

Dental Dialogue

The Best Toothbrush

Q. What is the best type of toothbrush for an adult?

A. There are many kinds of tooth-A. There are many kinds of tooth-brushes available on the market. The A. D. A. recommends a soft bristle brush with rounded ends, a flat brush-ing surface, and a straight handle. Try to select a brush that has a small enough head to fit into your mouth without causing injury, yet still reach all your teeth easily. If you have a particulary small mouth, you may want to purchase a child-size brush. Another feature to look for is whether the handle will fit comfortably in your hand. Some brushes have a nubbert tip to clean between the teeth, but if you are brushing and flossing but if you are brushing and flossing properly, such an option isn't neces-sary.

ridge. He was due to make his second talk to the Cisco Writer's Club on Tuesday, June 5.

Part of the fun of being here was getting to see this part of the country, the Englishman said. He had traveled in other parts of the United States, but never in Texas.

"Texans are their own unique selves - they have their oooown style," he remarked. "It is much more relaxed here than say, in Chicagp where I once stayed."

Besides the College, Frith said he also like the countryside around Cisco. He noted that it was green, with tress and wildflowers. He said he considered Lake Cisco very attractive, and was amazed at the site of what was once the World's Largest Outdoor Swimming Pool.

"That could be restored into a very beautiful area," he delcared.

While mentioning places of special interest Frith said he certainly didn't want to forget the Library (Maner Learning Center) at Cisco Junior College.

"The Librarians at the College have been very helpful to me, and I've enjoyed looking around there. They have some interesting mate-Firth brings out two of his

own books: "Dragon", set in China in 383 A.D., and "Asgard", set in Norway. He explains that these are written in the Homeric epic style, a type of writing he favors. Several other of his epic named "Krishna", and an epic dealing with the Cuban missle crisis of the early 1960's.

"On these epics I am following the traditional narrative style, in which material was passed down orally long before being written down," he says. "The epic is an old form, and I believe we are going to turn back to it."

cal style. Astonishingly good, with an Italian setting and soft shades of cobalt, brown and pink.

"I am attempting the style of the old Masters," he explains. "Some of the so-called modern art has been distorted, not true to form. Classical art is enduring, timeless, whether expressed in acting, music, or literature.

He mentioned some of his hopes for the future. "Art should be back at the core of Society, like it was in the Reniassance not somewhere on the fringes. Any truly modern culture will be based on that."

I planned for a moment, thinking of his vision. That was really his trip was all about - exchanging ideas. Perhaps that was what happened with the voyagers during the other Reniassance Frith talked about.





Stamford is probably the hottest bass fishing lake going right now. One angler reported a five fish string going over 23 pounds. These fish were taken on main lake points on jig and frog combinations in 3 feet of water.

If the water is still being released at Lake Granbury some excellent hybrid striper fishing has been going on. The largest I have heard of tipped the scales at 18 pounds. The number have been excellent with most anglers landing limits.

Just a little reminder for Leon the boat ramp located at the Chock-o-Block bridge is a state furnished ramp and no fees are required for using this facility provided by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department. Nor are fees

Retroactive Payments

Some people think that if, for any reason, they delay filing an application for Social Security benefits, they are entitled to benefits retroactively to the month of their first eligibility. That's not the case. If you apply before reaching 65, with few exceptions, you cannot receive payments for months before you apply. If you apply after you reach 65, you may be entitled up to 6 months retroactive payments. This happens if you meet all the requirements for entitlement to benefits except for filing of an application.

Suppose you reach age 65 in June 1990 but you don't file an application for retirement benefits until June 1991. You can be entitled to retroactive payments back to December 1990. Let's suppose now that you reached 62 in June 1990 and don't file an application until June 1991. Benefits cannot be paid to a retired worker, a spouse, or a widow or widower for months before applying, if this would result in a permanent additional reduction of the bene-

We say "if" because the retroactive payments do not always result in a permanent reduction of benefits. If your spouse is over 65, or under 65

with a child in his or her care. their benefits as your dependents are not subject to reducon, and they can receive retroactive payments and so

You can receive retroactive benefits for months prior to 65 if you had excess earnings in the first year of entitlement, and these earnings can be applied to months before applying. The number of retroactive months that can the paid depends on the amount of the come eamings and the months you

Retroactive benefits can also be paid to a disabled surviving spouse or a disabled surviving divorced spouse who is entitled to retroactive benefits for any month before reaching age 60.

Also, a widow(cr) or a surviving divorced spouse who files an application in the month after the month of the worker's death may be entitled to benefits for the month of the worker's death.

Social Security is always concerned about the rights you have to retirement and survivors benefits under the program, as well as to Medicare. There are certain rules and waiting periods that insured people have to meet before Medicare is available

to them. However, to permit a disabled widow(er) or disabled surviving divorced spouse to have Medicare as soon as possible (provided he or she meets all the requirements for eligibility) he or she is deemed entitled retroactively for up to 12 months, even if monthly benefits are not payable retroactively.

Area Mamography Service

The Mobile Breast Cancer Detection Unit of Odessa, Texas, which services EASTLAND, TEXAS today received the certification of the American College of Radiology Mammography Accreditation Program.

Mammography is an x-ray examination of the breast, which the American Cancer Society and other medical experts see as the best means for early detection of breast

The program is voluntary and is designed to insure that women receive optimum quality mammographic examinations. The process is done through a peer review evaluation of the facility's staff qualifications, equipment, quality control and quality assurance programs, image quality, and breast dose. The accreditation must be renewed every three years.

The accredication program was instituted because of the concerns of radiologists, other national medical organizations, and the public that qualified personnel perform and interpret mammograms and that dedicated mammographic equipment be used. The American College of Radiology received an American Cancer Society Control Grant which was used to pilot test the Accreditation Program.

Breast cancer will strike one in 10 American women. The American Cancer Society predicts that about 41,000 women will die of breast cancer this year. As there is no way to prevent the disease, early detection and treatment offer the greatest hope for survival.

The American Cancer Society recommends that women do monthly breast self-exams and have regular physical breast exams by a doctor. It further recommends mammography on the following schedule:

A baseline mammogram (for reference) between age 35 and 39.

A mammogram every one or two years between age 40

An annual mammogram from age 50.


Rumor 4: "You are just out to close this hospital and nothing you say is the truth"
