#### **Plaque Is Guilty**

Q. What is the number one cause of tooth decay?

A. The major cause of decay is a sticky, filmy substance known as plaque. Because our mouths harbor bacteria., almost everyone suffers from some degree of plaque build-up throughout their lives. The plaque clings to the enamel of the teeth, and when food particles and sugar are fermented by the bateria, they form an acid. This acid, if not removed regularly, will cause a pit to form.

#### **Search Begins** For Top 1990 **Rural Minister**

Nominations are being sought for the most outstanding rural minister of Texas for 1990.

"The rural minister might be considered an unsung hero, and where that's the case, his associates can bring some special recognition to him," said Dr. David Ruesink, a sociologist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Serv-

Ruesink said the award is given annually by the Progressive Farmer magazine during the annual Town and Country Church Conference, scheduled for Oct. 1-2, at Texas A & M University.

The conference is an Extension Service educational program for rural and small town ministers and lay lead-

To be eligible for the award, Ruesink said, a minister must have served for at least two years a congregation in a rural community or town of less than 10,000 population.

Ruesink said nominations should focus on how the minister has made a difference to his church and community.

"Show how the minister's leadership has helped bring the people together to fulfill unity and religious needs," he said.

Ruesink said 53 rural min-

isters were nominated last year. The winner was the Rev. Larry Castillo-Wilson, who helped organize relief efforts for victims of a tomado that devastated the West Texas community of Saragosa Ruesink said all nominees are recognized, and the top minister is named at the conference.

Nominations should be sent by Aug. 1 to Texas Rural Minister of the Year Committee, Department of Rural Sociology, Texas A & M University, College Station, Texas 77843.



What is the surface area of the pond? Generally, catfish is the only species recommended for ponds smaller than one surface acre. If the pond is larger than one acre several different species can be mixed for stocking.

Will you feed the fish? Stocking rates of catfish can be greatly inreased if feed is used. A catfish can grow one

pound for every two pounds of feed.

Will you fertilize the pond? Fertilization can double the productivity of most bodies of water and if done properly will also help control aquatic

Without any commercial feed catfish can be stocked at a rate of about 100 per surface acre with about 1000 fathead minnows per acre. In lager ponds bass may be stocked in addition to the catfish at a rate of 50 fingerlings per surface acre. Before stocking bass it is a good idea to have the forage fish already established in the pond.






