name of Sosigenes, decided

Caesar gave six of the months 31 days, five of then hree years in a row, with 30 days every fourth year,
which was named Leap Year. To get the new calen-
dar adjusted to the seasons,
the year 46 B.C. was extendthe year 46 B.C. was extend-

understandably, 46 B.
came to be known as 'The

## So far so good, except that Caesar and his astronomer

 has proceeded on thehat assumption that the sola year was exactly 365 days,
hours long. This introduced
an annual error of almost minutes, 15 seconds. No much of an error, one might
say, but considered over a say, but considered over a
long term it meant that at the end of 128 years the Julian calendar was lagging
behind the Sun by an entire
day. 1580's A.D. arrived before anything was done about this and by then the

about ten whole days. But fortunately the time required for the Earth to orbit the Sun had been determined
accurately. Pope Gregory accurately. .rope credit for ap-

that we use today. In order to bring the new Gregorian calendar into step with the
solar year, the Pope took the solar year, the epe droo ting

ar Stone on display in $u$ thropology in Mexico City. In the center of a disc 12 feet in
diameter is the face of the Sun God. Around it are seven
concentric circles, with the concentric circles, with the
spaces between them crammed with abstruse symbols which indicate to scholars that whoever directed the in-
tricate carving of the Stone was aware of how many days it took the Earth to make its annual orbit around the Sun.
Although calendar regulates the day loday activities of most people throughout today's world, a number of older,
traditional calendars such as the Hebrew, the Isamic and the Hindu govern the religious life of various
groups. Even the Julian calendar still finds some use in the United States. Nearly half of the Russian Orthodox congregations celebrate Christmas on January which corresponds to
December 25 on the Julian calendar.
The key to the accuracy of The key to the accuracy of
the Gregorian system is the ingenious way the calendar reformers of 1582 handled Leap Year, that odd but
essential procedure by which February is given 29 days every fourth year. Pope
Gregory foresaw that if Gregory foresaw that if this
quadrennial adjustment was quadrennial adjustment was
done continually, there would soon be trouble again so Leap Year is skippedo oc-
casionally. Giving February casionally. Giving February
an extra day every fourth an extra day every fourth
year is waived in the first year of a century whose date is not evenly divisible by 400 Thus, the year 1600 was a
Leap Year, and February Leap Year, and February
was given 29 days. But the years 1700, 1800 and 1900, all of which would normally
have been Leap Years, were have been Leap Years, were
not evenly divisible by 400 not evenly divisible by 400,
hence their Februaries had only 28 days. The next so-
called Century Year, 2000, called Century Year,
will be a Leap Year.

ing this are the ThirteenMonth Calendar, also called
the International Fixed Calendar, and the so-called
World Calendar.
The Thirteen-Month Calendar, proposed in 1849
by a Frenchman named by a Frenchman named
Auguste Comte, would have 13 equal months, each with four seven-day weeks. Since
that adds up to only 364 days, an extra day called Year
Day would be added at year's end, repeacingthe pre-
sent New Year as a time for sent New Year as a time for

follow June. The new thirteenth month would be call-
