For Reduced Meal Program Applications are available for parents who want to sign up their children for Cisco Independent School District's free and reduced-price breakfast and lunch program. Applications are at each school in the district and will be given to each child when

they register. The program, funded by the federal government, provides free and discount breakfast and lunches to children who qualify according to government and district guidelines.

Families who qualify for food stamps or are housing foster children automatically qualify for the meal program. Other families can qualify if their total household income is at or below a certain amount. For example, a family of four with a total annual household income of less than \$23,495 qualifies for reduced prices. If the same family had



a total income of \$16,510, their children would qualify for free breakfast and lunch. Student lunches regularly

cost \$1.00 and breakfasts costs .40 Children whose families qualify for reduced prices pay 40 cents for lunch and 30 cents for breakfast.

There is no deadline to apply for the program, and families turned down L . . . may reapply. The food services supervisor will verify eligibility. The information will be kept very confiden-

Staff in the audience: Dan Wagner of Washington, D.C.; Dale King of Abilene; and Bill Longley, Don Starr, Kay and Jane Looney Schoolsmaker, all of Stamford.

Continuing, O'Brien said that many have had a part in the bust project, and participation is still coming in. He described Dale Stewart's work as a "labor or love," saying that the sculptor had put a lot of time and care into this special piece.

He said: "Charlie may think we're an Indian giver, but I've asked permission for the bust to remain in Eastland a short while, so others will have an opportunity to view it."

He added that the bust will be on display at Eastland National Bank, probably until Fun Day in Stamford on Sept. 8.

Touching on the situation in the Middle East, O'Brien said: "I'm thankful to God that we have a man like Charlie for times like these."

At this point Dale Stewart stepped to the bronze. With Stenholm nearby he lifted the cloth from it, revealing the likeness of the Congressman. The audience applauded and Stenholm flashed a smile as he looked over the gift.

"'Thank you' seems so inadequate, but I'll say it," the Congressman told the crowd. "Most things like this come to people when they are no longer a part of this world. The love and thoughts behind this is what counts."

Stenholm then turned to the trouble in the Middle East, saying that he was "behind the President 100 percent. I'm glad the United Nations is performing in the way we want and expect it too.'

He said one hope was that the United States will have a true blockade supported by every nation in the free world. Another hopes was that out of this dangerous situation a lesson will be learned - to never again have the United States dependent on foreign

"For years we've ignored warning voices - took energy for granted," Stenholm said. "Now we must have a National Energy Policy. We cannot let one country control the economic lifeblood of the whole world."

He again expressed appreciation to everyone involved in the gift of the bronze. "My family and I will enjoy it while I'm till serving you," the Congressman said.

Stenholm also mentioned that Congress would begin its session Sept. 10, and had a "full year's work to do in three weeks." He said there needed to be bi-partisan support critical issues.

When the formal program ended the bronze bust was carried to the mezzanine,

where a reception was held. Refreshments of assorted cookies, punch and coffee were catered by Joyce Eaves of Kokomo. The crowd enjoyed visiting with Congressman Stenholm, Dale and others - and admiring the work of art.

It was a good, patriotic day in Eastland County.

Lifestyle changes -- even in the 70s and 80s -- can increase life span and quality, according to research analyzed at Duke University. Of course, dropping risk factors at age 30 is best of all, say doctors.

New drug to grow hair is being tested at UC/Los Angeles. Cyoctol is credited for an average 21 percent increase in hair growth.

Researchers at New York Hospital-Cornell Medical Center found that adding bran to the diet can help shrink precancerous ployps and lower the risk of colon and rectal cancer.

Eye doctor at Emory University has developed an experimental laser scanner that can spot early traces of cataracts. Its use would be combined with a drug to stop or reduce production of the proteins that form the cataract.

It's easier to remove superficial splinters from the skin if they are first loosened with salicylic acid, says the American Academy of Dermatology. (Non-prescription wart removers do the job.)



Applying For Social Security Retirement Benefits

If you plan to apply for Social Security retirement benefits, but find it difficult to visit a Social Security office, you can apply by telephone. Social Security personnel will take the necessary information over the phone and arrange to complete your application by mail.

You can call Social Security's toll free telephone number 1-800-234-5772, 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. every business day. The best times to call are early in the morning and later in the afternoon after the first week of the month.

You should apply for retirement benefits at least 2 or 3 months before you plan to stop working. This will help assure that your benefits will start the month of your retirement. The first check should be received early in the month after the first full month of your retirement.

You will need certain documents to establish your eligibility for benefits. They include yourSocial Security card or a record of the number and proof of your date of birth, such as a birth certificate or religious record of birth or baptism recorded early in life. These documents must be original records or copies certified by the agency that issued them.

If original birth or baptism records weren't recorded, you should submit the best evidence you have of your date of birth. This includes, among others, schools and church records, a marriage license, a passport, and employment or military service papers.

You should also have your Form W-2 for the preceding year, or, if you are self-employed, a copy of your Schedule SE. The reason is that most recent reports of your earnings may not yet have been recorded in Social Security records.

If your spouse is applying for benefits, she or he will have to provide similar evi-

If you have any more questions, call Social Security. Our toll-free telephone service is available from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. in all time zones weekdays. The best times to call are early in the morning and late afternoon. And if you can, it is best to call later in the week and later in the month.

and other vaccime-preventable diseases can pose tragic health threats unless all susceptible people are immunized against them.

Hodgson said that currently the law requires all children entering Texas schools or daycare to show proof of immunization at certain ages against

ents in recent years have failed to have their children vaccinated. Also, some school and day-care operators have not kept adequate records. The result is a growing number of insufficiently immunized children and young adults at

polio, tetanus, measles, rubella (German Measles), mumps and diphtheria. In addition, the law requires pertussis (whooping cough) vaccine for all school and daycare children younger than 5.

However, amendments adopted by the Texas Board of Health in June more sharply define, and in some cases change, children's immunization requirements. Among the major amendments are:

- Beginning Sept. 1, 1990, children and students enrolling in Texas child-care facilities or schools must have received both mumps and measles vaccines on or after their first birthdays.

- Beginning Jan. 1, 1991, students whose 12th birthdays occur on or after Sept. 1, 1990 will be required to have two doses of measles vaccine, or provide evidence of measles immunity. The two doses must be administered at least

30 days apart, and proof of the second dose will not be required until the child's 12th birthday.

Beginning Sept. 1, 1991, Haemophilus influenzae type b (Hib) vaccine will be required for children, age 18 months through 4.

Beginning Sept. 1, 1991, all children and students enrolling for the first time must have received rubella vaccine at age 1 or older.

Hodgson added that persons needing further details about immunization requirements should consult their family physicians, local health departments or school officials.



Researchers Seek To Improve Water Efficiency Of Crape Myrtle

by Kathleen Davis

If it comes to choosing between a popular beauty and limited water use, urban landscapers may soon be doing a double take on the crape myrtle.

The flowering shrub, once called the "lilac of the South," may not be utilizing water best under traditional plantings, research at the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station has shown.

"We are looking at how to do less watering in a landscape and still keep it pretty," said Dr. Jayne Zajicek, an ornamental horticulturist. "Water is a scarce resource in Texas. About 60 percent of the urban water use in the summer is for irrigating landscapes. And of that, 50 percent is used inefficiently; it's running down the drain."

As a researcher in the urban systems group - which includes agricultural engineers, landscape architects,

horticulturists and soil and crop scientists - Zajicek examined the crape myrtle for two years to see how the plants use water.

She chose the crape myrtle because it is a popular flowering shrub grown throughout the South - practically anywhere that average minimum winter temperatures don't drop below 0 degrees Fahrenheit.

myrtle - eight of which occur in Texas - include some 550 species ranging from pink to myrtles was significantly purple and white. New varieties in hanging baskets are miniatures of the shrubs that can grow to more than 20 feet tall and all sizes between.

"That's why it is so popular," she said. "There are so many different sizes and colors. But in the past, people have designed their yards without thinking about water

is woody ornamentals, studied 36 crape myrtles under three planting surface conditions: bare soil, Bermuda grass cover and pine bark mulch. She used four varieties in each trail.

The trees were planted in special pots in the ground to simulate the natural setting but also allow them to be hoisted above surface. Every evening for a month she weighed the trees, watered them, weighed them again and returned them to the ground. She also used a stem gauge, a new instrument that resembles a wrist sweat band, About 25 genera of crape to measure water loss from

> Water use by the crape affected by all the surface materials. But, surprisingly, those with pine mulch surfaces used more water than plants located on bare soil or turf surfaces, she noted.

The mulch heated up earlier in the morning, so the hotter temperature forced the plant to transpire more, she explained.

But Zajicek said the study doesn't necessarily mean

people should not mulch crape myrtles for maximum water savings. "We didn't measure under

the mulch to see if we were saving on evaporation, so this doesn't necessarily mean that water was wasted," she said. "And it may be that we can come up with a mulch that doesn't heat up as quickly as the pine bark did."

She said planting turf around the base of the plant may improve water use by the crape myrtle, but measurements are needed to determine total water use under such a system.

The urban landscape group plans to do more research on total systems using information on individual species such as this as a base, she

"This study points out that our environment definitely has an influence on the amount of water used by plants," the horticulturist said.

Occasionally, these patients have fractured bones, other times they have bruised or torn the soft tissue which supports these bones, Often, there are open wounds associated with injury or poor circulation which need special care and debridement Burns often need debridement and cleaning to promote healing. Physical therapy is also involved with the rehabilitation of patients after stroke, heart attack, closed head injury and amputation.

The greatest emphasis in Physical therapy is on patient education. It has been observed that the more the patient understands his/her physical limitations, the better the patient is able to cope with these changes.

Different types of physical agents can be used to assist a patient in recuperation. The agents include hot packs, ultrasound, electrical stimulation (galvanic and faradic), traction, TENS, whirlpool, massage, ice, gait training, postural education, therapeutic exercises and joint mobilization.
