John Morren Issues Formal Statement

Sheriff Johnnie W. Morren, a native of Eastland County, is seeking election to the office of sheriff. He is a certified Peace Officer and because of his excellent qualifications and experienced knowledge of law enforcement, he was appointed in July 1979 to serve the remaining term as sheriff of Eastland County.

Sheriff Morren served with the Eastland Police Department for 12 years, the last 10 of these in the capacity of Chief of Police. While serving with the Eastland Police Department, Sheriff Morren was closely associated in working with youth, and he will continue in that capacity as Sheriff of Eastland County.

Sheriff Morren entered military service in Sept. 1941, served in Europe during World War II, landing on Omaha Beach D-Day plus 6, 1944, served with the United Nations Forces in Japan and Korea in 1951-1952.

He was awarded numerous medals including the Presidential Citation, 4 Air Force Commendation Medals, European Service Medal with 7 campaign stars, United Nations Medal, Korean Service Medal, Army of Occupation Medal and others.

Sheriff Morren is married to the former Bounita Kinman and is the father of 3 children: David of Rt. 2 Cisco, Tom, attending Howard Payne University, and Pamela, a senior at Eastland High School.

The Morrins are members of Bethel Baptist Church. Sheriff Morren is also a member of the Mens Christian Fellowship Bible Class and is a past president.

Since returning to Eastland County in 1967, Sheriff Morren has been the recipient of numerous awards which include: "Outstanding Lawman of the Year" awarded by Veterans Foreign Wars Post No. 4136, an award for "Outstanding Contributions to Eastland County Law Enforcement Association", "Golden



Deeds Award" by the Eastland Chamber of Commerce, and most recently "Outstanding Lawman of the Year" awarded by the Eastland County Newspapers. Sheriff Morren was elected and served 6 years on the Board of Trustees of the Eastland Independent School District with 3 years as Vice President. He is a member of the Eastland Chamber of Commerce and is currently serving on the Board of Directors. He is a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars and a past Commander of Post No. 4136. Sheriff Morren is a charter member and past president of the Eastland County Law Enforcement Association.

Do Not Mail Census Forms Until April 1

Don't mail back your 1980 census form until April 1! Manager Billy Yarbrough of the census district office, says that, although they are accepting the questionnaires which are being mailed back, the Census Bureau wanted them filled out and mailed back on April 1. That is Census Day, the day of the official count of the U.S. population. It is important that every questionnaire list all persons living in the household on that day, that it does not list anyone who moved away or died a day or so before, but does include anyone who just moved in or a baby born on that day.

"Enumerators are still making their calls, dropping off a questionnaire at each household," the manager said, "so it may be that you have not received yours yet,

but enumerators should complete their calls within another week."

The manager suggests that filling out the questionnaire be made a family project, with everyone supplying the correct information about himself or herself, adding a word of caution: "Don't pick up a pencil and start marking until you have read the yellow instruction guide carefully. And be sure to use a pencil, so if you make a mistake, you can easily erase it."

The manager called attention to the telephone assistance number printed on the address label. The number is to be called if help is needed in answering some questions or if a questionnaire in Spanish or other language help is wanted. The number is 800-592-4477.

The annual Cisco Art Show will be held April 10, 11 and 12, in the Corral Room. The show is open to all area artists and accommodates all styles and media, as well as categories including children and adults. There will be a \$1.00 charge for each adult entry and no charge for children and youth.

The show will be divided into the following classes: Children: Pre-school through 4th grade; Youth: 5th grade through 12th; Adult: Novice, Amateur and Professional. Number of entries will be limited to 5 from each exhibitor and are to be provided with hardware for

hanging. There is no restriction on subject matter, but the picture is to be original and not entered in this show before.

Applications For CJC's Vocational Nursing Program Are Now Being Accepted

Applications for admission to the August 1980, class of the Cisco Junior College Vocational Nursing program on the main campus in Cisco are now being accepted, according to Technical-Vocational Dean, Gerald Bint, and the program instructor, Mrs. Veneta Mitchell.

Plans are underway to begin pre-testing applicants in March, so those desiring to take advantage of this program should make application as soon as possible.

This twelve month program will hold classes on the campus with clinical work to be done, on a rotating basis, in the E.L. Graham Memorial Hospital in Cisco and the Eastland Memorial Hospital in Eastland.

Satisfactory completion of the program entitles the student to a graduation certificate from the school and to take the State Board Examination. Upon successful completion of the state board examination, the graduate will receive a Licensed Vocational Nurse Certificate.

A prospective student must be at least 17 years of age, and in good physical and mental health. Students must be a high school graduate or furnish a GED establishing high school equivalency.

Mr. de la Renta has donated his talent to design brand new uniforms which provide contemporary style while maintaining the classic Scout look that is part of the American tradition. As the designer of a full line of clothing for men in addition to the high fashion women's wear which has brought him great acclaim, de la Renta knew how to meet the challenge presented by the Boy Scouts of America. "We felt the uniform should meet several criteria," he said. "It should be suitable for strenuous activity; it should be made from an easy care fabric; and at the same time the wearer should still look like a Scout."

A textbook, "Typing For The Physically Handicapped", published by Gregg Division / McGraw-Hill Book Co., can be used in conjunction with any standard beginning typing text. It contains keyboard presentation charts and drill lines for all possible combinations of missing fingers, as well as charts and drills for persons who must use a head pointer or mouth stick. The charts and drill lines can be reproduced for classroom use.

The text is expensive, but still cheaper than buying a special typewriter. Another advantage is that the person trained with this system is capable of using any electric typewriter he/she may happen to come across.—Mr. J.D.P., Special Education Co-operative Diagnostic-Instructional Center, Indiana

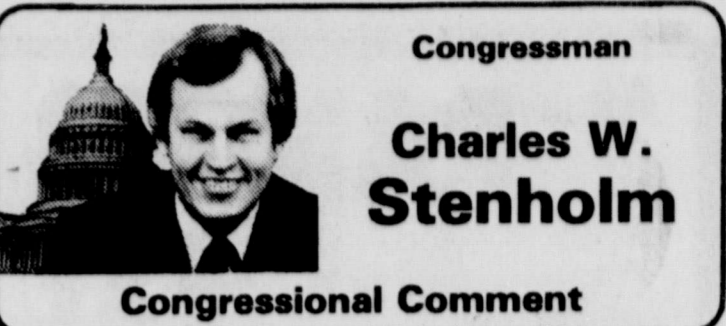

WASHINGTON, D.C. — There is no way that anyone can say AAM has failed in their objectives. Members of AAM have made great strides since their beginnings in 1977 and have learned, the hard way, how to become politically effective. They have learned a lot about how to "sell" agriculture, not just as a commodity, but as a political viewpoint and vital concern not only for rural areas, but for the nation as a whole.

The problems faced by our farmers are ones that should be shared with the rest of the population, for as a "food problem" it effects all of us. There is no doubt that these problems are real, especially when one compares returns on equity in agriculture and other industries in this country. In 1977, that return was 3.5 percent; 1978 it rose to 4.6 percent and stayed at that figure during 1979. Compare those figures with the 17 percent return to manufacturing corporations, 13 to 23 percent to oil companies and some 11.7 percent to textile manufacturers.

Even with improved prices, there are still long-range problems to be faced. In particular, the problem of ever increasing costs for fuel and other production inputs is squeezing the American farmer hard. Last year diesel fuel prices increased 99 percent and gasoline prices increased 60 percent. And increases in 1980 are expected to be even larger. Fertilizer prices, after a few years of relative stability, are climbing steadily upward.

That is the story farmers have been telling their congressmen and the public in Washington this week. That is the story that they must continue to tell. It is well past the time that Washington and every consumer in this country realized one fact: There is no such thing as a free lunch. And it's time the American farmer stopped picking up the ticket.

USDA is predicting a U.S. total in the mid \$20 billion range, a drop of some \$13 billion.

At this point, many might question the effectiveness of AAM during their brief history and wonder if the continuing trips to Washington have been worth the time, expense and effort.

Horse Seminar At A & M

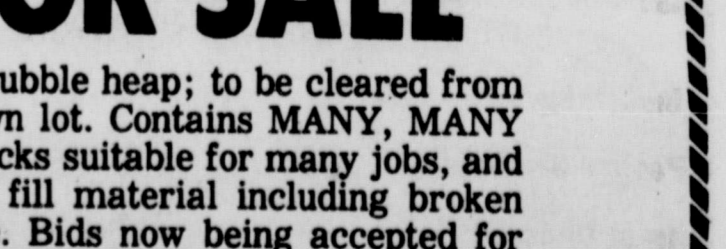

Tuesday afternoon, Tommy and Chris Manion will give a demonstration on "Training Horses for Versatility". Manion is nationally recognized for his success over the past 10 years in exhibiting horses in halter and a variety of performance classes at such shows as the All American Quarter Horse Congress and World Quarter Horse Show. Manion will specifically discuss western pleasure, reining, hunt seat pleasure and barrel racing. A "versatility class" demonstration will also be given.

Some production topics to be covered Monday and Tuesday mornings include: "Recent Advances in Broodmare Management", "Current Status of Reproductive Diseases in Horses", "A Lesson on the Economics of Feeding Horses" and "How To Make Pastures Pay on Your Horse Farm". This year's keynote speaker is Dr. Bill Tyznik, Professor of Animal Science at The Ohio State University.

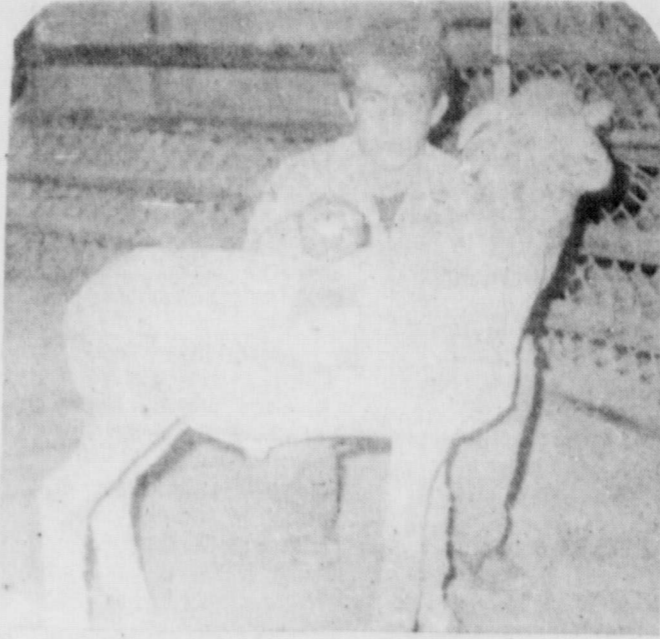

That said election shall be held at the following places in said district and the following named persons are hereby appointed officers for said election:

1. For Election Precincts Nos. 4 of Eastland County, Texas, at Corral Room- College Annex Building in Cisco, Texas, within said School District with Doug Fry as Presiding Judge and - as Alternate Presiding Judge and said Presiding Judge shall appoint the necessary clerks to assist him, which shall not exceed 8 clerks.

The polls at above designated polling places shall on election day be open from 7 o'clock a.m. to 7 o'clock p.m.

Steve Thomas is hereby appointed Clerk for absentee voting, and Jill Hollywood is hereby appointed Deputy Clerk for absentee voting. The absentee voting for the above designated election shall be held at School Tax Office, 610 Avenue D, Cisco, Texas, within the boundaries of the above named district and said place of absentee voting shall remain open for at least 8 hours on each day for absentee voting which is not a Saturday, a Sunday, or an official State holiday, beginning on the 20th day and continuing through the 4th day preceding the day of said election. Said election of voting shall remain open between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. on each day for said absentee voting. The above described place for absentee voting is also the absentee clerk's mailing address to which ballot applications and ballots voted by mail may be sent.

Any resident qualified elector of the district may have his or her name placed as a candidate on the official ballot for any of the positions to be filled at said above mentioned election by filing with the secretary of the board a signed written application not less than 30 nor more than 60 days prior to the date of the election and said application must state the number of the position for which he or she is a candidate or the name of the incumbent member of the board holding the position for which he or she desires to run. All candidates shall be resident qualified voters of the district.

This order shall serve as notice for said election and the president of the Board of Trustees is hereby authorized and instructed to cause a

copy of this combined election order and notice to be published one time in a newspaper of general circulation in the county where this school district is located. Said publication shall be not more than 25 days nor less than 10 days before the date of said election.

It is further found and determined that in accordance with the order of the Board of Trustees the Secretary posted written notice of the date, place and subject of this meeting on the bulletin board, located in the administrative office, a place convenient and readily accessible to the general public, and said notice, having been so posted, it remained posted continuously for at least 72 hours preceding the scheduled time of said meeting, and in addition the Secretary furnished a notice of this meeting to the County Clerk of the county in which most, if not all, of this District's pupils reside, and also gave notice by telephone or telegraph to all news media requesting such notice and consenting to pay any and all expenses incurred by District in providing special
