### A PERSONAL MESSAGE FROM JUDGE JIM R. WRIGHT:

It has been stated that the qualifications for Judge of the 91st District Court are experience, training, maturity, and integrity. I wholeheartedly agree. However, I believe that it is possible to achieve those qualifications at age 33 and that those qualifications are not achieved automatically by years alone. I have been fortunate in my career to work around and with some of the top lawyers and Judges in this State, and in the Federal Judiciary in both trial, administrative and appellate matters. I have had the type of extensive practice that qualifies me on all grounds to continue to serve you as your Judge, not only in maturity and integrity, but also in experience and training both as an attorney and now as District Judge.

Those of us who work in the 91st District Court have been engaged in an evaluation of every phase of the operation of the Court. This evaluation of every phase of the operation of the Court. This evaluation has as its goal the betterment of our judicial system in our county. One particular area in which we are working is in the area of probation. The appraisal in continuing and will result in a more comprehensive program of supervision and rehabilitation. I, too, feel that there are some cases in which probation is warranted. I, too, feel that those who are on probation should be supervised closely in accordance with the law. However, I also feel that a massive change in our probation program should be initiated only after clear thought and appraisal. I do not feel that just because the State of Texas offers financial and technical assistance that one should jump off the cliff of State aid blindly. We all know that more State control comes in the same package as State aid. Many of the State benefits are in danger of being cut off through legislation. Certainly we do not want to enter such a program until the full effects of this legislation are known. The program should be evaluated closely before being accepted, and a proper evaluation takes time. We are currently studying other probation departments and hope to take these studies as models in formulating our program. A program as vital as probation and rehabilitation should be studied closely, intelligently and with mature judgement. My concern for well supervised probation is one reason for my supervising the probation department personally, which I now do.

Ladies and gentlemen, I can and will make every department under the 91st District Court work successfully, if given the time and opportunity to do so. I ask you for your vote and your support in order that I can have the time and opportunity to continue to make your Court work for you.

Dr. Richardson To Spend Semester In Netherlands

RENO, Nev. (UNR)--Dr. James Richardson, son-in-law of Mrs. Perry T. Brown of Cisco, received a Fulbright Fellowship to spend the 1981 spring semester in the Netherlands.

Richardson, a University of Nevada-Reno sociology professor, will be at the University of Nijmegen to teach and supervise doctoral students in the psychology department who are doing research on new religious movements. He will also be adding to the store of his own research on that subject.

Richardson has specialized in new religious movements, and most recently did a study on the "People's Temple: A Corrective Critique and Comparison" to be published in the Journal for the Scientific Study of Religion.

He has authored four books, published over 40 articles in professional journals and presently nearly 20 papers at professional meetings primarily in the area of the sociology of religion.

This will make the tenth fellowship or grant awarded to Richardson and the third to send him abroad. ## Texas 4-Hers To Go To Japan

Thirteen 4-H members will represent the Texas 4-H program in the LABO International Exchange Program in Japan this summer.

They are Deann Davis, Karen Womack and Vanessa Power of Comanche, Susan Milstead of Nacogdoches, Lori Sue Brown of Overton, Gina Donovan of Diboll, Richard Reed of Snyder, James Fortin of Rio Hondo, Windsor Tanner of San Antonio, Robin White of Eastland, Ardie Hanath of Chappell Hill, Annette Flores of Stratford and Tori Hunt of Muleshoe.

The youth range in age from 13 to 18 and represent 10 Texas counties. They were selected on the basis of their 4-H experience, desire to learn about other cultures, and willingness to share their experience with others, points out Preston D. Sides, 4-H and youth specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas A.M. University System.

The LABO program has been active in the U.S. since 1973, and some 2,000 Japanese young people have visited various states in these years. Texas has been a participant in the program for the past two years and has received some 200 Japanese youth. However, 1980 will be the first year for Texas to send a 4-H delegation to Japan. LABO is a language learning experience where Japanese youth study the English

language for many years, e explains Sides. One of their learning experiences is to visit the U.S. and to spend a month living in an English-speaking environment with a host 4-H family. 4-Hers visiting Japan learn about the language and culture of the Japanese by spending a month with a host family.

The Texas delegation will depart from Dallas on July 21, arriving in Tokyo the following afternoon. 4-Hers will spend two days at the Olympic Village where they will go through a complete orientation before going to their host families. The 4-Hers will then spend four weeks with their hosts, living and working alongside family members. The delegates will depart Tokyo on Aug. 23, arriving in Dallas the following evening.

## Longhorn Press Publishes Book By Death-Row Inmate

"You Can Make Horeseman Clocks," a book written and illustrated by Billy G. Hughes, Jr., in his death row cell at the Texas Penitentiary, has just been published by the Longhorn Press.

The book, a 52-page paper back, is a complete "how-to-do-it" with plans and specifications with step-by-step instructions on the building of a wall clock. Details include a list of materials needed and where to find them.

A 28-year of Alabaman, Hughes has been in the penitentiary at Huntsville, Texas, since his conviction some four years ago in the death of a highway patrolman. He maintains his innocence and has repeatedly offered to take a lie detector test.

Hughes feels that his conviction and subsequent efforts for a higher court reversal were due largely to ineffective representation by a court-appointed attorney. A year ago,

other attorneys obtained a federal stay for Hughes a few hours before he was scheduled to die. A supreme court review of his case is now being sought.

In his prison cell, Hughes works 15 hours a day at his typewriter and drawing board to turn out cartoons and articles for (mostly horse magazines, publishing a stable directory for horsemen, taking correspondence courses, and reading. A clean-cut white man with good habits,

Hughes remains cheerful and is known in the prison as "the death row horsemen."

Hughes has been interested in horses since boyhood and was publishing a small magazine for horsemen at the time of his arrest.

The book resulted from a letter Hughes wrote the Longhorn Press from his prison cell. The Longhorn Press (P.O. Box 150, Cisco, Texas 76437) publishes a number of books on horse training. The Hughes book sells for \$4.
