PARADE:

Route: The Parade will start at Main and Ammerman and go east on Main to Seaman - South on Seaman one block to Commerce - West on Commerce one block and disburse. This route will take the parade around three sides of the Eastland County Courthouse Square. The review stand will be on the South side of Main Street between Seaman and Lamar Streets.

Parade Staging Areas: The side streets North and South of Main Street from Ammerman to College will be used as staging areas for the parade entries. These areas have been marked on the parade maps. You will be assigned a staging area. Parade officials will be at each staging area to show you your correct area to park.

Time: Staging for the parade will start at 8:30 a.m. on October 3rd, 1981. Parade entries should plan to be staged and ready to go no later than 9:40 a.m.

Missing Girls Are Back Home

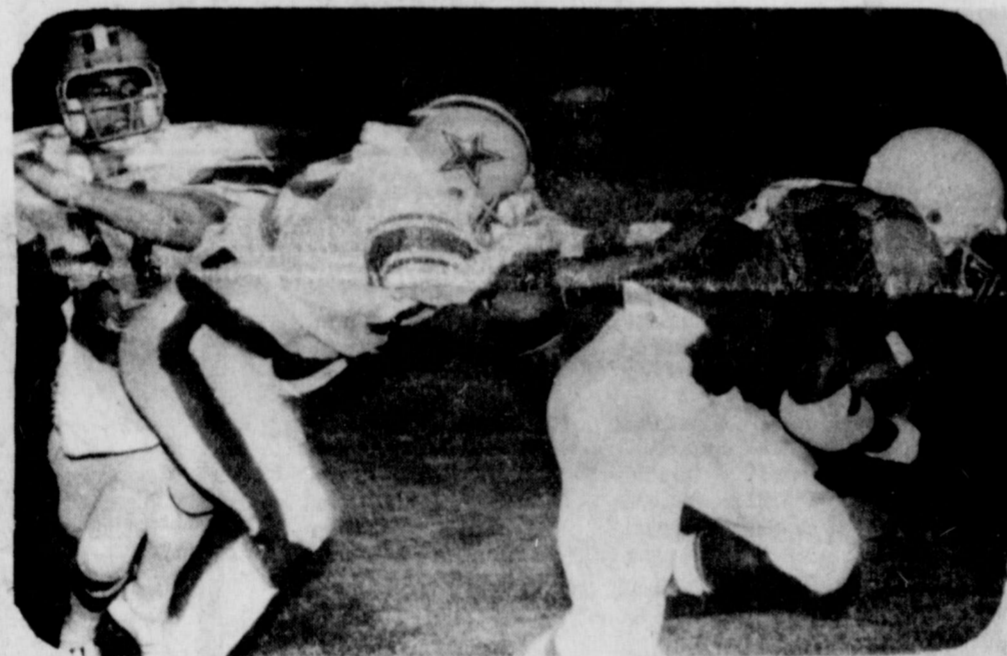

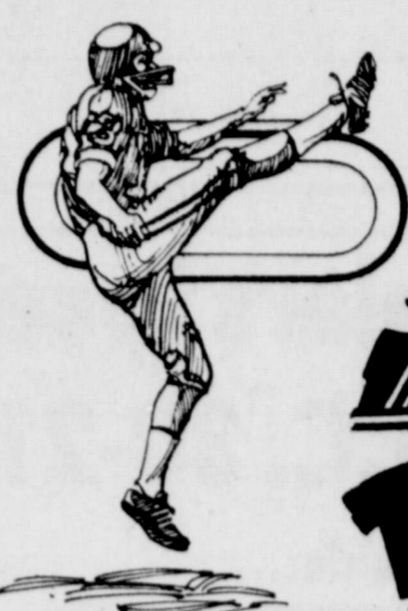

The pass for extra points caught by Douglas turned out to be the last of the scoring as the Rangers ran out the time.

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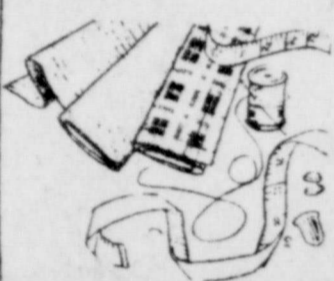

Enjoys Eastland County**

Not only in its garden-terrace decor, but in its attractive Managers from India, Bharat Bhakta and Mr. Bhakta's brother, Kiran. And managing, to these young men, means being able to personally take care of anything that needs attention. Kiran is doing a lot of the cooking, but Bharat assists him when necessary.

Bharat and Kiran had lived in California for about seven years before moving to Eastland on August 15th of this year. But Bharat Bhakta's wife, who is a homemaker rather than a worker at the Restaurant, lived in India until her marriage about six months ago. Kiran, who is the younger of the brothers, is not married.

Like most people the world over, the Bhaktas are enthusiastic about their plans for the future. They hope to keep Best Western a quality place to dine, with a menu comparable to restaurants in the Metroplex and other areas. They may even add a few International dishes, such as chicken curry and similar things, as interest indicates.

"I don't know whether the people here would like the curry or peppers as hot as they serve them in India," Bharat smiles.

At the present time the Restaurant is serving mainly American food, with meals based around beef, chicken, or seafood. And a wide cross-section of people seem to be enjoying it - business people, oilmen, and travelers from the Interstate.

As the Bhakta brothers stir about with their duties at the Best Western it is difficult to realize the tremendous changes which have taken place in their lives. Bharat and Kiran were born in a small town named Pathadia, near Bombay, Southern India. Bharat enrolled in a College at Bardoli, where he studied Mechanical and Electrical Engineering.

In 1972 his parents moved to San Francisco, where his father went into business. About two years later Bharat and Kiran decided to move to the United States and work with their father.

This was a new and sometimes strange experience for the Hindu boys, coming to America without knowing any of the language or customs of the country. Bharat began to learn the English language by watching television and attempting to talk to people. And he began restaurant work by washing dishes, cooking - anything that was needed.

About five years ago Bharat and Kiran's father moved to Blythe, California - northeast of Los Angeles, on the edge of the Mojave desert - to run a Motel. There the brothers learned even more about American cooking and restaurant management.

Six months ago Bharat went back to India on a visit and met and married a lovely girl.

"No, I didn't know her before that time," he explains. "I found her on this visit."

After a tradition wedding the young couple returned to the United States. This summer the opportunity came to manage the Best Western Restaurant, and they came on to Eastland.

Bharat Bhakta states that they have enjoyed it very much here - that the people have been friendly. They have found the area less crowded than California, with a hot summer climate comparable to that of Bombay. They haven't seen winter here yet, but are looking forward to that as just another in their long series of adventures.

Occasionally the family may travel to the Metroplex or to Coleman to visit other friends from India. Mrs. Bhakta also has an Uncle in Arizona.

Mr. and Mrs. Bharat Bhakta and Kiran Bhakta have apparently made all necessary adjustments to live with the American culture. But on one matter Bharat has not quite adapted! When asked what his hobby or recreation was, he looked a bit puzzled.

"My spare time? But I spend most of my time in the Restaurant," he explains. "I enjoy my work there!"

"Mainly," he adds, "I like to meet people. I want the people of this area to come out and try our food and service. I think they'll be very pleased."

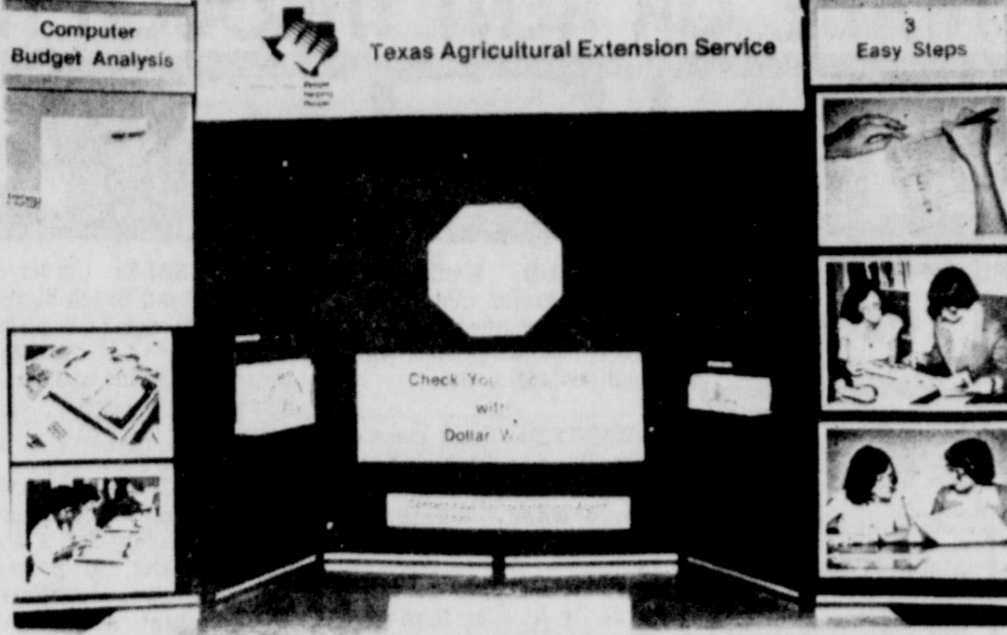
