Reward Fund Reaches \$4,850 For Garcia Murder Conviction

The reward for information leading to the apprehension and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the murder of Debra Garcia has reached \$4850, Mayor Eris Ritchie has reported. The Cisco mayor is coordinating efforts to increase the reward pledges, and the \$4850 was the total amount pledged as of press time.

The mayor has urged businesses and individuals in Cisco to make pledges to increase the reward even more. "We'd like to see the fund at \$5000 or more, as an additional incentive for anyone who might have knowledge that would be helpful in the case to come forward with it," he said.

Those recently making pledges to the fund are Clyde

and Debra Sublett, \$100; Kimbrough Funeral Home \$50; Stanson Oil Company \$250; Cisco Funeral Home \$50; Tony Gonzales, manager of Allsup's Convenience Store \$100; Ted's & Rex's One Stop \$200 and Slim and Montie Booth and the family of Debra Garcia \$500.

Ritchie stated that a pledge to the reward fund was just that — a pledge — and that the money would not be called for until someone qualified for the reward by providing information leading to the apprehension and conviction of the killer or killers.

Police investigators are still questioning people and running down every lead they can find in efforts to solve the Debra Garcia kidnapping-murder case, authorities reported Tuesday.

A person previously questioned in the case was due to be reexamined and possibly given a polygraph test this week, the report said.

A man arrested in San Antonio last weekend and charged with 21 murders was ruled out of suspicion in the local case, officers said. Reports Monday that a young woman was being held in the case were in error and purely a rumor, officers said.

Mrs. Garcia's body was found near a roadside culvert some four miles west of Cisco on Dec. 1st, two days after her disappearance from work at a local grocery store at about 6:45 a.m. on Nov. 29th.

The individual books on specific plants such as Roses and Chrysanthemums, etc. will provide the gardener the necessary requirements for that particular plant.

Pan: Melt 2 tablespoons

butter or margarine, spread on bottom of 9" x 5" x 3" loaf pan. Sprinkle with 3/4 cup brown sugar, 1 teaspoon cinnamon. Toast 1 cup pecan halves in oven, spread over mixture. Combine 2 tablespoons honey with 2 tablespoons water and drizzle over pecans. Set aside.

Streusel: Mix 3/4 cup chopped pecans, 4 1/2 tablespoons melted butter or margarine, 1/2 cup flour, 1 cup brown sugar, 1 teaspoon cinnamon. Mixture will be very crumbly. Set aside.

Loaf: 1 package dry yeast, 1/4 cup warm water 2 1/4 cups sifted flour, 2 tablespoons sugar, 1 1/4 teaspoons cinnamon, 2 teaspoons baking powder, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/2 cup butter or margarine, 1/2 cup milk, scalded, cooled, 1 egg.

Dissolve yeast in warm water. Set aside. Sift flour, sugar, cinnamon, baking powder, salt together into mixing bowl; cut in butter or margarine until mixture

resembles fine crumbs. Combine yeast with milk, beaten egg and stir into bowl and beat well. Knead about 5 minutes on floured surface until dough is no longer sticky. Roll out to 15 x 10 inch rectangle. Sprinkle with streusel mixture, and roll up from short side (like a jelly roll). Cut into three equal pieces and place in loaf pan, (cut sides up), press lightly. Cover with oiled plastic wrap and let rise in warm place 1 1/2 hours to 2 hours or until even with top of pan. Bake in preheated 350° F. oven on middle rack about 30 minutes. Remove from pan onto rack to cool. Serves 8 to 10.

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
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

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1981 Is Good Year To Itemize

If you "itemize" (use the "long form") on your tax return, 1981 is a "good" year

for deductions, recommends Nancy Granovsky, a family resource management specialist.

The Economic Recovery Act of 1981 will lower tax rates for 1982, so it behooves taxpayers to take deductions before Jan. 1, 1982, she advises.

Granovsky is on the home economics staff of the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, The Texas A&M University System.

For example, if you had planned to contribute money to a favorite charity, church or educational institution anyway, do it now during 1981 - IF YOU ITEMIZE, she says.

If you wait until 1982, your tax benefit on the itemized "long form" will be lower than it is this year. That's because tax rates will drop 10 percent from 1980 rates - starting Jan. 1, 1982.

On the other hand, if you file the "short form," there's no reason to wait until 1982.

That's when you'll be able to add TO YOUR STANDARD DEDUCTION 25 per-

cent of the first \$100 you donate.

The percentage allowed will keep climbing until 1986 when the allowable deduction will be same as for the people who file the "long form."

1982 marks the first time people who file the "short form" will have a chance to deduct any of their charitable contributions even though the allowable deduction is only 25 percent of the first \$100 donated.

Of course, not all donations are tax deductible.

Understanding Is Motivation For Individual Volunteer

Why do people want to give of their spare time to help an organization or promote a cause?

"Understanding the motivation of the individual volunteer is critical to his recruitment, placement, training, on-the-job support and recognition," points out Dr. Bill Jackson of Stephenville, 4-H and youth specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, a state agency that relies heavily on volunteers to help with informal educational programs in agriculture, home economics, and community and youth development.

Although some people still base volunteerism on the philosophy that "it's better to give than to receive," many of today's volunteers have selfish motives, notes Jackson.

"In other words, they view volunteer experience as an opportunity for continuing education through in-service training or they feel the practical experience will provide them with an opportunity to try out a new career before actually deciding on that career," he points out.

Jackson also notes these reasons why people volunteer today:

1. They need a sense of belonging.
2. People profit from a sense of sharing in planning objectives and realizing that these objectives are within reach and make sense.
3. People need to feel that what they are doing has real purpose or contributes to human welfare.
4. They want to share in making the rules.
5. They need responsibilities that challenge.
6. People enjoy seeing progress made toward goals that they helped set.

A recent survey by the Bureau of Labor Statistics showed that people volunteer primarily for humanitarian reasons. Some 200 reasons were listed by

Granovsky reminds taxpayers. Some groups, such as lobbying groups, do not fit the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) definition of "charities" even though the groups themselves may have "tax-exempt" status.

When you donate money to these groups, the donations are not tax deductions for you.

If in doubt about the tax status of any group - or a donation's "tax deductibility" check with the IRS, the specialist says.

Because the IRS will expect proof of your contributions, you should pay by check or get a receipt whenever possible, she adds.

volunteers as to why they give of their time and skills, and these can be grouped into five categories: a sense of duty, to help people, they enjoy volunteer work, they were asked to do volunteer work, and to gain experience, help friends and relatives with volunteer work and aid people suffering from natural disaster or other calamities.

According to Jackson, certain social changes and trends also have brought an increase in volunteer activity:

1. Increased leisure time.
2. Changing status of women, making them feel a need to accomplish and fulfill themselves outside the home.
3. Disappearance of the self-sufficient family, allowing more time to pursue other activities.
4. Many religious groups foster the need to serve.
5. Need to belong, to identify with some group or organization.
6. Desire to gain special knowledge.

7. Opportunity to put talents to work.
8. Desire to meet the expectations of others, to seek approval.
9. Desire for status and community recognition.

"So, people volunteer to help a cause or organization for a multitude of reasons. Being aware of these is important when working with volunteers so that their contributions will benefit both themselves and the organization," notes Jackson.

It is through our acquaintance with the Prince of Peace that we will know and be enabled to have peace reign within us. Praise the Lord for Christmas!

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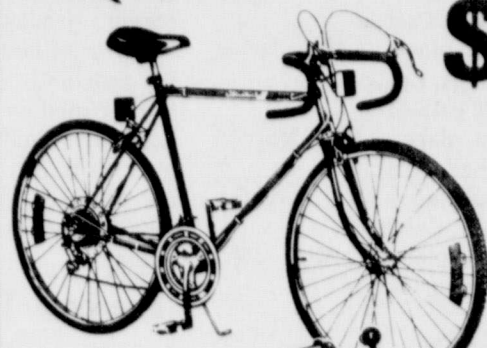
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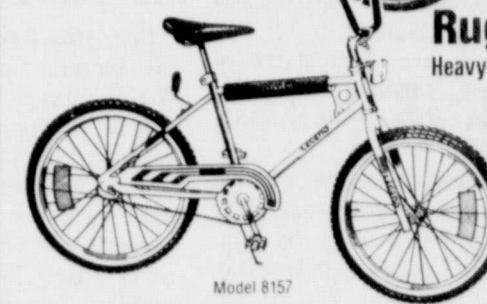
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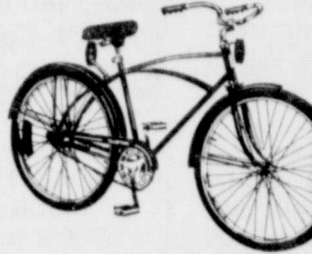
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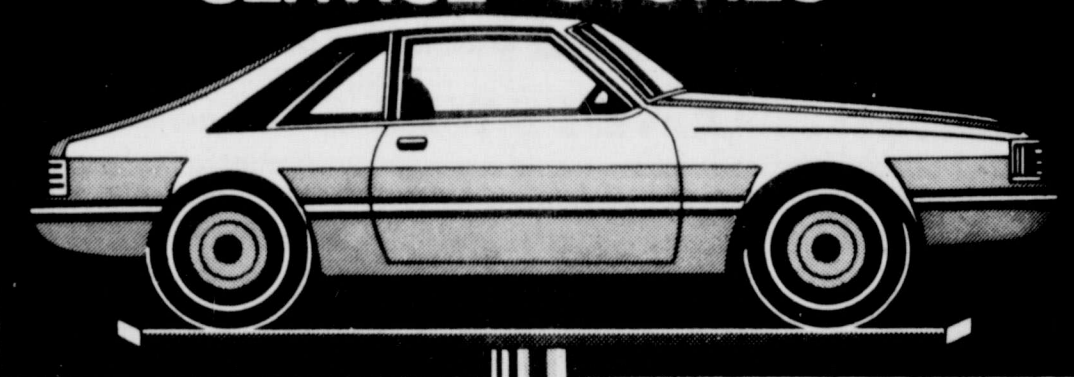
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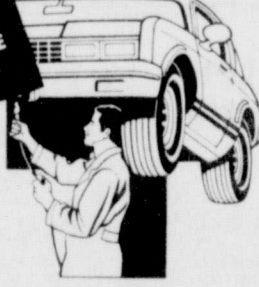
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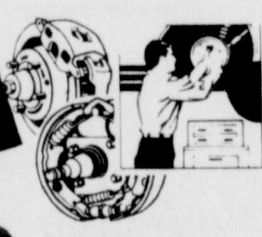
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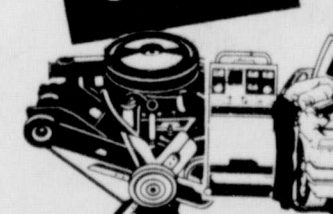

LISTENING TO the car radio, we heard a discussion of a case where a drunk driver, going the wrong way at 60 mph on a one-way street, collided with another car, killing the couple in it. And the drunk driver is now suing the estate of the dead couple for damages.

The drunk got off from murder with a car charges because a blood test that determined the state of his drunkenness was made without his permission! All of which makes us

want to speak in a loud voice about the state of law and order in our country - a country where lawmakers have passed so many laws that virtually prevents convictions and where federal judges have decreed that criminals have so many constitutional rights that all sense of reason is defied.

If the drunk who killed an innocent couple is allowed to collect damages from their estate - and their only wrong was being on a street where he was violating the law -

then there's little hope for ever restoring the kind of justice that made America strong.
