City Issues Building Permit To Dr. Petrini For Mobley Project

Dr. Rinaldo Petrini, architect in charge of the Mobley Hotel project in Cisco, announced here Saturday that he has received a building permit from the City of Cisco. He stated that the purpose for his most recent visit to Cisco was to present the plans to the city for a permit and to take delivery of the first group of original furniture for the Mobley.

He said the original furniture from the lobby and from the bridal suite has been given to the project and will be restored.

The next step is to draw out the details for the exterior and interior of the Mobley along with the specifications. Plans which have already been approved, along with an estimated cost, will be presented to the Hilton foundation sometime in February. He explained the cost would have to be estimated because in architecture there could be some unforeseen complications.

He said he hopes to call for bids sometime in May for the actual work to begin. He emphasized that he hopes to be able to offer some call of tenders to local companies stating he would "like to keep the money here."

The interior of the building is to be completely gutted and replaced by a steel and concrete structure which will be totally self-supporting.

The plans for the project call for a terrace to be added to the back of the building at the second floor level in the space between the two wings of the building. This terrace will serve two functions: (1) To act as a roof for a multifunction room in the space below the terrace with an access from the outside. This room could be used by the citizens of Cisco for meetings, etc.; (2) The terrace itself would also be for public use, as well as functioning as a type of roof garden for the museum's curator.

building's The curator will have a two-story apartment in the west wing of the building, the one facing Avenue D, with an ample living room, dining room and kitchen on the lower level. The upper level bedrooms with walk-in closets and a large family room which may also double as a study. His apartment will give him a private entrance with direct access to each level of

the Mobley. The west wing, in addition to the curator's apartment, will also be the academic wing containing the archives and reading room, as well as a viewing room for audio-visual equipment such as films and slides. Among many offers to cooperate and help, Dr. Petrini stated they have accepted the offer of Bell Telephone Company for an exhibition of the history of the telephone from the beginning through the future. He said the ed at as it has been used in the hotel industry, not the telephone as used in the home, "if there is a difference."

The east wing will be fully dedicated to the life of Conrad Hilton and the industry he created: the Hilton

One section of the exhibition area, or museum, on the second floor will be dedicated to the City of Cisco. It is envisioned by Dr. Petrini as a possible rotating exhibit, perhaps

photographic exhibit of the history of Cisco, a documentary of the history of various families or industries in Cisco, or a productoriented exhibit showing artifacts which "were produced in Cisco, which are produced in Cisco, which will be produced in Cisco. Also located on the

second floor, Dr. Petrini stated, "We have designed what we believe to be a first. We have dedicated six rooms to trace the history of the hotel bedroom through the ages of American history." Starting with the year 1750, a typical room of the stagecoach era will be depicted. It will be followed by a room in 1850 to show the grandeur of Victorian hotels. The beginning of the Hilton Hotel industry in the 1920's will be shown by a room depicting a typical bridal suite of the Mobley Hotel using the restored, original furniture. A room from

telephone is being look- 1946 will also be shown when the Hilton became a corporation, followed by a room of the contemporary Hilton in 1982.

Dr. Petrini stated the last exposition will be "what we think a room of the Hilton will look in the year 2500. It will be a projection into the future, it will be very imaginary; perhaps, in a way unrealistic. But based on the research we are carrying with the futurists, those are the people like Walt Disney, Hanna Berry and other people which project the designs of the future, and electronic geniuses like Carl Kleiner here which is consulting with us, we are going to try and show people what a room in the year 2500 might look like based on our technological and socialogical advances of today. And that room, believe me, is fun for us because we




ISD Request Exemptions

The exemption is \$5000 off of the full value of your resident homestead with an additional \$10,000 granted to those who are over 65 years of age or disabled.

Cattlemen planning to vote must register first at the local county Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCS) office from Jan. 28 to Feb. 6. The rules provide for one vote for each separate cattle business entity, be it an individual, family business, partnership or corporation. Absentee registeration and voting will be permitted.







Cabbage will be cheaper and more plentiful now than at any time of year. So it's a good time to plan on using this nutritous vegetable. When shopping for cabbage look for firm and heavy for its size.

Large head green cabbage 3 cups water

1 cup brown rice pound ground beef





Dried Food Facts One pound of dried fruit equals dark place. Dried foods are great for eating right out of your hand they can be used in cooking. They rehydrate if dried properly.

Food Drying

Successful food drying depends upon having enough heat to draw out moisture - but not enough to cook the food. There should also be enough dry air on hand to absorb the released moisture plus enough air circulation to carry the moisture off.

Deterioration

All dried foods deteriorate to some extent during storage throughout a range from six months to a year, depending on the kind of food. To keep nutritional losses to a minimum, vegetables and fruits (especially carrots, onions, and cabbage) should be consumed within a reasonable length of time.
