John Morren will serve as Eastland County Sheriff following his appointment Monday morning by the Eastland County Commissioners Court. He will serve out the unexpired term of R.B. (Ronnie) White who recently resigned. He was one of six men who had made application for the appointment. He resigned as chief Monday morning.

Hollywood and Mike Grice are jailers. Eastland City Manager Lewis Tiner announced that Robert Harbin has been named Acting Eastland Police Chief. Other police officers are David Saucillo and Eugene Lindsay and another man to be announced soon. Mr. Morren made bond Monday morning and was sworn in as sheriff by County Judge Scott Bailey. In 1976 Mr. Morren had been a candidate for the office of county sheriff and in the Primary election, moved into a run-off. The present term will expire at the end of 1980. Work Begins On Plans For Restoring Mobley

Preliminary work was begun last week in preparing plans and specifications for the restoration of the Old Mobley Hotel for the Conrad Hilton Foundation by the University of Houston School of Architecture, the Cisco Lions Club was told Wednesday in a talk at their weekly luncheon meeting.

Benson Walls, senior architecture student at UofH, arrived here last Monday to spend some six weeks on the

preliminary work. He will study the old building and gather as much data as possible regarding the structure.

Dr. Ronaldo Petrini of the UofH faculty is in charge of the project of restoring the Mobley, which was the first Hilton Hotel.

Mr. Walls said the project is expected to cost about \$750,000 and actual work on the building is slated to begin by the end of the year. He plans to begin

some cleanup work, particularly on the grounds this month. A year is expected to be used in restoring the building.

The restored Mobley will have living quarters for a curator, a meeting hall, kitchen, area for Hilton mementoes, several restored rooms along with a room from the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel of New York City and possibly others.

Extensive landscaping is being planned for the grounds. Plans call for an outdoor theater area, a statue of the late Mr. Hilton and other features.

Lion Gene Abbott presented the speaker. President Archie Chamness asked club members to make an effort to achieve 100 percent attendance during the coming year. "We will have a nice pin for the wives of all with perfect attendance records," he said.





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

GORDON SPOT

Honeydew on pecan trees is a real problem throughout Eastland County. Owners of commercial orchards and owners of yard trees are well aware of the problem. Just park your car under the shade of a pecan tree and you will soon become aware of the problems of honeydew. This is all caused by a small insect known as the yellow

aphid. Aphids are small soft-bodied insects, sometimes called plant lice. They suck sap from the leaves and excrete a sticky substance we call honeydew. The black aphids are also causing problems. They do not excrete honeydew, but causes large yellow blotches on the leaves and causes the leaves to shed.

Aphids may be controlled in commercial orchards by spraying with Dimethoate, Malathion, or Phosalone (Zolone). The yard tree owner may use Malathion or Guthion.

Di-Syston applied to the soil under the trees in April or May will usually give good control of aphids. It is a little late in the year to apply Di-Syston now.

A spray application now will also help control the second generation of the pecan nut casebearer.

Awareness of rabies prevention is important due to the large increase of confirmed cases in Texas this year. Rabies cases doubled dur-

ing the January - March period of this year compared to the same period a year ago.

Rabies, one of the oldest and most feared diseases, is a natural disease of dogs, cats, bats and wild carnivores.

All warm-blooded animals are susceptible since the disease is transmitted by a bite which introduces the virus-bearing saliva.

The virus may be present one to three days before the onset of clinical signs. Since there are no "typical" cases, animals exhibit a wide range of symptoms. Therefore, any unexplained central nervous system disorder should be regarded as possible being

rabies. Clinical rabies in man and most animals is essentially 100 percent fatal. There is no specific therapy once the disease's course has begun.

Take proper precautions when encountering an animal suspected of being rabid. An apparently healthy animal that is not a stray that bites a person should be confined and observed by a veterinarian for 10 days. Immediately kill a stray that bites. Since the brain is needed for diagnosis, don't kill the animal by injuring its head. Immediately clean all bites and scratches thoroughly with soap and water since this is the most effective

rabies preventive. Then contact your doctor for further treatment.

Protect all pets through a rabies vaccination program. Livestock should also be protected in areas where rabies is prevalent in wild-life.

Promptly pick up and humanely dispose of all stray animals. Also warn children to stay away from strays

Homeowners In Cisco ISD Have Until July 16 To File For New Exemption

Homeowners in the Cisco ISD have until July 16 to take advantage of new exemptions passed recently by the state legislature. All homeowners, regardless of age, are eligible for an exemption of \$5,000 from the full market value of their home. In addition, all persons who are 65 years old or older, or under a disability for purposes of payment of disability benefits under Federal Old Age, Survivors and Disability Insurance are also entitled to an additional exemption of \$10,000 from the market value of their residence homesteads for the purpose of school taxes.

To qualify for these exemptions for 1979, an application must be filed with the school district tax office on or before July 16, 1979. The exemptions cannot be granted for 1979 if filed after this date. The school tax office is located at 610 Avenue D. 
