Watch your newspaper and once an indictment is made you must call Crimestoppers again giving them your number and making arrangements for payment of the reward.

Understand that next year might not be so difficult insurance wise.

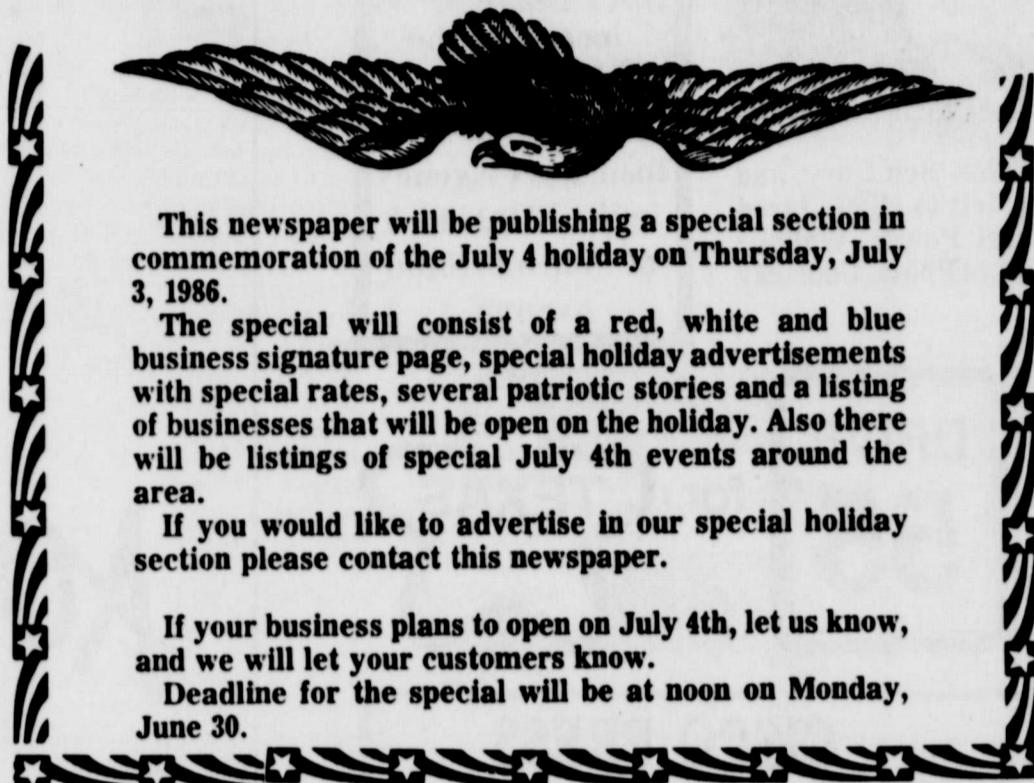

## No Fireworks For Cisco

No fireworks for Cisco on the 4th of July. Cisco, like many other small towns, has been unable to attain public liability insurance for fireworks.

Texas Insurance companies this year are not writing this type of insurance and out of state companies without offices in Texas are not permitted to write it. Those cities and towns who carry Texas

Municipal League Liability or who contracted with fireworks distributors while licensed shooters were available many have fireworks but many are doing without this year. This problem will be eliminated next year through legislation.

To help fill the void created by the absence of fireworks the Chamber of Commerce and Lions Club

will be sponsoring the usual games and activities in addition to the Little Miss Cisco Contest. Other special events will be announced later.

## City Council Meets Tuesday and Wednesday

The City Council met in its regular session, Tuesday June 24. City Manager Mike Moore gave the financial report stating that in May there were three pay periods instead of the usual two. There was also an insurance payment of \$7000, and two months light bills of \$3800 each.

Mr. Moore stated that the contractors are moving an office to the site of the new waste water treatment plant construction. Construction should begin very soon.

The water storage tank construction contracts are in and in the process of being readied for signatures. The city mowers are working as fast as they can to get all vacant lots and other areas mowed. With the rains not coming as frequent, possibly we can catch up Mr. Moore stated. He further stated that the city has two mowers, one in operation full time and the other, part time as is possible to put an operator on the mower.

Seal coating on streets is

scheduled to begin again on city streets. Possibly stated Mr. Moore, as soon as Monday July 1.

The city council appointed Mrs. Lois Holder as alternate Municipal Judge, to assist Municipal Judge Douglas Fry.

A discussion on Lake Cisco fees was continued until the next regular council meeting so that a study can be made of ideas and existing fees.

Mr. Moore stated that on Wednesday June 25, the city council met in a called meeting and went into a closed session to discuss conditions of the emergency situation existing in Cisco. He further stated that after their discussion, they came out of closed session in a regular open meeting where they agreed to assist the Texas Rangers, the Sheriff's Department, the Chief of Police, and the Mayor in any way they can.

Mr. Moore further stated that the council decided to continue the 12 midnight to 6 a.m. curfew for as long as needed.

## State Fire Marshall In Cisco To Investigate Recent Fires

Two state fire marshalls who have been investigating the recent fires here have sent samples of the fires to a laboratory to help determine the cause, according to City Manager Mike Moore.

Mr. Moore also stated that he is as anxious as anyone to know the cause as all the fires. He further stated that as soon as there is any news concerning the fires that he will let the Cisco citizens

know.

There have been three major downtown fires here in the last few weeks as well as one house fire. The Cisco Lumber and Supply sustained the loss of a warehouse containing paneling, sheetrock, cement and other building supplies, along with two forklift trucks. Webb's Inc. sustained the total loss of the White Auto store building in downtown Cisco. The building was used as a

warehouse. The Dixon Auto Supply was destroyed as a result of that same fire. The day before, the Red Front Mini Mall was heavily damaged by fire. There were two offices located in that building, The Calco Oil Co. and Ann Williams office of Pat Maynard Realty.

On Friday morning, June 20, the Frank Wilcoxon home just north of Cisco, was totally destroyed by fire. No one was home at the time.

**Brides Need New Social Security Card**

New brides, along with anyone else who has had a recent name change, should contact the Abilene Social Security office to arrange to have their names changed on Social Security records and to apply for a new Social Security card showing the name, Glyn Hammons, Social Security manager in Abilene, said recently.

Unless the bride plans to use her maiden name after marriage, the record should be changed so that earnings are correctly reported.

To apply for a new Social Security card, which will show the person's new name, but old Social Security number, a person needs evidence showing both the old and new names. For brides, the original or certified copy of the marriage license is the best evidence. If the bride is foreign born, she also needs evidence of U.S. citizenship or current alien status. This service is free; Social Security does not make any charge.

Only original documents or copies certified by the issuing agency are acceptable. Uncertified photocopies are not acceptable.

It takes about 2 weeks after acceptable evidence is submitted for the new Social Security card to be issued.

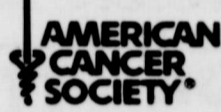

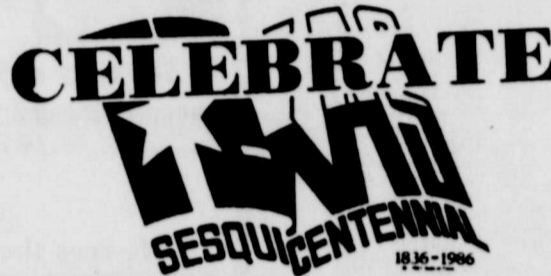

# Homemaking Hints

## From Janet Thomas, County Extension Agent

Recent United States Department of Agriculture research shows that the acidity level of fresh tomatoes drops after canning. A little lemon juice may make the difference between safe home canned tomatoes and those that can cause food poisoning.

This can compromise the safety of home canned tomatoes, especially if they are overripe when canned or if the lower-acid varieties are used.

The acidity of food is ranked on a pH scale. Foods that have a pH below 4.6 are acid enough to prevent the production of botulin toxin if heated in a water bath canner. The botulin toxin can cause a person to become ill with botulism, a serious form of food poisoning.

Foods with a pH above 4.6, such as vegetables and meats, must be canned under pressure to reach a temperature of at least 240 degrees to destroy the botulin organism.

By adding lemon juice to tomatoes, the acid level will be high enough that home canners can safely use a water bath for tomatoes, rather than having to use a pressure cooker.

One tablespoon of bottled lemon juice per pint or two tablespoons per quart should be added to the tomatoes states The Eastland County Extension Service office has an ample supply of Home Canning publications. These are free upon request. To get your free copy, contact Janet Thomas, Eastland County Extension Agent, at 629-2222.

### RECIPE FOR THE WEEK

A few good tomato plants will produce lots of tomatoes for home use. For that surplus amount of tomatoes, try canning some or better yet try this recipe for chili sauce.

**CHILI SAUCE**  
4 quarts peeled, cored, chopped red-ripe tomatoes (about 24 large)

2 cups chopped onions  
2 cups chopped sweet red peppers (about 4 medium)  
1 hot red pepper  
1 cup sugar  
3 tablespoons mixed pickling spices  
1 tablespoon mustard seed  
1 tablespoon celery seed  
2 1/2 cups vinegar

Combine tomatoes, onions, sweet and hot peppers, sugar and salt. Cook mixture gently for about 45 minutes. Tie spices in a cheese-cloth bag; add to tomato mixture. Re-cook mixture until thick about 45 minutes. As mixture thickens, stir frequently to prevent sticking. Add vinegar and cook slowly until the thickness desired. Pour hot mixture into hot jars, leaving 1/2 inch headspace. Discard spice bag.

Process pints for 15 minutes in a water-bath canner. Yield about 6 pints.

This winter, you will enjoy your chili sauce on hamburgers, hot dogs, beans, with fish, etc.

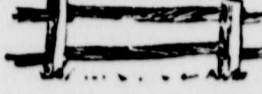

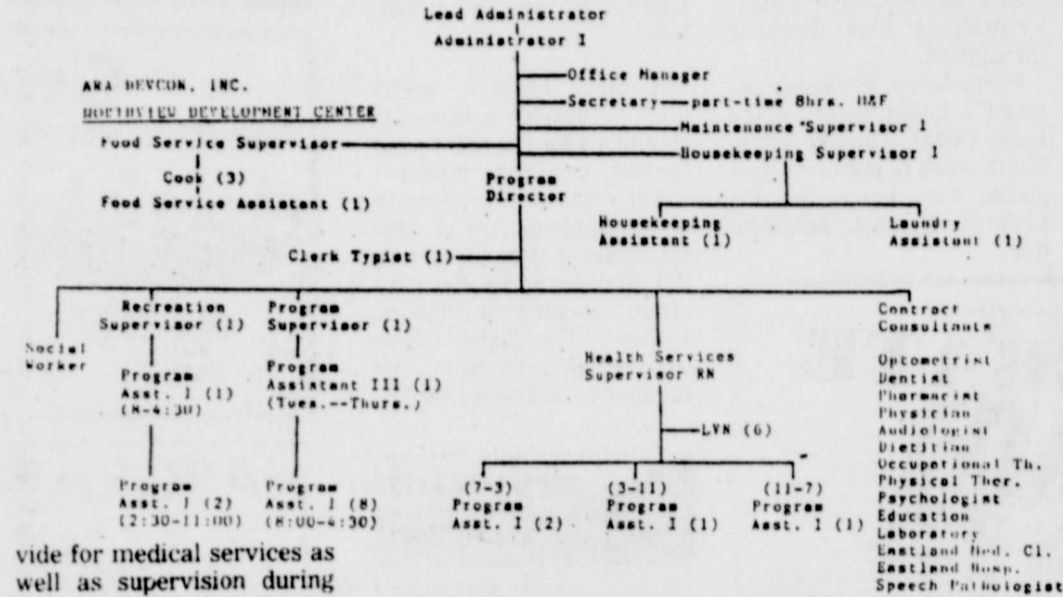

# Notes On Northview

The Table of Organization for Northview is the subject for this month's article. The primary function of this table is to define the chain of command and delineate what and how many positions exist in this facility. The highest position at the facility level is the Administrator. This position is included on Northview's Table of Organization because the Lead Administrator is based at this facility. Next on the table are the two secretarial supports for the administrative portion of the facility. The Office Manager is the key person in the overseeing of the financial mechanism. She also serves as secretary to the Administrator. The part-time secretary serves the Lead Administrator. The ancillary support systems are indicated next: Food Services, maintenance and Housekeeping. These areas each have a superior who is a department head that reports directly to the Administrator. The next section involves the programming aspects of the facility, hence the Program Director appears as a primary figure under the Administrator. From this position branches the remaining department heads: Social Work, Health Services, Program Supervisor and Recreation Supervisor. The Contract Consultants provide services to the clients on an initial, annual, or as needed basis depending upon the service. A facility such as Northview does not have aides. Our direct care staff are program assistants. These folks are responsible for the hands-on training and supervision. Each department involved in classroom training has enough program assistants (PA's) to insure that all training needs are adequately provided for. In Health Services, LVN's provide for medical services as well as supervision during non-administrative hours. They are considered in charge of staff and clients in the absence of the administrator staff.



The Table of Organization is the staff blueprint. If a position is not provided for on the table, it cannot exist within the facility framework. This table is posted around the facility so that staff can be aware of the chain of command and proper lines of communication.

MILD SUGGESTIONS that professional payroll-hunters be utilized in the unending effort to bring small factories and jobs to Eastland County have pretty much fallen on deaf ears. Well, maybe not deaf, but maybe more conservative ears.

There are of course any number of full-time, for-hire organizations who do nothing but work (presumably) with companies who are planning moves, and try to get them to move to areas which are customers of the organization. There are fees, of course, and they usually aren't cheap.

These professionals depend to a large measure on local help in putting together extra-slick, top quality sales brochures about the area which engages it, and then uses these brochures as sales tools with the various contacts the company has to show the advantages of Area A over Area B (assuming that Area A has hired it to do so.)

There are a lot of people in each of our towns in this county who are most capable in assembling data and presenting it in a commendable manner, so the question comes up, why should we pay an outsider to do our job?

It's a good question and we don't pretend to have an answer. Sure, we could collectively spend a lot of money and even then might come up with a blank.

And certainly the competition is stiff: in these soft economy times, every village and hamlet is looking for more payrolls to put people to work.

A major firm made a presentation in this county in recent times and their rate was expensive, but their track record looked good. They have since touched back with an inquiry for information for what appeared to be a prospect in this area. No report yet.

In an earlier column under this head we recommended a broadscale letter writing effort on the part of our citizens. These could turn up the raw ore we need.

One advantage of this type effort: these people claim to have computer-matching facilities which will link up assets of an area with those being sought by Planning-to-Move Big Company, and that way, it's a tailor-made effort.

One of the big pluses would have to be that these companies have contacts: they

are doing business with companies who trust them and they obviously know what's going on. (Although we'd guess that right now with the national soft economy, that there's probably fewer companies nationwide who are looking for expansion and relocation plans.) However the company that contacted us has extensive foreign contacts who are looking to come to the States.

And contact is one thing that we local folks don't have a lot of. Our utility companies have excellent industrial expansion departments and they have and are doing a good job of helping the communities they serve - but they often serve a vast area, which makes our individual chances diminished.

So what's the answer?

And maybe a collective effort to join in hiring such a national firm might be the answer. If so, many are going to have to come forward with push and cash to get it rolling. It would have to be a county-wide effort with all chambers, all cities, all citizens cooperating to make it work.

Our present batting average isn't too high.

Short of that, there's the possibility that this same type of joint effort could muster itself to engage the services of a local folk who has the time, talent and dedication to do a selling job for us in the market place where such selling is done.

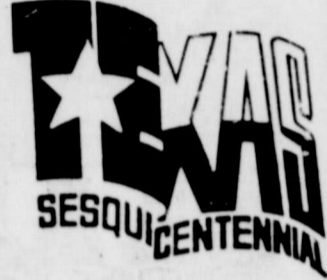

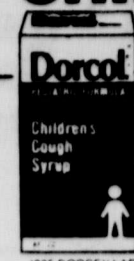

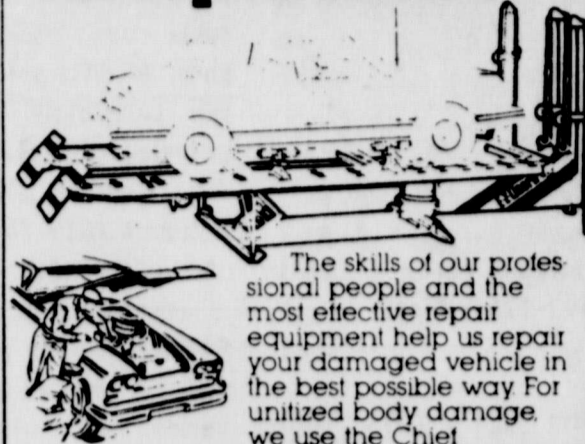

# Gordon Spot

By DeMarquis Gordon, County Agent—

Area pork producers have the opportunity to participate in a U.S. Department of Agriculture sponsored state wide election, July 7-11, to help select individuals for appointment to an industry-wide body that will administer a promotion, research and consumer information order for pork.

DeMarquis Gordon, County Extension Agent, said all pork producers in Eastland County are encouraged to vote in the elections. Candidates receiving the highest number of votes in each State will be eligible for appointment by the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Agriculture to the State's allotted positions on the National Pork Producers Delegate Body.

The Delegate Body, consisting of approximately 165 producers, including two or more members representing each of the 50 states and four importers, will be responsible for administering all aspects of the pork order.

Gordon said that voting in Eastland County will take place at the Extension Office, in the basement of the county courthouse. The office will be open for voting each day from 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. except for the lunch hour from 12:00 noon to 1:00 p.m. Pork producers can vote in any county in their home state after signing a voter registration list certifying that they are pork producers in that state.

Pork producers are urged to vote in person at the County Extension Office. If this is not possible, an absentee voting packet containing a ballot and registration form may be obtained from Jim Epstein, National Pork Producers Election, P.O. Box 23762, Washington, D.C. 20026-3762; telephone (202) 475-5407. Absentee ballots must be postmarked by July 11, and received at the above address no later than July 18.

Votes will be tallied at 9 a.m. on July 15 at the local county office of USDA's Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service. The public is invited to be present at this official counting, and the results will be forwarded to the Secretary for consideration.

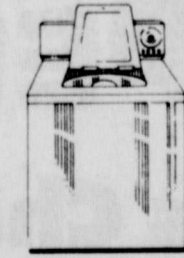

## Reba McEntire and Ronnie Milsap To Perform at Six Flags Over Texas

Arlington, Texas - Six Flags Over Texas will unveil its new, 10,700 seat Music Mill Amphitheater Saturday, July 5 with an 8 p.m. concert performance featuring Ronnie Milsap and Reba McEntire.

The million dollar project has been under construction since early spring.

The Music Mill first opened as a 4,500 seat concert venue in 1974. In the intervening years it has been the site of scores of concerts featuring such performers as Bill Cosby, Willie Nelson, Dave Loggins, Ray Charles, Dizzy Gillespie, Kenny Rogers and Blood Sweat and Tears.

The big names of show business will enjoy spacious, new dressing rooms in the expanded facility and they will step onto a stage more than twice as large as the original.

"The Music Mill now ranks as one of the finest outdoor concert facilities in the country," said Six Flags general manager Bob Bennett. "One of the most important features of the new amphitheater, from the concertgoer's point of view, is the new aluminum bench seating with seat backs."

Tickets to a given concert will go on sale at least two weeks in advance of the performance. Advance tickets may be bought either at the concert boxoffice at the park's main entrance, or at Rainbow-Ticketmaster outlets throughout the region.

Bennett said concert tickets will be priced at \$4 each in addition to the regular park admission fee which is \$14.95 for anyone over 42 inches tall. No charge will be made for in-

fantants in arms or small children under age 5 sitting in laps. Tickets will be required for anyone occupying a seat.

Bennett noted that Rainbow-Ticketmaster will make their usual service charge for tickets purchased through their outlets. There will be no service charge at the park boxoffice.

Seating for the Milsap and McEntire concert will be on a first-come-first-served basis.

"There's not really a bad seat in the theater," Bennett said. "The most distant seat in the house is only 215 feet from the stage."

Other acts scheduled for the theater in coming weeks include Russ Taff, Leon Patillo and Richard Mullins on July 11, Julian Lennon on July 13, Ricky Skaggs on July 19, Billy Ocean and Meli'sa Morgan on August 1, Jackson Browne on August 2 and Miami Sound Machine on August 3.

# People n Things

**MARLOW, Okla.**—For the first time in more than 60 years, we attended a reunion of relatives in this Stephens County, Oklahoma, town the other day. It was a gathering of second cousins—descendants of two pioneer Oklahoma sisters, our grandmother and her older sister.

There were perhaps 100 people at the reunion. Our family and the family of Grandmother's sister lived perhaps four miles apart some five miles southwest of Marlow. We visited mostly on Sunday afternoons and holidays, making the trip to each other's homes by horse and buggy.

THIS WRITER was a lad of perhaps eight years of age when he climbed into a covered wagon loaded with the family's household goods. The lad's father said "giddyup" and the team of mules headed toward the Texas Panhandle. Others of the family were to follow by train, which they did a month or so later.

Over the years, we didn't see but one of the second cousins. He was in graduate school at the UofT when we went there as a freshman.

DRIVING AROUND Marlow, we began thinking of things we could remember as a child. These included standing near a buggy at the second cousin's house and have a wheel run over a bare foot, making several toes bloody.

We recalled a day in town when we saw an Indian on the paved sidewalk in front of a bank, lying in his own blood—dead. A new yellow pencil with rubber eraser was also in the blood. A jewelry store on main street where the watchmaker kept a big bottle of the best tasting jaw-breakers (candy). A few years later, we moved to town and started to school and immediately came down with smallpox! And our house was quarantined. The sheriff came to the house, knocked, and talked for a time. Starting to leave, he said, apologetically, "I guess I'd better leave this." And it was a yellow quarantine flag that he nailed to a post on the porch.

THE FIRST TIME we ever heard a voice on the telephone was out in the country near Marlow. Men of the community arranged for a telephone line to be strung down a road that passed near five or six

homes, including our family's. The telephones were put in the homes and the line was being built. At noon one day, the line was near our house and our dad finished lunch and tied a line from our phone to a barbed wire fence to which the telephone line down the road was attached to await completion of the line.

After running the line to the fence, the telephone crank was turned and this caused the neighbor's phone to ring. The first conversation over the telephone began. And the children were permitted to listen and hear their first magic words from the black box.

OUR FIRST RIDE in an automobile took place near Marlow. Our family obtained a Model T Ford on a Saturday and next day we all piled in and rode to the second cousin's home. It was sensational. The old Ford was pretty bouncy on the dirt country roads and almost useless when it rained. It required hand cranking to start the motor. In wet weather, the coils under the dash that provided the spark (It was before the days of batteries) would refuse to work if they got wet or damp. The remedy was to place them in a pan in the oven to dry out for a time.

THE LAST TIME the second cousins were together occurred when the families drove in wagons to a creek near Rush Spring for a day's outing. The men folks, including small boys, seined a creek for fish that were fried in a huge pot of boiling hog lard. It was memorable for small boys.

Doubtless, the gathering the other day will be the last time for many of the second cousins as some are in their late 70s and early 80s and one is age 90. And it was with a somewhat heavy but appreciative heart that we left soon after lunch for our date in Idaho.

WE REACHED Memphis in Hall County before dark and spent the night in a trailer park in the edge of the city in which we grew up. Across the road in a pasture was the place where we went for a first airplane ride—in a Ford Tri-Motored tin goose. It was near the football field where we received a few lumps and bruises and learned a few of life's basic lessons. We turned through a telephone directory without spotting a name that
