## Fire Prevention To Be Observed Oct. 7-13

Fire Prevention Week October 7-13, 1979, marks the 69th year that fire safety has been the subject of a national observance.

It all started on Oc-

tober 9, 1911, when Fire Prevention Day was inaugurated. The date of October 9 was chosen because it marks the anniversary of the so-called "Great Chicago Fire of 1871"--the conflagration which killed 250 people and destroyed 17,430 buildings at a cost of \$168 million, and the fire which started people thinking in terms of fire prevention rather than only of fire fighting.

Fire Prevention Day was begun by the Fire Marshals Association of North America, now a Section of the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA). The Day was first proclaimed by President Woodrow Wilson on the 40th anniversary of the Chicago blaze.

In 1922, on recommendations of a member of NFPA, and unanimous vote of the membership at the Association's annual meeting that year, the fire safety observance was extended to cover the entire week that includes the October 9 anniversary date. President Warren Harding was the first to officially proclaim national Fire Prevention Week.

NFPA continues to be the international sponsor of Fire Prevention Week, which always is the Sunday through Saturday period during which falls the October 9 anniversary date.

The Cisco Junior College Wranglers were held off in a late charge Friday by Texas Christian University's junior varsity in Fort Worth. TCU's JV scored 16 points in the first half and claimed the 16-14 win at Amon Carter Stadium.

CJC is now 3-3 for the

season. The Horned Frogs scored quickly on a one-yard plunge with just over a minute gone in the game.

Then the Frogs intercepted a pass on Cisco's first play from scrimmage. The Wranglers held and TCU had to settle for a 31-yard field goal.

With 45 seconds left in the half, the Frogs drove 60 yards and scored on a two-yard run, but missed the extra point.

Cisco scored on a pass from Terry O'Leary to Quinton Smith early in the fourth quarter 14 yards. O'Leary passed to Blake Moody, who caught two passes for 30 yards to lead Cisco, for the two-point conversion. Moody also was the leading rusher for CJC with 78 yards

## Robert Chriesman Seriously Injured In Pickup Accident

Robert Chriesman, 20, of Cisco, was seriously injured late Tuesday afternoon when the pickup truck he was driving overturned following a blowout.

Chriesman was rushed to Stephens Memorial Hospital by Breckenridge Ambulance Service and was later transferred to Hendrick Medical Center in Abilene. He received serious head wounds.

The accident occurred about two and one-half miles north of Ivan on Highway 67 at about 6:50 Tuesday afternoon. Highway Patrolman James Cain, who investigated, said Chriesman was traveling north at the time of the accident. The vehicle, owned by Moylan Construction Co. of Eastland, where Chriesman is employed, slid off the road after the right rear tire blew out.

Trooper Cain said the pickup rolled front over back after the front tires hit a culvert. Chriesman was thrown from the vehicle.

The pickup was heavily damaged.

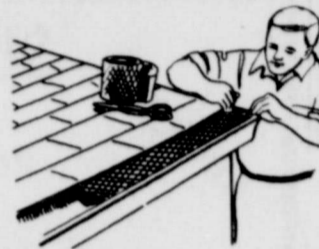


## THOUGHT FOR FOOD

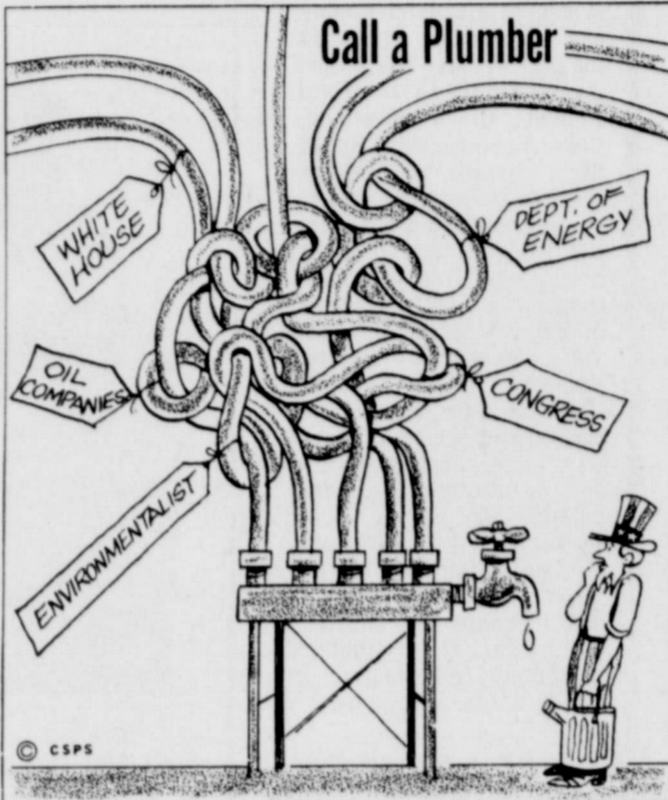
**Keep Home Gutter Clean**

## SENIOR CITIZEN'S CORNER

**Rise In Medicare**  
Medicare hospital insurance costs have increased this year. For example, the Medicare hospital insurance deductible is now \$160 - versus \$144 last year. According to Medicare officials, the increase is a result of a review of hospital costs during 1977, which continued to increase. Under Medicare law, the amount of the deductible is tied to the average daily cost of in-patient hospital care for Medicare patients.  
In addition, some other Medicare cost increases went into effect recently, including:  
For a hospital stay of more than 60 days, Medicare will pay for all covered services from the 61st through 90th day - except for \$40 a day (up from \$36).  
For a post-hospital stay of more than 20 days in a skilled nursing facility, Medicare now pays all but \$20 a day (up from \$18) for the 21st through the 100th day.

# The Christian Church

(Disciples of Christ)

A Minister of an Eastland County Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) carries an address card which includes this statement:

"Not the only Christians, but Christians only." Another favorite statement of Christian Church members is:

"Where the Scriptures speak, we speak; where they are silent, we are silent." They attribute this last one to Alexander Campbell, a Scottish and American Minister who helped articulate a ground-swell reformation of the 1800's - a movement which led to the formation of the Christian Church as we know it today.

Members of this Church believe that down through

the ages God has had a people bearing a true witness for Him, and they state a desire to do just that in the time in which we live.

Although the Christian Church has never held a comparatively large membership in Eastland County, its influence has been impressive. This has been not only because of the work of its Churches and members, but because of its establishment of Randolph Junior College - begun at Cisco in 1922. During the life of this Church College, Cisco was the area's intellectual center for the Christian Church. From this institution came a number of nationally known Church leaders, including Dr. Edwin Elliott, Dr. Patrick Henry, Sr., Dr. Granville Walker, and Cecil Barnes.

After Randolph College was

changed to a state supported school - Cisco Junior College - it continued to provide higher education for a number of young people.

The Christian Church is actually one of the pioneer religions of the County, although records of its beginnings here are sketchy. One early history of Eastland County mentions Circuit Riders from the "Disciples of Christ" being in the territory. Another account briefly mentions a "Rising Star Church" as containing a few members in disagreement with the main body of the Church. But the first Ministers who are definitely named as coming to this area were Addison and Randolph Clark. These remarkable men had established a school at Thorpe Springs, and this later became Texas Christian University in Fort Worth. In the fall of 1884 they gathered a small band designated as Christians, and established a Church in Cisco. Then they pushed on to establish Christian Churches in Breckenridge and Albany.

Unfortunately the cyclone of 1893 totally destroyed the First Christian Church building in Cisco, and its records were never found. But some information about the early work was recorded elsewhere, in which a Minister states:

"My first sermon in Texas was preached in Cisco the first Lord's Day in December, 1888, where I engaged to preach once a month. Eastland took one Sunday, and Abilene two, so I had regular work without loss of any time at all." (Quoted from "Religion on the Texas Frontier", by Carl E. Boren, Published by the Naylor Company, 1968).

Ranger and other outlying communities also began to show results of the work of these early Circuit Riders, who sometimes had to establish loose Fellowships due to lack of a Church building.

The present day Church buildings in Cisco, Eastland and Ranger have been constructed at various times during the last fifty years. The Ranger Church has recently been remodeled. All are attractive and well equipped, with classrooms and space for worship and fellowship. The spacious brick structure in Cisco Combines a modern simplicity with traditional styling.

There are 324 Christian Church members now in Eastland County. Sunday, referred to as "The Lord's Day", is the main day of worship, including Sunday School and the 11:00 A.M. Worship Hour. Instrumental and vocal music is used. The focal point of the worship is the weekly Communion Service, which is open to persons of all faiths. After this service the Pastor gives his sermon.

Anyone writing statements on beliefs of the Christian Church must take into account that each Church is autonomous, and makes a number of its own decisions. The Church believes strongly in the "Priesthood of the Believers", and that each Christian, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, should interpret points of belief, especially those which the Fellowship considers "nonessential" to salvation or the Christian mode of life. Therefore there is some variation in practice from one Church to another, but with most subscribing to doctrines of the main body. Geographically the Fellowship is divided into Areas, Regions, and National.

It also does a large work with foreign missions. Authority in the local Churches is vested in "The Elders", who are considered Elder for life. The Christian Church has two ordinances - Baptism and the Lord's Supper, or Communion. A basic difference between the Church and other Protestant Churches is that it is considered a "Bridge" Church. Sometimes husbands and wives who hold different faiths come into the Christian Church and find they may worship and commune with God together, yet still embrace things they hold dear. For the outstanding requirement for entrance into the Christian Church is belief in Christ and public confession of the same, followed by baptism.

The Church baptizes by immersion, but any person who has been baptized in a different way in another Church may join in profes-

sion of faith. The Church encourages its members to study the Bible, thereby educating themselves in all phases of Christian living. For the Church believes the Bible is the inspired word of God, and the foundation of all religious practices. It uses all valid translations, publicly favoring none above the other.

The Christian Church generally teaches that the Old Testament is the word of God, so it has more value than just a history book. But on the Ten Commandments - the Church also teaches that Christ fulfilled the Law and established a New Covenant, which is the driving force in the New Testament. So the Ten Commandments, the Church believes, leads to the final Commandment - through Christ - which is love.

And the Church believes that love for fellow men should lead Christians to serve in community organizations, and make this area a better place to live. Love should lead citizens to bear the brunt of politics and government, serving where they can.

Although the Church teaches separation of Church

and State, it also believes that applied Christian principles may elevate the society in which we live. The Church has taken no general stand on the taxation of Church property, or the acceptance of Government grants by Church schools.

The Christian Church has no stated position on the use of alcohol by its members, other than the counsel on moderation in all things. But on the subject of marriage, the Christian Church is a family-oriented Church, which teaches that marriage was ordained by God. It does not like to see divorce, yet realizes there are reasons for this falling within the Scriptural teachings.

"The Bible states - 'One Minister said - 'That Christ will return to this earth. So it's not just a matter of whether we 'believe' it or not. But the Church does not try to set a time for this tremendous event.'"

The Christian Church did not divide over the issue of the Civil War. But during its history one fellowship withdrew and formed another large Church. The Disciples, however, state they have always called for Christian unity, which is especially needed in this current age. This unity will come, they believe, through the total restoration of the Church of the New Testament. And Christ, they state, should be the Creed of the Church, and

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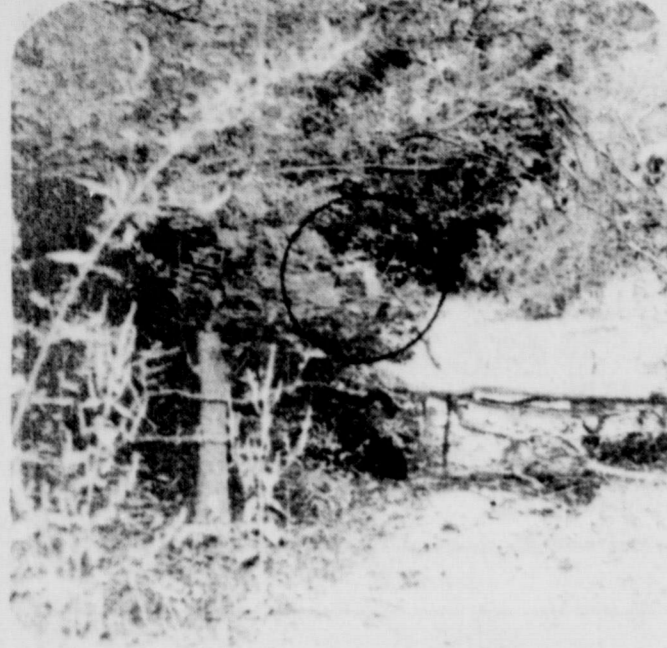
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## Jaycees Hope For 'Thing' Capture Soon

Dr. George Alston, Extension Service Agronomist, classified the hay based on physical and chemical (Protein) scores. Entries with the highest total scores in each division were named champion.

Troy Cross had the champion bale of coastal bermudagrass which graded 93.5. It tested 13.6% protein. K.F. Kirk had the champion perennial grass hay with a total score of 84 and 9.8% protein.

The champion sorghum-sudan hybrid hay was exhibited by Dr. W.P. Watkins. His hay had a score of 92 and was 11.6% protein. Burton Phillips had the champion oat hay which had a total score of 75.5 and 8.8% protein. The champion alfalfa hay owned by Jim Moylan had a total score of 92.5 and contained - 22.6%. Milton Spurill had the champion peanut hay. It scored 66.5 and had 12.1% protein. R.D. Hart owned the champion legume and grass mixed hay which scored 86 and had the

highest protein of all the hay - 22.6%. Milton Spurill had the champion peanut hay. It scored 66.5 and had 12.1% protein.

Hay that had a total score of 85 or above receive a blue ribbon. Scores of 70 to 84 got red ribbons and hay with scores of 50 to 69 received white ribbons.

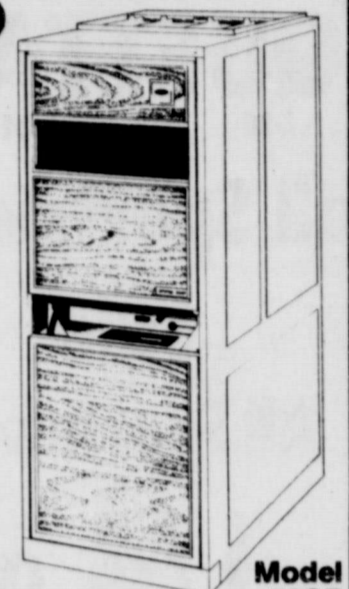

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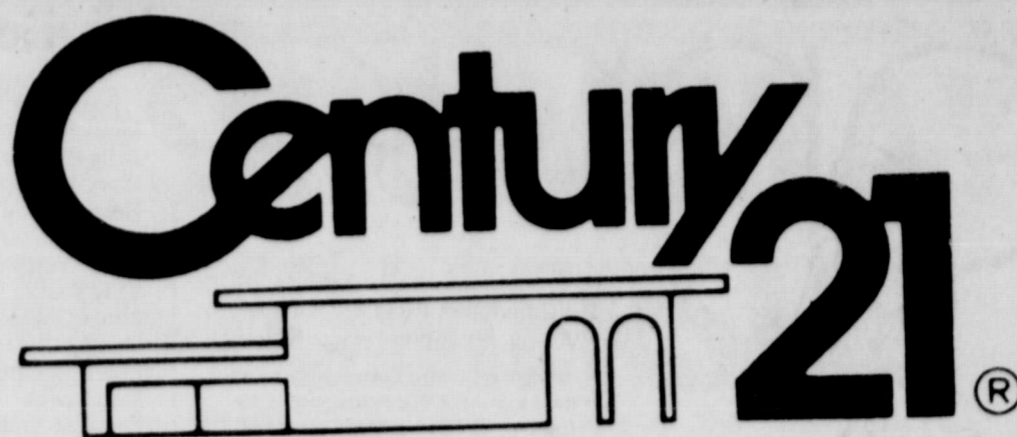

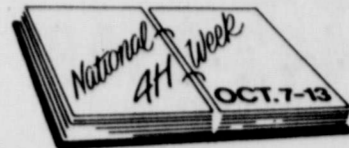

Volunteer leaders are very resourceful. They provide many opportunities for learning at these meetings

such as a guided tours, demonstration, guest speakers, games, etc. Their most important job, however, is to let the 4-Her learn from experience. That means letting them participate in kitchen demonstrations! This is accomplished through group related experiences such as demonstrations, short talks, etc.

The final process of the foods and nutrition project is the County Food Show. This is the time set aside for the 4-Her's to show others what they have learned. They are judged on the actual dish they choose to prepare as well as their ability to communicate knowledge verbally to the judges. The County Food Show is the highlight of the foods and nutrition project as the top Junior and Senior winners go on to the District Food Show in December.

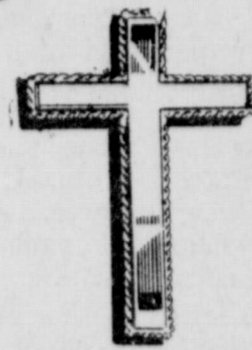

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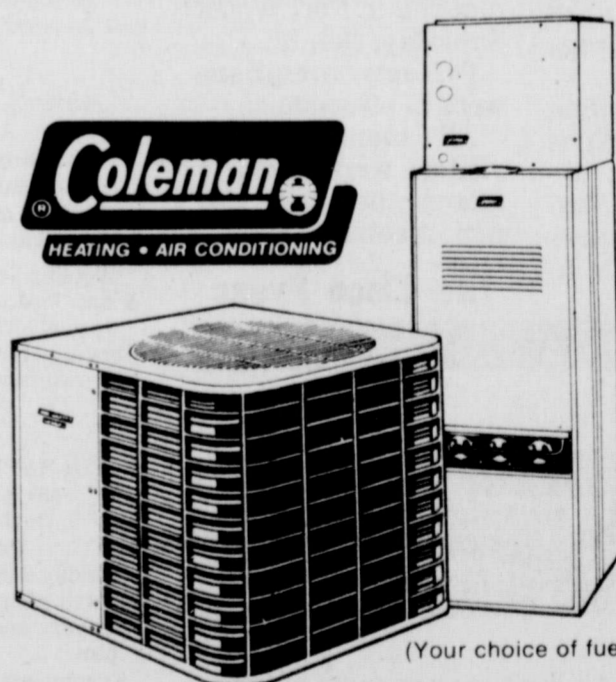
