Business Activity will Observe Holiday; Locals Will Be On T.V.

While virtually all business activity will be observing a holiday, many residents of this area will observe the Thanksgiving holiday Thursday watching the Cisco Junior College Band and Belles in the annual Macy's Thanksgiving Parade on national television.

The Band and Belles were in New York City along with more than 200 area residents for the annual parade that is due to commence on local television at about 9 a.m. (central time). Mayor Eris Ritchie, who was serving as coordinator for the trip, estimated that the Ciscoans would be on television

screens between 9:15 and 9:45 a.m. Thursday.

Chamber of Commerce Manager Randy Speegle reported that most Cisco retail stores and virtually all offices and manufacturing plants would be closed Thursday in observance of the holiday. Convenience stores planned to be open as usual.

The Cisco Public Schools planned to turn out classes at 2:30 p.m. Wednesday for the weekend, and Cisco Junior College expected to complete the last pre-holiday classes at 4 p.m. Wednesday. Schools will resume normal routine on Monday, Nov. 26.

The Cisco Rotary Club cancelled its regular weekly

luncheon on Thursday due to the Thanksgiving holiday. The First National Bank, Olney Savings and the Cisco Post Office were among those announcing plans to be closed Thursday.

The City of Cisco will close city hall offices Thursday and Friday, giving employees a long weekend. The garbage truck and the landfill will be open on Saturday as usual, the announcement said.

Eastland County's courthouse offices announced plans to close Thursday and Friday for Thanksgiving.

The Band and Belles and their big number of supporters began leaving the

campus at 3 a.m. Tuesday. Three chartered buses took Director Tim Jones and the Band and a contingent of fans to DFW Airport where they departed for New York at 7 a.m. Mr. Ritchie, Director Nicki Harle and the Belles and another big group of supporters left the campus in four chartered buses at 5:30 a.m. They flew to New York at 8:40 a.m.

The program called for the Cisco group to arrive in time for lunch in New York and for an afternoon sight-seeing tour. The band includes 55 musicians with Kim Lacy of Bangs as drum major. Twenty-nine Belles made the trip. Debbie Rodriguez of Fort Worth is their captain.

This was to be Macy's 58th annual Thanksgiving Day parade in New York City, and this was the 5th time the CJC Band and Belles had been invited to march there. Their previous trips were in 1971, 1973, 1977 and 1981.

Neal Moore, 83, prominent Cisco resident, made the trip with the group and he planned to dress as a cowboy clown and march with the Band and Belles.

The Cisco delegation was scheduled to stay at the Southgate Tower Hotel, and their tour plans called for trips to the Statue of Liberty, the United Nations and other sites. They also planned to visit Radio City Music Hall and the New York Experience Theater.

Plans called for the Ciscoans to fly home late Friday and to arrive in Cisco around 10:30 p.m. Friday.

Goodfellows Get Requests

The Goodfellows of Cisco had received a total of 26 applications for baskets this Christmas by Tuesday of this week. The deadline for applying with the Goodfellows is December 10.

"My husband has a very serious illness and is unable to work at this time," writes a family of four in their application. "He very much wants to work and support his family and also wants to help others in need but is not able to do so. Our major concern is for our two very precious children. It is their needs I am asking for help for."

The application continued, "Whether the Goodfellows are able to help us or not, we strongly believe in what you are doing and have enclosed what money (25 cents) we can spare at this time. Ultimately, we know God will take care of us. May God bless you for what you are doing."

A single parent writes, "I haven't had a steady job in over two years. I take care of my two boys and elderly mother, who is 81 years old and lives next door. I do odd jobs to help support them, but there is never enough to go around. Your help would be gratefully appreciated."

Another family lists their reason for asking the Goodfellows for help as "low income and got five in school and one at home and I know my income will be lower as winter comes."

A family with children ages 2 and 4 writes, "My husband has been out of work for over a year, but has a new job for only a week. We do not have our water or gas on because we can't afford to turn them on yet. There won't be much Christmas for our two little ones at our house without your help. Anything you can do to help us will be deeply appreciated. Thank you."

These applications, along with a score of others which echo the same needs, are being received daily by the Goodfellows. The Cisco

organization plans to help as many as financially possible this Christmas season.

But, without proper funds they will be unable to help all those who ask for help. Goodfellows are requesting that those who are more fortunate help these families in need who can not help themselves. The local organization has filed for a tax exempt status so contributions will be tax deductible.

All solicitation for funds will be made through The Cisco Press and everyone is urged to donate to this worthy cause. The money you give will be used to make some local, needy families a little happier at Christmas this year.

Letters of request for help from any family in Cisco are invited for review by the Goodfellows Board of Directors. The letters of request must be accompanied by an official Goodfellows application which may be picked up at the Cisco Chamber of Commerce office, 619 Conrad Hilton Avenue.

HALL OF REMARKS

I HOPE YOU and your family have a very Happy Thanksgiving this Thursday. Be sure and remember to give thanks to our Maker, since without Him we would have nothing to give thanks.

The program for the community Thanksgiving service held at First Methodist Church Sunday night contained a thought-provoking excerpt from Abraham Lincoln's Thanksgiving Proclamation in 1863.

It hits close to home and could have been written today. It is reprinted here as follows:

"We have been the recipients of the choicest bounties of Heaven; we have been preserved these many years in peace and prosperity; we have grown in numbers, wealth, and power as no other nation has ever grown.

"But, we have forgotten God. We have forgotten the gracious hand which preserved us in peace and multiplied and enriched and strengthened us. We have vainly imagined, in the deceitfulness of our hearts, that all these blessings were produced by some superior wisdom and virtue of our own. Intoxicated with unbroken success, we have become too self-sufficient to

feel the necessity of redeeming and preserving grace, too proud to pray to the God that made us."

THE FIRST United Methodist Church newsletter of Nov. 6, 1984, also contained a very interesting article which is being reprinted here:

FUNERAL HELD FOR CHURCH IN OKLAHOMA
A new minister in a small Oklahoma town spent the first four days desperately calling on the membership, begging them to come to his first services. He failed.

He placed a notice in the local newspapers, stating that as the church was dead, it was his duty to give it a decent Christian burial. The funeral would be held the following Sunday afternoon, the notice said.

Morbidly curious, the whole town turned out. In front of the pulpit, they saw a high coffin, smothered in flowers.

The minister read the obituary and delivered a eulogy; he then invited his congregation to step forward and pay their respects to the dearly beloved who had departed.

The long line filed by. Each mourner peeped into the coffin and then turned away with a guilty, sheepish look. For, in the coffin tilted at the correct angle, was a large mirror. Everyone saw himself.

The church is alive — always the question is — "Are we alive?"

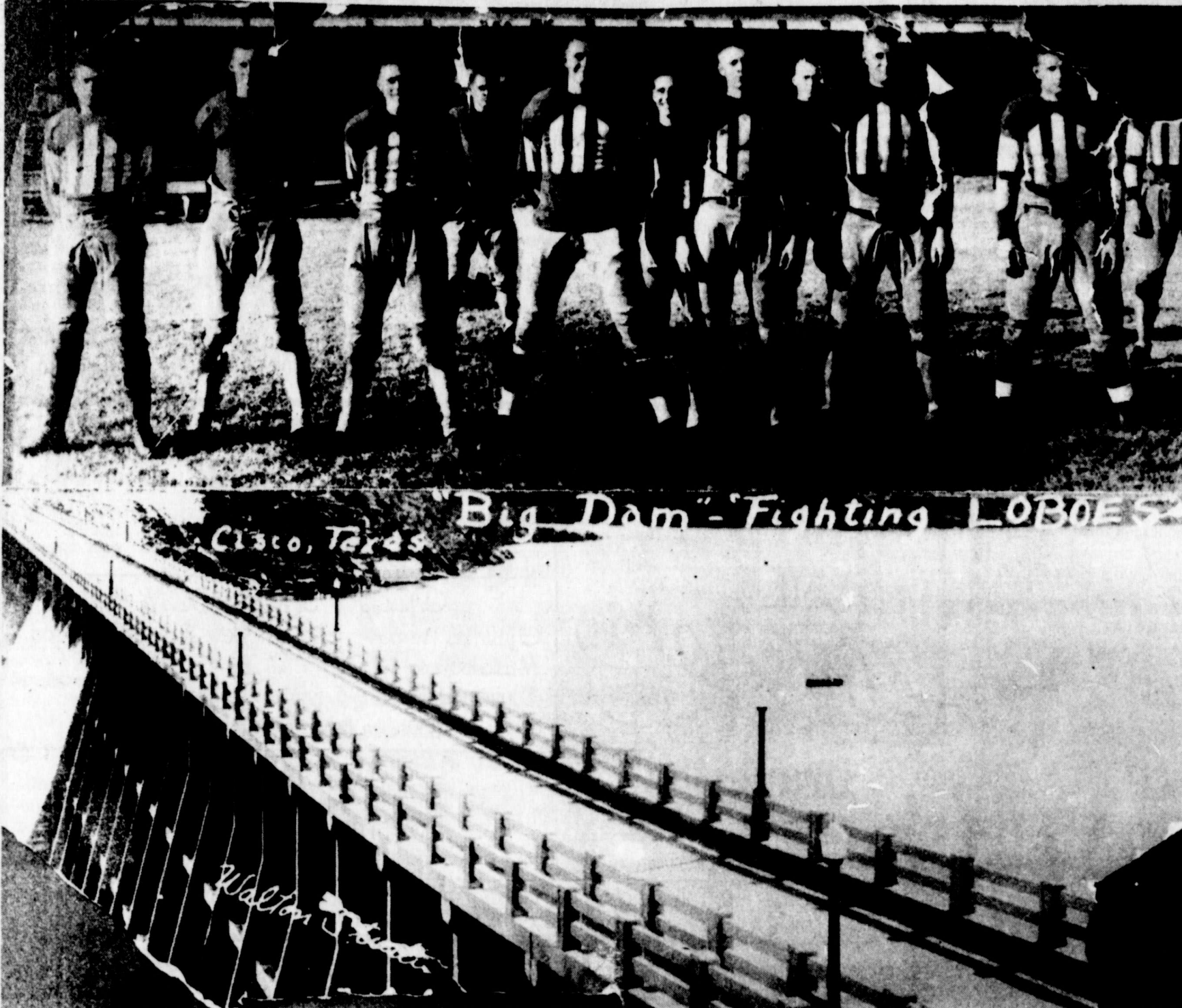

Eastland Commission Hears Report

Wayne Snyder of Fort Worth presented a feasibility report to Eastland city commissioners Monday evening concerning the construction of a community center.

tant points.

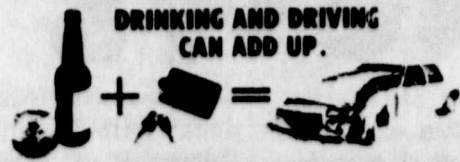

Oil And Gas Tax Shelters

The IRS recently published temporary regulations that could lead to the registration of many drilling deals that are not normally considered tax shelters. Tax shelter registration will apply even where the deal is exempt from registration under the security laws.

The IRS regulations were issued because of the Tax Reduction Act of 1984, which requires certain tax shelters sold after Aug. 31, 1984 to be registered with IRS before any interests in the shelter are offered for sale.

There are many complications and uncertainties involved in the calculation of a tax shelter ratio. So all persons offering oil and gas deals, regardless of their form of business organization, should carefully review all regulations.

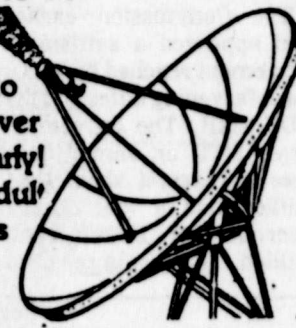

WTU's New Rates Became Effective Nov. 16

New rates for West Texas Utilities Co. customers became effective Friday, November 16, by order of the Public Utility Commission of Texas.

The Commission earlier had approved a settlement agreement reached by WTU, the intervening cities and the PUC staff. The agreement gives WTU an annual base rate increase of about \$12.4 million and a fuel charge decrease of about \$13.3 million. This would result in

a net decrease in revenue for WTU, to allow for an expected decline cost of boiler fuel during the coming year.

The new rates, which include a winter-summer differential, will raise average residential rates by about 4.2 percent. The rates will be slightly lower than current rates during the November-April period, but higher during the rest of the year. This feature was insisted upon by the PUC staff to encourage conservation during the peak usage months.

Bills for all electric meter readings recorded after Friday will reflect the new rates, according to Holman King, WTU vice president and director of corporate relations.

Dear Medicare Patient,
You may have read or heard about changes that Congress has made in the Medicare program--and you may be concerned. As your Clinic, let us assure you that, despite these changes, we plan to provide care for our patients as we have in the past.

The federal government has created another system for paying Medicare bills: there are now physicians identified as "participating," who accept assignment on all claims for all Medicare patients, and those called "non-participating," who find it appropriate to accept assignment on a case-by-case basis. Assignment means that the physician accepts what the government pays (after the patient pays the yearly deductible) plus the required 20 percent billing to the patient.

After carefully reviewing the options available to us, it is our belief that we can best serve our Medicare patients by continuing to decide on a case-by-case basis whether we should accept assignment or bill the patient directly for our services. It is our feeling that this is preferable to signing an agreement as a "participating physician," which would mandate us to accept assignments 100 percent of the time.

Fees are not the issue here, since the government has frozen Medicare payments at the levels based on adjusted 1982 fees for all physicians and they will remain frozen until October 1, 1985. We voluntarily froze all our fees last January 1984 in response to the needs of our patients.

Our primary concern is preserving our ability to provide you with quality care. The responsibility for medical care is an individual one involving the patient and physician in a carefully planned private relationship, free from any governmental intervention. We believe that we should be responsible directly to you, rather than to the federal government or the Medicare carrier.

While we share the concern all of us have over the cost of medical care, we do not wish to be part of an effort by the federal government that seems to place controlling costs above providing quality care. You have selected one or more of us as your physicians and we are proud of that fact. We will not relinquish that responsibility.

We will be happy to talk with you about these changes in the Medicare program. As always, we encourage you to call one of our patient representatives if you have any questions about our fees, or if you would like to discuss any aspect of your health or medical care, or our professional services.

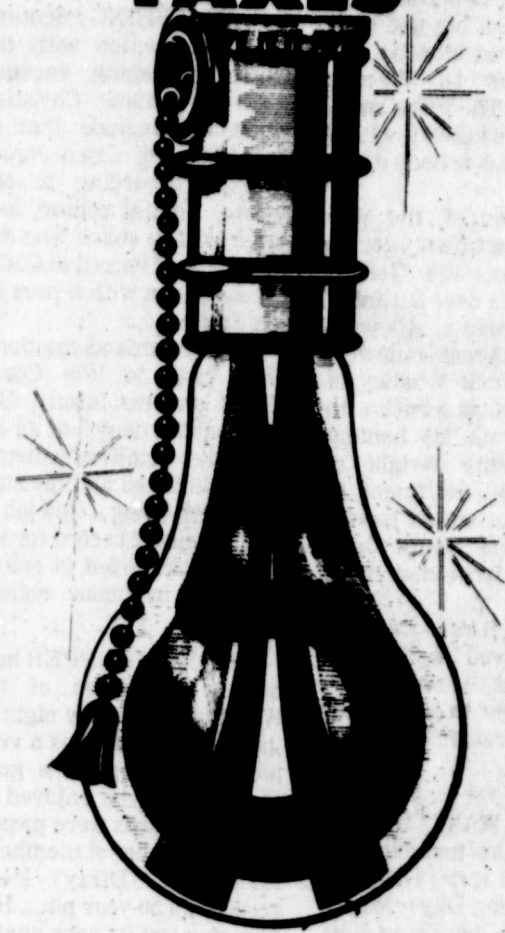

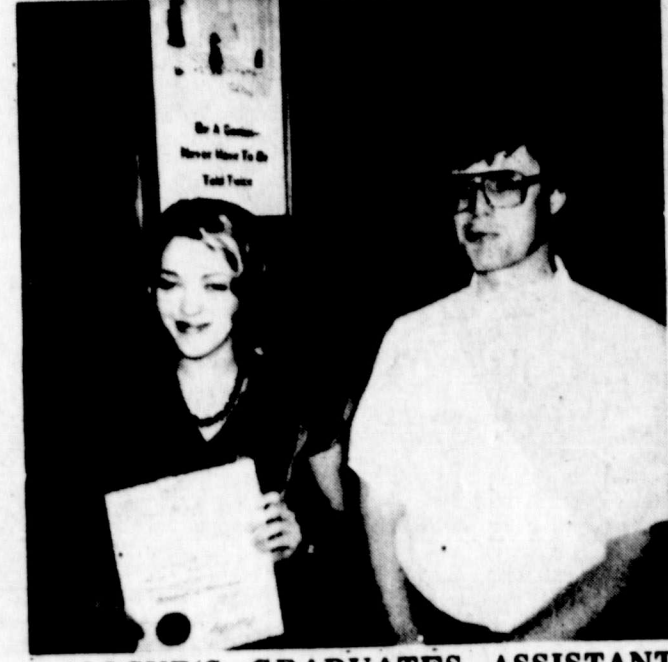
