There were two small trash cans sitting in the middle of a pile of empty boxes and bottles. One of the cans was overflowing, while the other barely had anything inside. The ground itself was covered by broken, as well as unbroken, bottles. There were numerous bottles floating at the edge of

of young, working per-sons in this town who the lake in the water. I counted at least twelve empty cases of beer, as well as numerous six-pack containers. There were anywhere from 20 to 30 empty bottles floating in the lake where they had washed up against the shore, and no telling how many more



She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. David McGowen of Rising Star, and she has a little sister, Allison, who is two years old. Her doting grandparents are Mr. and Mrs. Robert Butler of Rising Star and Mr. and Howard McGowen of Temple.

Leslie is very petite, almost doll-like. She has brown hair, big blue eyes and a smile that is sure to win your heart, and equally as sure to help her overcome any difficulty that she may encounter.

This little doll-like creature was born with a mal-formation of both the inner and outer ear, and it was determined in early infancy that extensive surgery would be required to correct the defect.



Leslie Now Hears Everything

When she was three months old she was fitted with a hearing aid. and after a brief period of adjustment it was evident that the device enabled her to hear at least in some measure, and she became a very responsive little person, manifesting the sparkling personality, which endears her to everyone that she meets.

The special education classes which she has attended since she was two years old, have been of tremendous benefit to Lesliethis was the initial phase of the speech therapy and the audio tests which were to later determine the surgical process.

Then on August 21. 1979, at the Baptist

Medical Center in Oklahoma City, Dr. Jack V.D. Hough, an eminent Otologist, performed the first surgery-in which he made a new audio canal in her left ear and also repaired the ear drum of the same ear.

Leslie's first reaction following the surgery was, "Mother. how can I hear without my hearing aid?" It seems that the hearing device had become a vital part of Leslie's existence, and the absence of it was puzzling to her.

She was dismissed

August 28, with some additional bandages, a few stitches, and the ability to hear.

Leslie will be tutored at home for a while by Mrs. Richard Purvis, kindergarten teacher in the Cross Plains school system. Then after the recuperation period, she will attend the regular kindergarten classes.

There will be further surgery sometime in the future, but Leslie and her parents are happy that the first steps have been taken toward correcting the problem and giving to her the joy of hearing from the hospital on the sounds of happines.

Blair graduated from Eastland High in 1948 as a Herald Running Back, gaining over a thousand yards for two consecutive seasons and earning a place on the All-State team. From Eastland the hard-nosed 5-11, 172 pound Fullback headed for Hardin Simmons University. There Blair played for a legend among Texas coaches, Warren Woodson, and for the next four seasons Blair learned from the master.

Woodson, often considered one of the greatest offensive minds in the game, soon had the slashing, hard-hitting fullback churning out yardage on offense and playing in the secondary of defense.

Perhaps Blair best describes his style of running when he recalls with a slight grin. "I used to go through the line so low I needed a linebacker to hit me and straighten me up so I could run some more." 'Doak Walker, in my opinion," says Blair, "was the greatest running back I ever

Graduating in only three and one-half years Blair turned down professional offers from Baltimore, San Francisco, and Chicago to pursue coaching. Cisco Blood Drive Set September 12

The Cisco Blood Drive has been set for Wednesday, September 12, at E.L. Graham Memorial Hospital. A team of aboratory technicians from Mary Meek Blood Bank of Hendrick Medical Center in Abilene will be present from 9 a.m.-3:30 p.m.

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A joint organized program (the Lions Club, Rotary Club, Cisco Civic League and the Cisco Service Club are sponsoring the blood drive on a rotating basis) the drive will be held every two months. Each Cisco citizen's effort is mandatory in order to make this a successful program

In order to insure an adequate blood supply, Cisco needs 40 pints of blood every two months. Cisco is, however, presently in debt to Mary Meek Blood Bank, 900 pints of blood. The Blood Drive Committee has therefore set its goal to collect 60 pints of blood, every two months to insure Cisco's adequate blood supply and replinish what we are already in debt for.

A blood insurance policy is available for those persons interested. For a pint of blood given, that donor's immediate family will be insured of having blood available to them for one full year. That donated pint of blood, however, will not count toward credit for Cisco. But for those persons interested in the insurance policy, perhaps at a later date, the donor can donate another pint of blood for credit for Cisco.

All types of blood are needed. There are no longer "paid" donors, except in the case of institutions using only the plasma from a pint of blood, so we must therefore depend on voluntary blood donations.

Blood donors should be aware of the following when preparing to give blood: A) Age eligibility is

from age 18-65. B) No medication should be taken 18 hours prior to donating

blood. C) No medication, however, should be deleted without check-

ing with the perspective donor's own doctor. D) Any person who has

been in Southeast Asia in the last three years should not donate blood.

E) A woman who has menstruated in the last three or four days prior to donating blood, or six weeks after pregnancy, should not donate blood.

F) Any person who has been sick or has had a cold within the last seven days prior to donating blood should not donate blood.






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
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
