# Dr. A.R. Cermin Announces Plans To Leave Cisco; Rollback Election Is Set

The Cisco Hospital District's board met Monday night and heard from Dr. Ayres R. Cermin that he is closing his medical practice here on Dec. 31.

Dr. Cermin, the only practicing physician in Cisco, told the board it was "extremely difficult" for him to make this

decision but he and his wife have been subjected to "verbal assaults" on his professional ability and on their personal lives. He said his decision to leave Cisco is not a result of the controversy over the proposed reopening of the hospital.

Dr. Cermin has accepted a position with a medical clinic in the San Antonio area.

"I realize this is a blow to the community," Cermin said. "But I have to look out for myself, and we think it is in our best interest to leave."

The Cermins moved to Cisco in the early 1970s and their four children graduated from Cisco High School. The family has been active in all community affairs, including the Cisco Civic League and Conrad Hilton Community Center. They have also been active members of Redeemer Lutheran Church.

Bill Philpott, vice president of the hospital board, said, "Dr. Cermin's announcement came as a complete surprise to us. We are terribly sorry to see him leave, but we certainly wish him God speed. We regret that the situation has come to this."

Mr. Philpott said that the board will continue to work with Preferred Management of Corporation of Shawnee, Okla., trying to locate a new physician for Cisco. In other action Monday night, the board set a property tax rollback election for Jan. 19, 1991. The board set the property tax at 50 cents per \$100 valuation on Oct. 1.

According to Don Henry,

hospital administrator, county tax collector Nancy Trout has verified all but 60 or 70 signatures of the 815 submitted on a rollback petition presented to the board Oct. 25.

The rollback election will be in the Corral Room. Absentee voting will begin Dec. 31 and continue through Jan. 15 at the Conrad Hilton Community Center. The board appointed Doug Fry election judge and Pat Isbell as absentee clerk.

The board also ratified a three-year contract with Preferred Management subject to approval of the board's attorney. John Ketting from Preferred Management said the contract will be null and void if the rollback succeeds.

## Cisco Police Officer Honored

A memorial service was held Friday in the auditorium of Cisco's restored Conrad Hilton. It was held in honor of Snake, a police dog who died in the line of duty, and the Cisco Police Force.

Snake was trained to use his nose to detect illegal drugs, and was an asset to the officers who used him. He was often called upon to travel to neighboring cities to assist others in drug enforcement. While on such a trip to Brownwood, someone slipped the dog poison and Snake died immediately.

A certified police dog, Snake was the first member of the Cisco Force lost in the line of duty since two officers were killed in a shootout dur-

ing the famous Santa Claus band robbery.

Louise Nelms organized the program which was covered by local and area members of the news media. Cisco Mayor Joe Wheatley started the ceremony and Larry Linam led in prayer. County Judge Scott Bailey spoke, telling the story of the black dog and the officers who worked with him. Among his comments was one stating that crime is much like the weather, everyone talks about it, but so few try to do anything about it. He reminded that some are trying to do something about it.

A plaque with a picture of Snake on it was presented by Eastland County Crimestoppers to officials who presented

it to the two officers who handled Snake, Donald Wiley and Larry Weikel, and to the entire Cisco Police Department.

The ceremony and the plaque are reminders of the seriousness of the war against illegal drugs and the damage being done by them.

We hear that there are plans to replace Snake with another police dog who will be trained to "sniff out" drugs.

**QUESTION:** Where did Cain get his wife? The Bible says that "He went into the land of Nod and took unto himself a wife."

**ANSWER:** This is an old question and is often accom-

panied by a total misquote of Genesis 4:16,17. Perhaps you have heard it from someone who quoted somebody else's misquote. The Bible says that, "Cain went ... and dwelt in the land of Nod, and Cain KNEW his wife and she conceived..." To "know" is a Biblical term for the physical relationship between husband and wife. Cain already had his wife with him when he went into the land of Nod. But where did her get her? There can be only one answer: she was a sister or perhaps a niece. The Bible says that Adam lived "after he had begotten Seth eight hundred years, and he begat sons and daughters, and all the days that Adam lived nine hundred and thirty years, and he died." 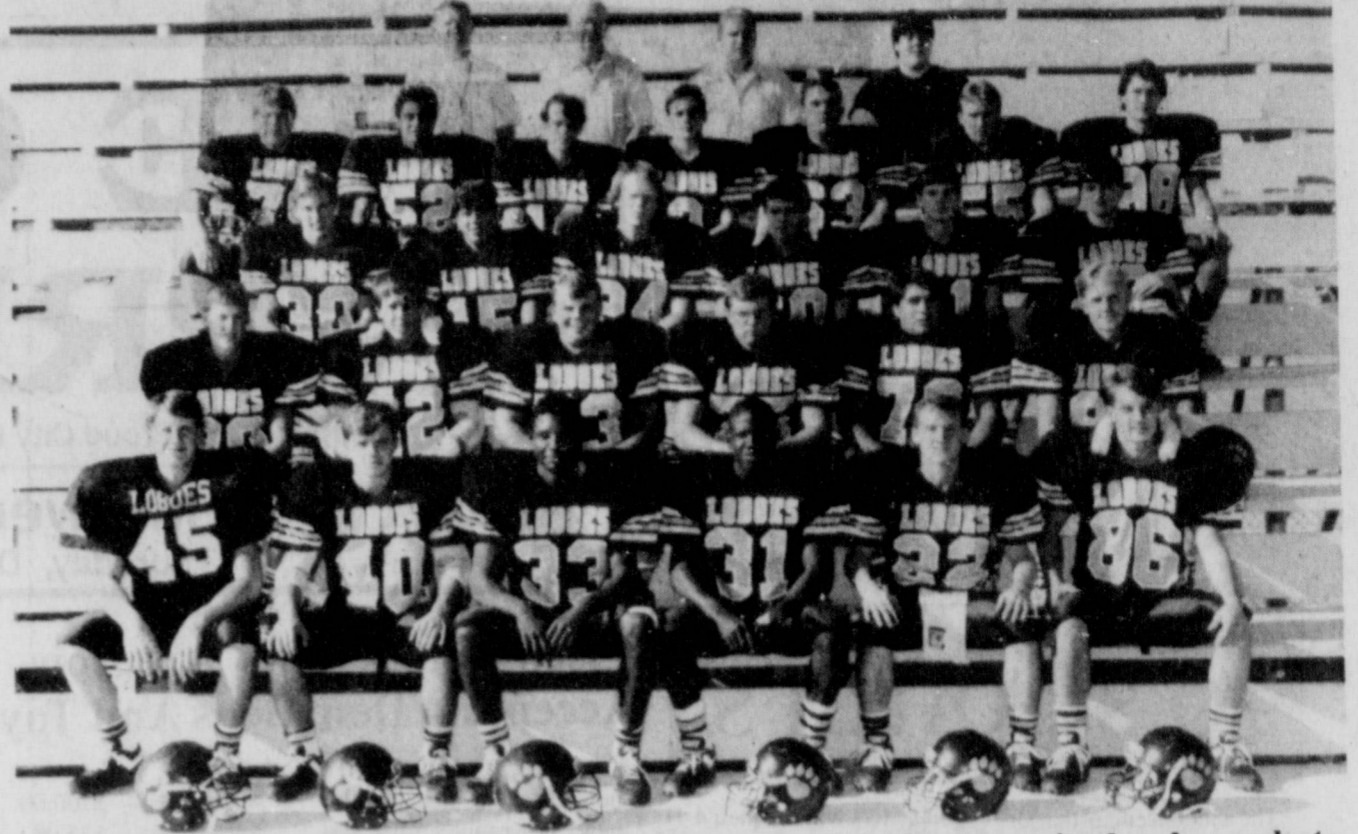

**Teeth Detectives**  
Q. Can our teeth tell difference in temperature, size, or taste?  
A. Even though we can safely say our teeth are truly remarkable, it is interesting to note that they can tell whether it is ice cream or hot tea we are consuming. We may experience pain when we bite into something hot or cold, but that's because of the temperature receptors we have in our tongue and lips. Teeth can, however, sense the size of whatever is between them. They are so sensitive, in fact, they can detect the finest grit. This ability belongs to the pressure sensors that are located in the periodontal fiber. Of course, it's not possible for our teeth to tell us if a food is sweet or sour, or even if we like it. That is the job of a group of cells commonly known as taste buds.

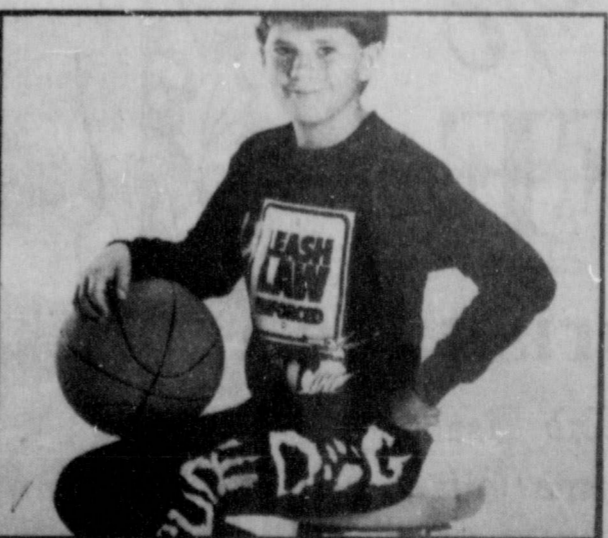

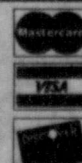

**Benefits Estimates Are For Young Adults**

"Could I support myself on my Social Security benefits if I became disabled?" "Would my children be able to get Social Security if something happened to me?" "These are questions that we want young adults to ask," Glyn Hammons, Social Security manager in Abilene, said recently. Young people

can get answers to these questions with a Personal Earnings and Benefits Estimate Statement.

The benefit statements show estimates of the Social Security each worker could expect. The estimate shows disability benefits for their families, and survivors benefits available to family members if the worker dies.

With a realistic estimate of their Social Security benefits, people will be in a better position to make informed decisions about their need insurance and savings, (name) said.

People can also use their statements to verify that all their earnings are shown correctly on their Social Security records. If the record is wrong, Social Security may be able to correct it. It's usually easier to make corrections if the error is found within a few years, while records are still available, Hammons said.

To get a benefit statement, call Social Security at 1-800-234-5772 and ask for a free Request for Earnings and Benefits Estimate Statement. When it comes in the mail, fill it out, and send it back. You'll get your statement in a few weeks.

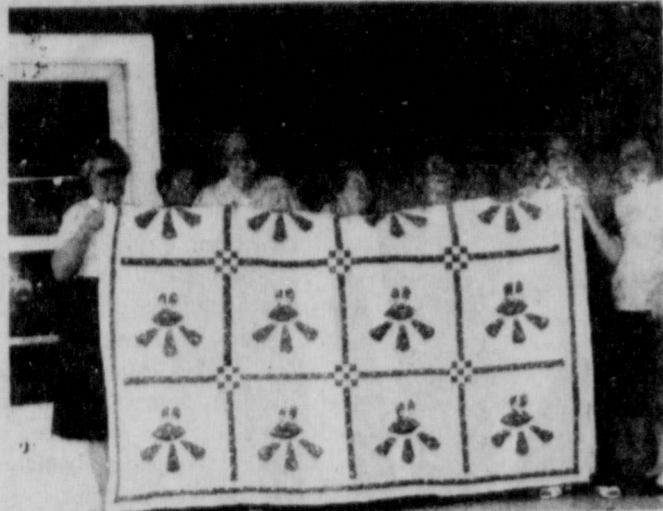

### GROUNDWATER PROTECTION IS EVERYONE'S BUSINESS

On Monday night this past week, a seminar was held on groundwater management and groundwater districts. The people attending the program asked many questions regarding groundwater quality and management.

How important is groundwater in Texas? Approximately 56 percent of the water used in Texas and nearly 70 percent of the state's water used in agriculture comes from underground water supplies. As these figures indicate, underground water is an important resource in Texas both for drinking water and for agriculture.

Texas landowners have historically held the right to capture and use groundwater beneath their property. Groundwater rights have been an inherent part of property ownership.

Increasingly, there has been more interest to control underground water as a way to

management it. Once such method used to manage underground water is through groundwater districts.

The 1949 Texas Groundwater District Act gave underground water conservation districts the authority to conserve and preserve the underground water supplies and develop more efficient methods of water use. Legislation in 1985 encouraged the formation of groundwater districts.

Underground water is an important resource in Texas. Locally controlled underground water conservation districts with rules, programs, and activities specifically

addressing the local problems and opportunities have generally proven to be useful vehicles for managing groundwater.

If you would like more information about groundwater districts, there is a publication entitled, "Managing Private Groundwater Through Underground Water Conservation Districts" available at the county Extension Office. The office is located in the basement of the county courthouse.

### DON'T FORGET TO ENTER THE PECAN SHOW

Entries for the 38th Annual Eastland County Pecan Show are due at the county Extension service office by 4:00 p.m., Wednesday, December 5th. The office is located in the basement of the Eastland County Courthouse.

Each entry must have at

least 43 nuts of the same variety. Bring the nuts in a paper sack marked with owner's name, address, telephone number and variety if known.

All pecans entered in the show must have been grown in 1990 by the person showing them. Each grower is limited to one entry of each improved or papershell variety. There is no limit on the number of seedling or native entries one grower may enter. There will, also, be a class for the largest pecans and the

smallest pecans.

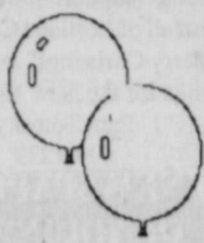

**THE FORGIVENESS OF SINS**

Some three thousand year ago, and about one thousand years before Christ, the Psalmist said:

"If Thou, Lord, should'st mark iniquities, O Lord who shall stand? But there is forgiveness with Thee..." (Psa. 130:3,4).

The Psalmist did not explain, however, upon what basis a just and holy God could forgive a guilty sinner. This was to be proclaimed one thousand years later by the Apostle Paul, himself once "a blasphemer, and a persecutor and injurious"; the "chief" of sinners, but forgiven and saved by the infinite grace of God (1 Tim. 1:13-15).

Preaching Christ at Antioch, in the province of Pisidia, Paul declared:

"Be it known unto you therefore, men and brethren, that through this man is preached unto you the forgiveness of sins, and by

him all that believe are justified from all things, from which ye could not be justified by the law of Moses" (Acts 13:38,39).

But even this does not fully answer our question, for we must still ask: *On what basis does God forgive sins through "this Man"?* The answer is: on the basis of His payment for our sins on Calvary's cross. Thus the Apostle wrote to the Romans, explaining how we may be...

"...justified freely by His [God's] grace, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus" (Rom. 3:24).

Now, thank God, through Christ's finished work, there is not a sinner who needs to remain unforgiven, for:

"In [Christ] we have redemption, through His blood, the forgiveness of sins according to the riches of his grace" (Eph. 1:7).

According to the American Cancer Society, one out of every ten women in the United States will develop breast cancer sometime during her lifetime. Every year over 37,000 women die as a result of breast cancer.

## Mobile Cancer Unit To Be In Eastland On December 10

According to a spokesman from the Regional Breast Care Center at Women's & Children's Hospital in Odessa, Texas "The death rate from breast cancer could be drastically reduced if women would have mammograms done before a problem exists." By using modern state of the art x-ray equipment breast cancers can be found when they are about the size of a grain of rice and well before the cancer can be felt. A woman who is diagnosed with breast cancer at this early stage has a 90%-97% survival rate. However, a woman who is not diagnosed until a lump can be felt has approximately a 50% survival rate in five years.

In an effort to find cancers at the earliest possible stage and prevent unnecessary

deaths, a Mobile Breast Cancer Detection Unit will be made available to local women on Monday, December 10.

The Mobile Unit will be parked at Eastland Memorial Hospital, 304 South Daugherty, Eastland. Appointments may be made by calling 629-2601.

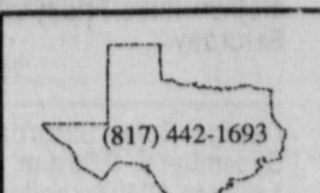

Q. What are Identity Achievers like?  
A. Identity Achievers are a more diverse group than Foreclosurees. Many factors and circumstances cause the formation of a self-made identity.

Psychological growth involves increasing autonomy from the parents and increased individuation from the pre-adolescent self. The adolescent has internalized the parents values. Further growth involves re-working the internal self. This is the process of individuation.

Although the adolescent gains in autonomy and freedom, some security and protection as a child is relinquished.

Individuation is painful because it involves giving up trusted aspects that feel like the self. There is a sense of uncertainty and rootlessness. In return the adolescent gains possibilities, but freedom can be terrifying. They feel relativity and risk in life decisions. They are free but vulnerable.

Identity Achievement women have gone through this process during adolescence. They have forged identities on their own terms. They have reworked the identities assigned to them as children. They are not necessarily achievers in the work world. They are women who choose lives after sifthrough options and have a life plan they can claim as their own.

Identity Achievement women are considered payers of the way.

## Rural Health Care To Receive Federal Funding Assistance

An idea developed and pursued by Congressman Charles Stenholm (D-Tx) has been approved by the President and will mean extra federal assistance for rural health care. When President Bush signed the National Health Service Corps Reauthorization bill, he okayed Mr. Stenholm's State Offices of Rural Health program.

"The idea is to help rural communities around the country which are trying to ensure that quality health care remains available for their residents," explained Stenholm.

Under the State Offices of Rural Health program, a total of \$10 million dollars could be allotted over the next three years as "seed money." It requires a match by recipient

states and is designed so that those states ultimately assume full financial responsibility of the offices. For fiscal year 1991, \$2 million has actually been appropriated.

State Offices of Rural Health will provide technical, hands-on assistance to rural communities concerned about their health care; act as a clearing house for information on innovative approaches to rural health care; and meet annually with other State Rural Health Offices to share information.

"Last year 65 hospitals closed around the country and

13 of them were in rural areas of Texas," said Stenholm. "These figures are alarming when you realize that entire counties are without any medical help. Creating State Offices of Rural Health is one way to encourage quality health care for our less populated areas."

During its last legislative session, the Texas Legislature committed funds to establish a state rural health office, named the Center for Rural Health Initiatives. Part of this money can be used to meet the matching fund requirement of the federal law, allowing the state to receive these new federal dollars.

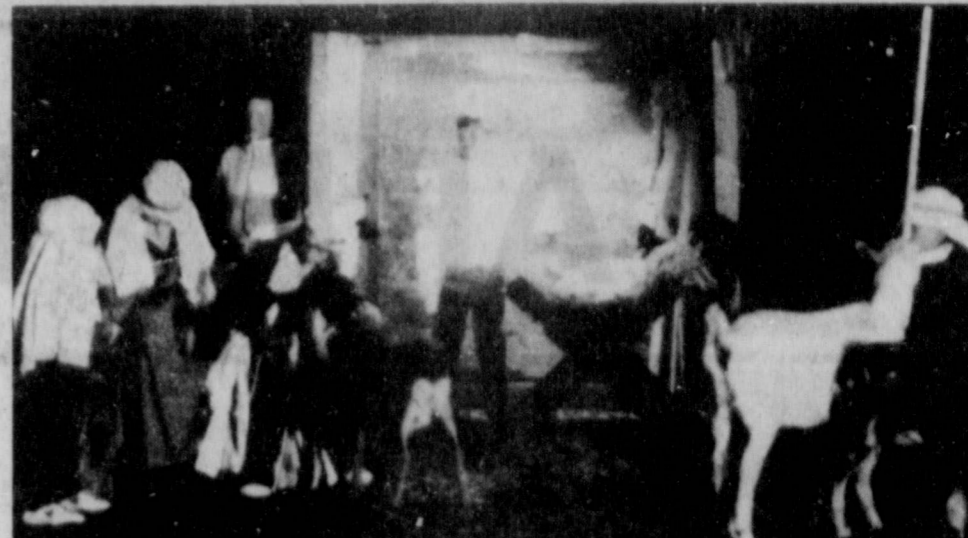

Dear Editor:  
People interested in reopening E.L. Graham Memorial Hospital have indicated that they would like additional information on the hospital management corporation with which the hospital board is negotiating.
