**Resident Killed In One-Car Wreck**

A Cisco resident, Daniel Anthony Carroll, was killed early Sunday morning in a flaming one-car wreck on Highway 206 about 14 miles southwest of Cisco.

Cisco Justice of the Peace Carlton Holder was called to the crash scene about 6:45 a.m. Sunday. Holder said the northbound vehicle straddled a Sabanna River bridge guardrail near Cross Plains, traveled across the bridge railing, went down an embankment, up an embankment and landed upside down on the north side of the highway. The car traveled 72 feet across the bridge and railing without the tires touching the highway, Holder said.

It burst into flames, he said, and the charred wreckage measured about 36 inches tall. Holder said

the condition of the body made it impossible to identify at the time of the accident.

Graveside services will be held for the 19-year old Carroll at 10 a.m. Tuesday in Oakwood Cemetery, directed by Kimbrough Funeral Home. The Rev. Buddy Sipe of First Baptist Church will officiate.

Daniel Carroll was born June 2, 1961, in Peoria, Arizona. He is the son of Clyde Carroll of El Mirage, Arizona and Mrs. Betty Jo Ferguson of Yuma, Arizona. He worked for Bandera Drilling Co. of Abilene as an oilfield worker.

Other survivors include seven brothers, Danny of Wittman, Ariz., Tommy of Covington, Richard Carroll, Tommy Ferguson and Chris Ferguson, all of Yuma, and Michael and Mark Car-

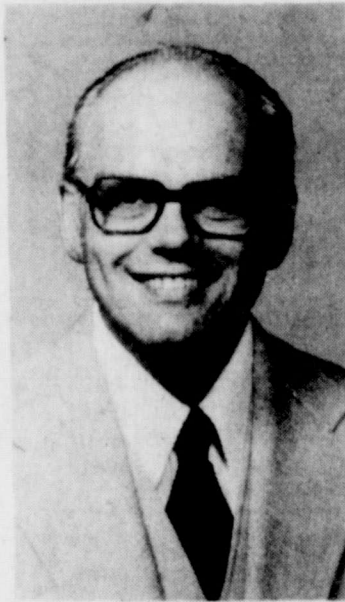

**3 Officers Resign Same Day**

Cisco Chief of Police Kenneth Eaves and three officers resigned here Monday from their employment by the City of Cisco police department. Chief Eaves cited a "basic difference in philosophy about law enforcement" between himself and the City Council as the reason for his resignation.

Along with Eaves, patrolmen Mike Glenn, John Ferguson and Jim Reynolds also resigned. All of the men, except Reynolds, presented written resignations on Monday to acting city manager Marilyn Abbott-Smith.

**John Boland Named Electra City Manager**

John W. Boland, former city manager of Cisco, has been named to fill the vacancy of Electra City Manager created when City Manager Kevin Evans resigned one month ago.

Boland served as City Manager of Cisco from September 1977 until his resignation this past June.

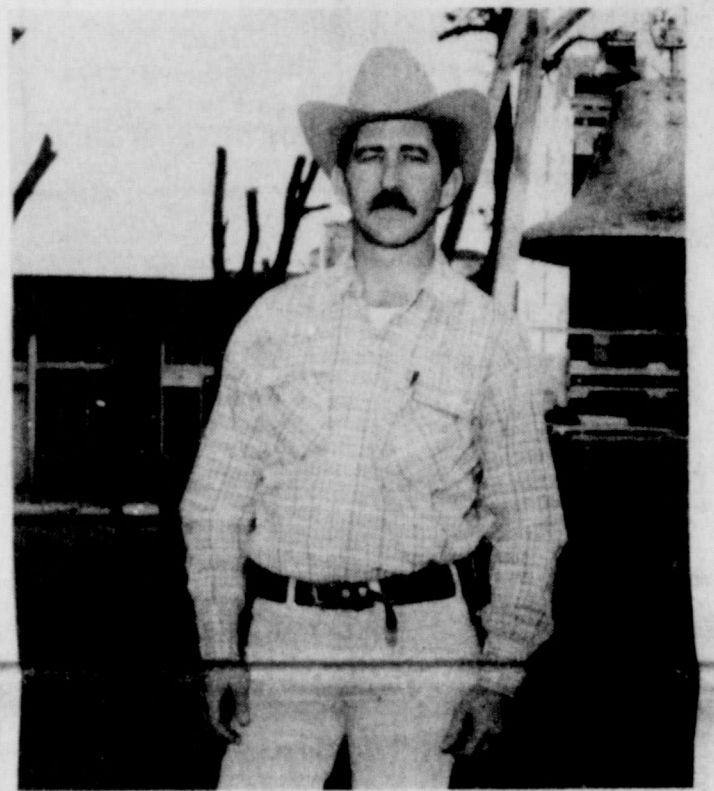

Less than two months ago, city manager John Boland and five city employees quit their positions with the City giving similar reasons. In his resignation, Boland cited irreconcilable differences with the majority of the council over policies promoted by Mayor Roy Cartee.

Eaves said his resignation was not related to Boland's, although the problems each encountered "might be connected."

Mrs. Smith, who has been acting city manager since Boland resigned in June, reacted with little surprise and felt sure that the remaining police officers could handle the job.

Eaves said his resignation, effective August 29, was also due to a lack of patrolmen, but he does

not view the walkout as a protest. He said when he became police chief in July 1979, he had eight patrolmen. Two other police officers resigned recently, and the three officers and the chief resigning Monday leaves Cisco

with three officers. Eaves said the patrolmen resigned because the city wants to go to one-man instead of two-man shifts. He said the officers felt they could not work under those conditions and resigned.

**'The Rainmaker' Playing Roof Garden Theater**

"The Rainmaker," by Richard Nash, is now playing at the Roof Garden Dinner Theater in Cisco. The comedy takes place during a paralyzing drought in the West, and it deals with a girl whose father and two brothers are just as worried about her becoming an old maid as they are about their dying cattle. All their schemes to marry off the rather plain girl come to naught, as do their hopes for rain. Suddenly, from out of nowhere there appears a smooth talking character who promises rain and changes the lives of the whole family.

Because of the disagreement over the number of patrolmen needed, Eaves said he thought it was better that he resign as well.

"I was not pressured or asked to leave. It was my own choice," Eaves said.

Mrs. Smith accepted the written resignations, saying personnel matters are administrative; the council did not have to act on them.

Mrs. Smith is working on a proposed budget for the council to review September 2, including a proposal that the police department consist of five or six patrolmen, one full-time investigator and one chief, for a total of seven or eight people.

Eaves said he does not know whether he will stay in Cisco; he does not yet have other employment.

Reynolds and Ferguson both joined the Cisco Police Department in November 1979 and Glenn has been on the force three years.

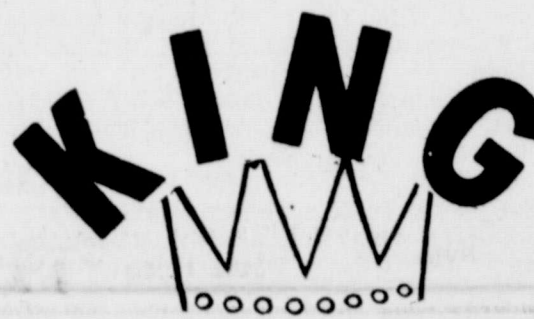

## Peanut Clinic To Be Conducted In Two Locations

A Peanut Clinic will be conducted by the Agricultural Extension Service in two locations in Eastland County Tuesday, August 26. County Agent DeMarquis Gordon said the purpose of the clinic is to help producers identify problems in their peanuts and provide recommendations for correcting the problems.

Three Extension Specialists and the Agent will be available to look at diseased plants, insects, problem weeds and nutritional deficiencies in plants. The

three specialists will include Dr. Chip Lee, Plant Pathologist; Dr. George Alston, Agronomist; and Dr. Jesse Coker, Entomologist. Each clinic will be open for two hours. Producers are encouraged to bring sick plants or other problems in for diagnosis. The specialists and Agent will discuss individual problems with growers.

Gordon said the specialists would also discuss cotton problems with producers since cotton is an important crop in the county this year.

## Community Budgeting

College Station—As Texas communities struggle to provide essential services like sewer and water systems, the question is always the same: "What's it going to cost?"

Such communities now have the opportunity to determine these costs without spending thousands of dollars in consulting fees.

By using budgeting assistance from the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, local leaders can determine the most cost-efficient methods of providing such services as fire protection, sewer systems, solid waste disposal, health clinics, water systems, ambulance services and transportation for the elderly.

How much will an ambulance service in our rural area cost? Which is more economical for us, a green box dumpster garbage collection system or a house-to-house system? How should we route our school buses in order to save money and yet provide efficient service?

"We don't make these decisions for community leaders, but provide them with budget facts and possible alternatives," points out Dr. James I. Mallett, Extension Service state leader in community development. "From that information they can make a decision, not by guess or estimate or politics, but by hard, solid data."

"The tide has turned and Americans are beginning to move back to the rural areas," contends Mallett. "Rural development efforts directed toward creation of rural job opportunities have been quite successful, and now many areas which experienced a population decline from 1950 to 1970 are beginning to grow."

## Josephine Cleveland And Daughter Tour Orient

Josephine Cleveland and daughter, Carolyn, returned last week after spending 21 days in the Orient. July 13, they joined the Nora Lam Sung Crusade team composed of members from Canada and the United States. The team assisted S.K. and Nora Lam Sung in conducting crusades, ministering in orphanages, Bible Schools and churches throughout the Far East.

The group assembled in Los Angeles International Airport and flew via Anchorage, Alaska to Seoul, Korea. From Seoul, they departed for Taipei, Taiwan. The group was met by government officials in a welcoming ceremony at the airport and each presented flowers.

Wednesday, July 16, Mr. Lin of Free China Relief Association met with the team and shared the work being done by them in assisting peoples in Red China and also refugees from other Asian countries.

Wednesday afternoon of the same day team members visited the Bethany Children Home Orphanage and presented gifts to each child. Wednesday evening a banquet was held for the team in the Miramar Hotel with Taipei government officials, local pastors and other distinguished guests.

July 17, the group flew to Kaohsiung, Taiwan. Upon arrival the group were transported to the City Hall for a welcome ceremony and later a Press conference.

In the evening of July 17 the American team met with local pastors and interpreters to plan for Sunday morning church services. Over 50 churches extended invitations for team members to speak in their respective churches and have fellowship with their congregation.

Mrs. Ruth Powell was the organist. Debra Hitt sang "The Wedding Song" accompanied by Susan Schaefer on the piano, and Cindy Lewis sang "Follow Me" to the accompaniment of Garry Barnes on the guitar. Ray Melton recited a selection from *The Prophet* by Kahlil Gibran entitled "On Marriage."

The bride is a 1977 graduate of Cisco High School. She received an A.A. degree from Cisco Junior College and is now a senior at the University of Texas in Austin, majoring in Elementary Education. The bridegroom is also a 1977 Cisco High School graduate. Having attended Cisco Junior College, he, too is a senior at the University of Texas in Austin majoring in Government Pre/Law.

A rehearsal dinner was hosted by the bridegroom's parents at Jammies Restaurant in Cisco.

The couple will reside at the Knoll Apartments in Austin following a wedding trip to Galveston and the Gulf Coast area.

was invited by the mayor of Tainon to a welcoming ceremony at the City Hall. They were then driven to the large city gymnasium for a program presented for them by school childrens choral groups, orchestra and other performances. School was in session at this time of the year. After the program, the group was invited to a luncheon prepared by the city officials. The American team was surprised and overwhelmed when asked to walk single file from the large gymnasium to the city square. There the street was blocked off and as they walked single file they were instructed to stop before school girls who were all dressed in black skirts and white blouses. A flower corsage was pinned on each team member.

Performances including a Chinese Dragon dance was then presented in the city square for the American team. The group was then asked to walk again single file through an archway of flower decorated arches held on each side by 3,000 girl students from the schools of Tainon. Mrs. Cleveland stated, "We were overwhelmed at the tremendous, unexpected welcome by this city in the southern part of the Free Republic of China. The four blocks of walking under the beautiful flower strewn archway led us to the site of the outdoor night crusade where an unestimated thousands of Chinese assembled for the night crusade. Hundreds responded to the message presented them through the ministry of S.K. and Nora Lam Sung, Chico Holiday, a former American night club singer and now a full time gospel singer was the featured singer for the crusades team evangelistic efforts."

On July 23 the team left the Free Republic of China from the Taipei International Airport, for Manilla, Philippines. The group held two evening crusades in the Grand Ballroom of the Philippine Plaza Hotel. The day after arriving in Manilla a typhoon struck the Manilla area. The government requested all people to remain at home. Mrs. Cleveland said, "This was my first experience to be in an area lashed by 160 mile an hour typhoon. The hotel, Phillipine Plaza, was located by the bay. The storm abated by nightfall and several thousand Philippines braved the elements to attend the second night of our crusade in Manilla. July 26, we departed

Manilla again for Seoul, Korea. Sunday our team attended the largest church in the world, the Korean Assemblies of God Full Gospel Central Church, pastored by Rev. Paul Yongii Cho. The church holds seven services each Sunday in order to accommodate the 110,000 members. It also televises all its services. The church building is enormous. Sections are divided in the balcony and ear phones provided for each to hear the message presented by choirs and the pastor in the visitor's own language of their particular country."

While in Seoul, the team visited the Angel's Haven Orphanage for fellowship with the children and teachers. Also members of the team visited Prayer Mountain where Korean Christians have dug caves in the side of the mountain. Here 24 hours a day Christians gather, individually or in groups, for intercessory prayer.

The final destination was Honolulu where the team spent four days in fellowship and rest at the Hawaiian Regent Hotel on Waikiki. Op-

portunity was given to present the gospel in many ways while on this beautiful island.

Mrs. Cleveland commented, "There were many occasions for personal sharing with the people in the countries visited. We found all to be receptive to the gospel and returned home gratified that we could share and have a small part in carrying out the Great Commission 'go ye into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature....' At the same time, we arrived home with the realization that the fields are ripe unto harvest and there is no stopping place until all nations have had the opportunity of hearing the Good News of the gospel of Jesus Christ."

Mrs. Cleveland and daughter were met by her husband, Dr. C.M. Cleveland, at the Dallas International Airport. She will have colored

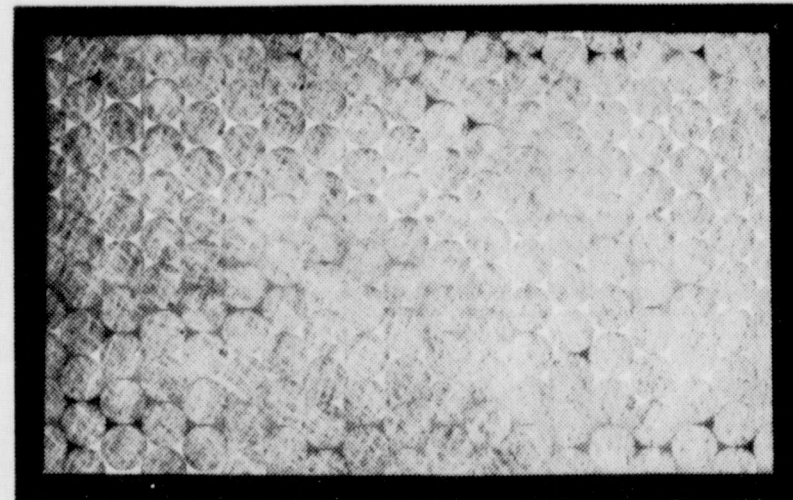

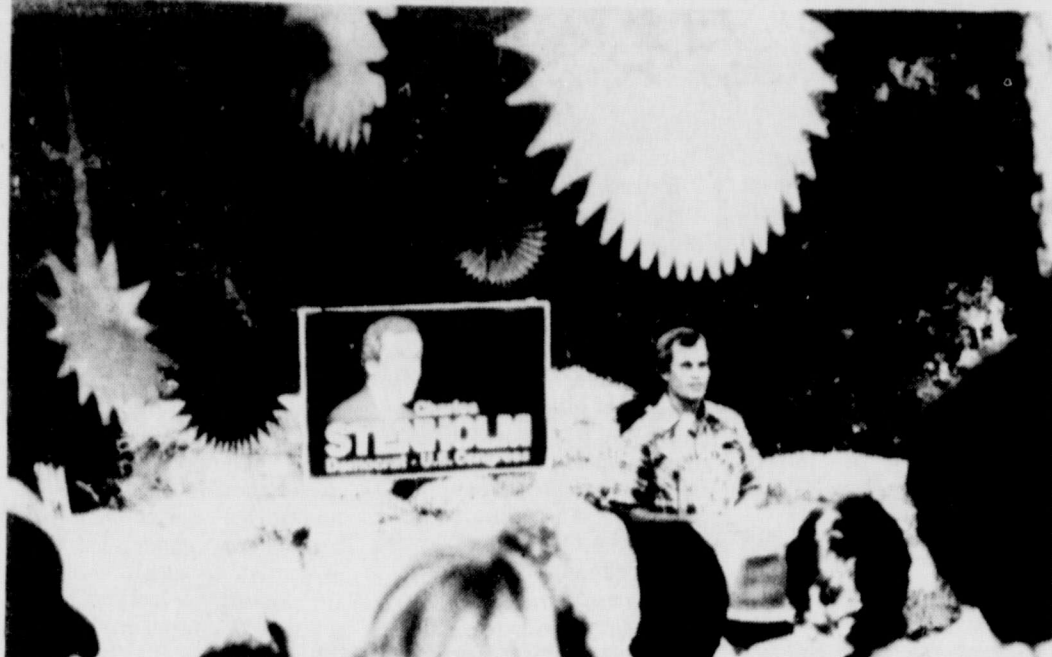

# INFORMED VOTING

**AMENDMENT NO. 1**  
Senate Joint Resolution 35, proposing a constitutional amendment permitting the legislature to authorize banks to use unmanned teller machines within the county or city of their domicile on a shared basis to serve public convenience.

The proposed amendment authorizes the legislature to permit state and national banks to establish and operate electronic teller machines located away from the banks' buildings. A bank would assign to each participating customer a unique form of identification, such as a card or identification number, so that the

customer could use the machine to communicate with the bank in confidence. Without the assistance of a bank employee, the customer could withdraw or deposit money, transfer money between accounts, or perform any other banking function. The use of a machine permits a bank to provide services for its customers at convenient locations away from the bank building and at times other than normal banking hours.

The amendment would permit a bank to place machines in the county or city in which the bank is located or, if the bank is

located in a city that lies in two or more counties, to place machines in both the county and the city in which it is located. The amendment provides that a bank must be allowed to share with other banks in the use of a machine that is located in its area if the machine is not located at another bank's office, and that a bank may share in the use of a machine with savings and loan associations or credit unions located in the same area.

**BACKGROUND**  
Article XVI, Section 16, of the Texas Constitution, prohibits state and national banks from participating in branch banking, which is

engaging in the business of banking at more than one location. That prohibition, which dates from 1904, is the result of a distrust of branch banking based on reasons that include concern for the stability of banks, fear that many banks could fail in a short period, desire to control the influence of large banking interests, and fear of a banking monopoly.

The federal courts have ruled that an electronic device that performs bank functions and that is installed away from the primary location of a bank is a branch bank. Texas courts if faced with that issue probably would reach the same result. An opinion of the attorney general indicates that the use of machines to perform banking functions is branch banking and is therefore unconstitutional.

The legislature passed this proposed amendment to lift the constitutional ban on the use of unmanned teller machines and enacted legislation for the use of those machines in anticipation of the adoption of the amendment.

While national banks are subject to the paramount authority of the United States, they are also subject to the laws of the state in which they are located unless the state's laws impair or destroy the national banks' efficiency as federal agencies or conflict with the laws of the United States. The United States Supreme Court has held that a state may prohibit national banks from participating in branch banking in the state.

Distrust of financial organizations is shown by the fact that before 1904 the Texas Constitution prohibited the incorporation of banks by the state.

**ARGUMENTS FOR:**

1. Unmanned teller machines allow customer to transact business at convenient locations and at any time.
2. Because each bank has the right to share in the use of the machines, a bank will be able to serve a larger area than it currently serves. Competition among banks will increase.
3. The use of unmanned teller machines allows banks to better compete with savings and loan associations, which currently may have more than one business location while banks are restricted to a single location.

**AGAINST:**

1. The cost of installing a network of unmanned teller machines would probably be passed on to the consumer, raising the costs of services currently provided by the banks.
2. The amendment provides a method to circumvent the long-standing prohibition on branch banking in Texas.
3. Instead of increasing competition among banks, the use of unmanned teller machines will allow a large bank to serve the entire community and to force banks operating on a small profit margin out of business, ultimately decreasing competition.

## Dove Hunting Outlook Varied

AUSTIN — Mourning dove hunting during the state's North Zone season opening Sept. 1 may range from exciting to dismal, according to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department.

The North Zone covers approximately the northern two-thirds of Texas. In general, dove prospects are good in the eastern half of the North Zone and poor in the west.

Biologists said that in terms of numbers of mourning doves statewide, the 1980 season may be outstanding. Dove Program Leader Jim Dunks said call-count surveys showed an increase in the statewide breeding population for the third consecutive year.

Also, a nationwide survey indicates a 12 percent increase in the nation's breeding population of mourning doves, part of a 10-year upward trend, Dunks added.

However, field biologists point out that the continuing drought in Texas may cause many of the native birds to leave some areas before the season opens because of a lack of food, and birds migrating from the north may not stay long if food is scarce.

The Dallas/Fort Worth area seems to be the dividing line, with East Texas looking much better because of recent rains and the availability of waste grain for food. Shooting around watering and feeding sites may be outstanding in some areas because of the drought con-

ditions. Biologist Hayden Haucke of Paris said the Northeast Texas dove situation looks better than last year, with plenty of birds and ample food. "We had an excellent wheat harvest this year, and there is plenty of waste grain around," Haucke said. "Also, by the time the season opens there will have been quite a bit of maize harvested, which will provide even more forage."

By contrast, biologist Tommy Hailey of Breckenridge said just the opposite is true in a large chunk of the state roughly bounded by Fort Worth, Wichita Falls and Abilene. "There's very little grain left for doves, only a little wheat stubble and maize. I expect most of that to be gone by Sept. 1 and a little croton weed will be all that's left," said Hailey.

Likewise, biologist Jim Dillard of Mineral Wells said from that city up through the dove hunting hotspot areas of Montague, Clay and Wichita Counties no significant concentrations of doves have been observed.

Regional Director George Litton of Waco said Central Texas looks a bit better. "We

have quite a few birds right now, but the problem is that food plants have matured quicker during the drought and food may be real scarce by Sept. 1."

The dove situation in the Panhandle-South Plains area looks pretty good, according to Vernon Morse, manager of the department's Gene Howe Wildlife Management Area at Canadian. "We apparently had a good hatch of birds this year, and forage conditions also are pretty good," Morse said. "But as usual, most of the doves probably will migrate to the south of us by mid-September."

## U.S. Coast Guard Accepting Applications

Applications for appointment must be submitted to the Director of Admissions, U.S. Coast Guard Academy, prior to December 15, 1980. Candidates must arrange to participate in either the College Board Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) or American College Testing Assessment (ACT) prior to or including the December 13, 1980 administration for the ACT and the December 6, 1980 administration for the SAT. The competition for appointment as Cadet is based on the candidate's high school rank, performance on either the SAT or ACT, and leadership potential as demonstrated by participation in high school extracurricular activities, community affairs and/or part-time employment. Most successful candidates rank in the top quarter of their high school class and demonstrate proficiency in both the mathematical and applied science fields.

To qualify for the competition, an applicant must be unmarried at the time of appointment, have no legal obligations resulting from a prior marriage, and must have reached the age of 17 but not 22 by July 1, 1981. All applicants must be assured of high school graduation by June 30, 1981. Applicants must have completed three units in English, and three in mathematics to include algebra and plane or coordinate geometry or their equivalents, and must fulfill basic physical and moral requirements.

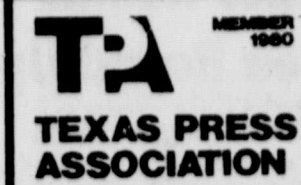

## Students May Be Eligible For Reduced-Price

The Cisco Independent School District serves nutritious meals every school day. Students may buy

lunch for 70 cents in grades Kindergarten through the Sixth grade. Lunch for

grades seven through 12 is 75 cents. Students may buy breakfast for 35 cents for all grades.

Children from families whose income is at or below those shown in the scale below are eligible for

free meals or meals at the reduced price of 10 cents for lunch, and a reduced price of 10 cents for breakfast. Children from families whose income is higher than that shown in the annual income scale may be eligible for free or reduced meals if they have unusually high medical bills, shelter costs in excess of 30% of their annual income, special education expenses due to the mental or physical condition of a child, or disaster or casualty

losses.

To apply for free or reduced price lunches or breakfast, contact the Principal of your child's school.

In certain cases, foster children are also eligible for these meals. A family who has such children living with them should contact the Principal of the school involved.

All children are treated the same regardless of the ability to pay. In the operation of the child feeding programs, no child will

be discriminated against because of race, sex, color, or national origin.

All students will be given an application for these meals at the beginning of school. Interested parents should complete and sign the application and return to the student's school as soon as possible. Information regarding this program may be obtained from the Principal of any of the schools in the Cisco Independent School District.
