Dear Joyce:

I Corinthians 4:2 says, "Now it is required that those who have been given a trust must prove faithful",

My child seems unwilling to take responsibility for his books, his jacket, completing projects and doesn't seem to know how to follow through with assigned tasks. How do I correct this?

Answer: The irresponsible child can be retrained but it is easier to work with the young child before behavior patterns are set.

1. Confront the irresponsible child, without anger. Tell him you see in him irresponsibility but you would like to help him. Tell him you have a plan that will help him.

2. Construct with the child a "ladder of do's" that will help him to experience satisfactory behavior.

3. Give bite-sized lessons or tasks and expect acceptable completion.

4. Reward with honest verbal praise.







I had one count of delivery and was never offered probation. I had never been convicted of any crime before this. Why am I going to prison alone Eastland County.

Parents Against Drugs, maybe. The 91st District Court should be asked about this. Maybe there should be a Parents Against 91st District Court.

Thank you for your time. I'll see ya in 5 years.



Feline Leukemia

Not A Human

rently no evidence that a leukemia virus in cats poses a threat to humans. Feline leukemia virus (FeLV) is in the same virus family that causes leukemia

University say there is cur-

and AIDS in humans, point out Dr. Alice Wolf and Dr. Bruce Lawhorn. Because of this relationship, some people may be

concerned that exposure to FeLV infected cats could be a health hazard for humans. However, at this time there is no evidence to indicate that humans can be infected with FeLV or that exposure to FeLV infected cats constitutes any risk of disease in man, say Wolf and Lawhorn. Wolf is an assistant professor of small animal medicine in Texas A&M's College of Veterinary Medicine, and Lawhorn is a veterinarian with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, The Texas A&M University System.

In the laboratory, feline leukemia virus will grow in human cells in a tissue culture. Although viruses are relatively species specific and may grow in isolated cells, they cannot infect an intact animal. In support of this is the finding that FeLV has never been found in human, point out the veterinarians.

Additionally, no antibodies against FeLV (which would indicate an immune response to infection by the virus) have been found in cancer patients, normal individuals exposed to infected cats, veterinarians treating sick cats or laboratory workers who handle virus cultures.

In spite of all this evidence against a human health hazard, Wolf and Lawhorn suggest some caution. Researchers have been working with this virus for only 20 years, and some pro-blems may take many years to develop and be recognized by medical science. Persons who may have poor immune system function or impairment, such as young children (less than 3 years of age), pregnant women and persons on cancer chemotherapy programs, should probably limit their exposure to FeLV infected cats, advise veterinarians.

INTERESTING visitors in our town this week were Malcolm Potter, Rhonda Ferguson and her son, Blake, all of Melbourne, Australia. The were guests of Mr. and Mrs. E.D. Anderson who live on West 14th

Street. The visitors arrived in early July at San Francisco. They went north to Oregon, and then went to Chicago and Washington, D.C., where Malcom's mother, Mrs. Melvin Lawson, lives. Then they flew to Dallas where the Andersons met

them. In Big D, they toured the town and took in such places as the South Fork Ranch that is shown each week in the TV show Dallas. There, they learned that some 1,000 people visit South Fork daily and pay \$6 to tour the handsome ranch home of the Ewings, including old J.R.

In Cisco, the visitors shot rifles, collected a couple of rattlesnake tails (the rattles), saw some jackrabbits and noted the hot weathner. (It's winter back home, they reported). They wanted to see but couldn't find an ar-

madillo and a horned frog. Mrs. Ferguson was an exchange student and went to school in Oregon in 1973. She returned there in 1983 for the 10th reunion of her school class. And this was her third trip to the USA and her first to Texas. Her 10-year old son is on spring break from school in Australia.

The Andersons drove their visitors to DFW airport where they boarded an airliner for Acapulco in the south of Mexico.

Mr. Anderson, by the way, was walking around early Wednesday in the yard at their home. He stepped on a rock and his ankle turned and he fell. The ankle has a bone fracture. He was due home Saturday from a hospital where surgery corrected the ankle problems.

A FEW WEEKS ago we printed a letter here from Mr. Charles Spears of Sherman who named several Cisco young men who lost their lives in WWII. Mr. Carroll Barnhill of Fort Worth, a retired Navy man, read and appreciated the letter. He was in town Wednesday to visit home folks and dropped by to tell us about other Cisco young men who also

died in WWII. Listed by Mr. Barnhill were Billy Westfall, son of the A.R. Westfalls, who was lost when the USS Ashville went down in 1942 off the Philippines; Roy Lee Ayers, who died while flying off the Carrier USS Yorktown on Feb. 2, 1942, in the Gilbert Islands fighting; and Roy Little, nephew of the late Smitty and Billy Huestis, whose ship, DDS USS Monsson, was sunk in late 1942 or early 1943 in the Pacific fighting.


