Girl Scouts will be knocking on doors from February 22 through March 1 to give their cookies customers a chance to stock up on a year's supply of Girl Scout cookies at a real bargain price.

Girl Scout council executive director. Donna Fincher of Brownwood points out that the local cookie sale price has not been raised since 1976 in spite of the fact that inflation has forced the girls to pay sixteen percent more to the baker for the cookies they sell.

"The annual cookie sale has been helping Girl Scouts earn their own way for many years," Miss Fincher said, "and we could not succeed without very loyal customers. We have kept our price at \$1.25 per box because we like to see our partners in success get a good product for a fair price.'

"Even for those of us who have worked with Girl Scout cookie sales for many years, each year's sale is a kind of miracle," Miss Fin-cher said. "The money earned by the girls does so much good that we can't ignore the dollar value, but there are many other benefits that have equal value."

"The cookie sale is an excellent educational program. Girls learn good salesmanship and that helps develop selfconfidence, poise and tact. Girls must learn to make change, keep records and be responsible for their inventory. Above all, girls learn the cost of things in terms of the labor required to earn special opportunities, and they develop a sense of pride in earning their own way," Miss Fincher said.

The annual cookie sale allows Girl Scouts to help earn their own way for year around troop activities, for a variety of camping programs, for membership development and program ser-


vices. Rather than asking the public to contribute

money to help pay for tents and canoes and camping other facilities, the girls earn the opportunity for camp fun with cookie sale profits. Individual fees which girls pay to attend Girl Scout camp can be held to the absolute minimum for food and other direct costs since the camp and its faciliites are paid for from cookie sale profits. Minimum directcost fees make it possible for more girls to participate in the program.

Girl Scout troops earn a commission on sales which finances year around activities and defrays costs for individuals. Each girl earns a bonus which she may use to pay her own way for a variety of program opportunities.

Orders for Girl Scout cookies may be placed with any Girl Scout from February 22 to March 1. Cookies will be delivered to customers from March 21 to March 29. The Girl Scouts want all their customers to know that cookies should not be paid for until delivery is made. Payment is not to be made at the time cookies are ordered.





National Society Daughters of the American Revolution, designated February as American History Month. Members of Charles Crawford Chapter. DAR, wish to pay tribute to Ethelia Harrell (Mrs. F.E.), founder of the chapter. Mrs. Harrell died June 21,

1979. She had been a dedicated worker in the organization for more than fifty years. Mrs. Harrell came to Cisco in 1911, and organized the chapter May 16, 1927. She was also a member of Colonial Dames. The chapter was named for one of her eleven listed Revolutionary ancestors, Charles Crawford of Virginia. He was taken prisoner at the siege of Savannah. Mrs. Harrell supported education, one of the prime purposes of DAR. Through her influence, Cisco Junior College has received substantial financial contributions. Her husband, F.E. Harrell, managed one of several Rockwell Brothers Lumber yards. The **Rockwell Brothers Founda**tion has given more than \$400,000 to Cisco Junior Col-

lege Mrs. Harrell was also a civic and cultural leader. She was honored at a Cisco Chamber of Commerce banquet shortly before her last illness. Charles Crawford



1980 CROP PEANUT SUPPORT LEVELS AND SALES POLICY ANNOUNCED

Washington--National average support levels of \$455.00 per short ton for 1980 crop quota peanuts and \$250.00 per short ton for 1980 crop additional peanuts have been announced by Secretary of Agriculture Bob Bergland.



The exception to this policy is that sales of additional peanuts for domestic edible use, if sold and paid for during the harvest season at tional peanuts for domestic the time of delivery by the producer, will be made at no less than 100 percent of the quota loan value, plus costs. Farmers stock peanuts will be sold by CCC for edible export at no less than \$455. per ton, plus costs, for quota peanuts and no less than \$435. per ton for additional

edible use, including use for

peanuts. On export sales of 1980 crop peanuts sold for crushing only, the CCC sales price will be at no less than \$250. per ton plus costs, for additional peanuts. Peanuts sold for export crushing must be fragmented before export. Sales of quota and additional 1980 crop peanuts for domestic crushing only will be made by CCC at competitive prices. Use of oil produced from these peanuts will be restricted to domestic markets if the price of peanuts from which the oil is produced is less than the applicable \$455. or \$250. per ton loan rate, plus costs.
