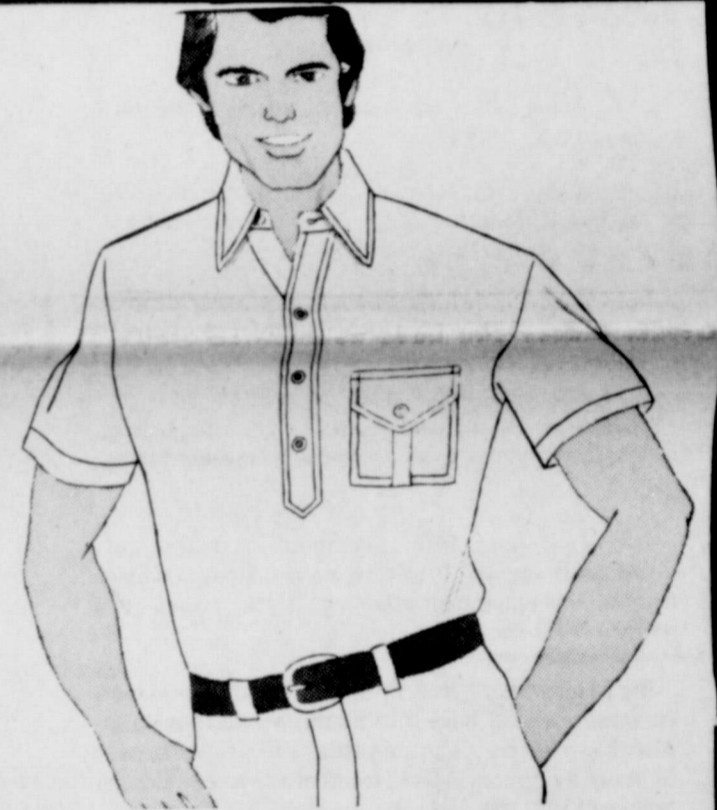

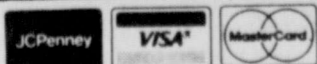

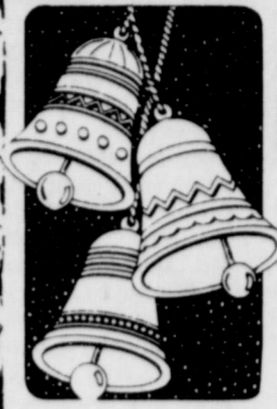

## Hay Show

### December 11

COLLEGE STATION--  
Texas farmers and ranchers  
wanting to see how well the  
hay they harvested this year  
stacks up have until Dec. 11  
to enter samples in the  
Texas State Hay Show.

The show is set for Jan. 27  
at the Waco Convention  
Center and will feature hay  
samples from the 1981 crop,  
points out Don Dorsett,  
forage specialist with the  
Texas Agricultural Extension  
Service, Texas A&M  
University System.

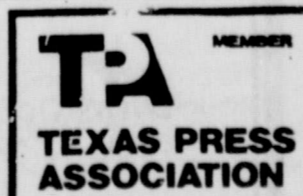
The Texas State Hay Show  
has attracted some 300 en-  
tries in past years, but this  
year's show has gained a lot  
of interest and entries could  
reach the 400 mark, notes  
Dorsett.

Producers may submit one  
sample in each of the seven  
show classes, which include  
coastal bermudagrass, other  
bermudagrasses, other  
perennials, mixed grasses,  
summer annuals, winter an-  
nuals and legumes.

Samples should be sent to  
Billy M. Collier, McLennan  
County Extension Agent, 420  
North 6th St., Waco, TX  
76702. Producers should in-  
clude their name and ad-  
dress, county in which the  
hay was produced, and class  
to be entered.

In addition to hay samples  
from throughout the state,  
the show will feature a pro-  
gram of interest to hay pro-  
ducers, users and commer-  
cial suppliers, points out  
Dorsett. Keynote speaker  
will be Dr. Monte Rouquette  
of Overton, forage resear-  
cher with the Texas  
Agricultural Experiment  
Station. The show also will  
feature 4-H and FFA hay  
judging contests.

Dorsett adds that the  
Texas State Hay Show will  
culminate several days of  
agricultural activities in  
Waco. The three-day Mid-  
Tex Farmland and Ranch  
Show starts Jan 25, and the  
following day features  
meetings of the Blackland  
Income Growth (BIG) pro-  
gram and the Texas Forage  
and Grassland Council.

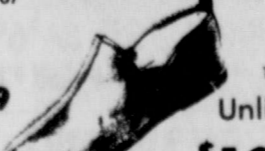

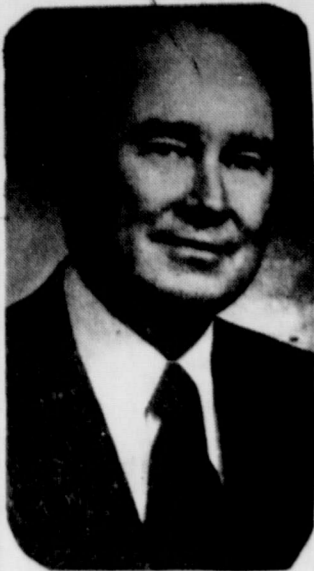

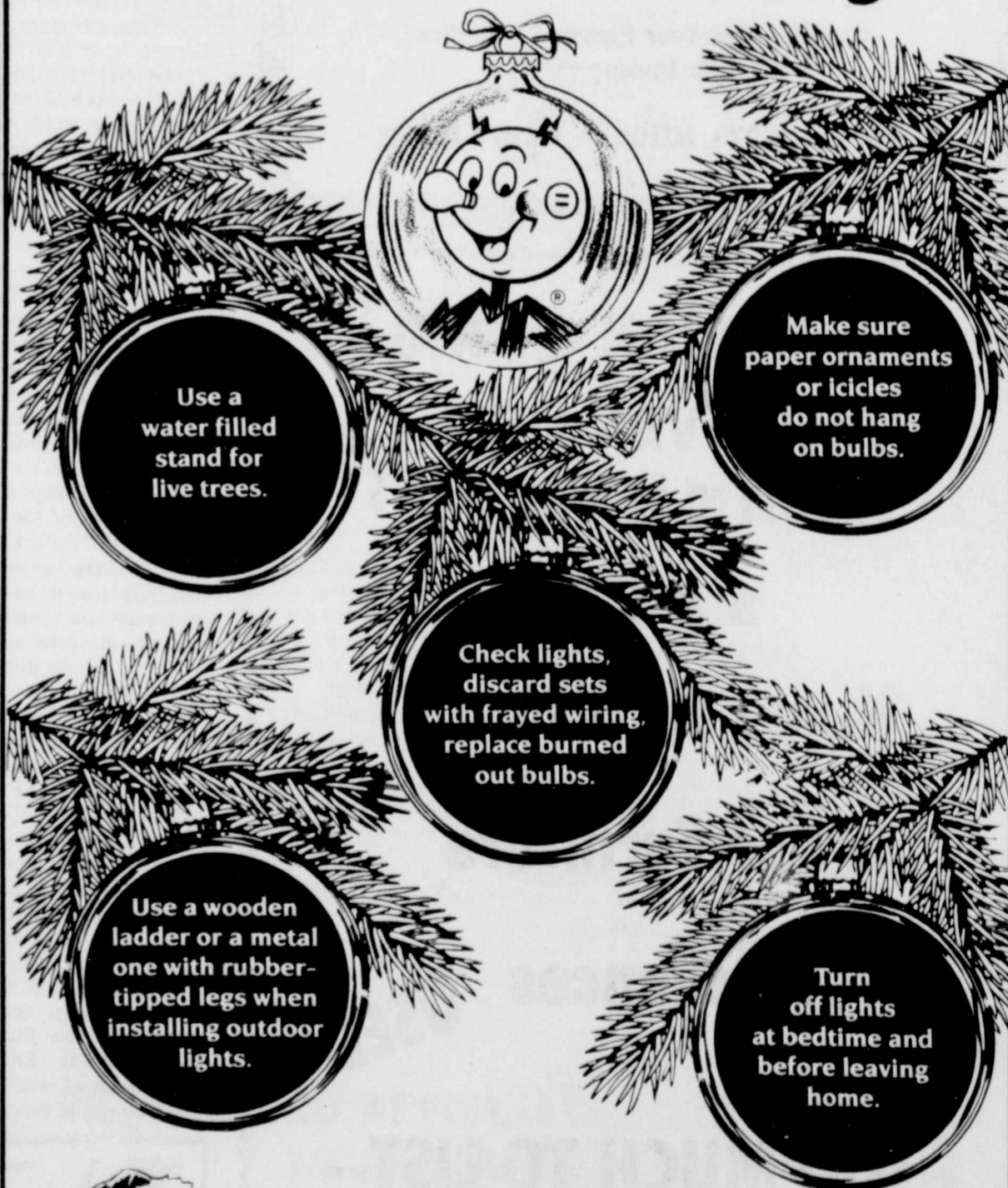

**Congressional Comment**

WASHINGTON, D.C. — I suspect that no one was particularly proud of Congress this week — either the House or the Senate — after they failed, one more time, to meet their responsibilities in the budgetary process.

It is perhaps time to take a serious look at the burdensome procedure of passing a federal budget, as, for the second year, we as a body have failed to meet our deadlines and have all the appropriations bills on the President's desk by October 1. All federal agencies have been operating since that time under a continuing resolution that carried over funding at last fiscal year's levels.

After the first continuation

ran out on November 20, a House-Senate conference committee worked through the weekend to come up with a solution acceptable to both sides and to the administration. Their proposal, voted upon by the House late Sunday, was over the budgetary level the President had already warned would be unacceptable and was, consequently, vetoed by the President Monday morning.

That action brought Washington to a standstill, with government agencies literally "going out of business." So-called "non-essential" personnel were sent home and the House immediately set about to pass still another continuing resolution, this one to expire on December 15, that would allow the federal government to continue its operations uninterrupted.

My colleague from the 10th District of Texas, J. J. (Jake) Pickle eloquently and accurately presented the problem to Congress that day, as he introduced a bill that would require a two-thirds affirmative vote before any continuing

resolution could become effective, with an exception in case of certain national emergencies.

"The underlying problem this week and in the last few Congresses is that we have come to rely on the passage of a continuing resolution to do our work for us, rather than to face up to the tough issues through our regular committee appropriations process. This 'continuing resolution' is a bad practice; it is an abdication of legislative responsibility and it will literally destroy the committee system unless we put a stop to it. Requiring a two-thirds vote would simply mean it would be very difficult to use this regrettable stopgap measure except in extraordinary circumstances. Thus, the responsibility for Federal appropriations would return to the committee system where, philosophically, historically, and traditionally, it belongs.

"The House has passed its appropriations bills, all but foreign assistance, and House Members can say rightly that the other body has failed to produce. I certainly have no criticism of my House Appropriations Committee, and particularly not in connection with this continuing resolution. The chairman of that committee, and the House conferees, have done a responsible job. The fact remains, however, that we are in this jam today because of an over-reliance on the continuing resolution. If we continue in this way, it will undermine the authority and the reputation of Congress."

I have joined Congressman Pickle in co-sponsoring this legislation and believe it would be an important means to shut this irresponsible "backdoor" that has allowed the Congress to ignore its budgetary responsibilities.

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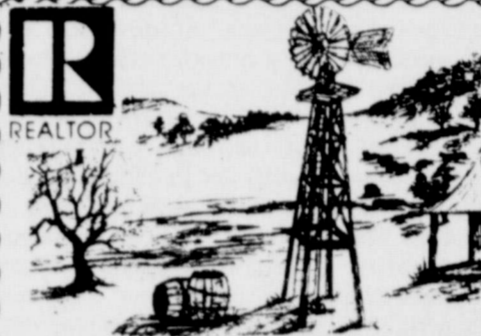

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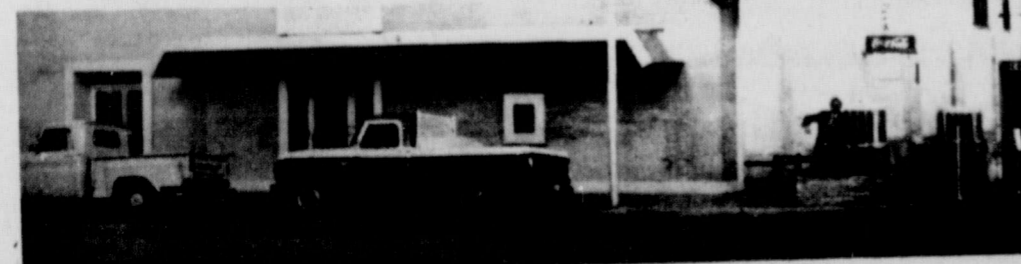

The holiday season is here which means parties and family get-togethers. Chicken Nut Puffs are a delicious party treat.

- CHICKEN NUT PUFFS**  
1 cup chicken broth  
1/2 cup margarine  
1 cup flour  
1 tablespoon chopped parsley  
2 teaspoons seasoned salt  
2 teaspoons worcestershire  
3/4 teaspoon celery seed  
1/2 teaspoon paprika  
1/8 teaspoon cayenne  
4 eggs  
5 oz. can chicken, drained & chopped  
1/2 cup chopped, toasted almonds or pecans

In saucepan, combine chicken broth and margarine; bring to a boil. Stir in flour, parsley, salt, worcestershire, celery seed, paprika and cayenne. Cook, beating rapidly, until mixture leaves sides of pan and forms a smooth, compact ball. Remove from heat. Add eggs, 1 at a time, beating well after each addition, until mixture is shine. Stir in chicken and nuts. Drop by teaspoon onto ungreased baking sheets. Bake at 400 degrees for 15-18 minutes or until brown. Serve hot. Makes about 60.

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## Volunteers Make Agricultural Service Work

COLLEGE STATION--Without hard-working volunteers, the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, a part of the Texas A&M University System, would be much less effective in carrying out its informal educational programs in agriculture, home economics, and community and youth development.

"Each state boasts a Cooperative Extension Service, and it's been said that this organization makes greater use of more volunteers than any other entity existing today," points out Dr. Ken Denmark, an Extension staff development specialist.

"County Extension agents pride themselves in the way they involve volunteers in

planning, organizing and implementing local educational activities," says Denmark.

This year alone, some 63,000 Texans have been involved as Extension volunteers. This includes about 18,000 serving on county program building committees, 23,000 in organized homemakers clubs and more than 22,000 in 4-H programs and activities.

For Extension's agricultural programs, farmers and ranchers volunteer their land, labor and equipment to test and demonstrate new ideas for the benefit of their neighbors. They voluntarily provide information about their farming and ranching operations and in many ways contribute their time and talents to the success of

Extension programs, notes Denmark.

Similarly, the adult home economics program conducted by the Extension Service depends on volunteers. These volunteers take special training to pass the knowledge they gain to their neighbors. They help less fortunate families improve their home life, and they work together in many ways to expand the efforts of Extension programs.

4-H, Extension's program for youth between the ages of 9 and 19, depends almost totally on volunteers who give generously of their time, talents, facilities and money, points out the specialist. Adults and older teens lead the teach 4-H members, organize clubs and project groups, and pro-

vide facilities, equipment, supplies, recognition and awards.

Extension's community development programs also are heavily dependent on the energies and minds of volunteers to develop stronger and better communities.

"A part of Extension's conventional philosophy is to 'help people to help themselves,'" notes Denmark. "During the process of solving their own problems and developing their own opportunities, Extension volunteers develop their abilities to help others with similar problems and opportunities."

Thus volunteers in Extension programs are really "helping people to help others" while they enjoy the self-satisfaction that their involvement brings.

"In today's world of hustle and bustle, getting people to

volunteer becomes more and more difficult," says Denmark. "Most volunteers prefer specific, short-term commitments with a meaningful involvement."

So, for continued effective contributions, volunteers must be developed through a systematic approach whereby they are identified or recruited, selected for the right job, provided orientation and training, and then involved and recognized.

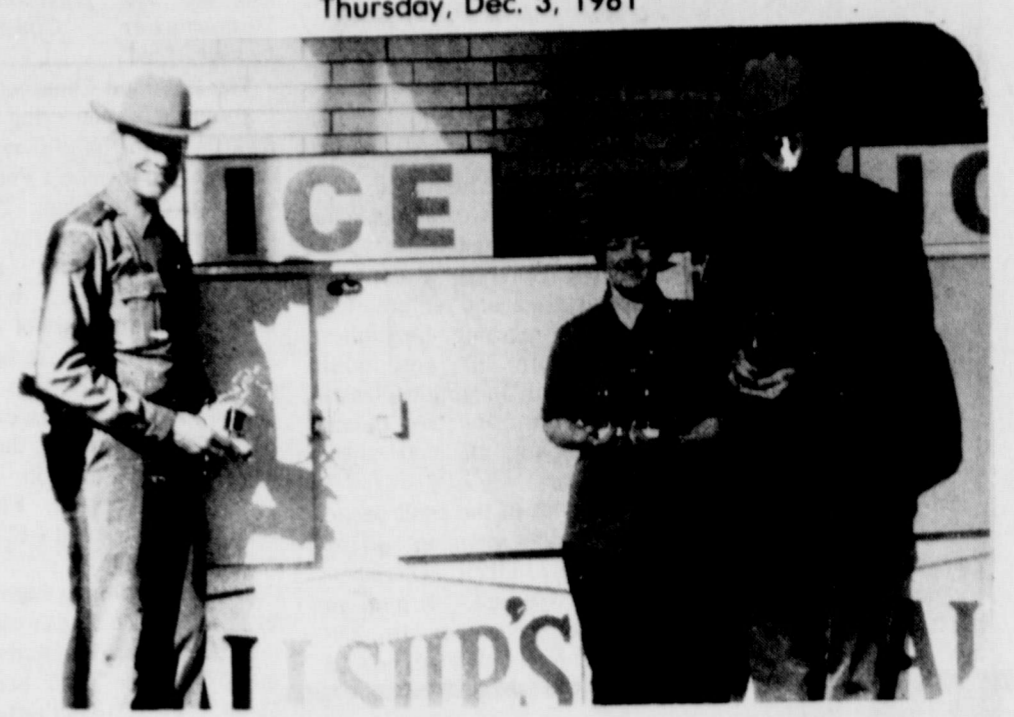

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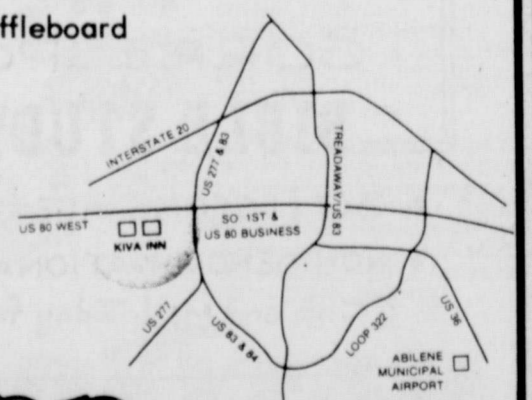

### Comments Sought In Conservation Program

The Secretary of Agriculture has invited the public to comment on the U.S. Department of Agriculture's proposed soil and water conservation program. The Secretary's preferred program features expanded roles for local and state governments and the

targeting of USDA dollars and personnel to conserving critical resource problem areas.

People who are interested in the program, or potentially affected by it, are urged to comment. Responses will be accepted through January

15, 1982, and can be mailed to State Conservationist, Soil Conservation Service (SCS), P.O. Box 648, Temple, Texas 76503.

Ron Bailey, district conservationist for SCS at Eastland said the Secretary's proposed program would concentrate more USDA assistance in areas where soil erosion and other problems threaten to reduce agricultural productive capacity and to increase agriculture production costs.

The program would use local and state conservation coordinating boards to identify critical problem areas, set priorities, and develop program for local and state action to solve the problems.

Bailey said the program is the Secretary's proposed response to the Soil and Water Resources Conservation Act of 1977 (RCA). It is contained in an RCA Program report and a summary leaflet with response form that can be reviewed at the local SCS or Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service offices.

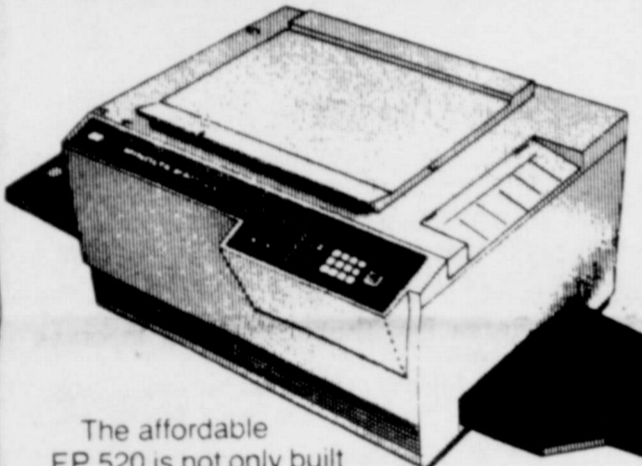

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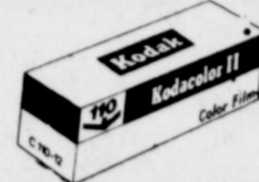

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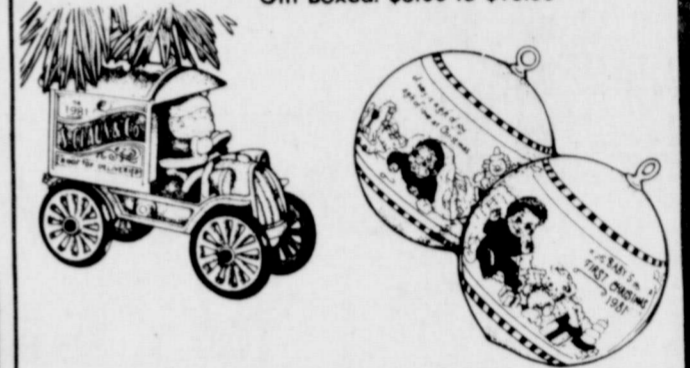
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# People n Things
