## Farmers are encouraged to purchase crop insurance

In the view of many lenders, there's something farmers today Eastland County should be doing with money between the time they borrow it and the time they spend it: they should insure it. According to Ardell M. Kalmbach, All-Risk Insurance Director for Eastland County, more and more lenders are urging farm borrowers to carry a crop insurance policy large enough to at least cover their short-term production debts.

Kalmbach points out that even though All-Risk insurance for wheat is now available primarily through private insurance agents, the policies continue to be fully backed by the USDA's Federal Crop Insurance Corporation. The federal government also pays up to 30 percent of the cost for farmers who qualify for the insurance.

"The premium subsidy and tax deductions make All-Risk insurance an extremely affordable way to be certain of having enough income to repay crop production loans when they come due and thus avoid additional interest costs," according to Kalmbach.

Wheat growers who carry insurance on their 1983 crops are offered a selection of yield guarantees as well as a choice as to the amount they want to be paid for each bushel of loss. This flexibility makes it possible to adjust their insurance coverage to their need for protection.

The deadline to obtain insurance on wheat in Eastland County is Sept. 15, 1982. Farmers can obtain a list of local insurance agents from the ASCS office in Eastland.

### OIL COMPANIES

About ten years back, the big major oil companies had a big meeting in New York City and one of the things that came out of the meeting was a declaration "let the so and so's freeze to death in the dark"

This is just what they thought of us, their customers, who used up their products and brought them to where they are today.

This meeting was the beginning of the tremendous price increases for oil related products.

Most people are of the opinion that we have been ripped off by major oil companies. There can be no reason or any excuse either for oil going up from about three to more than thirty dollars per barrel. The oil companies were doing pretty good at three dollars per barrel.

Since the big raises in prices, profits have soared to a point that is unbelievable.

Gas has also gone up beyond reason and our gas reserves are the largest in history, there is no shortage and more wells being brought in daily.

There was a time you could pass along the road and see a gasoline plant, most of which belonged to an independent oil operator. All of these small companies have long since been put out of business.

They control the price of the crude oil, refinery prices, wholesale, retail and pump prices. This is certainly a monopoly in the true sense of the word.

The major companies should be broken down to (1) exploration and drilling (2) production (3) refining and (4) sales.

Competition among these smaller companies would become tremendous and the oil business would go back to work again.

## Pest Alert

### LEAFMINERS

Do you still have tomatoes or peppers in production? Have you planted any fall beans of peas? If you have then you may notice a particular insect problem - the serpentine leafminer.

This insect pest eats the leaf tissue between the upper and lower leaf surfaces, leaving slender, white winding tunnels through the leaf's interior. This pest is the larval stage of a small shiny black fly with yellow markings. The larval maggot is 1/8 inch long, white, legless and wedge shaped. The maggots are not readily observed because of the tunneling habit.

The adult fly lays pale white eggs into plant tissues. The eggs hatch in about 4 days. The maggot mines the leaves for about 5 days. The entire life cycle of the fly averages about 23 days. Several overlapping generations occur each year.

Damage from this pest often does not produce levels which warrant control. Many natural enemies attack this pest. However, if tunneling becomes excessive, photosynthesis can be impaired and yield reduced. If chemical control is elected, diazinon is the most recommended insecticide. Allow at least three days between application and harvest.

Another insect currently attacking tomatoes are tomato pin worms. These are the larval stage of a small gray moth. Larvae invade the stems and fruits. The larvae tunnel through the fruit spoiling it. Sevin is the recommended insecticide. This pest may be difficult to control.

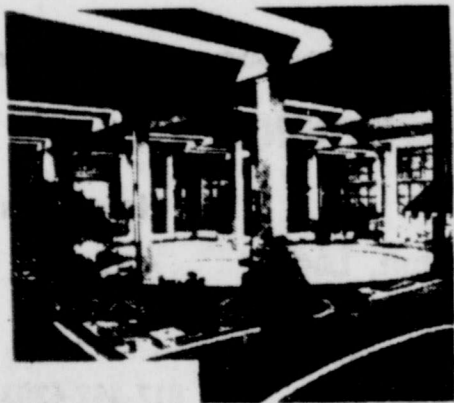

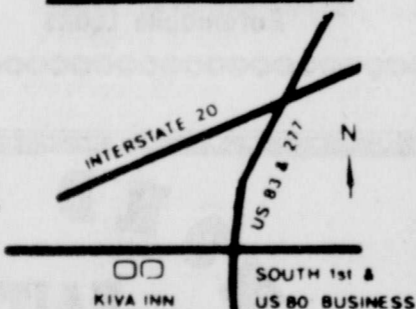

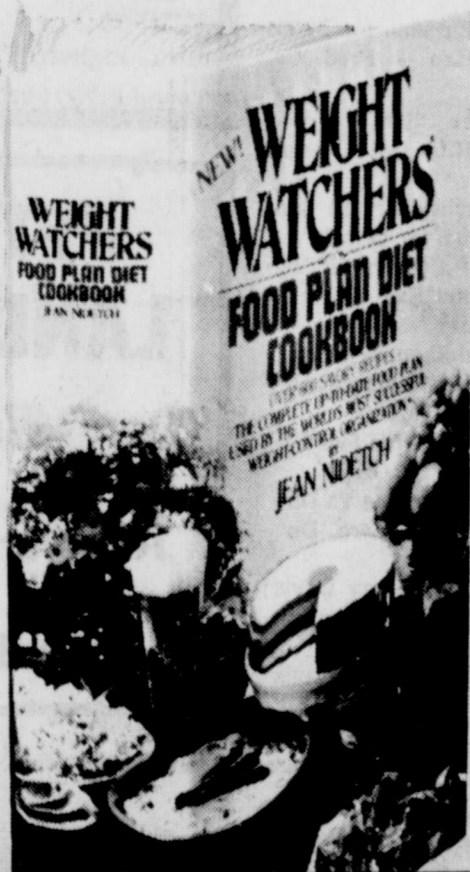

## Homemaking Hints

Energy savings that stem from laundry-room tactics can be dramatic, but laundry mistakes can become a pocketbook tragedy.

Know your laundry's performance capabilities and limits before trying to save energy - at your own expense.

Energy conservation in the laundry room starts with lower water temperatures for the washer, but don't switch to cooler temperatures until you know how to use them.

In water below 60 degrees F., detergents become ineffective. Also, lower water temperatures affect a granular detergent's ability to dissolve. The colder the water, the slower a powder will dissolve.

So use a liquid laundry detergent - or predissolve a granular one - if you want to use lower water temperatures.

You can't always use cool temperatures for the best effect, either. For removing certain soils, such as oily or greasy stains, hot water at about 140 degrees F. is a must.

Otherwise, heavily soiled laundry may become gray and dingy if you wash it in cool or cold water several times.

Cool-wash cycles definitely have their place in today's complex world of textiles and advancements in treatments for them. Many washes require warm, cool or cold water because of color, fiber content or finish of fabrics.

Another energy conservation tactic sometimes focuses on cramming washers and dryers too full of laundry items.

Don't allow your clothes "standing room only" - they need "elbow room" so enough wash water and dry air can reach them.

If you crowd them, clothes won't wash clean, and some may not dry enough.

Also, excessive abrasion of clothes can occur when a

washer is overloaded or when too-little water is used, and this can cause "pilling" or balling up of man-made fibers on clothes.

Bleach is another possible disaster in the laundry room as consumers use more of it to help overcome the "dingies" that result from using too-little detergent or too-cool water.

Some polyester/cotton blends and 100 percent cottons have chemical finishes that actually "grab and hold" chlorine bleach. These fabrics should warn you of this.

Read labels and follow instructions so you don't ruin them by trying to use bleach.

For most all other fabrics, overuse or misuse of bleach will result in damage such as rips and tears. Again, read labels - especially the one on bleach containers.

Always siltate bleach before it comes into contact with clothes.

When using a bleach dispenser, add bleach before loading the water with clothes to avoid accidentally spilling bleach on dry clothes.

Finally, make learning the ropes about laundry - and energy savings - a family affair. With more women working outside the home, laundry often is done by husbands and children, so all family members need to

know about laundry "do's" and "don'ts."

### RECIPE FOR THE WEEK:

If you are tired of cooking and eating the same old thing, here is a good chicken-spinach quiche.

### CHICKEN-SPINACH QUICHE

1 nine (9) inch pie shell  
butter or margarine  
1 green onion, minced  
2 cups half and half  
1 teaspoon salt  
1/8 teaspoon pepper  
3 eggs

1/4 pound Swiss cheese, shredded (1 cup)  
1 (10 oz.) package frozen chopped spinach, thawed and squeezed dry  
1 (5 to 6 3/4 oz) can chunk chicken, drained and flaked.

Spread pie crust with 1 tablespoon softened butter or margarine. Preheat oven to 425 F. In 1 quart saucepan over medium heat, health 2 tablespoons butter or margarine; add green onion and cook until tender, stirring occasionally. Remove saucepan from heat; set aside.

In medium bowl with wire whisk or fork, mix half and half, salt, pepper, and eggs; stir in cheese, spinach, chicken, and green-onion mixture; pour into pie crust. Bake 15 minutes; turn oven control to 325 F.; and bake 30 minutes longer or until knife inserted in center comes out clean. Makes 6 servings.

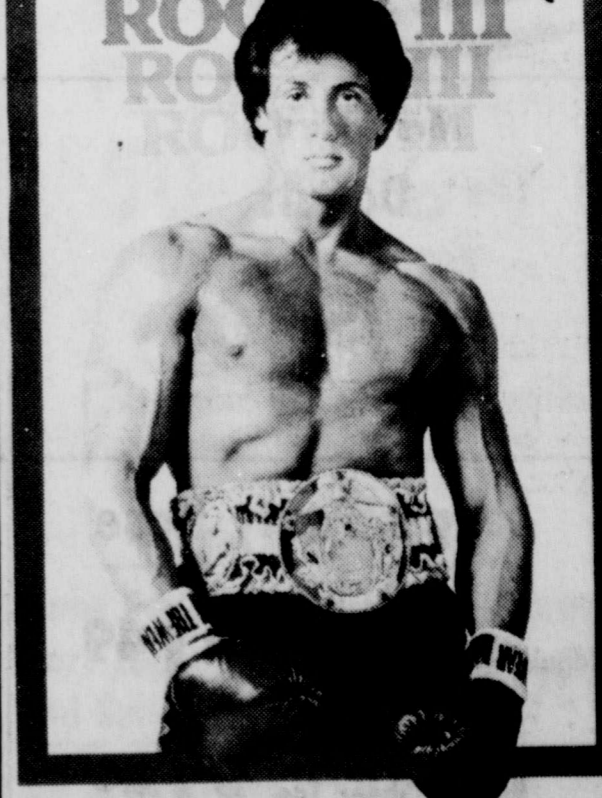

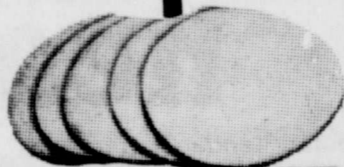

# Strake Talk

### TWO TERMS IS ENOUGH

Texans have a healthy skepticism of their elected officials, a wariness of entrenched power that they have embodied in the state constitution. They have historically refused to keep top state officeholders more than a few terms.

Now my opponent comes along, having spent nearly ten years in the Lt. Governor's office, one of the top state policy-making offices. Mr. Hobby wants yet another term to make it 14 years in that crucial job. That is unprecedented. Never in Texas' history has any Lt. Governor served that long—or wanted to.

His desire, frankly, puzzles me. You would think he would have other goals, other challenges he might want to tackle. As his primary opponent this year said, "If he had anything to get done, you'd think he would have done it by now."

My opponent will tell you that experience is what counts. I think voters need

to look at the experience they have had with him. After ten years, our highways are in bad shape, the quality of education has declined, we still do not have a new, statewide water plan and he has refused to tackle the growing crime problem. We can't afford more of that kind of experience.

I have a long-held belief in what I call the citizen-politician: someone who holds a job, serves his country or state for a reasonable time, then returns to that job and private life. For that reason, the first order of business after I am elected will be to have a constitutional amendment introduced in the legislature limiting the Lt. Governor to two terms—eight years. That is enough time for anyone. Too great a concentration of power for too long is bad. That is a principle of democracy.

# GORDON SPOT

by DeMarquis Gordon

Watering is one of the most basic practices in the maintenance of a home lawn. During our dry summers it may become absolutely necessary to water a lawn in order to assure its survival. With the increasing cost of water, and in some areas the reduced availability of water, it becomes even more important to water the lawn correctly and when establishing a new lawn give consideration to those tur-

grasses which require less water. The following grasses are listed in the order of their requirement for water. The first requires the most and the last requires the least amount of water: Tall Fescue, St. Augustine, "Tif" Bermuda, Zoysia, Common Bermuda, Buffalograss. There are a number of factors that should be considered when developing a watering program for lawn. Newly seeded or sprigged

lawns should be watered lightly at frequent intervals while established lawns should be watered heavily at infrequent intervals. During the period of seed germination or the growth of sprigs, it is important to keep the soil moist - not wet. After the new plants are visible the frequency of watering should be reduced gradually, and after about one month the lawn should be watered like an established lawn.

Water penetrates a sandy soil much faster than a clay soil, so lawns grown on sandy soils will require more frequent watering than those grown on soils that are high

in clay. Because water moves fairly slowly into a clay soil, the rate at which water is applied to this type of lawn should be as slow as possible.

Lawns with a high degree of slope present a particular problem. It is very easy for water to run down the slope without penetrating the soil. Water must be applied at very slow rates from sprinklers near the top of the slope. Sprinklers near the bottom of the slope may prove ineffective.

The faster the lawn grows, the more water it requires. The new slow release fertilizers that contain materials like sulfur-coated urea or ureaformaldehyde as nitrogen sources do not tend to produce high growth rates. Heavy applications of fertilizers high in soluble nitrogen should be avoided.

The use of an aerifier or coring device will aid in increasing movement of water into the soil. A surfactant or wetting agent may also aid the movement of water into high clay soils.

Ideally a lawn should be watered just as it begins to wilt. Most grasses take on a dull, dark appearance and the leaf blades begin to fold or roll. Grass under stress also shows evidence of tracks after someone walks across the lawn. A common bermudagrass lawn should be able to go at least 5 days between waterings.

Early morning is considered the best time to water. The wind is usually calm and the temperature is low so less water is lost to

evaporation. The worst time to water is late evening because the lawn tends to stay wet all night making the lawn more susceptible to disease.

When a lawn needs water, enough should be applied so that the soil is wetted to a depth of 4-6 inches. One to 1-1/2 inches of water should wet the soil to a depth of 4-6 inches. If the water applications are too light and too frequent, the turf tends to become weak and shallow rooted which makes it more susceptible to heat and drought stress.

## Registration drive underway

Gov. Clements has proclaimed the period of Aug. 11, 1982 through Oct. 3 as the official period for a statewide "Voter Registration Drive."

Based on the fact that only two out of every three eligible voters in Texas are registered to vote, eligible voters not currently registered to vote must be encouraged to do so by October 3, -the date by which Texans must be registered to vote in the State's November 2, general election.

In conjunction with the Governor's Proclamation, the Secretary of State's Office has initiated an extensive voter registration drive. Organizations across the State and the media are being asked to participate in this effort. In addition, an effort will again be made to contact eligible high school students to urge them to register to vote.

### VOTER REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Qualifications for Voting:

1. You must be a citizen of the United States.
  2. You must be at least 18 years of age on the day of the election.
  3. You must be a resident of the county, or political subdivision conducting the election.
  4. You must be registered to vote.
- Persons Not Entitled to Vote:
1. Those convicted of a felony whose full rights of citizenship have not been restored.
  2. Those persons found mentally incompetent by a court of law.

How to Register to Vote:

1. Complete a post card application for voter registration and mail it postage-free or present it in person to the voter registrar in your county.

2. You may register to vote at any time, but your application must be received by your county Voter Registrar by October 3, 1982 in order to vote in the November 2, 1982 general election. Because October 3, 1982 falls on a Sunday, persons wishing to register in person at the voter registrar's office by the October 3rd deadline must do so no later than the close of business, Friday, October 1, 1982.

3. You may register to vote if you are at least 17 years and 10 months of age, but you may not vote until you are 18 years of age.

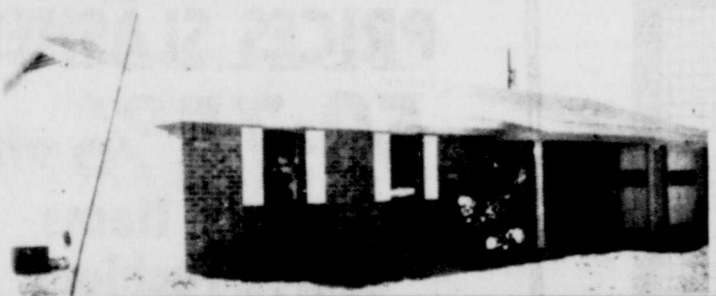

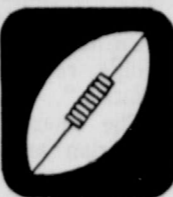
