Spring, with its threat of tornados and thunderstorms, represents a serious hazard to mobile home owners who have not protected their homes with tie-down systems, warns David Pickard, Vice President of Underwriting at Foremost Insurance Company. "I urge everyone living in a mobile home to protect themselves, their family and their home by installing a tie-down system immediately," he said.

"When struck by high speed winds, a mobile home can be moved off its supporting foundation or even lifted in the air," Pickard explained. "That's why tie-downs are so important. They prevent the home from moving and reduce much of the damage that can be caused by the wind."

The insurance executive warns that damages to unprotected mobile homes can mount into millions of

dollars. Recent reports of tornados throughout the Midwest underscore the need for tie-downs to protect homes and lives.

Pickard explained that tie-down system consist of metal straps, called frame-ties, which are bolted to the frame of a mobile home, and then secured to an anchor which is buried deep in the ground. He said that over-the-roof ties are longer steel straps which encircle the home from the roof to frame.

"Most mobile home wind damage is caused when the home is pushed off its foundation or moved in some other way. A tie-down

system prevents the damage by preventing movement."

"Determining what kind of tie-downs to use, how many are required and how to install them properly can be difficult questions to answer," Pickard said. Because there are so many questions about tie-downs, Foremost Insurance Company offers a free guide on the subject. 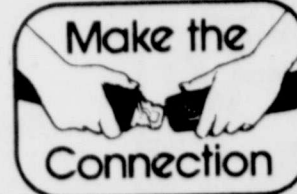

**GROWING PETUNIAS**

The petunia is a tender perennial plant and is a native of South America. It belongs to the Nightshade family, Solanaceae. The word is derived from Petun, a local name for tobacco or Nicotiana, to which Petunia is related, for the Tobacco plant also belongs to the family Solanaceae.

Petunias are exceptionally showy flowers and are used for the summer flower beds and for cultivation in pots in the greenhouse, or in window boxes or pots on the patio. The modern varieties are of

two types, one having large, double blooms which exhibit a remarkable range of coloring; the other small-flowered compact and bearing large number of flowers. Petunias are essentially sun-loving plants and are useless in heavy shade. They will grow, but they will not bloom satisfactorily. They thrive much better in well-drained, rather light soil. They like warmth very much. Petunias are admirable plants for the cultivation in window boxes and patio planters.

Although Petunias are tender perennial plants, they are generally treated as annuals, and raised from seed sown under glass or plastic in the spring. Double varieties do not come perfectly true, but a good proportion of them will bear double flowers, and those which are single will yield large and showy blooms.

The improvement in the colors of Petunia is very marked in the modern varieties. The flowers of some varieties are attractively fringed, others are striped with colors which contrast with the ground color.

To provide plants which will be large enough to plant out of doors in the flower beds and borders when the danger of frost has passed, the seed are sown under glass or plastic towards the end of February or early March. Flats or flower pans should be filled finely sifted potting medium of loam, peat moss or leaf mold. The seeds are sown thinly and covered with merely a sprinkling of the sifted compost. The seedlings should be raised in a temperature of 55-60 degrees. It is necessary to keep the soil always moist, but it must not be overwatered or the seedlings will damp off very quickly. As soon as the seedlings are one inch high and large enough to be handled conveniently, they should be transplanted two to three inches apart in flats or potted in three inch pots filled with the same potting medium they have been growing in.

In transplanting seedlings there is always a temptation to select the largest and finest and, if there are more than are wanted, to destroy the smaller, weaker ones. If this is done when dealing with seedlings raised from seeds of double-flowered Petunias it may be found that most them will produce single blooms. The largest percentage of double flowers is produced by the smaller seedlings.

In the final potting of Petunias to six or seven inch pots be sure to use the same potting medium that the Petunias have been growing in. At this stage add some bone meal and keep the medium damp but not wet. There is also trailing varieties of Petunias that are wonderful for hanging baskets. Petunia can be used in many ways and add a variety of color to your garden. Don't overlook the advantages of Petunias in your garden.

**Money's worth in weight can  
be gained by weighing locally**

Eastland County people can count on getting their money's worth in weight through the year if the products are weighed on local scales or gas pumps, Agriculture Commissioner Reagan V. Brown said today.

In the county there are 367 weighing devices of different types, ranging from 251 fuel pumps to 95 supermarket scales.

"Our Department regularly checks the commercial scales in the county and has found that they conform to our previous surveys across the state. Of those that were above or below tolerance, not many scales were off by significant amounts. Also, as many were giving the customer too much of the product as were giving too little. Because of frequent checks, the scales are not out of calibration very long," Brown said.

"Business owners are glad to see us come in because as often as not, they have been losing money if their scales were not accurate," Brown said.

The Texas Department of Agriculture has inspectors assigned to every county. They are trained to check all different types of scales—from those for medicines in a pharmacy to those for livestock and grain.

The inspectors also spot check packaged goods, such as cereals and crackers, to make certain that the weight stated on the label is accurate. If on the average the weights of the packages are below the amount state don the label, the shipment is put on a Stop-Sale order. The store owner then either returns the items to the processor or as is the case very often, gives them to charitable organizations. Meat packaged in the supermarket as well as processor packs are also checked by Department inspectors.

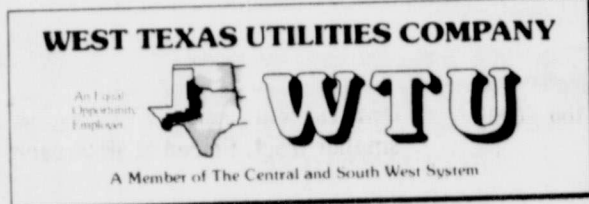

## Dr. Suggs named Regional Christian Church Minister

Dr. James C. Suggs of Austin, who has served as executive director of the Texas Conference of Churches since 1978, has been called as regional minister of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in the Southwest.

The call was issued at a special meeting of the CCSW board April 12 in Fort Worth. At the same meeting, board members approved preliminary planning and expenditure for a \$5 million capital fund campaign - primarily for new church development - to be launched this fall.

When Suggs begins work at CCSW headquarters in Fort Worth in mid-June he will be "coming home" to the office where he has twice

served on the staff - most recently as associate regional minister and editor of The Christian Courier from 1969 to 1973.

Although he will be on the job this summer, Suggs will not be formally installed as regional minister until October, when the Christian Church in the Southwest meets in biennial regional assembly in Amarillo.

At the same assembly, Harrell A. Rea, who has been regional minister since 1973, will be honored on the occasion of his retirement.

During the transition period between Suggs' arrival and the assembly, he and Rea will work together.

A search committee headed by Lina Hanna Walling of Richardson considered ap-

plications of many candidates before narrowing the field to Suggs. His nomination by the committee was unanimously approved by the board April 12.

As regional minister, he will work with 467 churches in Texas and New Mexico, representing approximately 90,000 participating members and will be administrative officer of the regional program of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ).

Before moving to Austin in 1978 to head the ecumenical state-level Conference of Churches, Suggs was president of Christian Church Services, one of the general administrative units of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), with offices in In-

dianapolis. He helped form that national organization in 1973 by bringing together departments from several units working in communication, financial services and administrative services.

A native Texan, he was reared in the East Texas oil field near the discovery well at Joinerville. He was baptized and ordained in First Christian Church of Hender-

son. He is a graduate of Texas Christian University and its Brite Divinity School and was awarded an honorary doctor of divinity degree by Bethany College in West Virginia in 1977.

In addition to his earlier years on the CCSW staff, the regional minister-elect directed the Disciples' international office of communication from 1961 to 1968 and was managing editor of The Christian, now The Disciple, from 1968 to 1969.

Suggs is a former national president of the Religious Public Relations Council, a professional association, and

is a member of the National Association of Ecumenical Staff. In 1977, he edited a book about Disciples beliefs, "This We Believe."

A pioneer in Disciples public relations, he won national recognition for his efforts in a Southwest Regional campaign to promote Reconciliation the church's race and poverty program.

His wife, Lynell Burgess Suggs, died early this year. He is the father of two children - Laura Gail, a speech pathologist in the Hurst-Euleless-Bedford (Texas) School District, and James Dale, a junior at Texas Christian University.
