## Charges May Await Adult Determination

A guardian has been appointed for the 15-year-old youth who is being held on an extended order, in connection with the murder of another 15-year-old Olden youth this week.

Determination of whether the youth will be handled as a juvenile or adult will be made before formal charges are filed.

Consideration is being given to asking that the youth be tried as an adult. Attorney Jim Farrar was appointed guardian.

Procedures differ between adult one and youth cases.

The Sheriff's Dept. will still continue evidential searches and evidence was being taken to laboratories in Abilene and Dallas at week's end.

Assistant District Attorney Bill Dowell represented the state in requesting the extended hold on the youth who was on a 30-day furlough from a youth detention center.

Preliminary charges indicated by the investigation are aggravated assault with a deadly weapon by the youth on the deceased youth's father, Bill Jones, who said the two youths left his house about midnight Monday. His son did not return.

The elder Jones said that the suspect did return, attacking him and robbing him inside his home. The boy reportedly took his wallet and car keys, and even though the father received two bullet wounds about the

head, was able to knock the gun from the youth's hands. The father was treated and released.

A railroad crew found the body of Charles Jones by the railroad tracks west of Olden early Tuesday morning. The body was sent for an autopsy and a preliminary report indicated that the younger Jones was shot three times, two facial wounds and one wound in the back.

The suspect was taken into custody at a relative's home in Olden and taken to Taylor County Juvenile Detention Center Wednesday on orders of the 91st District Court.

Investigators were in Dallas Wednesday setting in motion ballistic and firearms reports and other evidence was being forward for examination by experts.

## 320 Cases Processed In 91st Court

The judicial process often seems plodding and sometimes bungling to the average person, but a quick review of the statistics show that sheer weight of numbers is certainly a factor.

And the ever-evolving process of what appears to be favoritism to the accused further slows and sometimes handicaps due process, the layman believes.

A check of bare facts and figures in Eastland County's own 91st District Court proves up that the case loads and the volume of cases handled is no small matter.

Presiding Judge Jim Wright has established schedules and routines which deal with the volume commendable - but it often seems an unending task for those who are responsible for making the system work.

For instance - 340 criminal cases have been filed in the court since January 1 of this year.

Some cases can be handled quickly; many take time.

A total of 320 cases have been disposed of during the first six months, according to Criminal District Attorney Emory Walton.

During that same period, fines have been assessed in the amount of \$125,066.00, the records show.

D.A. Walton, Assistant Bill Dowell and Secretaries Jan Novak and Jeannie Mathews maintain one busy office.

Court costs assessed since January amount to \$18,962.94 and for the victims of crime, it's comfortable to know that restitutions for six months have amounted to \$33,358.38.

Under new provisions the D.A.'s office is also an active hot check collector - \$31,428.19 so far this year.

With every day and every grand jury there are more cases.

## Fire Department To Sponsor Controlled Burning of Lots

The Cisco Volunteer Fire Department announced Monday, June 30, that they will begin controlled burning of lots in Cisco. Fire Chief Richard Connell said, "that the burning of lots consisted of vacant lots only, and that

they must be clear of any out buildings." He said, "we cannot even consider burning lots with buildings of any kind on them."

Chief Connell stated that since the department has only a limited amount of time

to burn lots, that anyone wishing to have this done should call the Fire Dept. on their non-emergency telephone number: 442-3078, during regular business hours. He also stated that possibly one a week is all they can handle; and that lot owners need to still keep lots mowed until such time as the fire department can get to them.

Fire Chief Connell said that he will be in touch of those that request a lot to be burned, before it is burned.

## New Computerized Fueling Station To Open In Cisco

A computerized fueling station operating 24 hours a day will open here soon at 12th and Conrad Hilton.

The system is being installed by Pride Marketing of Texas, Inc., a subsidiary of Pride Refining, Inc. of Abilene, and will operate under the name Pride Fleet Fuel.

A grand opening of the facility - the first of its kind in Cisco - is planned for the end of July.

The Cisco outlet will be the first of several such operations planned for this area, although Pride has numerous similar facilities throughout West Texas.

Cisco's facility will serve both the general public and commercial customers, with separate fuel island with high volume pumps for large diesel accounts.

The system will be com-

pletely automated with an on-site computer relaying sales information back to Pride's Abilene offices.

Customers will purchase fuel by using a plastic credit card similar to those used by 24-hour banking facilities.

The computer will "read" the magnetic strip on the card to determine ownership and any restrictions that a customer might want placed on a particular card. Among the restrictions available are limitations on the amount of purchases and on the types of fuel that could be purchased. This option has proven to be of great interest to businesses in their attempts to better manage fuel cost.

Fuel provided at the site will come from the refinery owned by Pride Refining, Inc. and located eight miles north of Abilene.

Pride has operated a crude

oil gathering operation out of Cisco for several years and has three trucks and drivers located here. Pride purchases on an average 50,000 barrels of crude oil a month from local owners and operators.

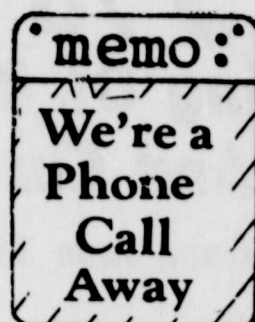

# Gordon Spot

By DeMarquis Gordon, County Agent—

Fleas are abundant this summer in Eastland County. They attack both humans and animals. I have been receiving calls each day requesting information on flea control.

The tiny pests cause annoyance and discomfort and can also spread certain disease, a major one being bubonic plague.

Adult fleas cause the most problems as they have piercing sucking mouthparts and suck blood. Adult fleas may live from two months to two years. After each blood meal females lay four to eight eggs, which hatch in two to three weeks. They may deposit as many as 500 eggs in their lifetime.

Flea control may be difficult due to the circumstances under which the pests occur. Home infestations are often discovered a short time after a pet has been taken out of the home. Immature fleas have completed development and, with the absence of the normal host, turn to man for their life-sustaining blood meal.

Satisfactory control of fleas for any length of time depends on these factors:

1. Both adult and immature fleas must be

eliminated from the home and yard by proper chemical control and sanitation measures, such as replacing infested bedding materials and cleaning carpets and stuffed furniture.

2. Pets must be rid of fleas by using registered chemicals. In the case of rat or mice fleas, these hosts must be eliminated.

3. Reinfestation must be prevented by protecting pets with flea collars other preventative chemicals during times of likely infestations.

Chemicals registered for indoor flea control include Baygon, DDVP, Dursban, Malathion, Methoprene, Ronnel and SBP-1382. Use a coarse spray on floors and baseboards. Treat one foot up the walls and under the house where possible. Check product labels prior to use.

Chemicals registered for outdoor flea control include Baygon, Cygon, Diazinon, Dursban, Malathion and Sevin. Treat animals' bedding or remove and replace with new material. Good coverage is necessary for good control.

To control fleas on host animals, use Dursban, Lindane, Sevin or Vapona on dogs and Korian, Lindane, Malathion, Phosmet and

## Conservation Becomes Tool For Meeting Needs

AUSTIN — Texans are using more water per person than ever—about 155 gallons per day. Every ten years, that average has increased by about four gallons per person, according to the

Texas Water Development Board.

As demand for water continues to grow, water conservation and drought contingency planning can play a key role in efforts to manage existing water supplies more effectively and help avoid serious water supply problems, according to the state agency. Surveys taken by

the Board show that more than 100 cities have already been forced into drought contingency measures during recent summers.

Since about 75 percent of the water in the home is used in the bathroom, that's where you can usually save the most water. Follow these tips:

—Install shower heads and faucet aerators that reduce water flow. Some models allow you to reduce the flow by half.

—Don't let water run while brushing teeth, scrubbing hands, or shaving.

—Make sure the commode isn't leaking. Add a few drops of food coloring to the water in the tank, but don't flush. If the coloring appears in the bowl within a few minutes, the toilet needs adjustment or repair.

—Place one-quart plastic bottles, capped and filled with water, in the commode tank to reduce the amount of water used in flushing. Bricks can do the same thing, but pieces might crumble off and damage the commode's working mechanisms.

—Showers usually take less water than baths, but the amount of water used varies among individual people. The next time you shower in a tub, plug the drain and then compare the amount of water used with the amount used when you take a bath in the same tub. Try to take shorter showers.

# John & Matilda Rose - They Have A Way With Plants

You can't miss the John and Matilda Rose home out on the highway to Carbon. South of Eastland there is a large young pecan orchard beside the road, and a brick house which fits comfortably on the hill behind it.

What seems to pull the house into the terrain more than an acre of landscaping all around it - lush sloping lawns, curving driveways and varicolored flowerbeds. Young trees bank the sides of the hill - Mondale pines, Black pines and Slash pines for windbrakes, with Arizona ash, mulberry and maple for shade.

Pampas grass, hawthorne, crepe myrtle and honeysuckle punctuate the brilliance of the flowers: yellow marigolds, purple and scarlet petunias, mums, red geraniums, dahlias, and enormous orange and gold cannas. There are also roses, periwinkle, and even azalias in pots.

Things weren't always like this on the hill. Mr. and Mrs. Rose have a "before" picture showing their home and acreage when they bought it in 1980. This was "before" a lot of hard work, planning, consultation with the Extension Service, and everything else that goes into successful horticulture. The same charming house is in the 1980 picture, but the hillside around it is about the same color as the tan brick walls.

This move to Eastland County was quite a venture for Matilda Rose, who was born in New York City and spent most of her life in New Jersey. It was not such a change for John Rose, who grew up in Ranger. But he had been away for a number of years, working for TWI Airlines until his retirement.

Mr. and Mrs. Rose know very well how their thick lawn got on the hill. "We plugged it in on our hands and knees," Mrs. Rose chuckles. "Then we set out everything we liked around the house - thinking it would grow. We didn't realize that the summer of 1980 was going to be the hottest every for Eastland County. Even with the water from our own well and the water line on the place we lost a lot of things." They also took losses dur-

ing the severe winter of 1983, Mr. Rose says. But, on the whole, things have done very well. They are particularly pleased with the Black pines and the Mondale pines for hardiness and growth. They obtained the Mondales through the Extension Service.

A walk around the hillside shows that John and Matilda are not the only ones enjoying the flowers. Hummingbirds and butterflies have discovered the nectar, and dive into the blooms. Sometimes turkey or other wildlife slips from the grove of oaks west of the house.

The vegetable garden lies down the hill to the west, and John Rose spends a lot of

time there. He raises some good sweet potatoes, corn, cantaloupe and assorted other items. "This has not been a very good year for gardens, due to too much rain and then the sudden hot weather," he says.

There are around 80 trees in the pecan orchard in front, mainly Chocotaw and Desirable. Some are beginning to bear. There will be shared by the Roses with their four children and their families, two of whom live in Texas and two in the northeast. There are other relatives on the Rose side of the family in Cisco, Eastland and Ranger.

Mrs. Rose likes homemaking and cooking, and has

found the Home Extension work most enjoyable. She belongs to the Pleasant Hill Extension Club, and participates in club-related activities. These include the annual Health Fair, and Fit For Life Seminars, which she considers very important.

But more than anything, Mr. and Mrs. Rose are enjoying their way of life, which includes sharing their beautiful place with family and friends. To these friends we are Eastland County gardeners they have a bit of advice: "It takes a lot of fertilizer and lots of water!"

They could have added: "And lots of loving care." For all their plants reflect that every day.

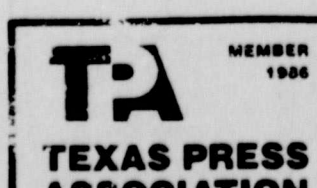

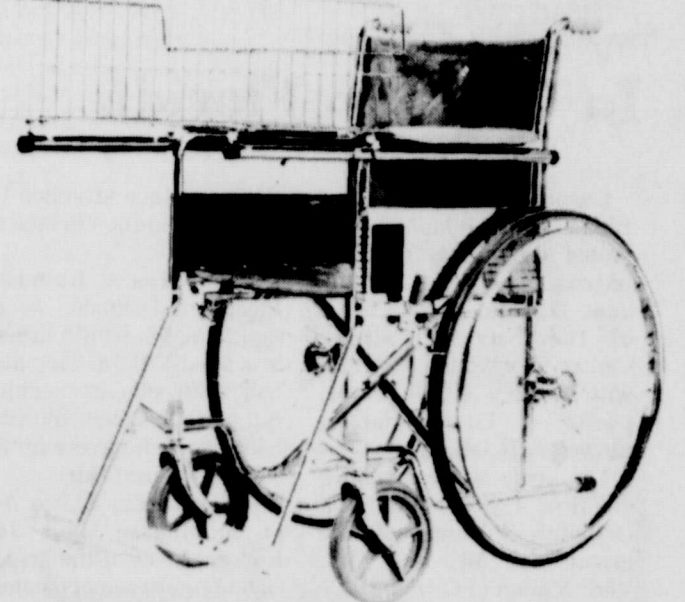

# Homemaking Hints

From Janet Thomas, County Extension Agent

From the time our children are born, we are concerned about their health, growth, and personal development. Every mother has given her children vitamins. The children's chewable vitamins are designed to appeal to youngsters with bright colors, animal and cartoon character shapes and a candy-like taste.

They're so appealing, in fact, that last year more than 8,500 children under six swallowed large number of pills at one time.

The greatest danger of vitamin pill overdosing is iron toxicity. The symptoms include bloody diarrhea and vomiting, which can occur in a 30 pound child after eating 15 to 20 tablets of a children's multivitamin-plus iron.

Parents need to treat children's vitamins as though they are a prescription medicine. The child-proof cap should be tightly fastened and the vitamin

bottle placed in a locked cabinet or a shelf out of reach.

Since children may still get access to vitamin pills in spite of these precautions, parent should teach their youngsters that vitamins may look like candy, but they are not.

Parents may also want to consider if they even need to be giving children vitamins. After infancy, most children do not need routine vitamin supplementation.

According to nutritionists, children who eat a balanced diet containing protein foods such as meat, poultry, fish and peanut butter; cereals and grains; dairy products; and fruits and vegetables should not need vitamins.

Preschoolers often do have spells of not eating well, or wanting to eat only certain things. But over the course of several days the nutrient needs are likely to be met.

Parents who are particularly concerned about children getting enough iron should be sure to include red meats in meals. Iron fortified breads and cereals are another good source of this mineral.

When a child has an extremely poor appetite or does not seem to be growing, parents should consult a physician who can then prescribe vitamins or another nutritional supplement if needed.

### RECIPE FOR THE WEEK

This week there has been many telephone calls for recipes to make pickled peppers. A word of warning, wear rubber gloves to prevent burning; hands when working with hot peppers.

### PICKLED JALAPENO MIX

- 1 pound carrots, pared and sliced
- 2 medium onions, cut into chunks
- 1 pound jalapeno peppers, sliced
- 4 cups distilled white vinegar
- 1/2 cup olive or vegetable oil
- 1/2 cup water
- 1 1/2 teaspoons canning or pickling salt
- 1 teaspoon ground oregano
- 1 teaspoon ground turmeric
- Garlic cloves

Simmer carrots for 2 minutes; add onions and jalapenos. Simmer 3 minutes until vegetables are hot; drain. Make a brine by mixing vinegar, oil, water, salt, oregano and turmeric together. Bring to a boil. Place 1 garlic clove in each hot pint canning jar; fill with hot vegetables. Pour boiling brine over vegetables, 1 jar at a time. 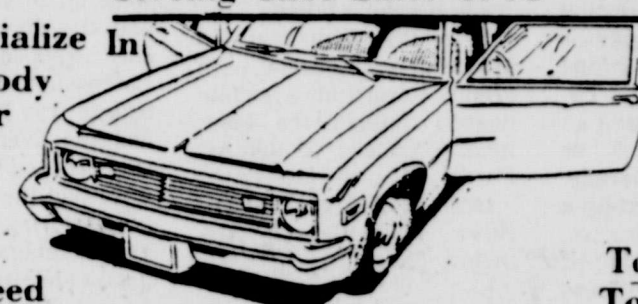
