### Planned At Club

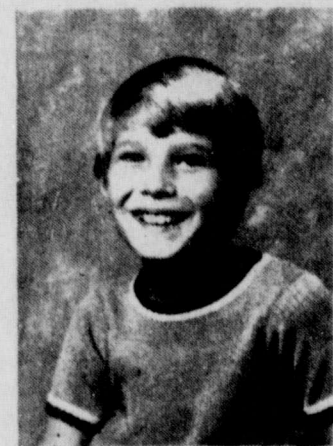

## Band-Belles To Appear In Shenandoah Festival

Cisco Junior College has announced that it will sponsor an American Airlines charter tour to Washington, D.C. and the Shenandoah Apple Blossom Festival in Winchester, Virginia, April 30 through May 3, 1980. The trip will accompany the CJC Band and Wrangler Belles for an appearance in the famous Shenandoah Apple Blossom Festival, and a tour of the many sites in and around the nation's

capitol. Approximately 80 seats are available on the charter flight, in addition to those that will be used by the band, dance team, and their directors. These seats, along with a tour package, are being offered to interested parents and other "boosters" who would like to make the four-day trip with the group.

A per-person price of \$413 will include the American Airlines charter on a 707 jet aircraft, charter bus transportation to and from Dallas/Fort Worth Airport, all ground transportation in Washington and Virginia,

three nights/four days hotel accommodations in the Washington area, a ticket to a first run play at Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts, a tour of Mount Vernon, a ticket to the multimedia presentation, "The American Adventure," and considerable sight-seeing in Washington, D.C. and the Shenandoah Valley. Among the historic sites visited will be the White House, Capitol, Supreme Court, Library of Congress, Smithsonian Institute, Washington Monument, Lincoln Memorial, Jefferson Memorial, and Arlington National Cemetery. Three of the

four days will be in the Washington area, with the fourth in Winchester, Virginia, via the scenic drive along the way.

The Belles will perform for the traditional "Knighting" Ceremony of the Apple Blossom Festival, accompanied by the band. The two groups will also appear in a featured performance prior to the Grand Feature Parade, and also as prominent attractions in the parade itself. The parade will be regionally telecast on the east coast by CBS-TV affiliates, and will also go into a national cable television hook-up to selected markets across the country.

CJC has sponsored package tours in the past in conjunction with appearances by the well-known band and Wrangler Belles. All of them have been to New York City and the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade. The two performing units of the college have appeared in three Macy's parades—in 1971, 1973 and 1977—and the Belles have also been featured in two television specials, the "On Parade" Show with Joe Garigiola in 1971, and the "Stars and Stripes Show" with Bob Hope and other celebrities in 1975.

Reservations may be made for the trip by contacting Mr. Tim Jones, CJC Band

Director. A descriptive brochure may also be obtained by calling Mr. Jones at 442-2567. A deposit of \$50.00 is required to insure a place on the trip, and the seats are of course available on a "first come-first serve" basis. When all available places have been reserved, a waiting list will be employed, Mr. Jones stated.

The tour is being coordinated by Mr. Eric Ritchie of Southwest Enterprises in Cisco. Mr. Ritchie is former Public Relations Director for the college, and a former band director and coordinator of the CJC Band and Belles. He handled arrangements for the previous trips to New York.

Mr. Jones and Mrs. Pat Owens, director of the Wrangler Belles, expressed delight at the invitation to appear in the prestigious festival in Virginia, and stated that they are looking forward to a great trip once again. "We're sure that we'll sell all of the 80 available seats quite soon, so those parents and other interested persons should see about making their reservations right away," they concluded.

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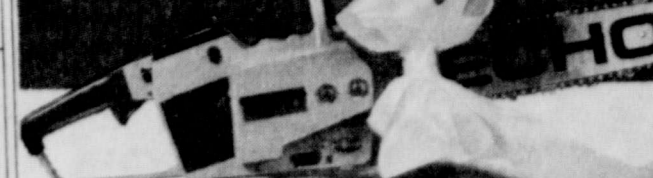

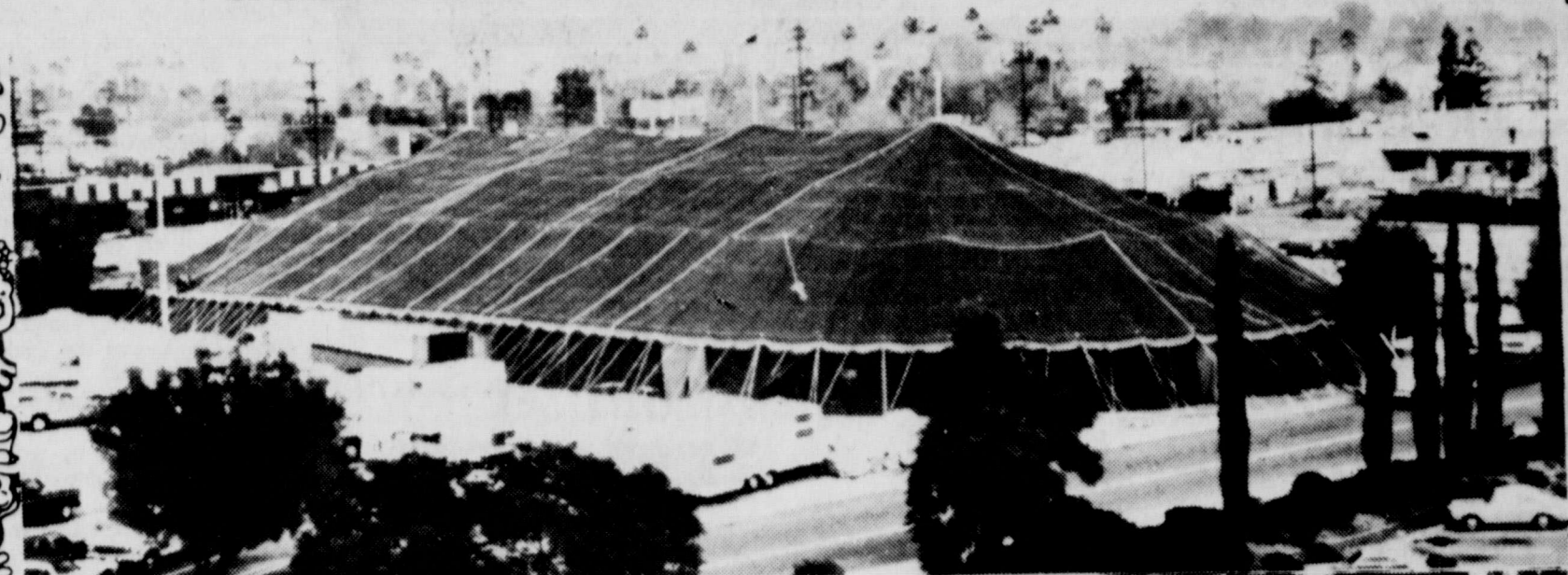

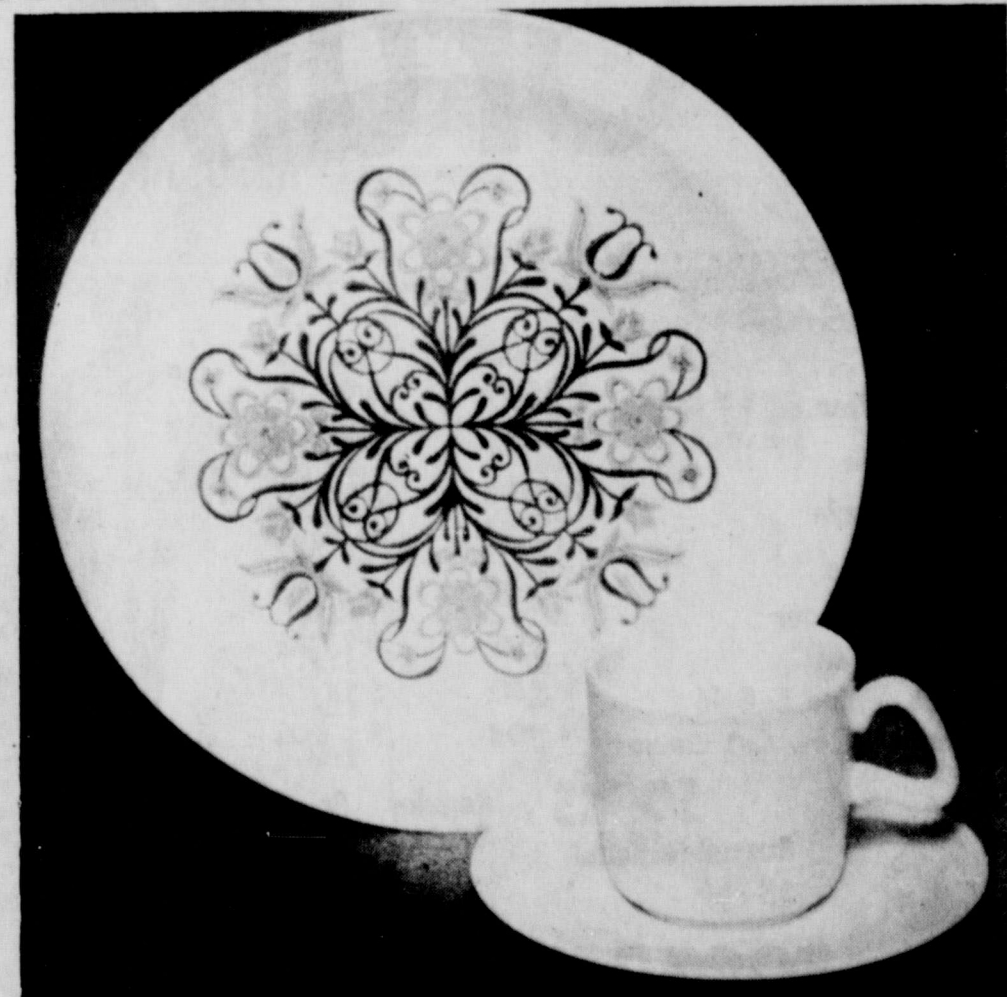

**Texas Pecan Week Has County Pecan Show And Queen Pageant**

In recognition of the State's largest pecan crop ever, the week of December 2, has been declared "Texas Pecan Week," by the Texas Department of Agriculture, Commissioner Reagan Brown. Pecan Week will be observed here in Eastland County with a Pecan Queen Pageant at Cisco Junior College, Monday night, December 3, and the 27th Annual Eastland County Pecan Show in Eastland, December 7 and 8. The Pecan Show will include about 200 entries of high quality pecans, representing over 40 varieties, a bake show, featuring delicious pecan pies, cakes, candies, nut bread and cookies. There will also be a pecan centerpiece class.

The show is being sponsored by the Eastland County Pecan Growers Association and the Eastland Chamber of Commerce. James Wright, Chamber of Commerce manager, says visitors will see some of the best quality pecans in Texas, as well as prize baked goods. Plaques will be given for the Champion in-shell pecan, the Champion shelling pecans, and the Champion natives. Ribbons will be awarded to the first, second, and third place entries, of each variety. In addition, ribbons will be given for the largest pecan and the smallest pecan. Dan Childress, President of the County Pecan Growers Association, says this should be one of the largest pecan shows held in Eastland County, Comanche County

pecan growers have been invited to exhibit in the Eastland County Show, since there will be no Pecan Show in Comanche County. Local county growers are harvesting one of the largest crops ever produced here. Visitors may purchase baked goods at the show. Show pecans not going to the Regional Show will be sold after the County Show closes at noon Saturday. The Extension Homemakers will operate a concession, where coffee and pecan food will be sold. Everyone producing pecans may enter the Pecan Show.

Each entry consists of 43 pecans. All entries must be entered by 5:00 p.m. Thursday, December 6. On Friday morning ten pecans from each entry will be weighed, shelled, and kernels weighed to determine the number of pecans in one pound and percent kernel. These two factors are important in determining winners, along with appearance, color, uniformity and texture. Members of the Eastland Chamber of Commerce will assist in the pecan shelling process.

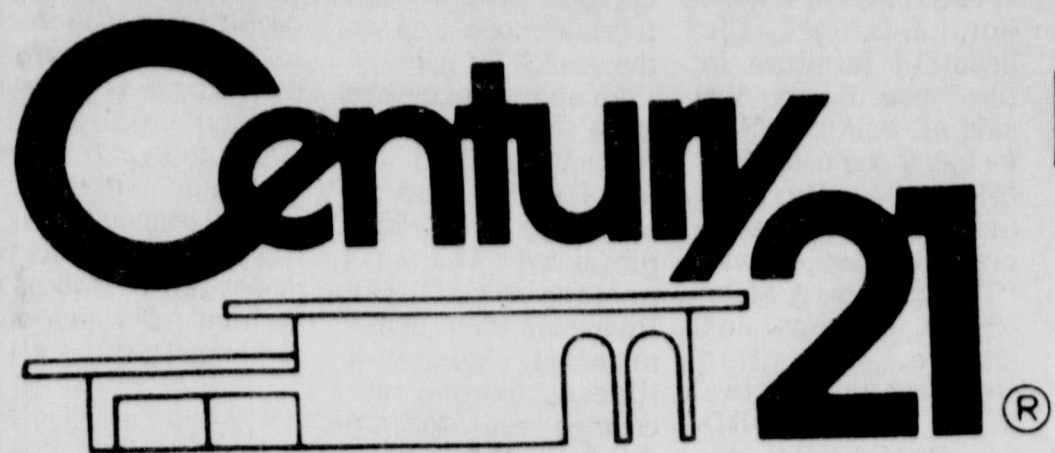

# City Council Adopts 1980 Airport Grant Agreement

The Cisco city council adopted a 1980 Airport Grant Agreement for \$25,000 at Tuesday night's regular meeting. The motion to adopt the grant was made by council member Raymond Whitley following a public hearing for discussion on the grant. Council member Lucy Collier seconded the motion with Mayor H.C. Brown and council members Morgan Fleming, Whitley and Collier voting in its favor. Council member Louise Allison voted no and council member Bill Eudy was absent.

In other council action, council member Allison made a motion to accept the second reading of an ordinance to close certain streets and alleyways adjacent to Block 139 of the original townsite. Collier seconded the motion and all voted in its favor.

Allison also made a motion to approve a resolution for the Eastland County Appraisal District. It was seconded by Whitley and all voted in its favor. In the resolution, Eastland will appoint a member to the county tax board for the first two years with Ranger and Cisco following with their own two year terms.

City manager John Boland reported the police department has had to use the city manager's pickup during the weekend because the timing chain went out on the 1978 Ford and the front end is worn out on the Plymouth. He stated three men went to Austin Tuesday to bring back two recently purchased, used Dodges from the Department of Public Safety.

The council approved the minutes of the last regular council meeting with some clarifications on a motion by Whitley. It was seconded by Fleming and all voted in its favor.

A financial statement submitted by Boland was approved with a motion from Allison. Whitley seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Boland informed council members that

city secretary Sherry Ledbetter has been in the hospital the past few weeks with a slipped disc and pinched nerve. He said she will be bedridden for at least eight weeks and it appears she will not be able to go back to work for some time. He suggested a new person be looked for to fill the position of city secretary. Council member Allison stated she would like to see the position filled as quickly as possible, but with the right person. She said prospects should be looked at very closely and the city should not be in too big a rush to fill the position.

Boland informed the council that he has looked into the matter of delinquent lake lot leases and prepared a recent list of those leases. He said he is working with City Attorney Billy Wright Jr. on preparing letters to be sent to those persons.

Council members discussed the need of hiring a new city auditor, since Charles Clark is retiring. Mr. Clark has sold out his CPA business to a man from Abilene who will be moving to Cisco. Several possibilities were discussed but Mayor Brown tabled the issue until more information could be gathered on all the possibilities; however, he stated he would rather give the audit to an accountant who lives and works in Cisco.

The possibility of acquiring street signs to identify street names was discussed by the council. The council seemed in agreement that the buying or making of street signs could be gradual with first priority being main streets such as Avenue D and 8th Street. Boland said he would check into the matter further and come back with some more definite price figures.

Boland also informed the council that the city has \$228,287.37 in various savings accounts with a \$30,825 certificate of deposit scheduled to mature in March of 1980. This will give the city a total of \$259,112.37 in savings accounts drawing 5 to 5 1/4 percent in-

terest. He suggested the city could place part of the money (emphasizing that he does not advocate taking all the money out of the First National Bank of Cisco) in U.S. Treasury Bills which draw from 11.5 percent to 12.5 percent interest. He said such an account could be opened with the First National Bank in Dallas. Mayor Brown tabled the matter saying the Cisco bank officials should be informed of what the city is considering doing and find out their feelings before any action is taken on the matter.



**Claude Johnson Celebrates 102nd Birthday, Nov. 22**

Claude Johnson celebrated his 102nd birthday on November 22, on Thanksgiving Day. Johnson was born in Okolona, Mississippi, and moved to Texas when he was still a youngster to work in the Dallas cotton mill. Johnson was a preacher for the Church of God for more than 50 years. Johnson preached in churches in Oklahoma, Big Spring, Sweetwater, Rising Star, Ballinger and Girard. He moved to Cisco after the death of his wife in 1956.

The Johnsons had five children, but all are dead. A daughter, Naomi, died when she was five years old. A son, Clyde, was born retarded, and died a couple of years ago.

Neal Moore, Johnson's neighbor, has helped look after him for many years. Until recently, Mr. Moore prepared breakfast for him each morning. Two months ago, the Department of Human Resources hired a man to live with Johnson, and to care for him. Only one relative, Beulah Brooks, lives in Cisco.

Johnson's attitude about living for 102 years was this: "That's too long for anyone to live."
