Mrs. Stroebel became administrator on Friday, February 1, the same day Medical Management Systems, Inc., became owners of the Center. Mrs. Stroebel has served 12 years in the past, as administrator of Cisco Nursing Center.

Mrs. Stroebel began her duties at Cisco Nursing Center as assistant administrator in charge of Nursing in 1967, and continued this position until 1969, at which time she accepted the position as administrator until December 18, 1978.

Cisco Blood Drive Is Rescheduled For Wed.

Due to unfavorable weather conditions, the third bi-monthly Cisco Blood Drive has been rescheduled for Wednesday, February 6, weather permitting, at E.L. Graham Memorial Hospital. A team of trained laboratory technicians from Mary Meek Blood Bank of Abilene will again be present from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

The joint organized project of the Cisco Civic League and the Cisco Service Club has received outstanding response from Cisco citizens and CJC students in the first two Blood Drives. A total of 69 units were donated at the September 12 drive, with another 45 units credited to Cisco from the Cisco Junior College November 14 Blood Drive.

The February 6 Blood Drive will be the first one of 1980, and

even greater participation is anticipated. It cannot be emphasized enough, that in order to maintain Cisco's adequate blood supply and repay the long-time debt, that each Cisco citizen's every effort is mandatory--either by their participation or help in "soliciting" eligible blood donors.

Up until the past two Blood Drives, Cisco has been in debt to Mary Meek Blood Bank, 900 units of blood. And though 114 units have been generously offered in only two drives, everyone must realize that a great part of that blood is used to maintain Cisco's average need of 40 pints every two months. To maintain this blood supply and repay its present debt, the Blood Drive Committee has set its goal to collect 60 pints of blood every two months.

Striving to find the most effective means of conducting a successful Blood Drive, the Blood Drive Committee will be trying several approaches in the drives. Due to some impossibilities of time scheduling every willing donor, appointment times will not be made for the February 6 Blood Drive.

A blood insurance policy is available for those interested donors, whereby for a pint of blood given, that donor's immediate family will be insured for having blood available to them for one full year. That donated pint of blood, however, will not count toward credit for Cisco, but for those persons interested in the insurance policy, perhaps at a later date, the donor can donate another pint of blood for credit Cisco needs. There are no longer paid donors, due to FDA regulations, except in the cases of institutions, using only the plasma from a pint

The public is invited to hear Mr. Barnhill speak.

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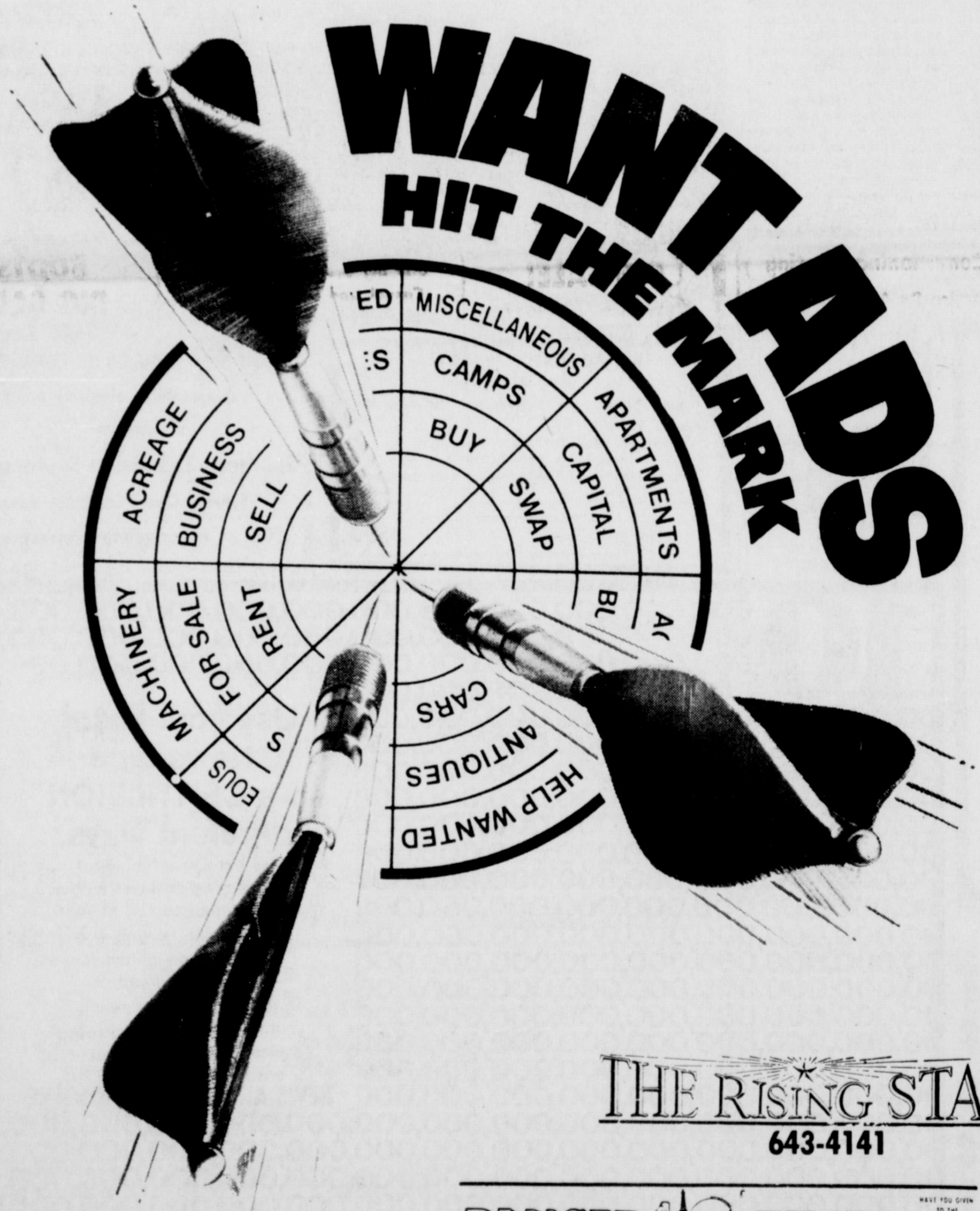

It's gardening time again and many home gardens in Eastland County are getting a good start. We have noticed a lot of people have already set out onion plants.

Some are thinking about weed control. We have had several requests this last week concerning chemical herbicides that may be used effectively in the garden.

Weed control in the home garden depends on garden size, kinds of vegetables being grown, and types of weeds.

Weeds (any unwanted plants) compete with vegetables for soil moisture and nutrients. They have extensive root systems and flourish under a variety of conditions.

Effective control of weeds depends on how they spread. Crabgrass and other annual weeds survive by seeds. Perennial weeds such as bermuda grass and johnson grass survive both by seed and underground plant parts.

Seeds are transmitted by

wind, water or animals. They may also reach the garden in improperly prepared compost manure or other organic matter added to the soil.

Some weed seeds remain viable in the soil for years. They and underground storage parts contain stored food reserves to support weed seedlings until they emerge or are exposed to sunlight.

Herbicides or chemical weed killers are the least desirable home garden weed control. While they are a necessity in commercial crop production to reduce labor and achieve maximum yield, there are not enough chemicals with a wide enough margin of error to be used safely and successfully in home gardens. Also, most herbicides are effective on specific weeds in specific crops, and most gardens contain a variety of vegetables. Furthermore, herbicides are expensive; a garden can cost \$70 or more.

Homemaker's Tips

The Eastland County Extension Homemaker's Council will meet Wednesday, February 6 at 2 p.m. in the Eastland Production Credit Association meeting room.

The best method is "hoeicide" or using a sharp hoe. Most gardens are small enough to be weeded with a hoe or by hand pulling. This is more effective when done regularly and when weeds are small.

Mulching makes weed control easier. A three inch mulch layer (after it settles) controls annual weeds from seed and preventing many weed seedlings from reaching light. Also, those that do push through are easier to pull.

Several types of mulches can be used. Grass clippings work well, but make sure they do not include weed seeds. Paper can also be used effectively. Black plastic is effective except against nutgrass which readily penetrates it. Clear plastic is ineffective since it allows light to reach soil.

Planning garden crops so as to avoid excessive space between plants also helps control weeds. Open areas readily become infested with weeds.

Good management, prior planning and a little hard work all add up to an effective weed control program. The fewer the weeds, the better the yield!

Don't forget the beef cattle short course being conducted at Cisco Junior College. The first session was held last Monday night. A second session covering beef cattle nutrition will be at 7:00 p.m. Monday, February 4 at the Agriculture building. A third session will be Monday night, February 11 at the same place. Forage management will be discussed the last session.

Following the Council business meeting there will be an election of voting delegates to represent Eastland County at the District 8 Extension Homemakers Association Spring Convention. The district convention is scheduled for April 1 in Breckenridge.

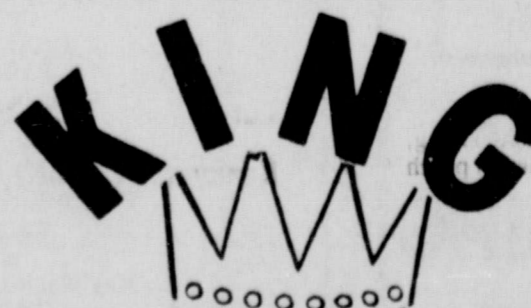

American Colleges and Universities. He received a bachelor of arts degree in 1967 and earned a degree from The University of Texas School of Law in 1970.

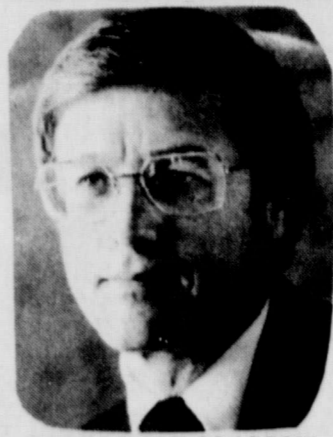
Glasgow served as administrative assistant to Governor Preston Smith until December 1970 when he returned to Stephenville to open the law firm of Glasgow and Jones.

Connie Rosson is the new Assistant County Supervisor working with Supervisor Jack Phillips of the Farm and Home Administration office

in Eastland that serves Eastland, Stephens and Callahan counties.

After working for the FmHA in Beatrice, Nebraska for two and one half years checking buildings and construction in the housing program to see that quality standards were maintained, she will be working here with both the housing program and the farm program.

The FmHA has a limited amount of money available for ownership, operating, emergency, and disaster loans in the farm program, with very little money expected to be available in the future for ownership. Available funds are expected to be mostly for operating and disaster loans, according to Mrs. Rosson.

Applications are being accepted for the farm program loans from those who

meet the requirements and standards, which include income level of the applicant and the lack of available funds from other sources. Even if adequate funds are not available to meet an applicant's needs at present, an application will place that person on a waiting list for future funds when they are made available.

Housing loans under the housing program are also processed by the local staff, which now consists of three permanent employees and one temporary employee. There had been two permanent and two temporary employees previously.

Rita Wilson is the third permanent employee.

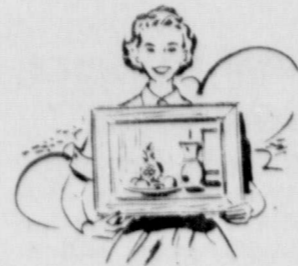

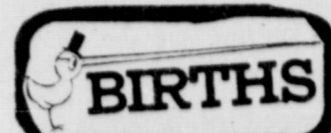

The fourth grade classes of Cisco Intermediate School were recently given an

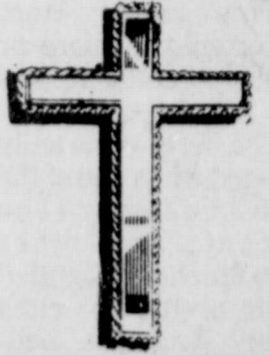
informative program on the subject of "Conservation" by Tony Taylor from the Eastland Field Office of Upper Leon Soil Conservation District.

H.T. Wagley, 67, of Moran, died early Thursday morning when flames engulfed the two room tin building in Putnam he was staying in. Justice of the Peace Ida Mae Waddell ruled the death was accidental.

Mr. Wagley had apparently been living in what was once the Hilltop Liquor Store reportedly to more or less protect the property.

It took 4,000 gallons of water to bring the fire under control about 9:15 a.m., nearly 45 minutes after the call went out.

Graveside services for H.T. Wagley, 67, of Moran, were at 3 p.m. Saturday in Dennis Cemetery in Moran, directed by Godfrey Funeral Home. The Rev. M.H. Jones of the Calvary Baptist Church in Eastland officiated.

He was born December 22, 1912, in Callahan County. He had lived in that area most of his life. He married Wylor Dean McDowell in Bradenton, Fla., in 1948. He served in the U.S. Merchant Marine during World War II. The couple moved back to Callahan County after the war.

He was a retired rancher and had worked most of his life in the oil business.

Continued From Front Page of blood, so it therefore depends on voluntary blood donations.

Blood donors should be aware of the following when preparing to give blood:

A. All donors must be age 18 or older; there is no age limit, only that each donor is healthfully able to give blood.

B. Blood donors should eat normally, and are encouraged to do so before giving

blood.

C. No medication should be taken 18 hours prior to donating blood.

D. No medication, however, should be deleted without checking with the prospective donor's own doctor.

E. Any person who has been sick or has had a cold within the last seven days prior to donating blood, should not donate blood.

F. Any person who

has had their ears pierced within the last six months at any place other than a doctor's office, should not donate blood.

G. Any person who has been in Southeast Asia in the last three years should not donate blood, due to malaria possibilities.

H. Any woman who has menstruated in the last three to four days prior to donating blood, should not donate.

I. No woman who is pregnant, or suspects she is so, should give blood, and should not do so until six weeks after pregnancy.

J. Persons can donate blood every two to three months, with no foreseen problems, although, it is hopeful to not have to call on the same donors nearly this often.

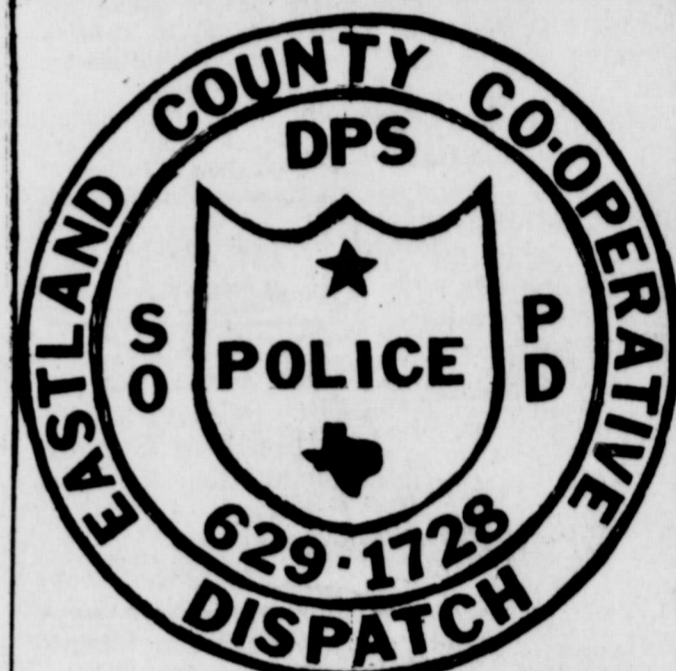
