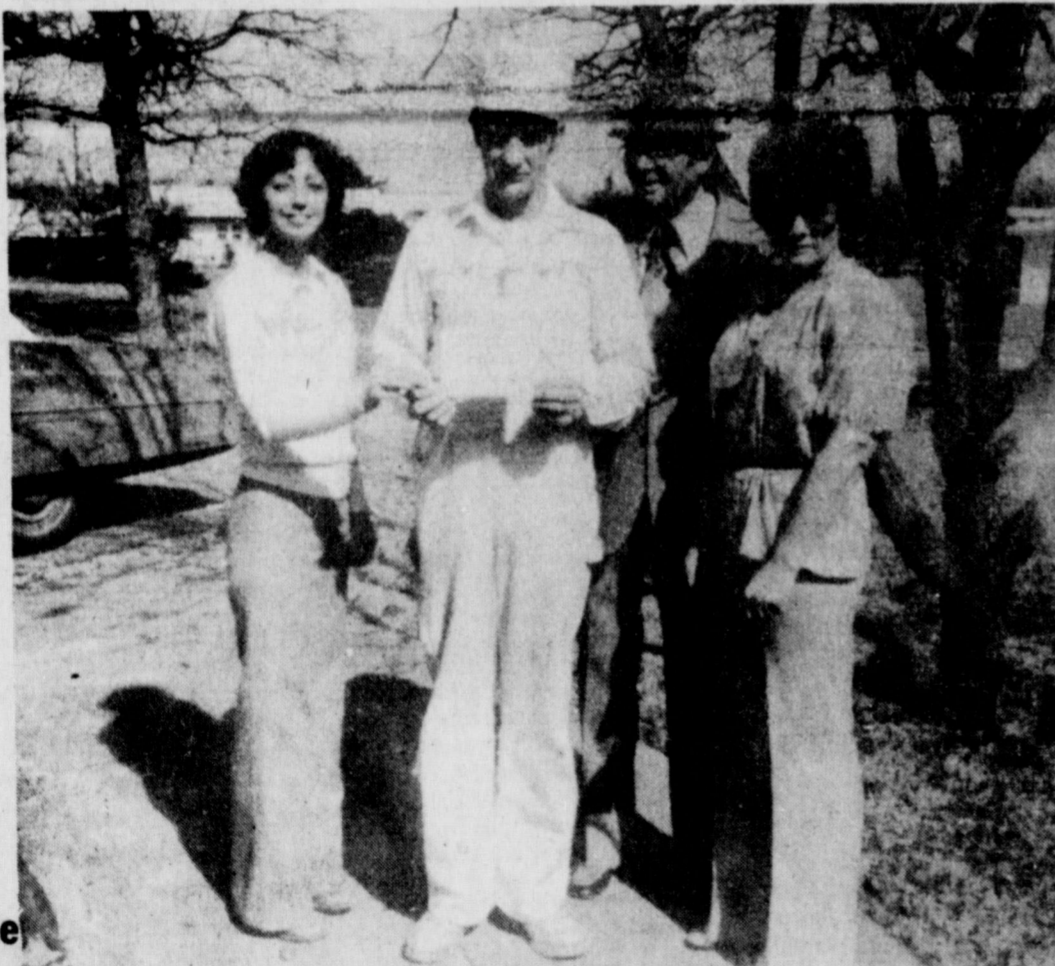
Pastor Dell J. Crockett, pastor of the church, stated, "Children are like banks where we

Election Of Directors For Cisco Hospital District To Be Held April 5

Election of directors for Cisco Hospital District will be on Saturday, April 5, 1980, along with other elections set for that date. Mr. Doug Fry has been named election judge. Mr. Fry will name his alternate and arrange for clerks to assist him.

Virginia Parker, Fran Davidson and Ramona Nichols have been named as absentee voting clerks. March 17th is the first day for absentee voting by personal appearance at Cisco City Hall and April 1st is the last day.

The Cisco Hospital District consists of County Commissioners' Precinct 4 and voting Precinct 8. It is a five member board

with three (3) directors to be elected this year for a two (2) year term. Incumbents are Lloyd McGrew, Emma Lee Donovan and Ayres R. Cermin, M.D. Hold over directors are Armo Chambers and Jay Richardson.

Legislation creating and establishing the hospital district states that any person desiring his name to be printed on the ballot as a candidate for director shall file a petition, signed by not less than twenty-five (25) qualified voters asking that such name be printed on the ballot, with the secretary of the Board of Directors of the district. The petition may be filed with Ayres R. Cermin, M.D., secretary, or with Garner Altom, administrator, at the administrative offices at the hospital. Deadline for filing the petition is 5:00 p.m. Wednesday, March 5, 1980.

Those persons whose names are to be placed on the ballot will meet in the conference room at the hospital at 10:00 a.m. Thursday, March 6, 1980, for the drawing of names for order on the ballot.

Girl Scouts To Sell Cookies

Girl Scouts will be knocking on doors from February 22 through March 1 to give their cookies customers a chance to stock up on a year's supply of Girl Scout cookies at a real bargain price.

Girl Scout council executive director Donna Fincher of Brownwood points out that the local cookie sale price has not been raised since 1976 in spite of the fact that inflation has forced the girls to pay sixteen percent more to the baker for the cookies they sell.

"The annual cookie sale has been helping Girl Scouts earn their own way for many years," Miss Fincher said, "and we could not succeed without very loyal customers. We have kept our price at \$1.25 per box because we like to see our partners in success get a good product for a fair price."

The Cisco AARP Chapter 2447 will hold their regular monthly meeting and covered dish supper at the Corral Room Thursday, February 21, at 6:00 p.m.

The featured speaker will be a representative of its insurance company who will answer any questions.

This year Girl Scouts have set their sales goal at a record level. One hundred thousand boxes of cookies are expected to be sold in the council's 19-county jurisdiction.

"Even for those of us who have worked with Girl Scout cookie sales for many years, each year's sale is a kind of miracle," Miss Fincher said. "The money earned by the girls does so much good that we can't ignore the dollar value, but there are many other benefits that have equal value."

"The cookie sale is an excellent educational program. Girls learn good salesmanship and that helps develop self-confidence, poise and tact. Girls must learn to make change, keep records and be responsible for their inventory. Above all, girls learn the cost of things in terms of the labor required to earn special opportunities, and they develop a sense of pride in earning their own way," Miss Fincher said.

The annual cookie sale allows Girl Scouts to help earn their own way for year around troop activities, for a variety of camping programs, for membership development and program services.

Rather than asking the public to contribute

money to help pay for tents and canoes and other camping facilities, the girls earn the opportunity for camp fun with cookie sale profits. Individual fees which girls pay to attend Girl Scout camp can be held to the absolute minimum for food and other direct costs since the camp and its facilities are paid for from cookie sale profits. Minimum direct-cost fees make it possible for more girls to participate in the program.

Girl Scout troops earn a commission on sales which finances year around activities and defrays costs for individuals. Each girl earns a bonus which she may use to pay her own way for a variety of program opportunities.

Orders for Girl Scout cookies may be placed with any Girl Scout from February 22 to March 1. Cookies will be delivered to customers from March 21 to March 29. The Girl Scouts want all their customers to know that cookies should not be paid for until delivery is made. Payment is not to be made at the time cookies are ordered.

to climb the mountain moved slower and slower; but as it steadily moved it continued to say, "I think I can, I think I can." It climbed the mountain.

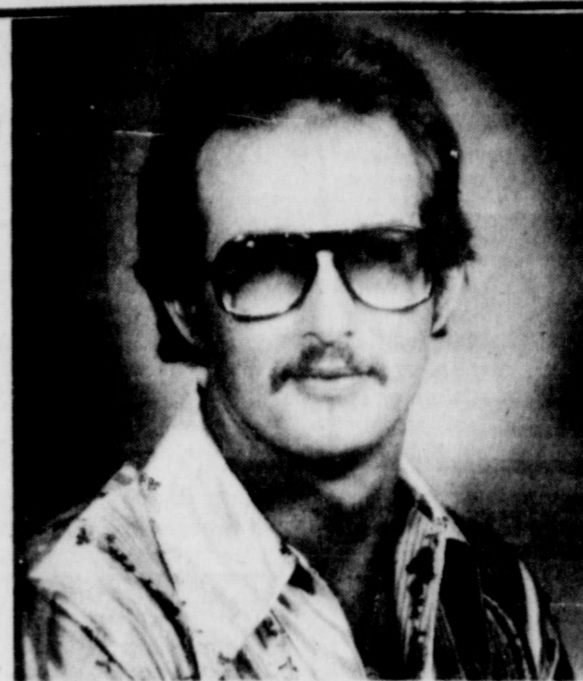
You may fail at times and stumble but Jesus' hands are always there to help you up again. You can finish your course victoriously as you continually look to the compassionate, understanding Savior.

1980 Peanut Crop

1980 CROP PEANUT SUPPORT LEVELS AND SALES POLICY ANNOUNCED

Washington-National average support levels of \$455.00 per short ton for 1980 crop quota peanuts and \$250.00 per short ton for 1980 crop additional peanuts have been announced by Secretary of Agriculture Bob Bergland.

\$35. above the 1979 level of \$420. per ton, Bergland said. Bergland said the increase in the quota support price is due to rising production costs. The additional support level is based on estimated demand for peanut oil and meal and on export demand, he said. Bergland said it was necessary to lower the support level for additional peanuts by \$50. per ton from

the 1979 level of \$300. per ton because USDA expects 1980 peanut oil and meal prices to be somewhat lower. Quota peanuts are those grown within the poundage quota established for the 1980 marketing year. Additional peanuts for the 1980 marketing year are those grown in excess of quota, but produced on allotted acreage. Sales of quota and additional peanuts for domestic

edible use, including use for seed, will be made by CCC at not less than 105 percent of the quota loan rate, plus costs, if sold on or before December 31, or 107 percent of the quota loan value plus costs if sold after that date. The exception to this policy is that sales of additional peanuts for domestic edible use, if sold and paid for during the harvest season at the time of delivery by the producer, will be made at no less than 100 percent of the quota loan value, plus costs. Farmers stock peanuts will be sold by CCC for edible export at no less than \$455. per ton, plus costs, for quota peanuts and no less than \$435. per ton for additional peanuts.

On export sales of 1980 crop peanuts sold for crushing only, the CCC sales price will be at no less than \$250. per ton plus costs, for additional peanuts. Peanuts sold for export crushing must be fragmented before export. Sales of quota and additional 1980 crop peanuts for domestic crushing only will be made by CCC at competitive prices. Use of oil produced from these peanuts will be restricted to domestic markets if the price of peanuts from which the oil is produced is less than the applicable \$455. or \$250. per ton loan rate, plus costs.

Fitzgerald said the current 25.2 cents per pound penalty for peanuts unintentionally overmarketed may be reduced to 2.1 cents per pound for the 1978 crop and to 4.2 cents per pound for the 1979 crop. The 25.2 cents per pound penalty will continue to be assessed producers

A change in the method of establishing peanut quotas for farmers who marketed less than the poundage quota for their farms was also

announced by Fitzgerald. Under the new regulation producers may not accumulate undermarketing credit but must use it the first year following the undermarketing, he said.

THERE'S A whole lot of history right here...a search through old records always turns up something worth sharing...from deep within the safe comes an accident report to the State Industrial Accident Board, filed by the

Ranger Times in December of 1925. It seems an employee, W.P. Cochran, age 60, was injured in the line of duty. He was a reporter and his salary was \$35. a week.

DID YOU KNOW that felt hats can be cleaned by rubbing them with nylon net

DID YOU KNOW that Bill Hart has practiced law for 29 years...he has! [Pd. Pol. Adv.]

But let the report tell it: "He was reporting football game of Cisco-Amarillo at Cisco and with many others was sitting on the ground when the Cisco-Amarillo boys ran across the line and into the crowd, and several football players fell on him." First: yes, teams around here used to play schools of

various sizes all over the state. Second: first rule of covering football is "stay out of the way." It really wasn't funny. "Both bones of left leg fractured about two or three inches above the ankle." The form asked: "State probable period of disability..." The answer: "Can't say, he is in hospital now." And yes, they used to play in the daytime: this accident happened at 5 p.m.

SINGLE APPRAISAL DISTRICTS DISCUSSED
Creation of single appraisal districts in many counties across Texas provides one of the greatest opportunities facing local government in the 1980s, according to the executive director of the School Tax Assessment Practices Board. Ken Graeber of Austin,

speaking at the recent County Judges and Commissioners Conference here, briefed officials on the recent revision of the property tax system established by the state legislature. "The most far-reaching revision (of the new tax code) is the establishment of a single appraisal district for each county to be responsible for listing and appraising taxable property," he said. The district is governed by a board of directors elected by governing bodies of local taxing jurisdictions, he said. The district appraises taxable property for all taxing purposes. This eliminates the necessity of having a separate tax appraisal for the school district, the water district, the county and others. Graeber noted two essential elements for establishing a successful system. The first is mutual support by all taxing jurisdictions for proper tax administration. The second element is effective management and competent professionals in property valuation. "State funding will be extremely small, with each district receiving approximately \$2,800 in early May of this year," Graeber explained. "Remaining state funds will be distributed based upon real parcel accounts in each county around the middle of the year." Participation by counties in the single appraisal district

program was made optional, but 213 counties have chosen to join, said Graeber. The State Property Tax Board was created as of Jan. 1, 1980, to assist local taxing

Applications For August Class Of CJC Nursing Program Being Accepted

Applications for admission to the August 1980, class of the Cisco Junior College Vocational Nursing program on the main campus in Cisco are now being accepted, according to Technical-Vocational Dean, Gerald Bint, and the program instructor, Mrs. Veneta Mitchell.

Plans are underway to begin pre-testing applicants in March, so those desiring to take advantage of this program should make application as soon as

possible. This twelve month program will hold classes on the campus with clinical work to be done, on a rotating basis, in the E.L. Graham Memorial Hospital in Cisco and the Eastland Memorial Hospital in Eastland.

Satisfactory completion of the program entitles the student to a graduation certificate from the school and to take the State Board Examination. Upon successful completion of the state board examination, the graduate will receive a Licensed Vocational Nurse Certificate.

A prospective student must be at least 17 years of age, and in good physical and mental health. Students must be a high school graduate or furnish a GED establishing high school equivalency.

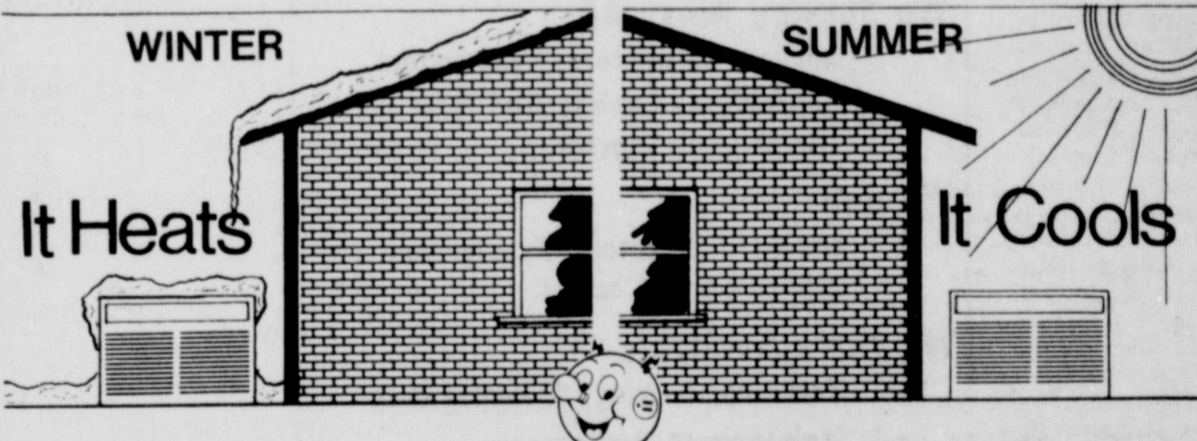
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People Things

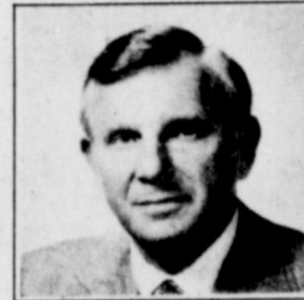

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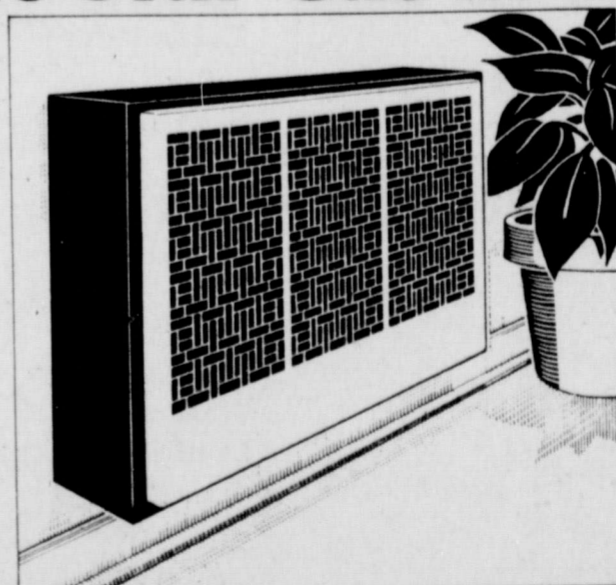
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Direct vent heaters require only an outside wall through which concentric tubes vent the products of combustion and allow air to enter for support of combustion. Heated room air is not vented to the outside.

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
