The board of directors of the Conrad N. Hilton Memorial Park and Community Center has accepted the restored Mobley Hotel under a "substantially complete agreement," President Eris Ritchie reported Thurs-

The conditional acceptance, it was pointed out, means that the contractor still is responsible for finishing several items to the board's satisfaction. The "incomplete" items include the landscaping work as well as minor things inside the building, Mr. Ritchie reported.

The conditional acceptance will allow the Chamber of Commerce to move into the building, and this is expected to be done in the next week or two, Mr. Ritchie reported. CISD Enrolls897 Students For 1986-87 School Year

A total of 897 students had enrolled for the 1986-87 school year in the Cisco Public Schools through Thursday according to a report by Supt. Ray Saunders. This was down from the peak of 961 last

There were 261 students enrolled in the four high school grades, including 88 in the 9th grade, 73 in the 10th grade, 50 in the 11th

grade and 50 in the 12th grade. This was about the same as last year.

In the other grades, enrollment was reported as follows: early childhood, 4; kindergarten, 70; 1st grade, 73; 2nd grade, 68; 3rd grade, 72; 4th grade, 65; 5th grade, 83; 6th grade, 64; 7th grade, 76; and 8th grade, 61.

Others were expected to enroll in the next few weeks. officials said.

Enrollment At CJC Increased

A report that enrollment for the 1986-87 school year has shown an increase for the Cisco and Clyde campuses is expected to be given to the Cisco Junior College board of regents at their regular monthly meeting Monday night, Dr. Henry E. McCullough, president, reported Friday.

A survey of enrollment activities is expected to be completed Monday in time for the board meeting, Dr. McCullough said.

The report is expected to show that the Abilene campus enrollment is about the same as last year while the Cisco and Clyde campuses are having an increase.

A new handbook for college employees will be submitted to the board for approval, Dr. McCullough said. Other routine matters are scheduled to be handled.

Mandatory Water Rationing Possible

Unless heavy rains provide a substantial amount of new water at Lake Cisco before the regular City Council meeting on Tuesday, Sept. 9, the council is expected to consider implementing new water conservation efforts, according to reports Thursday.

City Manager Mike Moore told the Council at their August 26th meeting that too many people don't seem to realize the seriousness of the water problem. July water

choices, Mr. Moore said at the last meeting: 1. Raise rates to discourage use of excess water or 2. Order mandatory rationing. The new rates as proposed

recently call for leaving the 2,000 gallon minimum at \$12 per month. The rate per 1,000 gallons for the first 50,000 gallons has been \$1.50 but the figure would change to the first 12,000 gallons at \$1.50. Water used over 50,000 up to 200,000 gallons would go up to \$1.60 from the present \$1.25, and all water over 200,000 gallons would cost \$2.00 instead of \$1.00.

Mr. Moore said that 75 to 80 per cent of the city's households would not be affected. He added that only a small group of residents are using excessive water-over 50,000 gallons per month. Lake Cisco has four

"in-take" valves that allow water to flow by gravity from the lake to the water filterations plant. Two of the "in-takes" are now out of water and the bottom valve is covered by silt and mud, Mr. Moore reported. This leaves No.3 opening to serve the city's water needs.

If the proposed rates for water conservation are approved, water customers will feel the effect on their Nov. 1 statements, Mr. Moore said.

Rains during the past few days have missed Lake Cisco and its water shed.

Famrers Market Some Tax Rates Could Go Down

Tax rates for taxpayers in six of Eastland County's 18 taxing entities "could go down" as the result of this years reappraisal, annexations and other factors, acpraiser Steve Thomas.

The Appraisal Office has completed the re-evaluation process, computed the effective rate and given public notices of that rate for all entities except for county taxes. (The effective rate has been computed for county taxes but is being held until final determination is made by the Commissioners Court on new provisions for Indigent Health Care re-

quirements.) The phrase "could go down" is important because each of taxing entities has the decision to make as to whether they will use the effective rate or increase. They could add three per cent automatically, but if they go above three per cent and hold hearings before

adopting a higher than three per cent increase in the rate. If each entity chooses to

add the three per cent, rates would be lower in these taxing districts: Gorman ISD, Ranger City, Cisco City, South Eastland County Hospital, Eastland City and

Gorman City.

Loss of oil revenue affected all taxing entities, some more than others, but increased valuations and additions of property through annexations benefitted most entities.

The addition of some \$4 million in property boosted the City of Eastland. Most of this was from the Oak Hollow Addition and annexa-tions on East Main St.







A summer place that symbolizes past, future

CISCO — One more hill. I told my wife, and we'd see it, and she'd be impressed.

I could picture it in my mind: wet bodies splashing in the water, plunging from the 30-foot high towers or swinging from a trapeze before plummeting into the coolness.

We shouldn't have been dallying. It's a long

way from here to Waco and it was late on a Sunday afternoon. But 1 was drawn to the water like a divining rod.

Finally we passed the sign, "Lake Cisco," telling me I was in the right place. I slowed to turn as I saw the dam that abutted what was touted many years ago as the world's largest

outdoor swimining pool.

But as we pulled into a giant parking lot consumed by ruts and potholes, my memory came to a jarring halt.

Well, the structure was there, but the water was gone, and so were the wet bodies, the colorful towels lining the pool, and the snow cones that made our tongues red. I clambered out of the car and stood there with my mouth agape, as if having stumbled on an ancient ruin.

The swimming pool of my memories at Lake Cisco was considerably larger than a football field. The shallow end I enjoyed as a child had swings and slides in the water. The deep end I enjoyed in later years had a dirt bottom, or so we understood. It was so deep that no one

Now the pool looked like a desolate play-ground. The swings and slides were still there, standing on dry concrete. The diving platforins in the deep end stood surrounded by an overgrowth of tall reeds. The trapeze was missing, and instead two frayed ropes drifted in the

For this community of approximately 4,600, 30 miles east of Abilene, the pool was and is a 30 miles east of Abilene, the pool was and is a symbol. It was part of a complex that included picnic grounds, miniature golf and a roller-skating rink. All told, it helped to make Cisco one of the preferred tourist attractions in the region, and visiting my grandparents there was always a highlight of a Texas trip.

The pool closed in 1974. In the years since,

Cisco has seen lean times. The oil industry that sustained it has slumped, and the community has had to battle to stave off decline The city is beginning to realize that the pool may be the missing link between stagnation

and prosperity.

Cisco merchant Bill Austin, who remembers





Refugee Rescue

Navy Seaman Apprentice Jimmy W. Davis, son of Butch Davis and Sandra Carr, both of Cisco, recently participated in the rescue of 21 Vietnamese refugees.

The combat store ship, USS San Jose, homeported in Guan, was off the coast of Subic Bay, Republic of the Philippines, when a small boat drifting without power was sighted. Upon reaching the distressed vessel, the San Jose crew discovered that the refugees had been adrift 22 out of the 24 days they had been at sea. The 21 refugees were immediately brought aboard the Naval ship and given medical treatment for malnutrition and exposure.

parent or a step parent must have from the child. If you have these, you will get everything else in a matter of time.

1. Respect & obedience -Be firm and fair but do not lose sleep over accusations that you are not being fair.

2. Accountability - They must simply take the responsibility to have permission for where they are going and with whom they are to go. 3. Control over friends - As

your child grows, peer influence more than anything else will affect his attitude and moral development. You should make sure he knows how to choose friends.

When these 3 things are received by the parents from the child, the other mentioned issues become less urgent. Do not make the mistake of hassling the child about everything. Start with the items of most importance. It will not all come in a few short days. You must be sensitive to their feelings and frustrations. Children sometimes feel the newly married parent gained or benefitted by this where the child only lost something of his world and gained nothing but problems.





WATER - NATURE'S BEVERAGE

It is important to consume adequate liquids, especially water. It will help to soften the food in the stomach, and assist in moving food through the digestive system. Water is also important in carrying nutrients, disposing of waste products and regulating the body temperature.

Because the body loses approximately 10 glasses of water each day, it is essential to good health that it is replaced. If the body doesn't receive adequate water intake, a poor complexion may result; or the individual may experience a feeling of slug-





CJC Bible Chair To Offer Free 10-Week Course

The Biblical Studies Center at Cisco Junior College will offer a ten-week, non-credit Bible course on "The Minor Prophets of the Old Testament' beginning Monday evening, Sept. 8. The course will meet from 7 to 9 p.m. Monday evenings, and will be open to anyone wishing to participate, at no charge. The classes will be informal, and there will be

no tests, special requirements, or assignments. A Bible Chair spokesman pointed out that the lessons will be helpful to scholars and non-scholars alike, and that everyone is welcome.

Instructor for the class will be Dr. Henry Speck, Jr., a professor of Bible at Abilene Christian University. Dr. Speck is not only an outstanding Bible instructor,

but he has also served as a minister for churches in Texas and Oklahoma, and he is a past president of Christian College of the Southwest in Dallas. He has participated in mission campaigns in several foreign countries and was an army chaplain in World War II and Korea. Dr. Speck has a reputation for being a very concise, easy-to-understand, and interesting Bible instructor.

The course will feature a different topic each week: The Minor Prophets (Introduction Backgrounds), Jonah and Nahum (Prophets to Ninevah), Joel (The Day of the Lord), Hosea (God's Eternal Love), Amos (The Prophet of Social Justice),

Amos (Spiritual Worship), Micah (One's Personal Religion), Habakkuk,

Zephaniah, and Obadiah (Prophets of the Fall of Jerusalem), Haggai and Zechariah (The Restoration of God's People), and Malachi (A Bridge to the Coming Christ). Dr. Speck has pointed out that each week's class will be a

separate lesson, and that if a student has to miss one or more clases it will not interfere with the continuity of the course. Class will not meet on September 22 or October 13; thus, the final session is scheduled for November 24.

The Cisco Junior College Bible Chair is under the direction of the elders of the Cisco Church of Christ, and is supported by other Churches of Christ in the area. Programs of the Bible Chair include free counseling services for students of CJC and area residents, social activities on campus, and special spiritually-related speaker series and retreats.

Chairman of the Bible Chair Committee is Dr. Ken Hammes, Head of the Language Arts Department at CJC and a member of the Cisco Church of Christ. More information about the Bible course may be obtained by contacting him at CJC,






