whites until stiff and dry and pour in hot syrup gradually, beating constantly. Beat until stiff and gloss disappears.

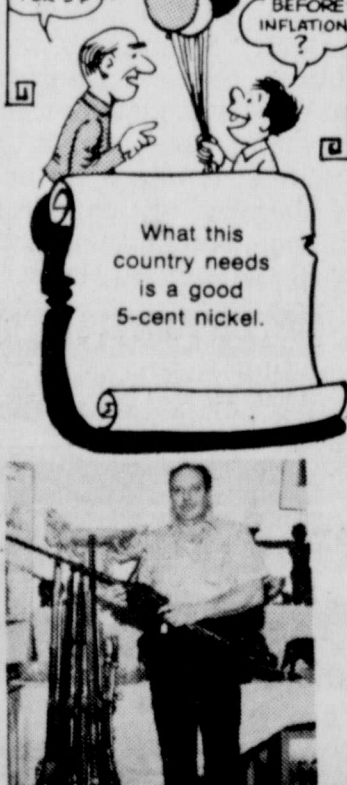

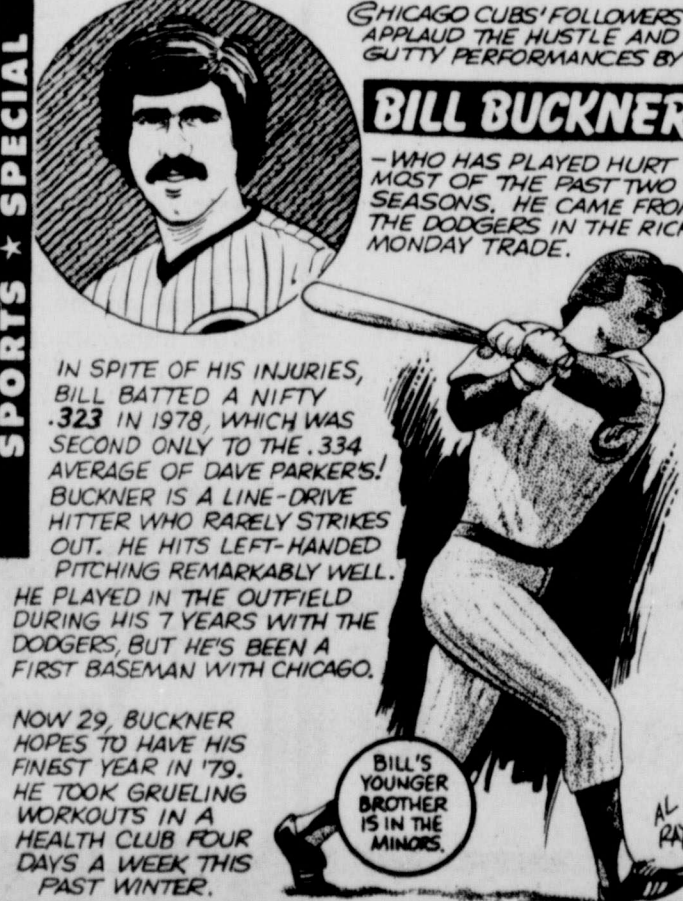

Avoid Burglaries

Did you realize that every 20 seconds — somewhere in the United States — a home or apartment is being burglarized? Senior citizens are susceptible to these crimes and following are some tips on how to keep your home safe:

—Locking windows is just as important as locking doors. The latches on double-hung windows can be jimmied open. They can be locked securely by sliding bolts into holes drilled through the bottom and into the top frame.

—Sliding glass doors are another favorite means of entry for burglars. They are often easy to "jimmy" open and usually don't have adequate locks. A locksmith or hardware store owner has special locks for sliding glass doors that will provide much better security than those usually built into the doors.

Your new refrigerator will operate better and longer if you follow a few simple tips:

—Be sure the unit is level. Models without forced ventilation around the condenser should have adequate space above, behind and on the sides for air circulation. Never place next to a kitchen range.

GORDON SPOT

The conditions are ideal for screwworms now. Animal owners should watch for signs of screwworm infestations in their livestock and pets.

Thanks to the Southwest Screwworm Eradication Program, there have been only a few cases of the insects reported this year in Texas. The eradication program needs full cooperation of livestock and pet owners if it is to be successful.

Livestock and pet owners are reminded to do three things. Inspect animals frequently. Treat all wounds with an approved product. Collect and submit worm specimens that might be screwworms to the Screwworms Laboratory at Mission, Texas, for identification. Positive cases then can be given sterile fly treatment. This treatment will not be given unless the worms are sent to the laboratory for positive identification. We have mailing vials and cartons in the Extension Agents Office. I would suggest that all livestock owners keep a mailing carton in their possession so that samples can be sent to the lab.

Weeds and brush are abundant throughout the county this year. Control of these unwanted plants will boost the grazing program.

Products containing 2, 4-D or dicamba (Banvel) and used for weed control while 2, 4, 5-T is used for brush control. Products containing 2, 4, 5-T (Banvel 2 plus 2, Tordon 225E and Silvex) were suspended from use on forestland, rights-of-ways and pastures on February 28. The Environmental Protection Agency defines pasture as "land producing forage for animal consumption, harvested by grazing, which has annual or more frequent cultivation, seeding, fertilization, irrigation, pesticide application and other similar practices applied to it."

It has been determined that all cultural practices must be carried out before a plot is a pasture. Also, any grazing land with woody plant problem can be treated with 2, 4, 5-T because, by definition, it is rangeland. Rangeland can be broadcast with 2, 4-D amine or a low volatile ester or 2, 4, 5-T compounds. Spot treatments with kerosene, 2, 4-D or ammate can be used on specific weeds.

Water, plus a commercial surfactant, is the standard carrier for pasture weed control. A water-diesel emulsion plus a surfactant is needed for woody plant control. Herbicides can be applied with hand sprayers or by aerial or ground broadcast.

For herbaceous weeds, apply herbicides when the weeds are young and soil and air temperatures are 70 degrees F.

Control woody plants after leaves mature but before they develop a waxy coat. Weedmaster or Tordon 225E are suggested for hard-to-kill rangeland snakeweed. Tordon 225E and Tordon 10K pellets are restricted herbicides and should be applied by a certified applicator.

Easy-to-kill weeds (bitter sneezeweed, cocklebur, annual broomweed, pigweed, ragweed, snow-on-the-prairie, sesbania and croton) can be treated with 2, 4-D. When weeds are slightly mature or under stress, Weedmaster produces better results.

Cool-season annuals, such as western bitterweed, can be treated in late winter or early spring before plants bloom. Make sure soil moisture is adequate and the air temperature is about 70 degrees F. for herbicides to be effective.

Treadleaf groundsel, goldenweed and broom snakeweed can be treated in spring or fall.

For satisfactory and economical weed control, know which herbicide to use on which weeds.

Pressure Canning Clinic

Set By Extension Office

Fresh vegetables are beginning to mature enough to can. So why not see if your pressure canner is in good working order.

First of all you will want to have your pressure canner dial gauge checked. If it does not register correctly, then your food may spoil. The Eastland County Extension Homemakers' Council is sponsoring a pressure canner gauge clinic on Tuesday mornings, June 5 and 19th, from 9:30 to 11 a.m. in the County Extension Office at the Courthouse. Charge for testing a canner gauge for accuracy is 50 cents.

If you canner has a gasket, check to see if it is allowing steam to escape. If the pressure can't reach 10 pounds, buy a new gasket. You will want to wash the bottom or kettle part of your canner -- inside and out -- with soapy water. If the outside is stained, you can use fine wool with soap as a cleaner for those other than the porcelain coated ones. To clean the inside, fill the canner half full of water and add one cup vinegar. Put it on the range. Be sure you have the rack in it so that it will be cleaned too. Let pressure go to five pounds for 10 to 15 minutes. Slide canner from hot range unit and let cool until gauge reaches zero. Let it sit four or five minutes, then open petcock and remove the lid.

Do not put the canner lid in water; this will damage the dial gauge and may cause the petcock to become clogged. Instead, wipe the lid with a soapy cloth and then with a clean, damp one.

Clean the openings in the lid by drawing a string or pipe cleaner through them. Take off removable petcock and safety valve, wash and dry thoroughly; occasionally soak these parts in vinegar and wash and dry. After cleaning, put all parts back together carefully and correctly.

The Eastland County Extension Office has free food preservation bulletins on canning, freezing, jellies and jams, pickles and relishes, and drying of fruits and vegetables. Everyone is invited to call or come by the County Extension Office for your free food preservation bulletins.

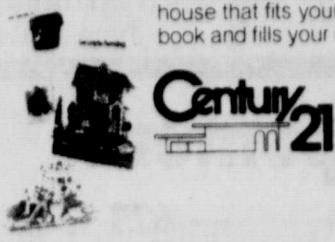

Hints for the Handicapped

DEAR PAT--In a recent article you mentioned "home-health care"

I would like to know more about what services are offered and what is the cost to the person. Will a person's private insurance take care of all or part of this cost?

Does the person have to be bedridden to take advantage of this service? How do you apply for help?

Does it cover people under 65 years of age?--Mrs. G.H., Arkansas

DEAR MRS. H.--Home care is just that: care in the home of a disabled, ill, or elderly individual.

A mother in Wisconsin needs the constant care of a registered nurse. An older brother in Florida needs occasional help with meals and personal hygiene. A good friend in Arizona needs companionship. In some cases, these people might be in a hospital or nursing home, but because of home health care services, they are able to stay in comfort of their own homes and still receive the care they need.

Skills and experience of nurses and attendants are carefully matched to the needs of the individual. Services can be arranged on an hourly or round-the-clock basis. When licensed nursing care is not required, nurse assistants or home health aides are available to perform more basic health care

duties. A live-in companion or home-maker may make it possible for a person to stay at home by providing help with meal planning, shopping, housekeeping chores, or just by offering companionship. Similar services are also provided by a visiting home manager when a key family member is absent.

Because the federal, state and local governments are becoming increasingly aware of the importance of quality health care delivery, many home care services are government funded. Services can be provided within the framework of Medicare, Medicaid, Title III (services to older Americans) and Title XX (Social services) in many locations around the country.

The cost of home care services provided under a doc-

tor's orders may be covered by the client's group or private insurance. In addition, many services may be all or partially tax deductible; more information on this is available from your local Internal Revenue Service office.

A discussion with the Service Director of your local Upjohn Health Care Services office will help to clarify specific coverages.

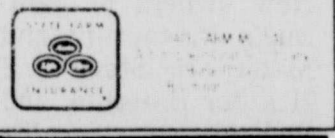
