## Wagon Train Set To Arrive In Cisco Next Wednesday

The Lone Star Wagon Train will arrive in Cisco on Wednesday, July 23, 1986, traveling through the great State of Texas celebrating its 150th birthday.

This will be the only sanctioned wagon train traveling through Texas for the balance of 1986. The Lone Star Wagon Train will travel through hundreds of towns and communities on their way to Austin for the closeout of the Sesquicentennial year.

The Cisco Chamber of Commerce Redcoats will welcome the wagon train and escort it into Cisco. The train will camp out on land located behind Stovall Roustabout on Hwy 80 West. They will head out north on Hwy 183 the following day.

The Lone Star Wagon Train has planned when they arrive in Cisco to help provide entertainment for the night camps with a drawing for a pair of Tony Lama boots with the Texas Sesquicentennial logo stitched in the front of the boot.

Tickets for the drawing for the pair of Tony Lama boots will be fifty cents per ticket. Tickets may be purchased at the following locations: Western Auto store, Chamber of Commerce office, Olney Savings, Madisons Western Wear, and the First National Bank. You must be present to win the boots.

Also Cisco's Western Auto store will be giving away a bicycle and a set of can-

koolers.

The Lone Star Wagon Train invites all local talent to come to the nightly camps and perform. They would also like to invite all local organizations to set up shop along with the wagon train vendors to sell their arts and

crafts, food stuffs and etc.

Chamber manager Don Shepard said a committee is still working on plans for food and entertainment for the overnight stay of the wagon train.

## Plans Being Made To Broaden Base

State Comptroller Bob Bullock said his staff is drafting a plan to broaden the state's sales tax base to make it fairer and at the same time raise additional revenue at lower rates.

"We are looking at taxing all goods and services, except food, medicine and medical services," Bullock said.

"We haven't put the pencil to it, but I think we can lower the present rate, make it fairer and less regressive and still keep an income tax off the backs of Texans."

Bullock said his plan to broaden the sales tax would be ready for the Legislature, if they meet in August.

"If the Legislature addresses only budget cuts in a special session, that's just fine. With our plan at least they will have something to study when and if they decide to bite the bullet."



## Andy Hawari Named To Dean's List At School

Andy M. Hawari, a first-year student in the School of Optometry at the University of Missouri-St. Louis, was named to the Dean's List for the fall, 1985 and winter, 1986 semesters. of Missouri, and there are only 14 others in the United States. There are approximately 130 students enrolled in the four-year program leading to the Doctor of Optometry (O.D.) Degree.

An optometrist is a health professional who is specifically educated, trained and state licensed to examine, diagnose and correct problems of the vision system. An optometrist examines eyes and related structures to determine visual efficiency and performance as well as to detect eye diseases or other ocular abnormalities.

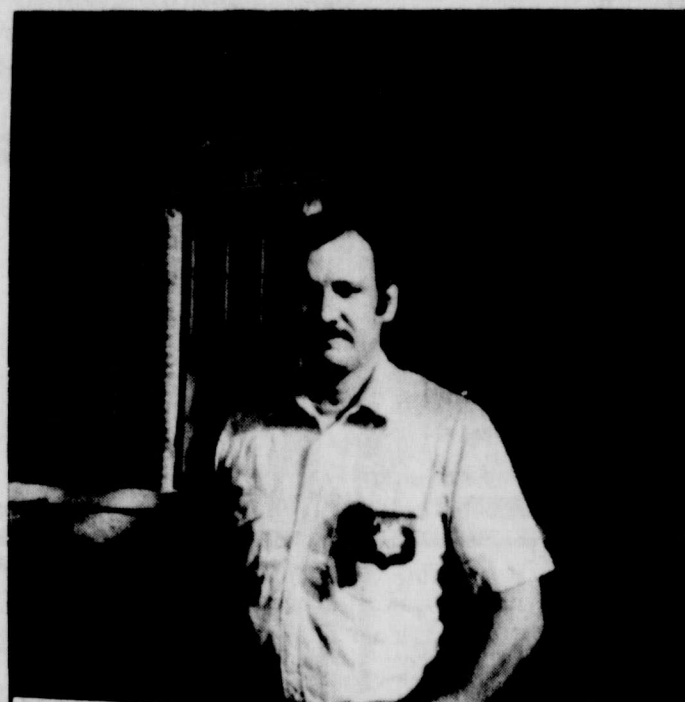

## Dale Stewart, Local Artist, Is Busy With His Sculpturing

Dale Stewart, son of Tom and the late Ollie Stewart of Voss, was born at Gouldbusk and spent his early years by Big Panther Creek in south Coleman County.

Dale has enjoyed art as a hobby throughout life. He worked with oil painting and iron sculptures before getting into bronze sculpturing.

In the 70's he sold complete editions of John Wayne and Elvis Presley in Midland.

In December of 1985 Dale received a diploma in art from the National Education Corporation Independent Study Division in Scranton Pennsylvania.

In February of 1986 Dale was able to devote full time to his art work in his studio in Cisco. Since that time he has been very productive, finishing one or more pieces per month.

Also in February Dale finished a commissioned bust of a Houston minister, the late Rev. Oliver Fauss. A special unveiling ceremony for the bronze is planned for the near future.

During June Dale was commissioned to do a bust of the late Conrad N. Hilton in

conjunction with the Mobley Hotel restoration project in Cisco. (The Mobley was Conrad Hilton's first hotel.) The bust will be permanently displayed at the Conrad N. Hilton Memorial Park and Community Center. Formal dedication of it will be on October 13, 1986.

Dale is currently associated with Art Alchemists in Fort Worth. The group of artists has been commissioned to begin an art project for The Astronauts Memorial Foundation, Inc. at Cape Canaveral, Florida. It will concern the seven who lost their lives in the Challenger.

One of Dale's sculptures is "Old Rip", a bronze horned toad. It has been on display by Old Rip himself at the Eastland County Courthouse.

Dale's bronze "Old Rip" is also on display permanently at the Homer Garrison Museum and Texas Ranger Hall of Fame in Waco, Texas.

Dale's Sesquicentennial piece "Lookin' at the Past" (a longhorn steer looking at a dilapidated wagon) recently won a 4th place ribbon in the Emerald City Classic in

Wichita, Kansas. Over 450 entries from around the world were submitted. Dale's work was in the American Sculpture Division.

Other pieces that will be on exhibit at the Coleman First National Bank are as follows: "Territorial Rights" (a buffalo looking at a pair of prairie dogs defending their home); "Battle Creek" (an Indian warrior with a lance on a rearing horse); "The Challenge" (an Indian with a tomahawk and coup stick on a decorated war horse); and "Waitin' Trial" (a young horse with breakin' rigin' on).

Dale's art is currently at two art galleries including Hoka Hey Fine Arts Gallery at Dublin and Southwind Galleries at Ingram, Texas. His works have been displayed at Olney Savings in Cisco, Moran National Bank and will be at the Breckenridge Fine Arts Center at 207 North Breckenridge Ave. It is the Stephens County Sesquicentennial Art Show which will be open to the public from July 4th through August. The Breckenridge Fine Arts Center is open from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday.

## Bullock Seeks Bill To Collect State Sales Tax From Firms

State Comptroller Bob Bullock said a bill pending in Congress to force out-of-state mail-order firms to collect state sales tax on goods shipped into Texas could bring the state millions in additional taxes.

H.R. 5021 is a federal legislation proposed by U.S. Representative Jack Brooks of Beaumont, which if passed, will require the big national mail-order operations to collect and remit state sales taxes.

Bullock says Texas is losing \$100 million a year on mail-order goods; all other states are losing, too. Our home-town merchants are also losing. They are paying taxes at home, taxes to the state - and trying to compete with an out-of-state firm, that starts off with a five percent unfair advantage.

"Mail order firms have had a free ride for the last 19 years since a court decision handed them special privileges to legally avoid collecting taxes but we're about to turn that around," Bullock said.

Bullock said he thinks the Brooks' legislation stands a good chance of getting Congressional approval this session, and that he thinks tax-free mail-order sales are out of step with the idea of fair and equal taxation.

Bullock said closing the mail-order sales tax loophole should help promote Texas businesses and jobs as well as provide the state with needed revenue.

Bullock says that the big national mail-order firms

are pulling \$3 billion a year out of Texas while in return doing nothing to help pay for Texas schools, hospitals, highways and other state government services.

Further, those supporting H.R. 5021 point out that the out-of-state firms are enjoying an unfair competitive advantage over the hometown, taxpaying merchants.

Congress won't move on the bill until the Congressmen know that the folks 'back home' want to see it passed. We in Eastland County need to go to work to drum up the support for this

bill.

There is a lot of talk in Texas now about broadening our tax base. The mail-order goods is a good place to start. Simply, \$100 million a year is a lot of money for our state - and \$3 billion a year in sales is a lot of competition for our home town merchants.

This newspaper will have more on this bill in the near future, hopefully, but contact with our representatives and Congress will help to get this bill passed as long as Congress knows we are all supporting it locally.

Several thousand property owners within Eastland County will be receiving their 1986 reappraisal notices from the Eastland County Appraisal District within the next few days. The notices being mailed out this week will cover properties in Eastland, Cisco, Gorman and Ranger. Notices for Carbon and Rising Star were mailed earlier this summer.

The reappraisal work has taken several months to complete and has been done in compliance with requirements of the State Property Tax Code. The Tax Code requires that all taxable property within the State be reviewed or reappraised at least once every four years. The last total reappraisal of property within Eastland County was conducted in 1982.

ONLY property owners falling into one of the below listed categories will be receiving notices:

1. Property is new for 1986 and has not previously been valued for ad valorem tax purposes.
2. The 1986 value of property is to be more than \$1,000 higher than the 1985 value.
3. The property was rendered for 1986 and the

value for 1986 is to exceed that rendered value.

The reappraisal notices will give the proposed taxable value for the described property for 1986. Property owners will be able to meet the appraisers concerning their values on the date indicated on the notice.

So, you think your house or apartment is electrically safe, but is it?

Safety experts at the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission offer this quick-and-easy checklist of some major electrical hazards to look for in your home:

\* Has any electrical product shocked you lately? If so, stop using the product and have it inspected at an electrical repair shop or appliance service center; the next shock could be far worse if you continue to use the product.

\* Are countertop electrical outlets within six feet of the kitchen sink protected by a ground fault circuit interrupter (GFCI)? Probably not, says CPSC, in which case you could be electrocuted by means of a number of product-related accidents. For example, if an electrical appliance fell

into a sink of water and the consumer instinctively reached into the water to remove the product, the consumer could probably be electrocuted, even if the switch were off. However, if the circuit were protected by a GFCI, the power would be shut off before serious harm came to the consumer.

The GFCI monitors off electricity flowing in the circuit to sense any loss of current, then switches off the power quickly if current is escaping from the circuit. For any circuit or outlet which may pose a risk of electrocution, a qualified electrical repairman should install the GFCI's.

\* Are all bathroom outlets protected by GFCI's? If your home was built before 1975, CPSC says the outlets probably do not have GFCI protection. Since then, new

homes wired according to the National Electrical Code are supposed to have GFCI protection on all bathroom circuits, plus garage and outdoor circuits. However, not all newer homes have these GFCI's. Find out if your home has them. If your home does not have GFCI protection on these lines, this protection can be added by a qualified installer.

\* Do you always connect the grounding system when you use a third wire grounded electric appliance, one with a three-prong plug? If you don't you lose shock protection. To reduce the risk of shock when using an extension cord, be sure it is three-wire. If your outlets do not accept a three-prong plug, be sure to use an adapter and connect its ground terminal to the screw of the faceplate. Double-insulated products do not require the three-wire cord and may be used with two-wire extension cords.

Consumers may obtain a free copy of the detailed electrical safety checklist in English or Spanish by writing Electrical Safety, Washington, D.C. 20207, or by calling the agency's toll-free hotline at 1-800-638-2772. A slow-play disc record of the checklist is also available for the blind.

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# Commissioners Appoint Bush Peace Justice, Precinct 2

Eastland County Commissioners made several decisions during their regular meeting on July 14. One was to appoint Alford Bush of Ranger to fill the remainder of the term of Justice of the Peace, Pct. 2. This office was vacated by Luther Maxwell last November.

Present at the meeting was Richard Robinson, Commissioner of Pct. 1, Bill Riddell, Comm. of Pct. 2, L.T. Owen, Comm. Pct. 3, and C.B. Dill, Comm. Pct. 4. County Judge Scott Bailey presided, and County Clerk Joann Johnson recorded minutes.

Alford Bush was in the courtroom during the appointment, and again expressed his willingness to accept the duties. He was the winner in the Democratic Primary for this J.P. office, and apparently will have no opposition in the general election in November. The elected term of office will begin Jan. 1, 1987.

Judge Scott Bailey and the Court requested that Bush begin his appointment on July 24. He will arrange for an office, gather up furnishings, and secure J.P. records. He was reminded that he would be operating on a pre-set

budget. In another matter, Judge Scott Bailey told the Court that he had written a letter to the Texas Commission on Jail Standards informing them that the Eastland County Jail was now in compliance with all but two of the nine deficiencies cited in the last jail inspection.

The Judge has been informed by Chief Jailor Gene Russell of this compliance, and that the two remaining deficiencies are due to the structure design of the jail. New state rulings have been made since the jail was designed a few years ago.

Another item on the agenda was a request by Jerry Sutherland of Cisco that the Court grant him a quit-claim deed to five lots of 504 West 1st St. in Cisco. Sutherland stated that this was abandoned property - that he had made every effort to locate the owner of this tract. He had paid all taxes due on the property for a number of years, and was asking the county to release its tax lien. The Commissioners approved his request.

Other requests came before the Court, including that of Gene Hicks, Rising Star Constable, and Tex

Evans, Justice of the Peace. They described how hot it was in their office, which is without any air conditioning. "Even hotter than here," Hicks said, referring to the sultry Courtroom.

The Commissioners approved their request to purchase an air conditioner for \$749.99.

Also approved was an appropriation of \$1439.95 for equipment and furniture for the Eastland County Probation Department. This request, brought by Chief Probation Officer Joe Housson, will be included in the 1986-87 budget.

The problem of how much will be needed for Juvenile Detention is not as easy to solve, however. It costs \$50 per day to hold a juvenile in Abilene. The Department has spent only \$300 so far this year, out of a budget of \$3500, but presently another juvenile is being held. The length of time it will take him to go through the court system is undetermined at present.

The Commissioners approved a request by JoAnn Johnson, County Clerk, for the use of a closet on the first floor of the courthouse. This

will be used for election supplies and materials.

Pendragon Oil Co. requested permission to cross County Rd. 165 in Pct. 1 with a low-pressure gas line. This is behind the Coca-Cola Plant in Eastland. The request was granted.

In concluding the meeting, Judge Scott Bailey said he had been assured by attorneys representing the county that the case of Ainsworth vs. Eastland County was moving forward. No trial date was stated, however.

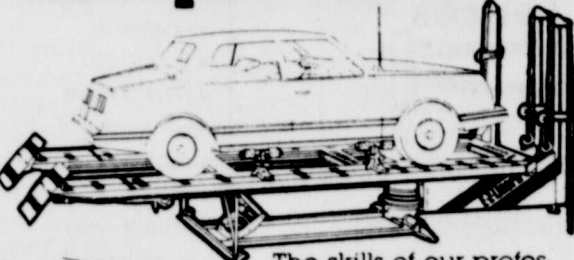

# Fire Ant Battle Rages On

The battle against the imported fire ant rages on—and it's an uphill battle.

Fire ants now infest about 115 of the state's counties, including Eastland County and earlier visions of eradicating this persistent pest have faded. Now the battle seems to be one of containment.

Brought into this country from South America, the imported fire ant is fierce competitor and is more aggressive than other ant species, points out Dr. Bart Drees, an entomologist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, The Texas A&M University System. The defensive nature of the ants is readily demonstrated as they swarm on anything that disturbs their mound.

Fire ant stings produce a burning sensation and a pustule usually forms soon after a sting. The sting

usually is not serious unless the person stung is hypersensitive, Drees explains. Several hypersensitive persons have died from fire ant stings. The biggest hazard with fire ant stings is the possibility of a secondary infection if the pustule pops and is not kept clean until it heals.

### Mounds, Mounds and More Mounds

Recent rains over the state have seemed to cause a proliferation of fire ant mounds, but that can be attributed to the fact that the ants are simply rebuilding mounds collapsed from the rain, says Drees.

Imported fire ants prefer to build their mounds in open, sunny areas, and mounds in clay soils may reach and foot-and-a-half in height. Fire ant colonies frequently

located around stumps; in rotten logs, bales of hay and electrical boxes; and under other objects that offer some protection. The ants will rapidly reinfest land disturbed by construction, farming operations, flooding and pesticide use.

Fire ants mainly consume insect material, but they also sip sugary juices from aphids; feed on plant materials which contain oils, such as okra buds and soybean and grain seeds; and occasionally feed on dead animals and protein-containing products such as broken eggs. Worker ants return to the mound with food and feed the colony's queen and brood. Only larval ants that are nearly mature will eat solid food; the remainder feed only on liquids, according to the entomologist.

### Control Products Plentiful

As far as fire ant control is concerned, a whole arsenal of materials is available, including individual mound treatments, baits and, of course, home remedies.

More than 65 different products are now available for controlling fire ants. All work differently and vary greatly in cost. There seems to be a product for about every type of situation, Drees points out.

Spraying surfaces for foraging ants is common in and around the home, and products for this purpose contain carbaryl, chlorpyrifos, diazinon, isofenfos, propoxur or resmethrin. These sprays can be used as spot treatments and to establish a barrier around areas or objects such as gardens, patios, electrical boxes and bee hives.

Granular products containing chlorpyrifos or isofenfos can be applied to turf areas with a seeder or fertilizer spreader. After application, the treated area must be watered thoroughly. These granular products are long-acting and will kill foraging worker ants.

Mound treatments are aimed at killing the queen and her brood to eliminate reproduction, explains the entomologist. Mound drench products contain chlorpyrifos, diazinon and isofenfos. They can be sprinkled on top of and around the mound and generally do not produce immediate results.

Granules containing chlorpyrifos or diazinon also can be applied to mounds but should be sprinkled with one or more gallons of water.

Dust products containing acephate can be applied to mounds and act like a tracking powder. Or they can be drenched into the mound with water.

### Fast-Acting Controls

For more immediate results in controlling fire ants, Drees recommends products containing methyl chloroform (often shows as 1,1,1-trichloroethane on the product label). When poured into a mound, the liquid immediately turns into a gas and kills all ants within a minute. However, the vapor soon dissipates and leaves no residue to kill foraging ants returning to the mound.

Aerosols containing pyrethrum and tetramethrin also produce immediate results and work well in treating fire ant mounds in outdoor areas where picnics or other activities are planned.

New bait products such as Amdro, Logic and Pro-Drone are for treating individual mounds through broadcast applications. These products contain insecticides on bait particles of toasted corn grits coated with soybean oil. With these products, worker ants pick up the bait and bring it back to the mound where they feed it to the queen and the brood.

Amdro can kill ants in a mound in about a week. Logic and Pro-Drone are insect growth regulators that prevent queen ants from producing more worker ants and thus cause a slow decline in the ant colony. Several weeks to a year may pass before a total colony is eliminated, notes Drees.

### Do Home Remedies Work?

What about home remedies? For a cheap, environmentally safe treatment, pour several gallons of hot, boiling water over a mound. Shoveling one mound on top of another has been thought to force colonies to "fight each other to the death." However, this technique is not always effective.

Other home remedies include petroleum products, soaps, ashes, battery acids and bleach. Most of these generally are ineffective, dangerous or serious pollutants, says the entomologist.

Mites now marketed for fire ant control also are not very effective, adds Drees. They will readily attack humans, producing a severe skin rash.

Devices such as electronic probes, microwave units and explosive devices are exempt from required registration by the Environmental Protection Agency since no chemicals are involved. In most cases, their effectiveness has not been scientifically documented.

Armed with all of today's information for controlling fire ants, what is the best approach?

First, evaluate your fire ants situation, suggests Drees. If total elimination is desired, intensive and costly control efforts may be justified. If only large mounds are to be reduced, another approach is in order. In pastures, broadcasting a bait in combination with dragging heavy objects over mounds will reduce fire ant problems. Baits can also be used in turfgrass areas.

Few products are cleared for fire ant control in home gardens, notes Drees. Applying diazinon to control soil insects also kills foraging worker ants. Mounds can be treated with a hot water drench, shoveled out of the garden or treated with a product containing methyl chloroform.

Amdro should not be used in a garden but can be broadcast around a garden where foraging ants will find it and take it to the queen and brood. Spraying around the garden with diazinon or chlorpyrifos also will keep foraging ants out.

## Bob Bullock Sends

### Sales Tax Checks

AUSTIN - State Comptroller Bob Bullock Friday sent checks totaling \$56.6 million in local sales tax payments to the 1,015 cities that levy the one-percent city tax.

In Eastland County, Rising Star received a check for \$2,191.97 which brought the total to \$14,569.09 for 1986 for a 23.24% increase over 1985. Eastland received the largest check, \$22,504.59 which brought the 1986 total to \$189,813.42, down 0.42% from last year. Cisco's check for \$9,101.67 pushed its total to \$95,618.79 this year, a decrease of 5.74% over 1985.

Ranger's payment of \$5,838.52 brought total payments to \$62,248.30, down 21.92% from last year. Gorman's check for \$1,344.49 brought its total for 1986 to \$14,707.56 for an increase of .71% over 1985.

Houston received the largest check, \$8.8 million, bringing Houston's total 1986 payments to \$82.2 million, down four percent over last year. Dallas' check for \$6.7 million pushed its total to

\$59.8 million this year, a six percent decrease over 1985. San Antonio's payment of \$3.6 million increased its 1986 total to \$32.1 million, up three percent. Austin received \$2.8 million for a total of \$24 million, a three percent decrease over 1985.

payments. Fort Worth's check for \$2.1 million brought total payments to \$19.9 million, six percent over last year's payments. El Paso received \$1.4 million, increasing its total to \$12.6 million, up eight percent over 1985.

Bullock also sent checks totaling \$26.5 million to the state's six Metropolitan Transit Authorities. Dallas' DART check was \$10.3 million, bringing total payments this year to \$91.1 million. Houston's MTA payment was \$10.2 million for a

1986 total of \$95.4 million. Austin's Capital Metro received a \$2.8 million check for a yearly total of \$24 million. VIA in San Antonio received \$1.9 million, increasing payments this year to \$17.6 million. Fort Worth's MTA check was for \$29,527

for a total \$4.7 million this year. Corpus Christi's MTA received a check for \$499,804 bringing total payments for the year to \$2.6 million. July checks represent taxes collected on sales made in May and reported to the Comptroller by June 20.

## TMA Tips For Traveling With Tots

Summer vacation trips can present an extra challenge to families with babies and toddlers. The Texas Medical Association suggests tips that can make air and automobile travel more comfortable for children and families.

Airplanes are probably the most stressful vehicle for the family with an infant. Changes in cabin pressure can help start an ear infection that shows up a couple of days after the flight. A drop in cabin pressure tends to push mucus from the back of the baby's nose into the tube leading to the middle ear, and this blockage can become infected.

Nursing an infant during takeoff and landing is one precaution that can help prevent ear infections. The sucking movement helps keep the middle ear open, much the way chewing gum does for an adult.

Check with your physician who may suggest protecting the child by giving a combination antihistamine and decongestant, which will reduce the amount of nasal secretions and help keep air passages open.

Infants should not be buckled inside a seat belt on an airplane, but held in an adult's lap for takeoff and landing; the child can rest in a portable crib during the flight.

Automobile traveling with young children need not be difficult, but it can be hazardous. Children of all ages risk injury if they're not pro-

perly restrained. They should ride in the back seat. The type of harness designed for children is safer than a lap belt and allows more freedom of movement.

According to Texas law, young children and infants must be strapped into a car seat that is securely belted to the seat of the automobile. This safety measure also may make the ride more pleasant, because children react to car travel better if they can see outside.

Ventilation is another problem during car travel. Babies are likely to react unfavorably to the stuffy air that can result from automobile air conditioning systems that recirculate air. Try to keep at least some fresh air coming in at all times.

If you are traveling with children who are on medication, remember to pack an adequate supply. And if your children are likely to need medical attention while traveling, ask your physician to suggest where you can find a physician.

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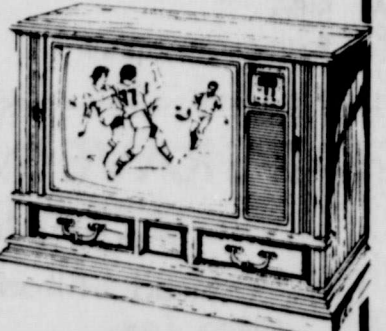

3. Enclose your fireplace behind glass doors. Close the damper. And store wood outside.

4. Avoid dust-catching knicknacks, bookshelves, and side windowsills.

5. Vacuum your home at least once a week.

6. Invest in an efficient kitchen exhaust fan and wash the filter regularly.

7. Don't carpet bathrooms. Use washable throw rugs instead.

8. Buy rugs, carpets and padding made of 100 percent synthetic fibers.

9. Damp mop floors regularly.

10. Keep your bathroom sinks and fixtures as clean as possible.

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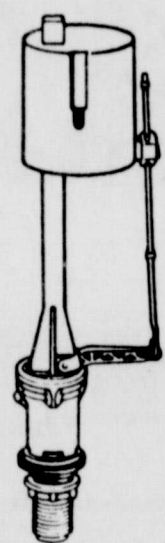

**Constant Supervision Is Urged For Pools**

Shocked by the drowning of nearly 300 young children each year in residential swimming pools and spas, government safety experts are warning parents and pool owners to maintain constant, alert supervision of children in and around pools and spas.

According to the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, lack of constant supervision is one of the reasons why drowning is the fourth leading cause of death to children under five years of age. The agency said that of the 600 drownings in residential pools in 1982, nearly 300 were to children under five, and almost one-third were children below two years of age. Another 3,000 children under five were involved in submersion accidents, some resulting in permanent brain damage.

"It is vital that parents and caretakers be aware of steps they can take now to help reduce the high number of annual child drownings," said CPSC Commissioner Carol G. Dawson. "The most obvious precaution is constant supervision. Children are naturally curious and have the ability to crawl or walk quickly to the water's edge. One moment you have a healthy child, full of life, and the next minute that precious life is lost or damaged permanently. Continual supervision of children around swimming pools and spas is critical."

CPSC offered the following safety precautions for parents and pool owners:

Never leave a child unsupervised near a pool. Be certain that children do not have access to the pool area through an open gate, open door or through an open window. Fence in the pool area completely, and install self-closing and self-locking gates. Latches should be located out of reach of young children.

Flotation devices are not a substitute for adult supervision. Don't consider children "drown proof" because they have had swimming lessons. They should be supervised at all times.
