Perry Supporters Plan Fund Raiser in Abilene

State Rep. Rick Perry, Republican candidate for Texas Agriculture Commissioner, will be the guest at a fund-raiser in his honor, Friday, Sept. 28, in Abilene.

Under the new rules, the Social Security Administration will no longer be able to furnish Medicare numbers, entitlement dates or similar information to Private Hospitals, Medical Suppliers, Clinics or Doctors' offices without written consent of the individual. The consent statement must be directed to the Social Security Administration, must specify what information is to be disclosed, must specify the individual or organization to receive the information, must show a timeframe during which the information is to be disclosed and must be presented to SSA

within a reasonable time after it is signed, usually within 60 days.

These restrictions on releasing information also apply to private sector landlords or private housing management companies, State Legislators, and other private organizations or individuals even if they are trying to help someone.

Supreme Court Decision Broadens SSA Restrictions

A recent Supreme Court decision has restricted the situations in which the Social Security Administration can release information without the written consent of the individual according to Glyn Hammons, district manager in Abilene. There have always been restrictions on release of confidential information because of the Privacy Act and Federal Regulations on disclosure, but the court decision broadened the restrictions.

Classes For Foster Parents To Begin

The Texas Department of Human Services will present a ten-week series of classes for Foster and Adoptive Parents, beginning Tuesday, Sept. 25, 6:00-9:00 p.m. at the First United Methodist Church, 419 W. Walker, Breckenridge.

Classes will be held each Tuesday night and lead to certification for persons completing the course. These training sessions are for a five-county area, including Eastland County.

The instructor will be Henry Rodriguez, Foster Home/Adoptive Specialist, located with the Department of Human Services office in Eastland. Rodriguez will be assisted by Tommie Newton of Abilene, who has been a Foster Parent for eight years.

Called MAPP Program Classes (Model Approach to Partnerships in Parenting), the training sessions will contain a lot of practical instruction on parenting skills.

"The main idea of these classes is to make sure foster (or adoptive) parents are prepared and can handle different situations. Some children have special needs - they feel abandoned, or have come from abusive situations," Rodriguez says.

He states that Eastland County needs more Foster Parents - right now. Only a few homes in the County are certified to keep foster children.

Rodriguez wishes to emphasize the need for families to accept sibling groups. There is also a definite need to minority families to accept children.

He also points out that new laws have changed various aspects of foster parenting. Foster parents can now become eligible to adopt children, including those they keep. Single people can now be Foster Parents, and couples where both the husband and wife work away from the home can become Foster Parents.

So a number of things about Foster Parenting have changed - but some things never change. That's the need for kind, loving, patient people who will make a commitment to helping children.

Rodriguez hopes a number of such people will show up at the MAPP classes at Breckenridge.

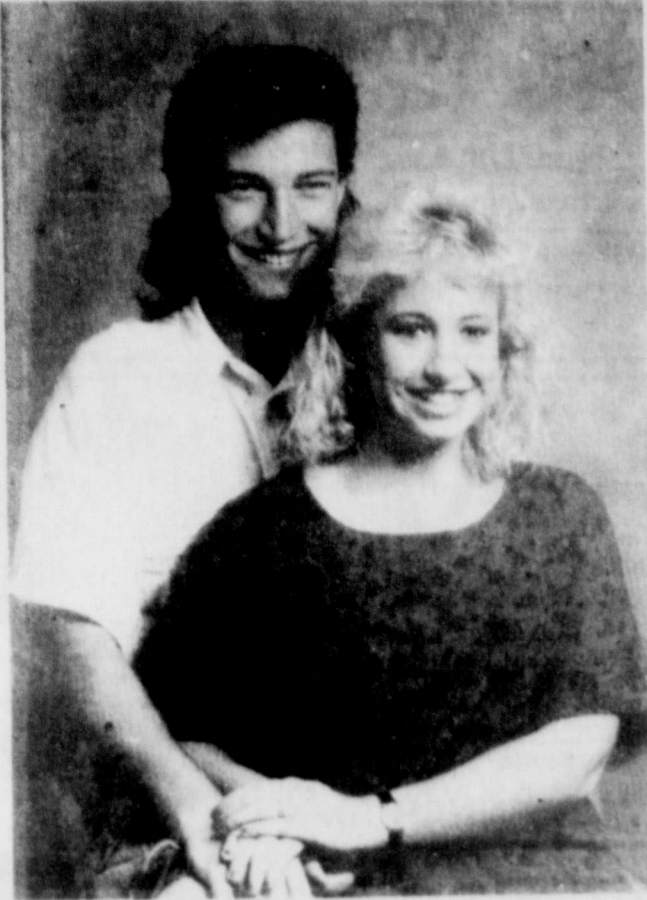

First State Bank Folds In Eastland

Depositors and others who previously conducted business with First State Bank of Rising Star in Eastland will now conduct business with the parent facility in Rising Star, Saran Anderson, an E FDIC official told this newspaper Friday morning.

Customers may continue to use check blanks on the bank, he said, and these will be honored.

A telephone call to the First State Bank of Rising Star in Eastland Friday morning was answered: "FDIC", by an Eastland County Sheriff's Dept. deputy.

The deputy explained that the Sheriff's office was notified at 3 p.m. Thursday to provide security for the East Main St. facility, which was being closed.

Its parent bank, First State Bank of Rising Star reportedly was to re-open Friday morning as the Peoples State Bank of Clyde. Another sister facility, First Comanche Bank, was not expected to re-open, an FDIC spokesman said.

Employees of the Eastland facility, which has been open for about three years, were to learn Friday morning if and where there services would be needed.

No bids were received for the Comanche bank which had about \$34 million in assets and depositors will be paid, the FDIC said.

An FDIC spokesman said the Comanche bank failed because it made loans that borrowers failed to repay.

State Banking Commissioner Kenneth W. Littlefield said the Rising Star Bank, with \$14.3 million in assets,

failed largely as a result of poor quality loans made by prior bank management, coupled with a locally depressed real estate market. The capital deficiency could not be remedied.

All records and data at the Eastland facility was being transferred to the Rising Star facility, where depositors and others may secure further information.
