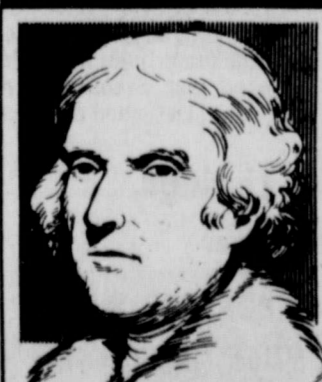

Eric Hilton To Make Presentation At Cisco Bank Friday

Loboes To Begin District Play In Clyde Friday At 7:30 P.M.

The Loboes of Cisco High School will begin district play this Friday night when they travel to Clyde to face the Bulldogs in a 9-AA contest there. The kick off will be at 7:30 p.m.

The Loboes were open last week and have been preparing for this week's contest which should be a very competitive game to say the least. The Loboes are 1-3 for the season.

Coach Rick Calhoun reported Tuesday that the Loboes should be at full strength Friday night since everyone is back with the team and healthy. The coaches scouted last Friday night's game between Clyde and Breckenridge, which was won by Breckenridge 65-0.

The Bulldogs, now 0-1 in district play, have two reasons to be fired up for Friday night's game. One reason being there big loss to Breckenridge in their district opener last week, and the

other reason being that this week's game will be Clyde's Homecoming.

Four senior members of the Lobo squad were chosen Monday as season captains to serve for the rest of this year. Those chosen were Tommy Green, Sy Tabor, Ronnie Eudy and Steve Hopson.

CareFlite Proves Its Benefit

CareFlite, a helicopter emergency ambulance program, from Dallas, has already proved to be of benefit to Cisco. CareFlite began on Monday, October 1, and Cisco's Graham Hospital had a patient on the following Thursday that needed to be transported to Houston. The helicopter landed near the emergency door, loaded the patient, Wayne West, and transported him to Houston.

CareFlite's helicopter emergency ambulance program will serve a 150-mile radius of Fort Worth and Dallas, to include approximately 100 counties in northern Texas and southern Oklahoma.

This service is needed in many types of medical emergencies, because the time spent in transporting patients to appropriate medical facilities can mean the difference between life and death.

CareFlite will be operated by North Central Texas Services, a non-profit corporation formed especially to provide emergency helicopter ambulance service to the Fort

Worth and Dallas area. CareFlite expects to transport 45 to 55 patients per month, usually neonatal, cardiovascular (heart pa-

tients) and accident victims.

To contact CareFlite, a doctor, hospital, or law official may be notified.

Mobley Hotel Restoration Project Model To Be Presented For Display In Lobby

Representatives of the Conrad Hilton Foundation, including Eric Hilton, Dr. James C. Taylor, Dr. Rinaldo Petrini, Benson Walls and five other architect students from the University of

Houston, will be in Cisco Friday afternoon to present a model of the finished restoration project of the Mobley Hotel to the city, according to an announcement Tuesday by Dick Woolley, president of First National

Bank in Cisco and president of the Cisco Chamber of Commerce, and Gene Abbott Chamber of Commerce manager.

The presentation of the model will be made by Eric Hilton at 2 p.m., Friday, October 12, in the lobby of the First National Bank in Cisco. Mr. Woolley said the model will remain on display in the bank lobby for an indefinite amount of time.

A time-schedule for the restoration project should also be made available at this time, according to Mr. Abbott.

Mr. Hilton, his wife Pat, Dr. Taylor and his wife Helen, are scheduled to arrive here by plane around noon Friday. Eric Hilton is the son of the late Conrad Hilton and Dr. Taylor is Dean of the Hilton School of Hotel and Restaurant Management at the University of Houston.

Dr. Petrini of the UofH faculty and architect in charge of the restoration project, his wife, Mr. Walls a senior architecture student at UofH and the other five students are due in Cisco on Thursday. Mr. Walls spent some six weeks in Cisco this summer doing preliminary work on the project and the other students have all helped in some phase of work on the project.

The restored Mobley Hotel, the first hotel owned by the late Conrad Hilton, is planned to have living quarters for a curator, a meeting hall, kitchen, area for Hilton mementoes, several restored rooms along with a room from the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel of New York City and possibly others.

Extensive landscaping is being planned for the grounds behind the building and the garden area.

The general public is invited to attend the Friday presentation which is to be covered by local and area news medias, as well as KRBC-TV, channel 9 of Abilene.

Mr. Woolley stated the bank will halt its business transactions at 2 p.m. for the presentation and will close afterwards, reopening for business at 4 p.m.

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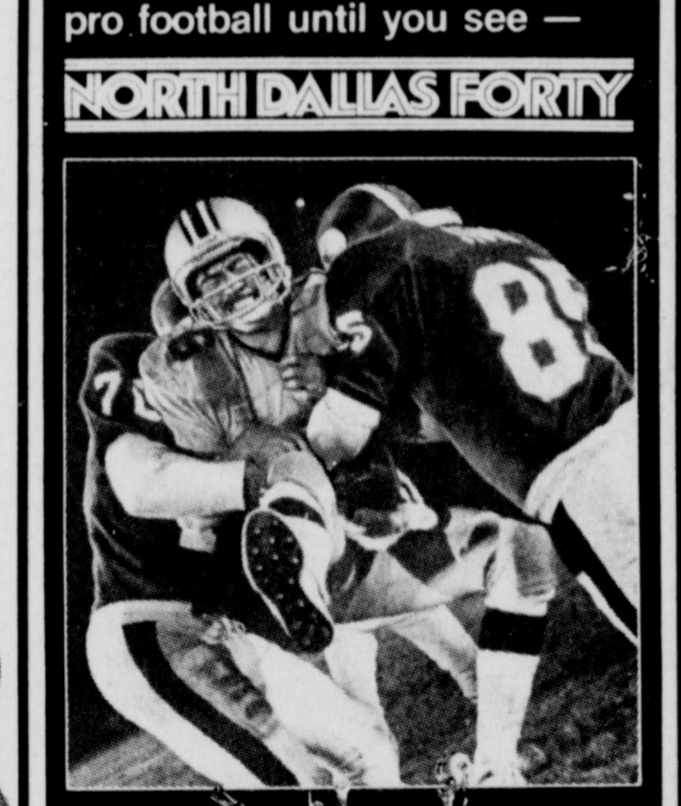

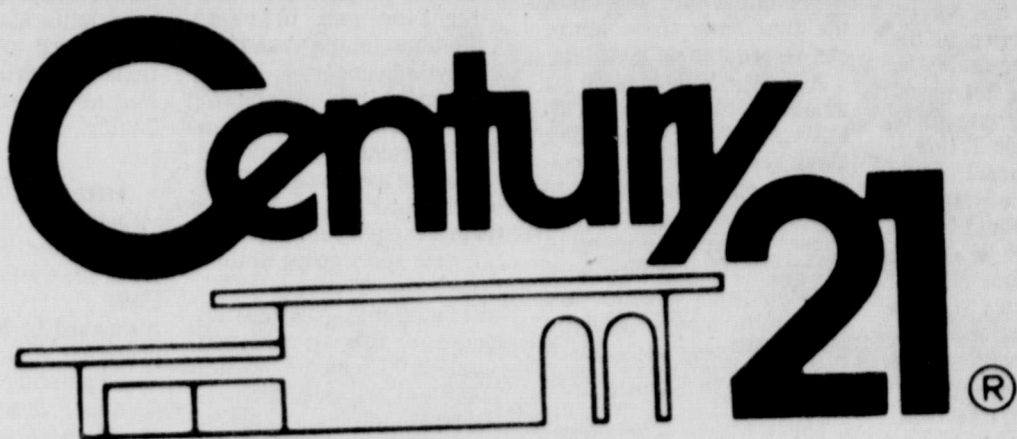

Ranging from the sporty-subcompact Starfire to the top-of-the-line Toronado, the 1980 Oldsmobile lineup includes 27 models, one more than was available in 1979.

The popular diesel option will be offered in 21 Oldsmobile models in 1980.

Here's a rundown on the new Oldsmobile lineup:

STARFIRE...Two Starfire models will be available - the two-door sports coupe and the SX sports coupe. Both are hatchbacks with fold-down rear seats.

A Firenza package, which includes a special front air dam, rear spoiler, flared front and rear wheel openings, wide oval tires and sport wheels, is offered in the Starfire sports coupe. It also has a special paint scheme.

The GT option is available on the sports coupe and SX coupe. It features body side and hood paint stripes in black, white or metallic gold and GT lettering. Other GT equipment is a 3.8-liter V-6 engine, Starfire rallye wheels, raised white letter tires and the instrument panel has a tachometer, voltage meter, temperature gauge and clock.

OMEGA...The 1980 Omega, introduced earlier this year, features front wheel drive and a transverse-mounted engine. With a weight reduction of approximately 750 pounds over previous models, the Omega obtains a fuel economy rating of up to six miles per gallon over comparable 1979 models.

Four models are offered...a coupe and sedan in two series, the Omega and Omega Brougham. The sporty SX option also is available.

CUTLASS...Three new notchback sedans join the Cutlass lineup in 1980, expanding it to 10 models. The new sedans replace the Cutlass Salon and Salon Brougham four-door sedans.

Included are a Cutlass Salon coupe, Cutlass sedan, Cutlass Salon Brougham coupe, Cutlass Supreme coupe, Cutlass LS sedan, Cutlass Supreme Brougham coupe, Cutlass Brougham sedan, Cutlass Calais coupe, Cutlass Cruiser and Cutlass Critser Brougham station wagon.

Optional opera lamps are available on the LS and Brougham sedan and mark the first time these lamps can be ordered on a Cutlass.

A 4-2, W-30 option is available only on the 1980 Cutlass Calais with either black or white exterior colors. The option includes W-30 and 4-2 identification, gold accent stripes and gold painted grille, pillar, hood and top. Also included are aluminum sport wheels, sport mirrors and raised white letter tires.

The 5.7-liter, four barrel V-8 engine is standard with the package and is the only Cutlass where the engine is available. An automatic transmission is also standard on the 4-2.

EIGHTY-EIGHT...The Delta 88, 88 Royale and 88 Royale Brougham are available in either two-door coupe or four-door sedan styles. The front end has been lengthened and the rear shortened. Park and turn lamps are located in the bumper and allow a lower front end for reduced aerodynamic drag. Other aerodynamic drag reduction features are flatter wheel discs, rounded front corners and the addition of a small air spoiler to the deck lid.

A more formal appearance is given with a straighter backlight angle and a softened side feature line.

The Holiday 88 option is available on the Delta 88 coupe. Included in the option are special emblems, contour bucket front seats, sports console with shifter, sport mirrors, custom sport steering wheel and special color-keyed wheel discs.

NINETY-EIGHT...The 1980 Oldsmobile Ninety-Eight is offered in three models...the Luxury sedan and the Regency coupe and sedan.

With the Ninety-Eight, as with the Delta 88, aerodynamic drag has been reduced. The side feature line is also softened and standard wheel skirts provide a clean body line.

TORONADO...A new front end appearance and a sporty coupe option highlight the 1980 Oldsmobile Toronado Brougham.

The new model has shed up to 111 pounds to help improve fuel economy.

Many lighter weight components made this weight reduction possible including alternator and bracket, aluminum intake manifold, catalytic converter, compact spare tire and power seat adjusters. Aluminum bumper reinforcements and hoods are used when inertia weight class targets require further weight reduction.

A new sport coupe option, called the Toronado XSC, will be offered in 1980. It includes a special ride and handling package, bucket seats with console, leather-wrapped steering wheel, oil pressure gage and voltmeter.

All new Oldsmobile will be available in dealerships starting October 11.

NEW SIX-LITER ENGINE, DESIGNED AND BUILT BY CADILLAC

DETROIT - Cadillac designed and built a new and lighter six-liter engine for 1980.

The engine, a major revision of the seven-liter engine used in 1979, has a smaller bore, giving reduced friction, emissions and lower weight, as well as improved cold starting drivability.

The six-liter engine is available in carbureted and fuel injection versions. The carbureted engine is standard on Federal De Villes and Fleetwood Broughams.

A closed loop carburetion system is used on California De Villes and Broughams, as well as limousines and commercial chassis nationwide.

For Eldorado and Seville Federal cars, the engine is available with digital electronic fuel injection, a Cadillac exclusive (new for 1980) that incorporates advanced electronic fuel metering and emissions technology. Digital electronic fuel injection is standard for the front-wheel-drive Eldorado and optional for the front-wheel-drive Seville, which uses the GM 5.7 liter diesel engine as standard.

Digital electronic fuel injection features electronic spark timing and incorporates, for the first time, extensive self-diagnostics, including memory and direct readout. Factory and dealer service personnel can get an instant readout of an existing or intermittent malfunction the system has experienced. It also can

recheck after servicing to make sure repairs were completed properly.

In California, 5.7 liter EFI is standard on Eldorado, optional on Seville. The diesel engine is standard on Seville.

THE 1980 CADILLACS

Cadillac's distinctive new front-wheel-drive Seville leads the Cadillac lineup for 1980.

Edward C. Kennard, vice president of General Motors and general manager of Cadillac, describes Seville as, "A most significant car. It is not only the first U.S. car to be sold with a diesel engine as standard, it is a car with such advanced technology it will become a classic in its own right."

"It has," Mr. Kennard said, "the crisp styling and custom-built look of a great luxury car. It combines European flavor and American flair. There is no other car like it."

Mr. Kennard added, "Cadillac owners look for something beyond anything anyone else offers. Our 1980 Cadillacs, with their distinguished good looks and impressive mileage figures, should completely fill the bill."

Couple and Sedan de Villes, Fleetwood Broughams and Limousines are re-styled with added comfort and convenience features for 1980. The Eldorado retains its basic design characteristics and overall dimensions, but incorporates design and engineering refinements for the new model year.

SEVILLE

Seville for 1980 "gives our customers the best of all worlds," Mr. Kennard said. The diesel is standard, and the option is a new engine with digital electronic fuel injection. Seville is the first sedan to combine front-wheel-drive with fully independent four-wheel suspension, four-wheel disc brakes, electronic leveling control, electronic climate control, cruise control and digital electronic fuel injection with an average and instantaneous miles per gallon "MPG Sentinel" as the option. It is one of the finest production cars in the world.

Engines
The GM 5.7 liter (350 CID) V-8 diesel engine is standard. The Cadillac-designed

and built 6 liter (368 CID) digital electronic fuel injection V-8 engine is the Federal option. California cars retain the closed loop electronic fuel injected 5.7 liter (350 CID) V-8 engine.

Fuel Ratings

With the Federal digital electronic fuel injection gasoline engine, the EPA estimate is 14 mpg city and 22 mpg highway with a composite of 17 mpg. This is up from a composite of 16 mpg in 1979.

Exterior

The 1980 Seville looks longer, but exterior dimensions are much the same as 1979. The gasoline Seville is about 300 pounds lighter. The front is lower, rear overhang shorter.

The rear profile is a combination of classic elegance, nostalgia and practicality, and the new design adds 1.7 cubic feet of usable trunk space. Thanks to front-wheel-drive and independent rear suspension, the trunk floor is flat. A new, lightweight spare tire is mounted vertically. Rounded, flared wheel openings house new, all-weather radial tires and new, cast aluminum wheels.

Added body structure reinforcements at the pillars and new dual rate suspension rubber bushings, front and rear, improve the ride.

Interior

Seville's interior design continues the custom feeling. The simulated teak woodgrain instrument panel is accented with simulated butterfly walnut inlays. A conveniently located center console display area makes it easy for driver and front seat passenger to reach radio, electronic climate control, clock re-set and accessory switches.

Seville is roomier, with extra front seat leg and shoulder room and, for rear seat passengers, more leg, shoulder and hip room.

Seville seating is available with a new knit fabric or optional leather.

Elegante

Seville Elegante, the ultimate Seville, has a look that is all its own. The Elegante is available in three distinctive two-tone color combinations: Sheffield Gray Firemist and Sable Black; Norfolk Gray and Sheffield Gray; or Desert Sand Firemist and Canyon Rock. Brushed and

bright chrome moldings add to its distinction. Elegante owners may choose wire wheel covers.

The Elegante interior features seats with leather seating area as standard. A newly-designed console includes an integrated fold-down arm rest and two individual storage compartments.

Other Features

Seville benefits from other new features: a new battery, improved radios, a new electronic climate control system and, with optional digital electronic fuel injection, the MPG Sentinel for digital readout of instantaneous and average miles per gallon.

ELDRADO

Exterior

Eldorado is America's best-selling personal luxury car, and the 1980 Eldorado continues the popular design theme introduced in 1979. Overall length is 204.5 inches and wheelbase is 114.0 inches.

Eldorado shares with chassis with Seville, combining front-wheel-drive with fully independent four-wheel suspension, four-wheel disc brakes and electronic leveling control.

A more graphic, stronger grille texture is new for 1980 along with a new, along with a new, multi-slot design standard wheel cover to add more flair to this sporty Cadillac. Six two-tone colors are available.

Engines

The new, Cadillac-designed-and-built 6 liter (368 CID) digital electronic fuel injection V-8 engine is standard. Eldorado's destined for California use the closed loop electronic fuel injection 5.7 liter (350 CID) V-8. The 5.7 liter GM diesel powerplant is an optional selection.

Fuel Ratings

Eldorados with Federal digital electronic fuel injection have an EPA estimate of 14 mpg city, 22 mpg highway with a composite of 17 mpg. This is up from a composite of 16 mpg in 1979.

Interior

Interiors feature two-occupant divided front seats with loose, tufted pillows in six shades of a new knit cloth or 10 leather shades.

Eldorado's simulated teak woodgrain instrument panel has a center control display.

Biarritz

The Eldorado Biarritz is identified by its custom cabriolet roof with stainless steel cap, and by wide chrome moldings. Biarritz is available in seven exterior colors. Interiors include seven leather-vinyl color selections or gray knit. A short-pile, high density carpet highlights the theme.

DE VILLE, FLEETWOOD BROUGHAM AND LIMOUSINE

Exterior

Coupe and Sedan de Villes, Fleetwood Broughams and Limousines retain the same width and wheelbase as last year, but are restyled. The traditional Cadillac design includes an isolated cross-hatch grille flanked by flush-mounted lighting modules. Both front and rear were aerodynamically-tested in a wind tunnel to lower drag coefficient and help improve fuel economy over last year.

The 1980 De Villes and Broughams feature a stiffer roof profile with a sharpened crease line running the full length of the side to give a longer, more tailored look.

The deck lid has a higher profile and the rear surface is beveled.

Park and turn lights, now under the head lamps, are amber in color to coordinate with side marker lamps.

Fleetwood Brougham Exclusives

Exclusive touches for the 1980 Fleetwood Brougham includes closed-in back lights with chrome belt moldings, larger rocker moldings, new wheel discs with a silver colored veined insert and wreathe and crest ornamentation, and a new, electroluminescent opera lamp.

Engines

Coupe and Sedan de Villes and Fleetwood Broughams are powered by the new, lighter, Cadillac-designed and built 6 liter (368 CID) carbureted V-8 engine. California models utilize a closed loop fuel control carburetor version. The GM diesel engine is optional on all models, except Limousine.

Fuel Ratings

EPA fuel economy estimates for Federal De Villes and Broughams with the Cadillac 6-liter engine are 15 mpg city, and 23 mpg highway with a composite of 18 mpg. This, too, is up from

a composite of 16 mpg in 1979.

California De Villes and Broughams are estimated at 14 mpg city, 21 mpg highway and 16 mpg composite.

Improved Ride

Engineering refinements give the new De Villes and Broughams a smoother ride than ever. Contributing to it are selectively boxed frame sections, upper arm assemblies with low friction ball joints and larger rubber bushings, structural reinforcements in key areas and new, low-rolling-resistance tires.

Anti-Corrosion

Improved anti-corrosion measures protect against stone chipping. The Fleetwood Brougham has a wide chrome molding. A more slender molding, supplemented by Plastisol, identifies DeVilles. It is measures such as these that have contributed to the recently-announced GM 36-month, unlimited-mileage corrosion perforation warranty on all 1980 model GM cars and trucks sold in the United States.

Interior

Inside, Cadillacs are quiet. Several insulators developed to absorb diesel noise have been built into these models.

Broughams and De Villes offer a selection of leather, fabric and carpet with more luxurious trims available as options. There are 21 exterior colors, including five optional Firemist shades.

The De Ville is trimmed in knit fabric. The luxurious d'Elegance option features an interior seat trim velour.

The Fleetwood Brougham interior bespeaks its elegance. New biscuit-sculptured seats feature bolsters with an embroidered Cadillac wreath on front and rear armrests. The optional Brougham d'Elegance includes three-occupant split seats with two knit fabrics.

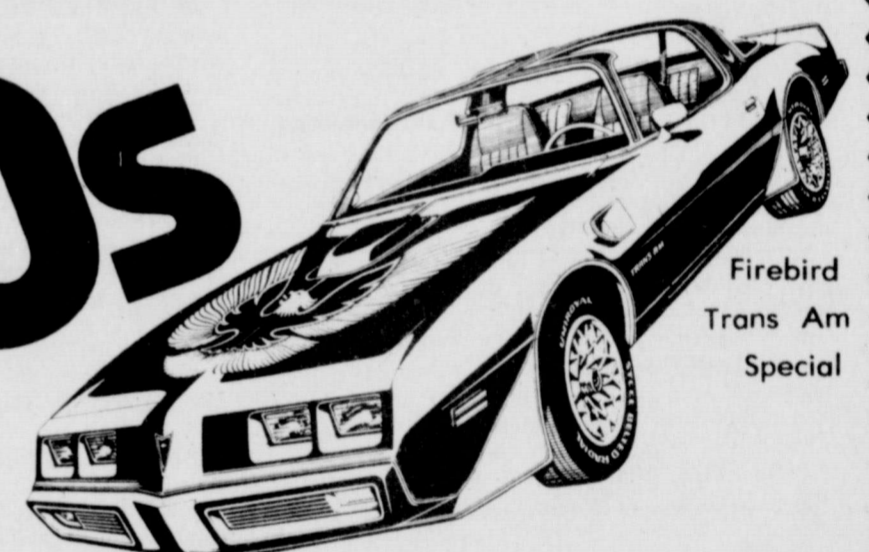

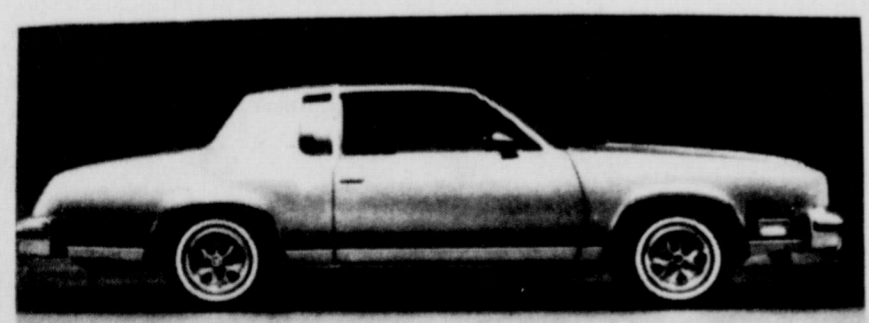

Large Number Attends City Council Meeting

A large number of citizens and city employees were present at Tuesday night's regular meeting of the Cisco City Council held in the Council Chamber at City Hall.

During the City Manager's report, city engineer Billy Jacobs said the Front Street project will hopefully be finished the latter part of this week, or the first part of next week. He said one of the major problems on the project has been allowing the base to set up with a good density, which it now has. He said the remaining work includes smoothing, priming and two days later, putting down the asphalt.

Mr. Jacobs also informed the council he is looking at two possible routes for a sewer line to relieve the major problem on eighth street. One route would go along Front Street north of eighth to second street where it would turn east and then be directed toward the waste water treatment plant. The other would go more along the same route as the present line from that area.

Other items discussed during the city manager's report included the information that on September 29, a number of persons helped to cut the grade and do surface work at Cisco Municipal Airport. City manager Boland said Mr. Turner of the Texas Aeronautics Commission (TAC) was in Cisco on Tuesday and seemed to be pleased with the progress at the airport.

Boland also told

council members the city has received and is using its new sanitation truck. He said the truck is bigger and heavier than expected.

A discussion was held by the council concerning a request from Mrs. Kitty McCracken "to close certain streets and alleys adjacent to Subdivision 139, Blocks 1, 2 and 3 of the original townsite, City of Cisco, Texas." City Attorney Billy Wright Jr., said instead of closing the streets, the city would need to abandon them and draw up an ordinance to do so. He also suggested getting waivers from all abutting property owners. Council member Louise Allison suggested Wright draw up such an ordinance along with all the legalities, and the city council could then act on the ordinance. The council seemed in agreement for Mrs. McCracken's request to be granted as long as the city gets an easement for any existing water lines in the area.

Also discussed at the council meeting was a request by Herrell Steddum to relocate Spears Street on college hill. No action was taken by the council since it had decided in a previous meeting to let the matter be settled in court. Mr. Steddum says Spears Street is located on his property and does not agree with a survey he has of his land. City Attorney Wright said even if the surveys are off, the street is already there and has

been used for a certain length of time; therefore, it is as good as a dedicated street. He went on to say the city should wait until a judge tells them different on the location of the street.

A request of Homer Bible for a six months oil drilling lease on city property at the sanitary landfill was brought before the council. City attorney Wright said the city legally should take bids before leasing property. He suggested drawing up a six month lease containing an one-eighth royalty for the city, advertise for bids and accept whichever one the city wants. He stated a copy of the lease should be available for inspection at the city manager's office. Council member Lucy Collier made a motion for such a lease to be drawn up and advertise for bids. Bill Eudy seconded the motion and council members Louise Allison, Morgan Fleming, Collier, Eudy and Mayor H.C. Brown voted in its favor. Council member Raymond Whitley abstained from voting.

Bids for four different specified insurance policies were discussed by the council. The four policies were Workmen's Compensation, Multi-Peril, Automobile Liability and Airport Buildings (Fire). Since all the bids were for the same protection, council members agreed to go with the cheaper of each policy. Council member Whitley made a motion to accept the bids on each policy from Lebetter Insurance Agency except the Multi-Peril policy, since Ronnie Ledbetter said he thinks either his company or David Callarman's company made a mistake on their figures causing too large a difference between the two bids. Whitley included in his motion that after the two companies recheck their figures, city manager Boland should go with the cheaper of the policies. Collier seconded the motion and all voted in its favor.

A public hearing on a 1980 airport grant was held at the meeting. City manager Boland informed the council that TAC had sent a letter of September 18 to Mayor Brown informing him that in response to a preliminary grant request from Cisco, \$25,000 has been set aside for improvements at the airport. The funds will be held for 90 days to permit the city opportunity to apply for the grant or to inform TAC they are not going to apply for the grant. City manager Boland read two letters, one from Dr. Ayres Cermine and the other from the E.L. Graham Memorial Hospital Medical and Administrative Staff, citing a need for the airport for medical reasons such as the services of an air ambulance to transfer a patient safely and rapidly from the local hospital to a medical

center in a metropolitan area.

City manager Boland gave a presentation during the public hearing of the proposed work at the airport with a breakdown of construction and financing at Cisco Municipal Airport. In the breakdown he showed how the city would be reimbursed for 50 percent of its cost throughout five stages of the development. In the sixth stage, final payment, the airport committee would be required to provide \$13,193.40, leaving the city to come up with \$10,691.52. Boland said this figure could be worked into next year's city budget (1980-1981). He went on to say the total airport valuation, when finished, should be \$223,531.54 while the city should be out only \$10-15,000, giving it a 900-1000 percent return on its investment.

Council member Eudy emphasized that the city is not forgetting other areas, such as streets and sewers, for the airport. He explained the city set aside \$30,000 for street improvements in the 1979-1980 budget and has a major sewer line improvement being looked into by the city engineer. He also stated if a good airport brought in one company to Cisco employing 200 people, it would be worth the expense.

In council action on the 1980 airport grant, council member Eudy made a motion to accept the grant offer, and if the city cannot work out its financial part in next year's budget, give Boland approval to borrow the funds. Collier seconded the motion and all voted for, except Allison who said she would have gone along with the grant but not with borrowing the money.

In other action, council member Fleming made a motion to pay the monthly bills. Whitley seconded the motion and all voted in its favor.

Chief of Police Kenneth Eaves presented a police department policy to the council. He stated such a policy is necessary for uniform treatment of personnel and citizens. Council member Allison praised the policy but objected to the parts concerning salaries, vacations and holidays. She stated all city employees should come under the same pay system. She made a motion to accept the police department policy with the exception of those parts concerning salary, vacations and holidays. Collier seconded the motion and all voted in its favor except Whitley who abstained, stating he is not qualified to make the decisions of a chief of police on salaries and holidays.

Chief of Police Eaves presented five different proposals to the city for putting a dispatch back in Cisco, since he had been asked to look into the possibility. Following discussion of the proposals, the general opinion of the council

seemed to be in agreement with Chief Eaves that the city would save a lot of expense by leaving the dispatch service as it is just outside of Eastland. The council also seemed to agree that a walkie-talkie should be purchased which would allow officers to be contacted by the dispatch service when they are not in their autos. Mayor Brown also suggested that the possibility be looked into of having a 442 prefix placed on the dispatch number for Cisco, thus allowing people in Cisco to dial a familiar number which would ring the dispatch in Eastland.

Council member Allison made a motion to re-appoint Charles Graham, Mrs. Reggie McCrea and C.W. Guthrie to the Cisco Housing Authority (following their recommendation by Mayor Brown). Whitley seconded the motion and all voted in its favor.

Other appointments listed on Tuesday night's agenda were postponed due to the length of the meeting.

Council member Allison made a motion for the city to approve the September 11 action by the Eastland County Tax Appraisal Board, making a seven

member board to be filled by appointment rather than election and operating on a three-quarters rule. Eudy seconded the motion and all voted in its favor.

Following a closed meeting to discuss personnel matters, the city council unanimously voted to give the city manager a proposed salary increase of \$140 per month raising his yearly income from \$16,060 to \$17,740.

The council also voted unanimously to give all city employees a general seven percent cost of living increase. However, a proposed merit increase based on years of longevity was turned down when council members Whitley, Eudy, Fleming and Mayor Brown voted against, while Collier and Allison voted for the proposal.

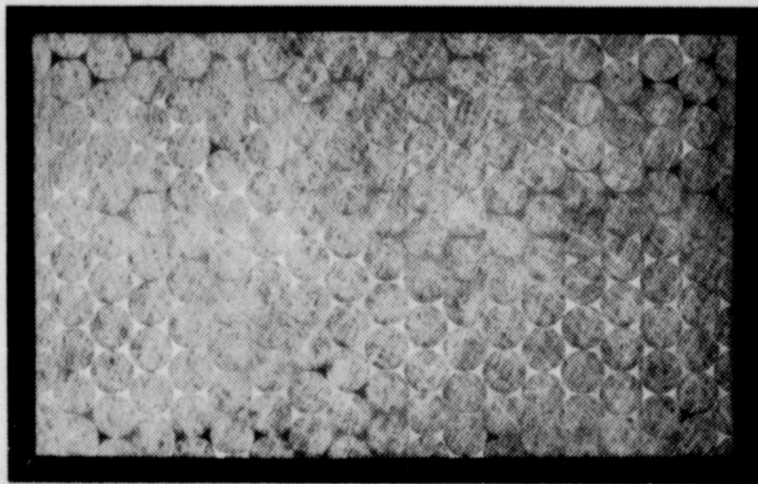

To avoid damage to your unit, to keep your home cleaner, and to save energy and money, be sure filters are clean. Permanent types can be cleaned according to the manufacturer's instruction. Non-permanent types are replaced, since they are inexpensive. It is wise to check filters every 30 days.
