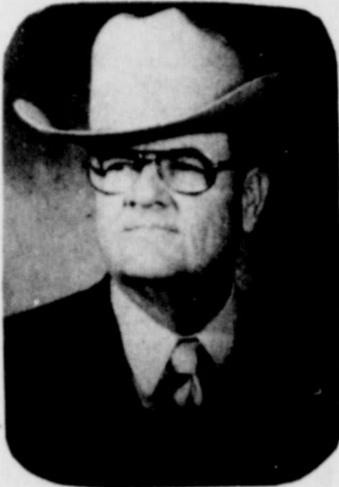
## Judge Is Wright

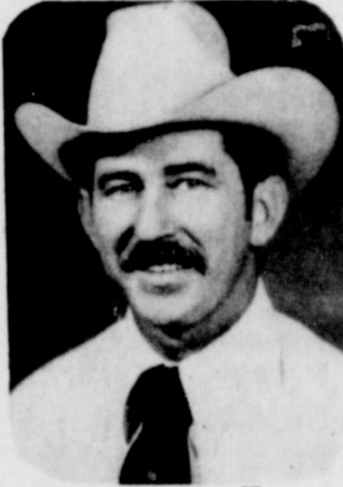


## Run-Off Election To Decide Sheriff

### 4-H: A LASTING EXPERIENCE

4-H is a rapidly growing youth organization in Eastland County according to Mrs. Donna White, Assistant County Extension Agent. 4-H has a lot to offer young people. "After reading our state 4-H newsletter, I felt I had to share with you some of its contents" says Mrs.

White. Recently, a group of former 4-H members were interviewed in an attempt to learn first-hand about the long-term benefits of 4-H membership. These south Texas citizens ranged in age from early twenties to early thirties. Most had completed

their 4-H membership five or more years before. They were teachers, medical technicians, businessmen, housewives, students and an olympic athlete in training. They also represented farmers, government employees, military personnel and a host of other professions. Many were married with children now in 4-H. One was a foster parent to almost seventy children. These appeared to be ordinary folks, the kind we meet every day. Yet, to a person, there was something intangible which set these apart from the crowd. One had a feeling that these people had a sense of

urgency, a sense of decency, a sense of purpose in their lives. They were definitely not the stand-bys; they were obviously the motivators and the doers in their communities. A series of questions were posed to each of those interviewed. Among the questions were, "Do you feel that your 4-H experience has influenced what you have done with your life?" and "What was the most important benefit of your 4-H experience?" The answers to these questions provided some insight to whether or not 4-H programs have any long-term benefits to the participants.

To the first question the response was a unanimous, "Yes". The comments which followed varied from those who said they first became interested in their vocation or avocation through 4-H to those who voiced a feeling about attitudes and values gained. The second question attempted to identify the skill or attitude gained in 4-H which is most often used by the former member. Skills in sewing were mentioned by both men and women. Skills in agricultural production, mechanical skills, horsemanship skills and many other were cited as being important. A great number of

persons mentioned record-keeping skills as important. Others mentioned the ability to organize tasks, to allocate time and to manage resources. There was, however, a common element which emerged from the answers given to the second questions. That element was "people skills." Almost every person mentioned the ability to meet, to interact and to relate to others as the skill gained through 4-H which is most valued and utilized. Many of the former 4-H'ers specifically mentioned their public speaking, method demonstration, committee member, club officer or other 4-H

responsibility roles as experiences which better equipped them to deal with other people effectively. Is 4-H a lasting experience? According to these former

"A tax shelter can mean the difference between a needless payment to Uncle Sam and money in the pocket," points out Dr. Richard Floyd, associate director of the Texas Real Estate Research Center, Texas A&M University System. "All of us want to pay our fair share of taxes, but we also want to take advantage of our legal rights to reduce our individual tax burden."

Real estate investments provide three opportunities to shelter income produced from other sources, says the economist. These are depreciation, interest deductions related to mortgage payments, and income subjected to capital gains tax rather than income tax.

The Internal Revenue Service permits depreciation of physical improvements of investment property. This represents the using up or wearing out of improvements as a business deduction and thus reduces the investor's taxable income.

Interest expenses on real estate investments are deductible although these actual cash outlays reduce investor cash proceeds. For many investors this will add sufficient tax deductions so they can benefit from itemizing their income tax deductions, says Floyd.

**Hints For The Aged**  
By Patricia Galbreath

DEAR PAT-- After reading last year in your column about the lady who had her garden in planter boxes on her front porch, it gave me an idea.

A dear friend constructed planter boxes for me in yard. I am unable to bend comfortably from the knees and hips so my planter boxes are a little more than waist high. I am so delighted with this method of gardening. I have grown many vegetables and it is easy to do all of my gardening with the small "hand" gardening tools.

My friend built two planters last year and is being very creative in the one he is building this year. It is round and is built like an old water well out of different size rocks. It will later produce some flowers for me. —Mrs. K.K., Indiana.

DEAR PAT— Is it possible for someone to learn to drive with his feet with special foot-controls for an automobile? Would it be legal? If so, where can I get some information on it? —B.G., Colorado.

DEAR BEN— It's possible; it's possible; it's legal, and you can get further information from: Cameron Enns Co., 13637 South Madsen Avenue, Kingburg, California 93631 or Die-A-Matic, Inc., 4004 Fifth Road, North, Arlington, Virginia 22203.

When using foot controls, steering is accomplished by either leg, preferably the left. The driver must have one foot functional leg and foot for steering and enough use of the other leg and foot or hand to operate the brake and throttle. Various methods are used to secure the driver's foot to the steering assembly. Basically, the controls from Cameron Enns are custom made to fit each individual. Presently, the work must be done at Kingsburg/Fresno, CA but branch locations are being planned.

Also, only certain vehicles are suitable. They must be factory-equipped with automatic transmission, power steering and power brakes. They are adaptable to motor homes, vans, trucks, and certain makes for automobiles.

In addition to foot-steering controls, Cameron Enns Co. manufactures and supplies foot-operated ignition switches; knee-operated door openers (both interior and exterior), body stabilizers, brake boosters, gear selector controls, foot brake and throttle extensions, and other modifications.

From Dia-A-Matic, Inc., Everything, including radio, warning lights, and windshield wipers, can be operated by the foot or knee. The car is steered by a pedal operated by the left foot and fitted to the shoe of the driver. Steering is accomplished by moving the pedal forward or backward. In addition, there is an automatic seat belt system.

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

### Congressional Comment

WASHINGTON, D.C. — The chaotic years following the Great Depression spawned many of our current Federal programs dealing with socioeconomic problems of American citizens. Perhaps none of these has had the widespread and long-range impact of the Social Security Program.

The purpose of the first Social Security law, enacted during the Roosevelt years, was to provide the foundation for a three-part income maintenance system for older people in retirement. These three parts consist of: 1) social insurance (the social security benefit), 2) income from private means (such as individual insurance, savings and other investments), and 3) assistance from means-tested programs, when such assistance is necessary (the Supplemental Security Income (SSI) Program is one such means-tested program).

This law was later built upon with the addition of protection for disabled employees and self-employed people, and for the dependents of retired, disabled and deceased workers. This entire program is now known as the Old Age Survivors and Disability Insurance (OASDI) Program.

Many changes have been made with regard to the Social Security law over the years. There are a good many misconceptions which exist with regard to this program. A review of the records, hearings and transcripts of testimony given through the years shows that while some changes have been made in the program, one idea continues to remain consistent: The practical objective of the Social Security Program is and always has been to pay benefits that provide a minimum degree of social security as a basis upon which the worker, through his own efforts, will have a better chance to provide adequately for his individual security.

The original Social Security law was established in 1935 and

I have heard from far too many individuals who have made no provision for their retirement, other than the receipt of SS retirement benefits. They find out, only too late, that Social Security Retirement benefits alone are not sufficient for meeting their living expenses. It is my personal feeling that the public needs to be made more fully aware of just how the Social Security Program works. For example, the Social Security Program is a "pay-as-you-go" program; this means, of course, that today's workers must pay in this month the amount that will be paid out next month.

It is my feeling that the program, more than any other program in the U.S., has done much to help individuals who, for whatever reasons, are experiencing a change in their incomes and thus require financial assistance. This program provides assistance for retired persons, disabled workers and their families and widows with school-age dependents.

There are many misconceptions about the Social Security Program, however it has done much to assist the needy and will continue to do so in the years ahead.

Next week, we will examine the program as it presently exists, with a final article the following week on proposed future directions.

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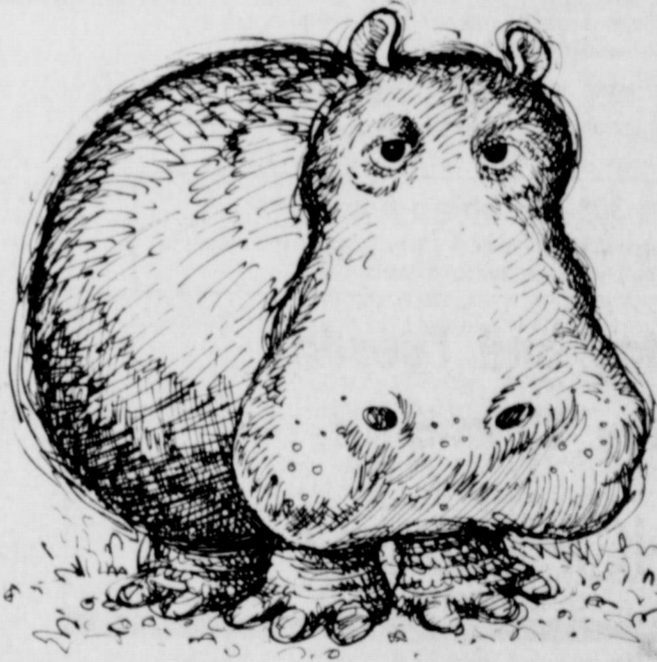

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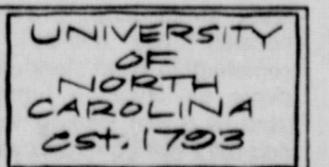

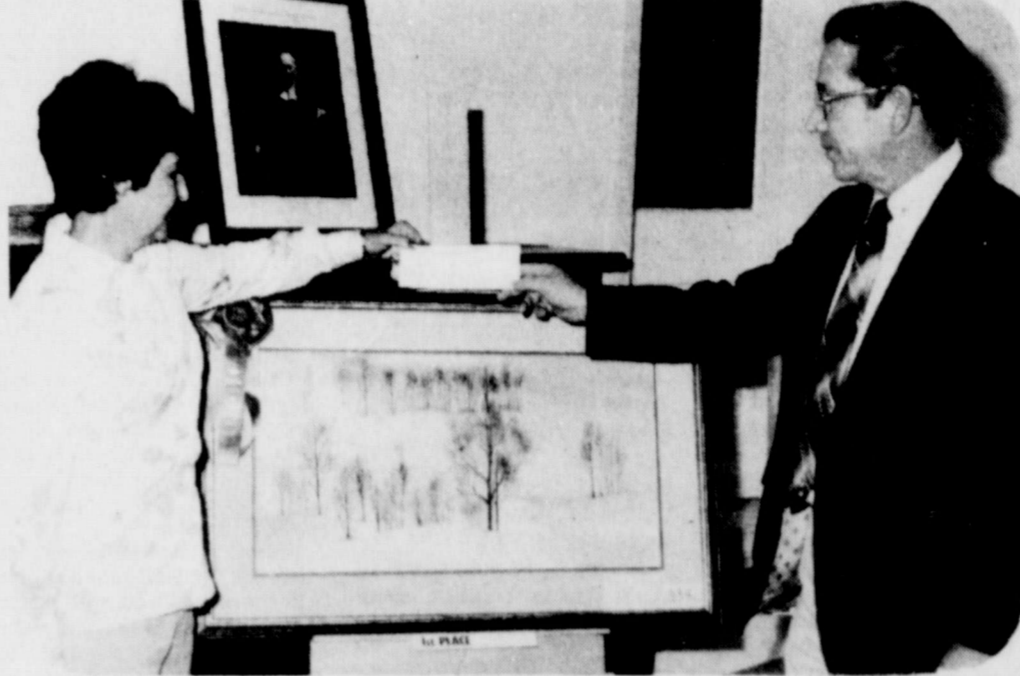

"GHOST TOWN, MANGUM, TEXAS" is the name of the exciting new book by Eastland County Author, Millard Slaughter of Cisco. It's a fact-filled, very interesting and well printed book about the town that was once a thriving "health resort" and major rail center, that is today a quiet virtual crossroads. The book sells for \$4.75 and may be obtained from Mr. Slaughter whose address is Rt. 2, Box 25, Cisco, Texas 76437. His

telephone number is 442-2378. On the cover is a photo of the "last residence standing in Mangum." The book is written in a flowing, easy-to-read account, beginning with the author's move with his family from Desdemona to Mangum. His father was a Methodist minister and "share cropper." Mr. Slaughter's description of Mangum where he grew up, is especially valuable: "Located in Eastland County six miles from Eastland...Approaching the town from the south you would see five section houses probably built in 1902, the same year the train station was built." "To the right and east of the railroad was the Mangum Missionary Baptist Church. Next was a huge rock building housing the Jim Dryer Grocery Store. Next the U.S. Post Office, Charlie Mangum's Barber Shop, J.K. Smith's Grocery Store, the Baseball Field and the only cotton gin within five miles.

"On the left and west of the railroad, first the Don Carlos Hotel, the car house, the railroad state, a drug store, the Maurice Mineral Water Bottling Warehouse, the Maurice Mineral Water Co., two story bath house, about 20 rooms, a telephone exchange, [21 subscribers, operated by F.M. Graham and his wife, a small grocery store, Pete Mangum's Mineral Water Business, a black smith shop, a small hospital [two doctors], a combination band stand and dance pavillion, a lumber yard, a cotton loading wharf and the High Point School, a quarter mile east of town." That was Mangum—and it's to Mr. Slaughter's credit that he has recorded it. Were more history being so recorded.

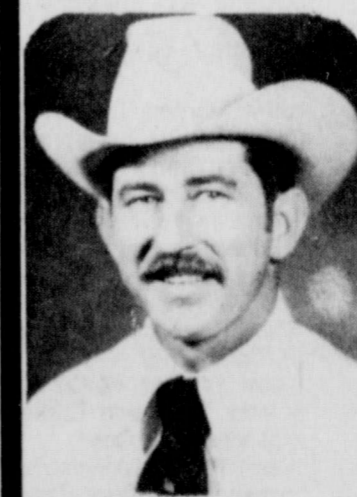

Barry Mahler, Iowa Park. Mahler is one of three winners of the Young Farmer Spokesman for Agriculture competition held last fall in Toledo, Ohio. He has recently completed a tour of major cities in the country promoting agricultural products and meeting with consumers.

State FFA president Alders and National FFA officer candidate Randy Green will address the convention prior to the awards and announcement of scholarship winners. Production Credit Association will provide the public speaking award to be presented by Billy Hassler, Loan Officer with the Stephenville PCA.

Benny Clark, Stephenville, is Area IV FFA supervisor and Terry Gerhart, Angelo State University, is Area IV state officer.


