

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Roads A Leading Topic For County Commissioners; Jail Passes Inspection

Eastland County Commissioners Monday again discussed emergency measures concerning recent flood damage to rural roads.

The County has been declared a Federal Disaster Area, and there is money available from both FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency) and the Soil Conservation Service.

But the County has to first spend the money and then apply to receive it back.

The Commissioners approved a Resolution to take \$94,000 from the County-Wide Road and Bridge Fund to begin these repairs. It was estimated that total repairs in all Precincts will cost around \$698,000.

As various Precincts are reimbursed the money will be put back in the County-Wide Road and Bridge Fund.

Richard Robinson, Commissioner of Pct. 1, appeared to sum up the situation: "We need to see that everything's documented - everything we've spent on every mud puddle. If we do it right, we'll get part of our money back."

The Commissioners continued to report widespread damage on all the roads, especially in Pct. 2. Norman Christian, Comm. of that Precinct, had some pictures with him that left no doubt about the destruction.

County Judge Scott Bailey said that Federal money was expected to be available soon, with at least \$100,000 from the Soil Conservation Serv-

On other road matters, R. E. King of the Nimrod/Sabanno area, Pct. 3, said that water diverted from an oil lease by the Big M Oil Company Inc. was damaging a county road and causing flooding on his property and in his driveway. His home was difficult of access, he reported.

He told of attempts to conpany and to work out some that was tried these days. better arrangement on the water flow.

Billy Bacon, Commissioner of Pet. 4, said that water had also been recently impounded in lakes on the Simpson property just north of Pleasant Hill Church. During the heavy rains May 1 and 2 the water ran out of these lakes, tore up two fences, and threw water in the County road nearby.

Bacon had some better news to report from the County Jail. The Jail passed the inspection on May 8 with "flying colors," he said. It was in "perfect condition" on in-

There are currently 17 inmates in the Eastland County Jail, Bacon reported, and 7 of them belong to the State.

Bacon said he wanted to reply to a letter he had received about the Television sets in jail cells. The County does not buy T.V.'s for prisoners, he said. The County furnishes T. V. connections in the cells, and the prisoners have to furnish their won T.V.

"If there is any misbehavior or vandalism by these prisoners their T. V. sets are cut off," the Commissioner stated. "We have found this to be the most effective way of dealing with problems in the Jail. It's a money-making deal for us."



Pharmacy Topics

Purified poison -- the Food and Drug Administration has approved the use of sterile botulism toxin to treat two eye muscle disorders. Treatment is the first to be successful against strabismus -- crossed or wall eyes -- and blepharospasm, in which eyes close involuntarily.

Non-surgical treatment for prostate problems is under investigation in London. In hyperthermic treatment, a microwave instrument heats the gland for an hour at a time, monitored and controlled by computer.

Laser beam that travels in a flexible fiber is being tested for dental use at Marquette University. The NdY AG laser is expected to be more useful than the carbon dioxide laser to vaporize decay and infected tissue in various procedures.

Use of the drug misoprostol is recommended to avoid the gastric upset and ulceration that may accompany the frequent use of nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs, according to a report in the journal Geriatrics. The report says misoprostol does not interfere with the pain-killing effect of the NSAID.

"We may not have extremely high quail populations this year because the number of holdover birds from last year was low but the birds that are out there should have excellent nesting success," said Brummel.

Conditions also appear optimum for white-tailed deer fawn production and survival, after several years of low fawn





Q. Lately I have been having some interperonal relation problems. I'm sure there must be some things I need to change. Could you give me some clues?

A. In general there are some characteristics that can cause interpersonal relation problems. You misht like to check this list to see if any would apply to your situation. According to Dr. George Brazell some causes of such problems can be as follows:

1. Lack of Dependability - some people are not dependable in words or actions.

2. Tendency to Exagerate - everything is bigger and

3. Always Grouchy - nothing good to say about anything or anybody.

4. Sarcasm - "Yeah, but ... "

5. Sense of Inferiority - "Everybody is better than I

More of these characteristics will be given next time. Do you see selfcenteredness being at the root of many of these things? If you see anything in this list to work on try to have a friend help you to change to better habits. (to be continued) Questions should be addressed to:

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




