## Wranglers Play Last Game Of Year

The 1986 football season ended for the Wranglers of Cisco Junior College as they lost a 16-to-7 game to Ranger Junior College in the annual Lions Benefit Bowl at Breckenridge last Saturday night. The loss left the CJC team with a 5-5 record for the season.

It was the 9th annual Lions Benefit Bowl meeting for the Cisco and Ranger college teams at Breckenridge, and Ranger has won all but the 1985 contest. Sponsors of the game are the Lions Clubs of Albany, Breckenridge, Cisco, Clyde, Eastland, Gordon and Ranger. Profits from the game are divided by the clubs for use in supporting the Texas Camp for Crippled Children and for

local charities sponsored by the clubs.

Scott Simpson, freshman running back from Dallas, chalked up 187 yards in 27 carries to lead Ranger to the victory. He scored both of his team's touchdowns.

The Wranglers scored first in the opening quarter after Donnie Harris, freshman from Gilmer, returned a punt 24 yards to Ranger's 19. Two plays later, Cisco QB David Dacus passed 15 yards to Flanker Kevin Evans, Fort Worth freshman, for a touchdown. Eric Edwards kicked the extra point.

In the first quarter, Mike Martinez booted a 35-yard field goal for Ranger's first points. In the second quarter, Simpson scored on

a left end sweep for three yards to climax a seven-minute, 15-play series that covered 77 yards.

In the final period, Simpson went up the middle for 30 yards to score. The extra point was not good.

Ranger's defense had an outstanding night, intercepting one Dacus pass and blocked a field goal for Edwards plus halting at least two strong thrusts by the Wranglers. Ranger had a 10-7 half-time lead.



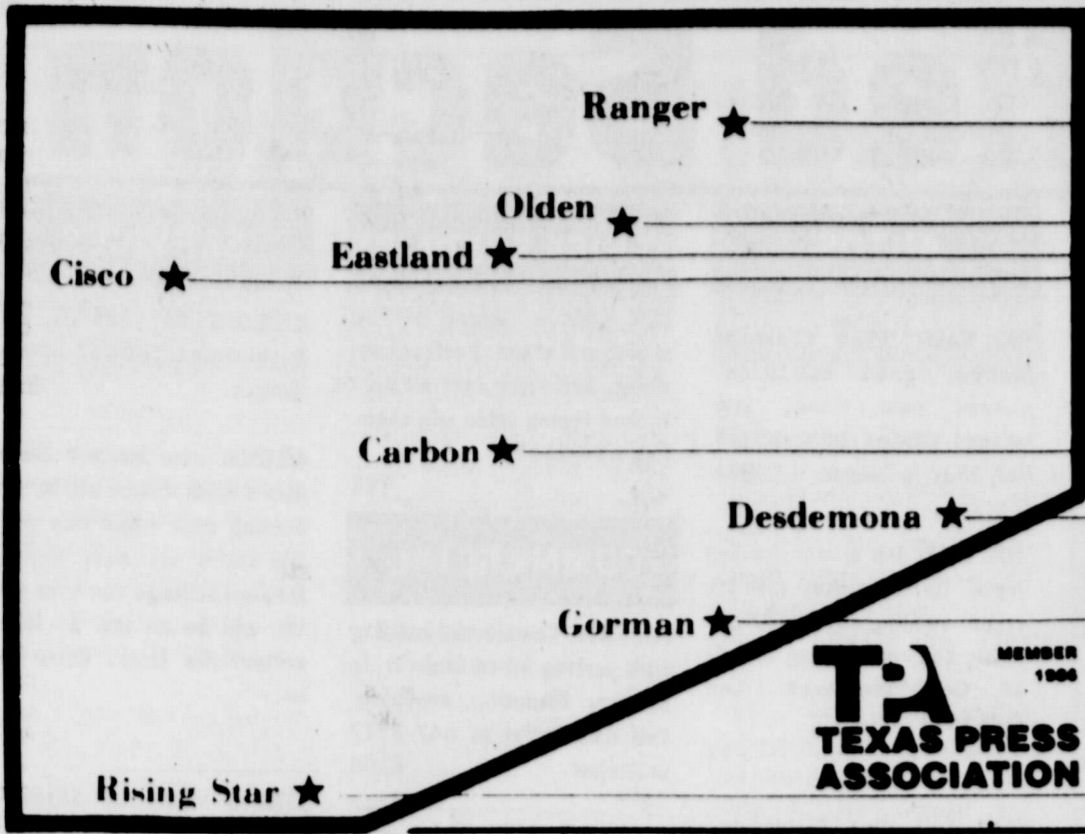

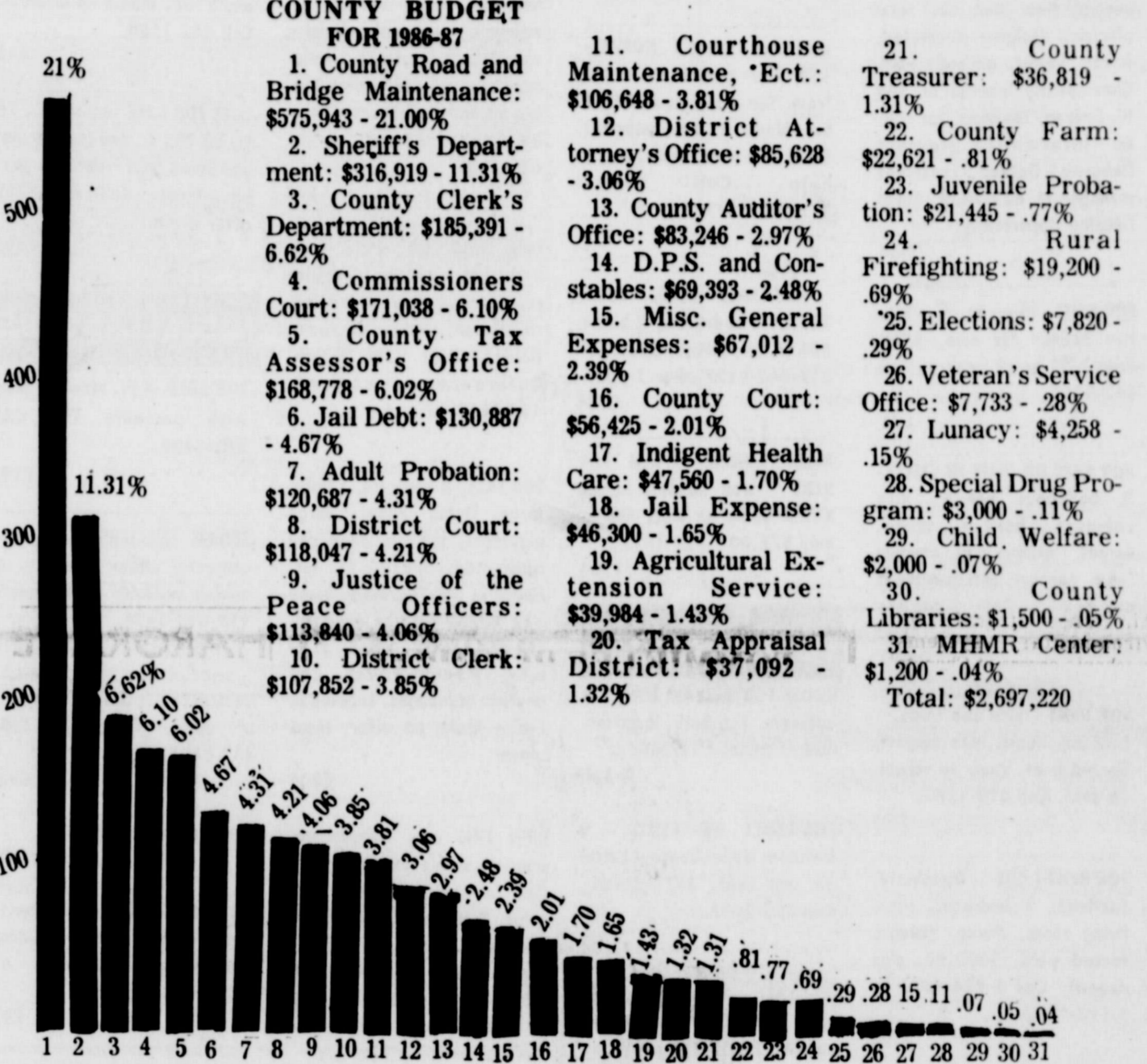

The Budget for 1986-87 is set at approx. \$2,800,000, with exact totals for all Departments falling slightly below that. County revenue sources are listed as more than \$1,200,000 expected from taxation, with \$1,763,000 anticipated from fines, fees, permits, intergovernmental sources, etc.

In looking over the amount of expenditures allowed various Departments for the current year, it should be noted that some of these offices, such as the County Clerk's Department, the taxing agencies, etc. bring in much more revenue than the cost of their operation.

## SURVEY SHOWS AMERICANS TREASURE CHRISTMAS SPIRIT, TRADITIONAL VALUES

Basic values and the spirit of Christmas are alive and well and living in the hearts and minds of Americans, according to 175,000 people who responded to a questionnaire about the "Good Things in Life" by Dewar's Scotch.

Enjoyment of "sports and the outdoors" ranked second in the tally, with

21 percent of the responses. "A wonderful day of skiing" summed up the joys of winter sports for a San Jose man.

In total, those interested in the material things of life accounted for nine percent of the responses.

Less mercenary thoughts, though, restore our faith in mankind. Ten percent of the respondents echoed the thoughts of a Cliffside Park, New Jersey woman who simply wrote "Peace on Earth."

## Five steps to carving the perfect holiday turkey

The turkey is out of the oven — juicy, golden brown and ready for carving. To serve the perfect holiday turkey from roast pan to platter, the following carving tips, supplied by the culinary experts at Revere, should help:

- The essential tool for carving a turkey is a sturdy and reliable eight-inch carving knife. It should fit comfortably in your hand and have a blade created of molybdenum stainless steel for easy sharpening and carefree cleaning.

- Another feature to look for is a tang that extends the length of the handle (a tang is the part of the blade that connects the knife to the handle).

cutting along the breast bone and rib cage and then lifting meat away from bone.

- Place on cutting board and slice evenly, going against the meat's grain. As more slices are needed, remove second half of the breast and repeat.

- Arrange meat on platter, separating white and dark meat. Garnish with holiday trimmings such as seasonal fruits and vegetables. Then relax and enjoy — this is one meal everyone loves — no matter how you slice it.

## I'VE BEEN WRONG BEFORE

However, my opinions have never been as expensive as errors by people in positions of power. Having thus dodged a degree of responsibility I will give my opinions on Veterans Administration hospital care.

There are certain vested interests who push for private control of Vets medical treatment. While they claim all sorts of reasons, I am of the opinion that their motivation is strictly greed.

Too often such grasping outfits are aided by well-meaning, but poorly informed people like the lady who wrote a letter to the Abilene paper. She stated that our veterans were poorly served, experimented on, operated on by inexperienced interns, etc. Furthermore, she thought that the mobile homes at Camp Walters should be moved up near the Dallas V.A. hospital so the vets family members could be near their loved ones being treated (though her letter inferred mistreatment). To the uninformed it might sound logical to provide the best for the former defenders of the nation and even a disgrace that it wasn't being done. Her letter probably prompted a few angry letters to Congress.

The cold facts are (I have been in that hospital more times than I like to remember) viewed by one with experience quite different.

Yes, like all major medical facilities, V.A. hospitals have interns and much of the work done on me was by interns. Opening by stub arm and scraping the bone where infection had set in was done by a couple of interns. It was no big thing threatening life much. Still, an expert was at their elbow during the procedure. Likewise, an intern worked on the only eye I have and

## Region 4 Clinic

## To Charge Fees

The Eastland clinic announced today that the clinic as well as all public health clinics in the forty-four county Texas Public Health Region 4, will begin collecting fees from patients December 1, 1986.

Payment will be based on the patient's abilities to pay, allowing for income, family size, and types of treatment needed.

Because the Texas Department of Health's funds for distribution to public health clinics have been limited, and because the number of patients has increased while health care costs have soared, those patients who can afford to contribute to the costs of their services will be asked to do so.

Charging small fees for clinic services is a way patients can help the state pay for the minimum costs of services, and it is a means of ensuring continued services to all who need health care.

No one will be denied service at the clinic because they do not have money. Those who do have some resources need to help pay for the services they receive, and allow us to use the limited funds available to keep on serving everyone. Anyone who can afford private health care is urged to see a family physician.

Fees will be collected using a sliding scale. Many patients are already familiar with one or all of the programs, so a sliding scale as simple as the one designed should be easily understood. Bilingual information is to be handed out to patients, and the staff is trained to answer any questions patients might have about the new system.

Every cent of the patient's contributions will go toward defraying the growing costs that have threatened the clinic's ability to continue serving all persons who need help.

did four by-pass surgery on my heart. Always the experts were right there. In fact, the young men's hands might be steadier on the knife than some older doc's.

The mortality record for V.A. is much lower for heart surgery than the average for other hospitals. If our exercise men were indeed being used as guinea pigs as the lady charged that simply wouldn't be reflected by low mortality.

Probably unknown by or forgotten by most people is the fact that medical experimentation is strongly restricted by law. While experiments were formerly done in prisons and mental institutions, laws were enacted forbidding coercion, requiring consent by family, rejecting consent forms signed by the mentally impaired, and requiring review to prevent abuses. You are now more likely to receive medication which has not been absolutely tested from a local doctor than from V.A. In such a fish bowl as they work, a malpractice would hardly go unreported for long.

Ah, yes, they are kept waiting for longer periods. One vet sitting beside me said they wasted time asking the same old questions every time he came in and he was going to tell them they already had all that written if only they would read the record. I told him that my record was probably as thick as a dictionary and that I didn't want to wait while they searched through all that.

A minutes reflection and he decided he would answer those same old questions. Certainly we wait, but the cost of maintaining staff for instant service would be staggering.

And while considering cost I turn to those empty mobile homes at Camp Walters. The land purchase required to locate them near V.A. in Dallas would be frightening even if there were no budget problems and cleaning, police protection and record keeping V.A., would have to provide would be prohibitive. The best we can say about the letter the lady wrote is that with her man in serious condition her thought processes were temporarily malfunctioning. The rub is that others might react in sympathy to her outcry.

My brother was turned away from badly needed medical treatment at V.A. in California, because he resorted to beer to relieve his pain before going in, few indeed are those who give a drinking man credence. Sad, but true. I know of a case in Bryan, Texas where a doctor neglected a man who has not been drinking at all but was struck by a beer bottle while passing a tavern. He left 11 children fatherless.

Back to Dallas, I was once held over three weeks because a routine chest X-ray showed a suspicious cleft in the vertebrae. They had to wait that long to get the top bone specialist flown in from Ann Arbor, Michigan to check it out because they did not know what to make of it. Does anyone dream they could get such service in a private medical facility?

Here are some Quit Tips.

Hide all the ash trays, matches, etc. Lay in a supply of sugarless gum, carrot sticks, etc. Drink lots of liquid, but pass up on coffee and alcohol. Tell everyone you are quitting for the day. When the urge to smoke hits take a deep breath, hold it for 10 seconds and release it slowly. Exercise to relieve tension. Try the "buddy system". Ask a friend to quit too.

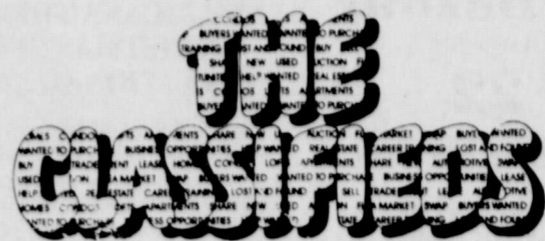

## WTU Residential Customers To Pay Less In November

Residential customers of West Texas Utilities Co. are paying less for electricity during November than the average price being paid by customers of other investor-owned utilities in Texas.

The monthly report by the Public Utility Commission of Texas shows that WTU's standard residential rates are \$36.80 for 500 kilowatt-hours, compared to an average of \$38.53 among the state's eight investor-owned companies, and \$64.09 for 1,000 KWh, compared to an

average of \$70.

Highest rates in the state are charged by El Paso Electric, whose customers are paying \$49.69 for 500 KWh and \$92.86 for 1,000 KWh.

The PUC report shows that WTU's rates have declined 11.4 per cent since November 1985, while the average decline among all utilities in the survey, including rural electric cooperatives and municipals, was 8.8 per cent.

## Power Plant To Be In Operation Soon

Start-up operations at West Texas Utilities Co.'s Oklahoma Power Plant are proceeding normally, and the new coal-fired generating plant is expected to be in commercial operation before the end of the year.

The huge plant eight miles southeast of Vernon produced its first electricity in a test run this past week, with 22 megawatts going out over transmission lines for a short time. When it is brought on line, the plant will have a net generating capacity of 665 megawatts.

The first test run was fueled by oil, but coal will be burned in future tests as the boilers are brought up to full load. An on-site supply of low-sulphur coal has been building up since July, when the first coal train arrived from Gillette, Wyo.

The Oklahoma station is WTU's first coal-fired plant. The company's other eight plants use natural gas as the

main fuel.

"We're glad that we'll no longer depend on just one source of fuel," said Walter Meller of Abilene, WTU's Manager of System Production.

"This new fuel mix means cheaper energy for all our customers in the long run," he said. "And in the short run, the more stable fuel costs will help offset higher base rates that will be necessary to pay for the new plant."

WTU officials say an application for an increase in base rates will be filed after the plant becomes commercial, although details have not been worked out. WTU has not raised its base rates in over two years, and has lowered its fuel charges and made fuel cost refunds four times to its retail customers.

The Oklahoma Power Station is by far the largest in the WTU system. Construction began in 1982 and all equipment is the most modern available, including state-of-the-art pollution control facilities.

From the beginning, ownership was shared by two other companies in the Central and South West Corp.—Public Service Co. of Oklahoma and Central Power and Light Co. Since construction began, PSO and CPL have sold portions of their shares to the Oklahoma Municipal Power Authority and the City of Brownsville. WTU remains majority owner and operator of the station.

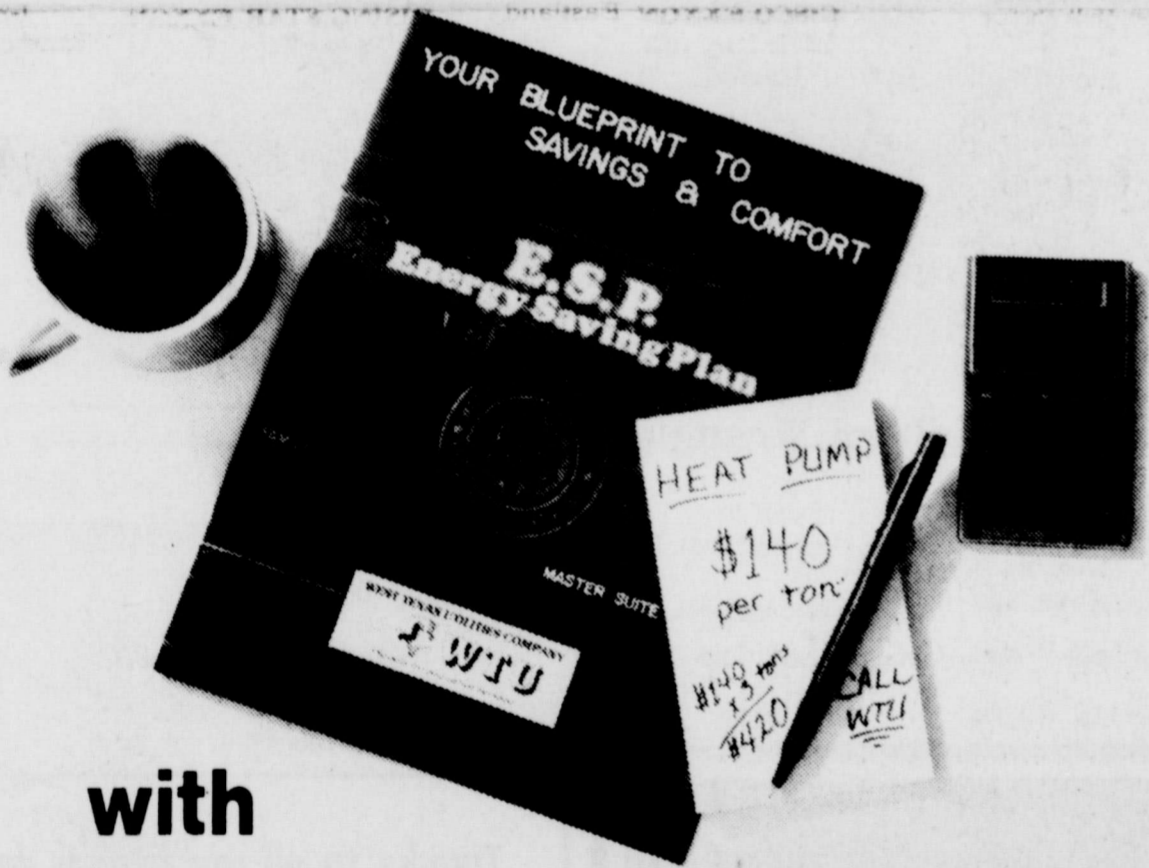

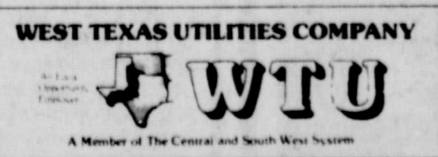
