





# CJC Board Of Regents Sets New Tax Rate For 1985

A tax rate for 1985 was set, four new faculty members were employed and a new building for the Clyde branch was accepted by the board of regents of Cisco Junior College at their monthly meeting last Monday night at the college.

In other action, the board named two streets on College Hill and appointed several committees to handle long-range planning for improvements at the college, according to a report by Dr. Henry E. McCullough, president.

The tax rate set at 17.7 cents per \$100 valuation as compared with 14.5 cents last year. The raise was necessitated by a drop in college district property valuations from some \$155,000,000 to \$137,000,000. Dr. McCullough said. The 17.7 cents tax rate is expected to raise a budget of some \$242,000 for the coming school year.

## City Seal Coats 27 1/2 Blocks

The City of Cisco has completed seal coating 27 1/2 blocks of pavement in the city limits this year using city personnel and equipment according to City Manager Mike Moore. He stated the seal coating projects are being done by a priority list and are being paid for from the general fund.

Mr. Moore stated paving such as the Front Street projects, and the proposed paving of West 17th Street, is contracted out to other crews and is paid for from the oil and gas fund of the city.

City crews are currently working on an area near the football stadium which will seal coat 1 1/2 blocks and is scheduled to be finished before football season begins.

The city plans on trying to finish an additional 24 1/2 blocks of paving before the project is ended for this year. Mr. Moore said he feels the crews will probably be able to continue working up until the first part of November, and any streets not paved this year on the list, will be added on to the streets planned for next year.

Those areas which have been seal coated this year are: two blocks on East 10th from Avenue A to Beech; two blocks on East 11th from Avenue A to Beech; 7 1/2 blocks on Beech from East 8th to East 11th and from the I-20 Access to East 21st; one block on Ash from East 10th to East 11th; five blocks on West 11th from Hilton Avenue to Avenue I; five blocks on Avenue H from West 8th to West 13th; and five blocks on Avenue I from West 8th to West 13th.

### Firemen Make Grass Fire Call

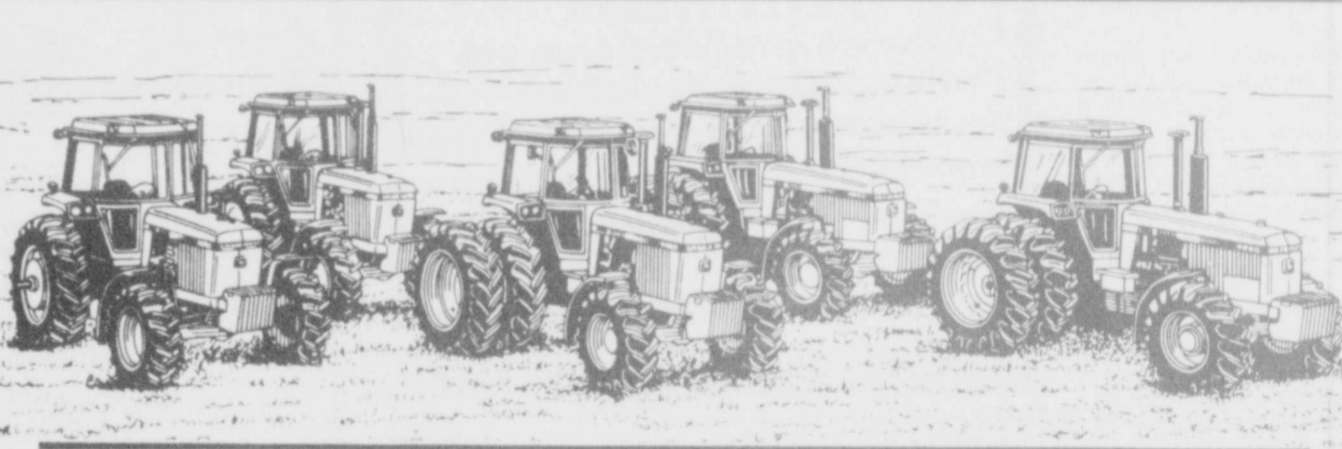

## Lions Hear Advantages Of Prepared Will Here

A properly prepared will that provides for the distribution of property and assets can save a lot of time, court costs and legal fees. Attorney Virgil T. Seaberry, Jr., of Eastland told the Cisco Lions Club in a talk Wednesday noon at their weekly luncheon.

Next to a last will and testament, a power of attorney should be executed by both men and women to enable their spouses or other to manage their estates or properties in the event of serious illness or disability. Mr. Seaberry said. A power of attorney would permit business as usual with a minimum of delay and expense, he added.

"Everybody should have a will," Mr. Seaberry said. "It is not unusual for a will to be unnecessary in estate settlements, but it is there if needed. A will is your opportunity to say where your property goes. And it can save your estate a lot of money in court and legal costs."

Mr. Seaberry said it would be possible for a properly prepared will to save money in inheritance taxes that are levied by both the state and federal governments when estates exceed \$300,000 in value. Recent legislation provides for the estate values to go up to \$600,000 in the next few years before inheritance taxes are levied.

Hand written wills are legal but often don't say the right things, Mr. Seaberry said. "If you write your own will, it would be a good idea to let an attorney look at it," he added. "Don't scratch out anything in your will--rewrite it. Revise your will as circumstances change."

He said both men and women need wills.

Council members voted in agreement to award a bid for a 40-acre grass lease on a portion of the airport property to Odell Rains. Mr. Rains sent in the only bid and it was in the amount of \$150 per year. All members present voted in favor of the bid except council member Rains who abstained.

The council also heard a request from Barry White on behalf of Ray Richey & Company, Inc., for a one year extension of an oil and gas lease acquired from Tidwell Investments, Inc. City Attorney Billy Wright, Jr., recommended to the council that it advertise the lease for bids in accordance with law.

Members of the council voted to deny the request of Ray Richey & Company, Inc., and to advertise the lease for bid. They told Mr. White that his company would be able to bid on the lease and would be informed of the bid date. All members voted in favor of the motion except Mr. Rains who abstained.

City manager Moore informed the council that bids for the paving of West 17th Street will be opened Monday, August 20, at 3 p.m., and he requested that the

council meet at 4 p.m. to award the bid.

Sue Taylor asked the council, during citizen-council discussion, to consider a request to pave West 21st Street, due to recent heavy traffic in that area. The council said Mrs. Taylor's request would be reviewed and possibly added to a waiting list currently being worked from, but they did not see how the street could be paved this year.

C.W. Guthrie of the Cisco Volunteer Fire Department requested the council con-

sider a way of having local citizens remove obstructions from local alleyways, so fire trucks might enter the alleys in the case of an emergency. He stated some alleys are blocked by parked or broken-down automobiles, trailers, etc., and the fire trucks cannot pass through the alley, losing valuable time in the event of a fire.

The council said they felt that if citizens were made aware of the problem, they would probably cooperate and remove the obstructions.

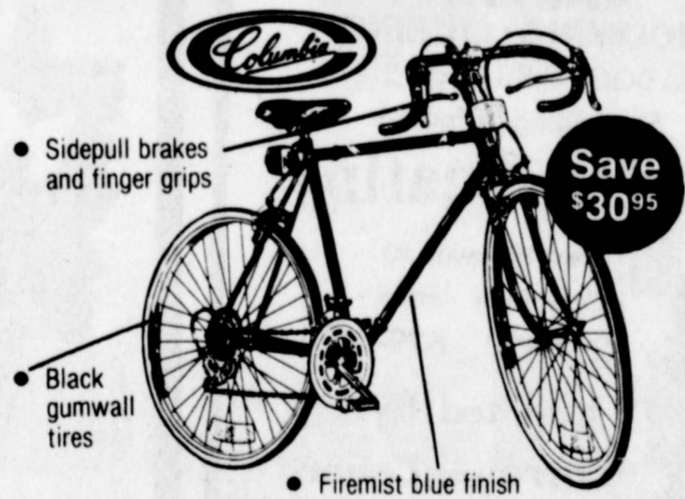

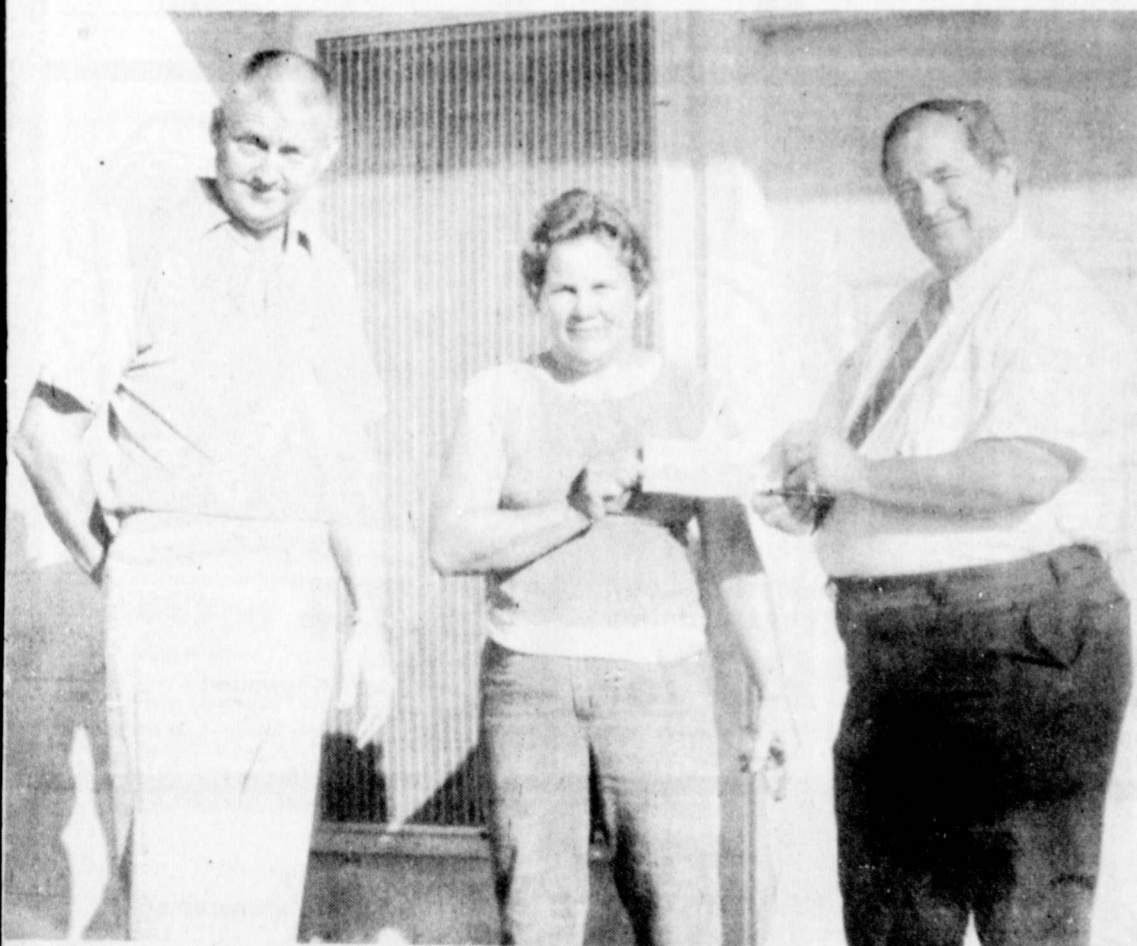

## Catholics Prepare For Fall R.C.I.A.

The Catholic community of Eastland, Cisco, Ranger and Strawn, is preparing for the Fall RCIS (rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) program, scheduled to begin in October. This program reintroduces the early Church's Catechumenate Program. It is for adults who are interested in learning about the Catholic Faith and/or becoming a member of the Catholic Church. The RCIA Program takes the candidates through well-defined stages during their preparation which is seen as the Journey of Faith.

The first of these stages of study and growth is called EVANGELIZATION and is a time of inquiry. It consists of six sessions which allow the inquirer to hear the call of God and how this is experienced and celebrated in the Catholic Community. After these six sessions there is a period of discernment to allow the candidates time to determine if they wish to be

formally initiated and continue the program. The initiation takes place in a Rite of Enrollment on the First Sunday of Advent for those that choose to continue their Faith Journey.

The second stage of study and growth is called: CATECHUMENATE - During this time each candidate will receive a sponsor, preferably some church member they already know. There are 13 sessions in this stage. We look at the life of the Church in greater-detail by studying and experiencing: Prayer; Jesus; Ministry; Morality; Sin; Forgiveness; Reconciliation; Marriage; Faith; The Community of Faith; Church History, with sessions for questions. At the end of this stage those candidates who choose to continue will participate in the Rite of Election of Catechumens on the First Sunday of Lent. The Bishop presides over this ceremony

at the Cathedral in Fort Worth. The ceremony draws many candidates from throughout the Diocese of Fort Worth.

The third stage of study and growth is called: PERIOD OF ENLIGHTENMENT - The Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist are studied as well as their implications for our life, death and resurrection. This consists of five sessions.

After this Faith Journey, those who decide to become members of the Catholic Community are initiated during the Easter Vigil Service. This is the traditional time that new members become part of the Christian Community from the earliest times of the Church.

There will be two follow-up sessions after the Easter Vigil Initiation. All sessions will be held on Thursday evenings from 7:30 to 8:30 in Saint Rita's Church Hall in Ranger.
