Khomeini Lashes Soviet Intervention

Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini today strongly condemned the Soviet intervention in Afghanistan and pledged "unconditional" support for the Moslem rebels in Iran's eastern neighbor.

In his first comment on the Soviet move into Afghanistan in late December,

Khomeini said it is the duty of Moslems everywhere to oppose aggression around the world.

"We strongly condemn the military invasion of Afghanistan," the 79-year-old religious leader said in a message delivered by his son to tens of thousands of

'We are Moslems and for Moslems there is no East or West, it is our duty to condemn any aggression, that is an Islamic ritual," the ailing head of Iran's revolutionary government said.

Khomeini remained in a Tehran hospital where he is recovering from a mild heart attack while a huge throng met at Tehran's main cemetery to listen to his message as well as a speech from President-elect Abolhassan Bani Sadr.

Bani Sadr, who already has pledged Iranian aid to the Afghan Moslems, delivered a similar message pledging support for "our Moslem brothers in Afghanistan, Palestine and the Philippines.'

Bani Sadr is to be sworn in before Khomeini today.

Bani Sadr appealed for calm several times, but many persons were injured as the large crowd jammed together to get a better view of the partially covered speakers' platform.

The president-elect acknowledged that the revolution has taken its toll on the country's economy and culture. Iran's relations are strained on the for eign scene as well, he said.

Meanwhile, the Iranian government agreed to an international commission to consider its charges against Shah Mohammad Reza Pahlavi and said it "will be effective in solving the hostage cri-

'The international investigation commission will consider the shah's crimes, his violation of human rights and the return of his wealth to Iran," Khomeini's ruling Revolutionary Council announced over the weekend.

Foreign Ministry spokesman Nassirosadat Salami said the commission "will be effective in solving the hostage crisis." However, Bani Sadr in an interview indicated that the U.S. government must help Iran get the shah back for trial before the hostages will be freed.

"If the U.S. government gets away from its past policy of intervention in internal affairs," he said, "and if it accepts the right of the Iranian government to follow the criminals to your country and

our wealth and to accept in practical terms to help us in that matter, that would be grounds for deliberations on the hostages

Salami said the members of the investigation commission will be chosen by U.N. Secretary-General Kurt Waldheim. He said it will include foreign and Iranian representatives, and Waldheim will decide whether Americans are included.

Salami did not say when the commission would come to Iran or when the hearings would begin.

Waldheim proposed an investigating commission during a visit to Iran early in hostages be turned over to the Red Cross or some other neutral third party in Iran

The militants holding the approximately 50 Americans since Nov. 4 had no comment on the council's decision, but they announced Saturday that they had invited a special American delegation to Tehran this week to hear Iran's grievances against the shah and the U.S. gov-

The embassy captors had called for a massive rally in front of the Embassy today. But on Sunday they announced they were canceling the demonstration "to avoid a clash" with a rally planned by Bani Sadr at Tehran's main cemetery.

Death Toll Rises To 35 At Prison

SANTA FE, N.M. (AP) - Fires still burned in the New Mexico State Prison today as 1,100 prisoners huddled in tents outside the compound and stories unfolded of hellish murder, torture and mutilations in a riot that left at least 35 persons dead and 15 others missing.

State police Sgt. George Ulibarri said three more bodies were found today,

Gov. Bruce King told a news conference that at least seven died of drug overdoses, others died of smoke inhalation and some were murdered. The governer said a total of 50 prisoners were unaccounted for, including the dead.

State police said more bodies were found today in the gymnasium which had still been burning during the morning. "They're inside looking for more right now," Ulibarri said."That's where the biggest fire was.

'It's one hell of a bloody mess in there," said Corrections Commission Chairman Bud Richards. "There are a hell of a lot of bodies in there.

The 36 hours of carnage at the prison, recaptured by National Guard and state police Sunday afternoon, was the most serious since the 1971 Attica riot in upstate New York left 43 persons dead.

Amoco 72-hours notice if a walkout was planned. Friday, the union announced it would join the strike Monday.

More than 60,000 refinery workers across the country went out after Jan. 8 in support of demands for higher wages and improved health benefits. More than 500 employees in other states were scheduled to return to work today after their employers reached weekend settlements with the OCAW

Fuel-Saving By Agency

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Energy Department announced today nine proposed standby measures to save fuel in the event of a severe shortage. Most of them are aimed at curtailing gasoline consumption.

Eight direct fuel-saving measures

-Strict enforcement and possible further lowering of highway speed limits. -Cooperation by employers in pro

grams to reduce commuter driving. -Readjusting working hours to fit a work week shortened by one day, anoth-

er travel-reducing measure. -Extension or reactivation of temperature restrictions in non-residential buildings, a measure now slated to expire

-Restriction of gasoline purchases to odd and even days, as was done in many

states during past shortages. -Minimum-purchase rules to prevent the "tank-topping" that stretches gaso-

line lines during shortages. -Restrictions on weekend use of rec-

reational boats -A vehicle sticker program prohibit-

ing the use of a vehicle for one or more days per week.

The department announced five of the measures as "interim final regulations," meaning they can be put into effect if necessary without awaiting completion of public hearings and review.

The five interim measures are those relating to speed limits, building temperatures, odd-even, minimum purchases and the public information program, all of which have been used before.

A recent Texas law designed to take away some of divorce's trauma from children of separating parents has drawn mixed reaction within the legal community of Lubbock

The law, signed into effect last August, provides for both parents to retain co-managing conservatorship - joint custody - of their children in a divorce.

In a co-parenting situation, each parent continues to have an equal voice in raising the children after the divorce. The court awards custody to both together - not to one parent with visitation rights going to the other. Living arrange-

ments also are stipulated by the court.

During recent years the concept has drawn support nationwide from divorcing parents who do not want to relinquish a place in their childrens' lives in exchange for court-set visitation. More important, they believe the shared custody arrangement is, in legal jargon, "in the best interests of the child."

Proponents of co-parenting argue the impact of a divorce on children is less severe when both parents continue to raise

One study cited by authors Mel Roman and William Haddad in their book "The Disposable Parent" concluded, "The greater the involvement of the non-

custodial parent, the better the child's adjustment to a divorce.

"It seemed," continued the authors, "that the children in joint custody situations were thriving and had much less of post-divorce struggles and difficulties than we see in children with convention-

al arrangements." According to another author, co-parenting is as good for divorced parents as it is for their children.

Instead of placing 100 percent of the burden of child-rearing on one custodial parent - usually the mother - co-parenting allows both the divorced mother and father to share time with their children and participate equally in major deci-

sions. Thus each is permitted a relationship with the children and a life of his own, argues Miriam Galper in her book "Co-Parenting.



Physiological age is how well an individual maintains his physical and mental faculties, and on physiological age I'm satisfied that I am healthy. We don't elect a president to run foot races. We elect one to display some maturity, experience and good judgment, and I think all those things come with addedyears.'

-"How many presidents were many years past the level of longevity when they became president back in the years. not too many years ago, when the average life span was in its 40's and we had 50-and 55-year-old presidents? They were 15 years past the life span of the time.'

When Carter does emerge from the White House, Kennedy said, "then I think the real campaign starts" and Carter will be forced to defend in person his record on issues such as the economy and energy policy.



Tech Dean Says U.S. **Needs To Spend Less**

By RUTHANNE BROCKWAY **Avalanche-Journal Staff** There are two things to do with in-

come: spend it or save it. The trouble is, "Our economy is in dire need of less consumption and more savings," a Texas Tech University professor testified in Washington this past

Dr. Carl Stem, dean of the College of Business Administration, was one of numerous witnesses but one of only two professors who testified before the Ways and Means Committee of the U.S. House of Representatives which held two days of public hearings on tax incentives for

Stem spoke in support of a measure, House Resolution 654 and section 202 of H.R. 5665, which would defer income taxes on dividends invested by stockholders as long as the stockholder continued to reinvest in the newly issued stock of the corporation.

He said it would interest more people in buying stocks, which would in turn, provide more capital for businesses to invest in advanced technology, which he said would contribute to increased prod-

Although Stem said labor unions argue that technology can lead to layoffs of workers. Stem said, "Growth and technology spawn jobs."

Conversely, if industry does not have the capital to update its equipment, he said that plants may close and workers

Stem, who has worked as an economist for the Federal Reserve System, the Treasury Department, the Commerce Department and the Central Intelligence Agency, testified that, "An economy's growth, viability and competitiveness are linked to its rate of investment. The rate of investment directly impacts an economy's rate of growth - the higher the rate of investment, typically, the greater the growth rate of the economy.

He explained that basically savings may be categorized into two types: savings invested into real assets such as gold and other precious metals or property and savings invested in financial assets

The first category, he said, profits individuals but not the economy as a whole. But investing savings in financial assets. Stem said, means "turning the savings over to the capital markets and financial intermediaries to be used to support business investment in new plants and equipment.

While he agrees that savings of all types is important he stressed the need for "savings which take the form of business investment to generate greater increases in productivity.

He specifically noted that utility companies - and in the long run, consumers would benefit from such a tax incen-

"It would increase the attractiveness to savers of financial assets which would provide capital to a vitally important sector of our economy that is having a difficult time raising capital in these inflationary times — the utility industry.

He explained that, "The viability of our economy is these times of radical readjustment to the changing supply of and relative price of petroleum-and gasbased energy is heavily dependent on our energy-producing utilities being able to respond to these changes with capital expansion and improvements.

If materials prices rise, but productivity does too, Stem said companies don't have to pass on higher prices to customers, but if materials prices rise and productivity declines, the consumer bears the burden of the cost.




does the stockholder."

A treasury department spokesman testified against changing the double taxation, saying that the federal government could lose as much as \$10 billion in revenue if the proposal passed.

But Stem said United States Chamber of Commerce spokesmen argued that after three years taxes on the increased earnings of businesses and stockholders would provide the same amount as the government earned through double taxation of stocks.

If the solutions offered by Stem and other witnesses are so simple, why haven't they already been passed?

'There's a lot of sentiment against big business," he said, although he added that the proposals before Congress "wouldn't let the big boys escape taxes.

El Paso Bar Shooting Leaves MIDDLE AGE Five Dead, Three Wounded

EL PASO (AP) - One bar customer grabbed the gunman, another hit him with a pool cue and a third stepped into the path of a bullet to spare a woman's life, police said. But five people died before the shooting, the worst in El Paso history, was over.

Three other persons were wounded in the gunfire, which broke out early Sunday in the crowded Starburst Lounge.

Police Lt. Ed Agan said the suspect identified as Barry Chvarak, 21, of El Paso, was subdued and held for police by two bar patrons. He was jailed under \$1 million bond, \$200,000 on each of five counts of murder, set by Peace Justice Fred Chavez.

One of those killed was identified as Randy Wayne Steele, 20, of El Paso.

There are three heroes in this, Agan said. "Steele, I understand, when the shooting started pushed a young woman out of the way and stepped in front of her and took a bullet that I guess would have gotten her.

Another man, a patron named John M. Harris, he jumped the suspect after the shooting had started ... and was able to take the rifle away after another patron Roger Dean Miller, came to his aid. He (Miller) clobbered this guy with a

pool cue. Agen said there appeared to be no motive or the shooting.
"The guy was with his brother ... there was no fight," he said.

Two 19-year-old men were treated for minor gunshot wounds, and a 20-year-old woman was hospitalized in stable condi-

tion with two gunshot wounds. He identified the other victims as Kathleen Lynn Austin, 32, Marianne Laweka, 53, and Jana L. Carpenter, 29, all of El Paso, and Fredrick Bergford, 28, a soldier at Fort Bliss.



Speak No Ill Of Ronald Reagan



WASHINGTON-Among the road gang of Republicans in pursuit of the GOP nomination here is something that might be called the 12th Com-

It follows immediately behind No. 11 which was given by Gov. Ronald Reagan when he dwelt on his Sinai of party popularity, "Speak no ill of another Republican." The 12th Commandment is like unto it, "Speak no ill of Ronald Reagan."

It was composed earlier this season when Reagan had what appeared to be a shoo-in win for the Detroit Convention.

David Keene, who is George Bush's chief factotum in this city, says he expects all Republicans except John Connally to adhere. The reason until recently was that Reagan seemed to have a 'floor" of 30-plus percent of GOP support below which he could not fall.

BUT REAGAN HAD no "ceiling" and would not become a certain winner until he attained one. What behooved Bush, Baker, Crane, Dole and, to a lesser extent Anderson, was to be in the former California governor's good books if the dam burst. The secondary GOP candidate who got most of Reagan's leavings was likely to come home on

Keene's Law-or Reagan's leavings-or adherence to the 12th Commandment-becomes of growing importance with the approach of the spring primaries.

Had Big John Connally not taken so many unkind swipes at his fellow former-governor, the torch of conservatism might well have passed into the hand of the tough-talking Texan. ALL THE REPUBLICANS except Reagan and

Connally somehow manage to fall off the conserv-

ative chalkmark. Connally, when he's in full swing, is Reagan Resurrected from the 1960s, and Connally made his millions on the fighting fields of the law courts, and has a certain military glow from having been a Navy combatant and a Navy Secretary. It is altogether believable that Connal-

ly, if he became President, would be the leader for which the country hungers. But if Reagan's support really does fall apart and come up for grabs, Connally is the least likely Republican to become heir to the legacy. He alone has repeatedly broken the 12th Commandment by

needling the Californian about his age, his absence from the hustings and his 3 x 5 memory cards. Oft-bitten media commentators are less likely this year than usual to reach premature judgments. Front runners like Rockefeller, Romney Muskie have left their skulls along the trail and

the dust of Jimmy Carter's out-of-nowhere win is still in the nostrils of journalists.

Reagan remains the sentimental favorite, and could still take it all. If he turns kingmaker, however unwillingly, his blessing seems more apt to go to George Bush if for no other reason than that his transplanted-in-Texas New England Yankee seems to possess the keenest appetite for the presidential fare.

The pathos of Reagan's slippage is that so many true-blue conservatives have come to believe that his hour has passed. One of these is the former Nixon-Ford speech writer, Peter Witonski, who can give his heart but not his head to the Califor

In a sympathetic article for the current issue of 'Politics Today," Witonski calls up a comparison between Pope John Paul II, a theologian, and Reagan, a mere salesman of the conservative creed. But Witonski, as it should be with all of Reagan's one-time army of followers, cannot leave him

without a word of courtesy.
"He helped to sell conservatism to the multitudes, and he sold it without ever resorting to demagoguery or humbuggery.

Newsman Compares New Mexico Riot To Tragedy At Attica

United Press International Writer A husky man knelt beside a little boy. Both wept

God took daddy away," the man gently told his nephew. Inside the church, funeral services were about to begin for the boy's father, a prison guard killed in the Attica riot. The man hugged his nephew, then lifted him into his

arms and the two disappeared through the church entrance. Forty-three prison employees and inmates died in the Sept. 13, 1971, riot at New York state's maximum security prison. A shocked nation - spurred on by outraged reformists - vowed there never would be another Attica.

Yet it happened again this weekend, hundreds of miles

There are striking similarities between what occurred in the rural village of Attica, N.Y., and at the New Mexico State Penitentiary near Santa Fe. But there also are some key differences - decisions and events that may, in themselves, be responsible for sparing the lives of the guards taken hostage in the latest uprising.

The principle issues involved at both prisons were the same — overcrowding and general harsh treatment of pris-oners by guards. More than 2,200 convicts were crammed into living spaces built for 1,200 in Attica. In New Mexico, 1,-200 jammed cells were intended for 800.

Both prisons were in turmoil for days preceding the uprisings. New York Corrections Commissioner Russell G. Oswald canceled a meeting with inmates a few days before the Attica riot because his wife took ill. There had been mess hall brawls and Oswald's session was designed to air inmates grievances

Two months before the New Mexico outbreak, there was a mass escape. Eleven of the 12 escapees later were caught, but the incident spurred complaints about overall conditions

As the rioting started, both sets of inmates seized prison

Both issued a long list of demands for better treatment. At both institutions, there were rumors of atrocities committed by convicts upon other convicts. Some stories were

Inmates at both prisons demanded face-to-face confrontations with the governor. New York's Nelson Rockefeller refused to go to Attica. New Mexico's Bruce King went to the prison but did not meet with the convicts.

New Mexico prisoners wielded meat cleavers and homemade knives when they seized the penitentiary. The day the Attica siege ended, reporters were shown huge boxes of confiscated weapons - meat cleavers, homemade knives, spears, guns and even a rocket-launcher.

There are other similarities between the two riots, but it may be that what did happen in New York and what did not happen in New Mexico is responsible for the fact that all the hostages in the latest riot escaped with their lives.

There was a catalyst in the Attica riot - an event that so abruptly changed the mood of both sides that two days before officials ordered the retaking of the prison, death in massive numbers seemed inevitable

That was the death of guard William Quinn. Quinn was critically injured at the start of the riot dumped from a second story window. There were rumors Quinn was used as a battering ram by inmates to force a cellblock door open. He suffered severe head injuries.

Outside the prison, grim-faced guards cursed as news of Quinn's death spread. Inside, frightened convicts openly expressed fear of reprisals. Ultimatums were issued by Oswald. Give up. or else.

Both sides hardened their positions. Ominously, the day it all ended, rioting inmates hauled their hostages onto a concrete area known as "Time

Penitentiary Damages May Take Tax Rebates

SANTA FE, N.M. (AP) - A weekend of rioting at the New Mexico State Penitentiary may have cost New Mexico taxpayers their 1980-81 tax rebates, a state egislator savs

Rep. Fred Mondragon, D-Bernalillo, said Sunday that damage to the prison was so extensive it may have to be re-placed. He said that would cost at least \$40 million.

The prison was described as a burnedout shell by reporters and legislators who were allowed inside during negotiations and after National Guardsmen and police moved in to take control of the facility. Mondragon, who was allowed inside

as a representative of the House Appropriations and Finance Committee, said the riot would have a significant impact on the state's fiscal position.

"As far as I'm concerned, medical facilities and museums go out the win-

dow." Mondragon said. "As far as I'm concerned tax rebates do to."

Gov. Bruce King has asked the Legis-lature for \$60 million in tax relief in the form of rebates to be paid in 1980-81.






He said federally financed research should not be permitted to benefit a small number of people who could "gain control of the farm to market structure, monopolize the sources of finance at every step and increase their profits by selling what may well be an inferior product at a price that is insulated from competi-

In the past, research was judged by how much it helped to raise agricultural productivity. Now criteria should be whether the research truly serves the national interest or merely increases the profits of a small group of citizens or businesses," Bergland said.

The agriculture secretary became involved in a flap over mechanization research at a Dec. 13 hearing in Fresno, Calif. The hearing was one of a series on the future of the family farm. On that occasion, Bergland said federal money should not pay for research that cuts out farm labor.

In a speech recently to Agriculture Department research officials, Bergland said his statement was misinterpreted by people who thought he wanted to cut off federal money for all mechanization research.

His complete position, he said, is that he has no objection to research on machines that lighten a person's workload, that are needed because of lack of labor in an area or that help a farmer without displacing lots of workers.

Bergland said mechanization research that displaces farm laborers should be paid for by states or by private industry.

Although the policy does not rule out all federal funds for mechanization research, it does jeopardize some federal funds that go to the University of Califor-

Of that total, about \$400,000 is directed to states who spend it on 15 to 20 projects. The remainder finances six to 12 projects under the department's research program.

Bergland said no one knows how many other research projects "involve the dubious use of federal money.

Prediction **Not Cause** For Panic

LOS ANGELES (AP) - An earthquake prediction is not likely to produce the dire economic consequences that some fear could turn a bustling city into a panic-stricken ghost town, several researchers contend.

In fact, social scientists said recently at an earthquake prediction conference that it may be difficult to get officials and the public to take reasonable precautions if a prediction is made.

"I don't think people are going to run in panic to sell their houses," said Dennis Mileti of Colorado State University.

Several studies give "little indication that people will overreact to earthquake warnings. The problem with earthquake warning systems will be getting people to respond at all." The session was sponsored by the U.S. Geological Survey, the city of Los Angeles and other state and federal agencies. It was held in Los Angeles, about 300 miles south of the area hit by a series of earthquakes.

People tend to deny and diminish a threat," he said. "That is the mechanism that lets us get on an airplane even though we know that airplanes sometimes crash."

The mechanism can work on public officials just as it does with the public, he said, adding that people often choose to believe only the information that reinforces their preconceptions of the dan-

The distribution of accurate and complete information therefore becomes critical if attempts to reduce the potential damage are to match the actual danger from a predicted quake.

Economist Harold Cochrane of Colorado State University sounded a note of warning, however. Although the initial response to a firm, long-term prediction may be business as usual, he said, "there will be very subtle things happening to the regional economy.

The danger in terms of public policy is to believe that when a prediction does not yield any immediate impacts that things are now safe," he said.

If the predicted quake is a few years away, he said, such things as demand for new homes in the target area may slowly decrease. That would produce a decline in construction leading to unemployment and similar effects.

Although the economy may seem outwardly sound, it could be teetering on the edge and, if ultimately pushed over, "there could be a precipitous collapse ... that is very dramatic and very quick."

One way to help prevent such a sud-den crash is to provide earthquake insurance for the target area. Cochrane contends insurance could be sold profitably since even a major quake will produce only pockets of severe damage and most single-family homes should escape without major losses.

Law Officer Recalls Life Of Adventure

BONHAM (AP) - It is not known how many men Rufus Van Zandt killed during his 50-year career as a law officer.

"My brother got to figuring it once, and when he reached 15, I told him to quit." says Van Zandt, 84. He has been a Texas Ranger, a prohibition agent for the Justice Department, a soldier and a private security guard.

Today he lives in this quiet East Tex-

as town and walks with a cane. But he remembers well the days when he lived by a simple code:

"I never shot anybody that didn't

need shooting."

Van Zandt, born in Tennessee and reared in Fort Worth, said he left home at age 18 and worked as a cattle guard on a Mexican ranch. He said that's when he killed his first man, a Mexican soldier trying to steal a cow. But he found himself in deep trouble because of it.

"I had two choices then. Join the Mexican army or be arrested and shot, he said. He joined the army, but escaped by stealing a colonel's horse and riding for 32 nights — sleeping days — crossing back into Texas just east of El Paso.

He was wounded in France in World War I and, after recovering, became one of 33 Texas Rangers, earning \$90 a month and providing his own horse and guns. Van Zandt's territory stretched from San Antonio to El Paso.

In the late 1920s, Van Zandt joined the Justice Department as a prohibition





The bill will cost \$15 million for fiscal year 1981, \$20 million for 1982 and \$30 million for 1983, when it expires.

Another 15 percent of the funds will be spent in the states to administer programs relating to domestic violence, develop a media campaign on the subject, encourage citizen participation in projects, make annual reports to HEW and state legislatures, and provide technical assistance at the local level. The other 10

percent will go to HEW for program development and coordination.

An estimated two million American couples have used a lethal weapon against one another and husband-wife violence is estimated to include at least half of all American families. Testimony before the committee on education and labor said that during 1975, one-fourth of all persons murdered in the United States were killed by a family member and half of such victims were killed by a

Rep. Paul Simon, D-Ill., a prime sponsor and floor manager of the bill, told Baptist Press after its passage that Violence is, unfortunately, very much a part of the American scene



However, when one donates his entire body to a medical school, in some states the medical school bears the cost of transportation. In other states, the estate of the donor must pay for it. Check with your local medical school.



are totally gone" from butchery by other prisoners. State Sen. Ben Altamirano said he saw the body of a black inmate who had been decapitated and his head stuffed between his legs. Guards said another inmate's arm was cut off before he was tossed from an upper window inside the prison complex.

Hundreds of the 1,000-plus inmates who survived the two-day riot spent the night in tents flown in Saturday for National Guard troops and set up in a recreation field. Temperatures were below

State police said the riot apparently was not racially motivated, but racial tensions broke out afterwards - with some white inmates threatening to kill blacks - and prisoners were segregated in their makeshift camp.

"From what we understand there was no racial tension involved," said state police Maj. Charlie Anaya. "It was getting all the snitchers.

One guard and nine inmates were listed in critical condition from the violence that ended Sunday, with no shots fired by police or the 100 guardsmen. Seven guards and 55 inmates were admitted to hospitals, and 14 inmates were treated for drug overdoses from medical supplies passed around freely on the takeover's

"The violence was incredible," said Adolph Saenz, newly appointed secretary of the state's Criminal Justice Department, after he had toured the prison 10 miles southwest of Santa Fe late Sunday. Saenz said at least 80 percent of the

prison's structure was destroyed. State Rep. Fred Mondragon estimated it would cost \$40 million to \$50 million to replace the 23-year-old prison. State Finance Secretary David King said he believed it would cost \$7 million just to make the usable portions habitable

King said Arizona had offered a newly built minimum-security prison for housing some of the prisoners, and that other nearby states had been asked to help

The siege ended quietly about 2 p.m. Sunday after state officials promised inmates that they would not use violence in retaking the institution. With or without violence. King said, "We told them we were coming in.

"We knew they didn't have any guns, but they had clubs, fires, machetes and knives. We thought some would try and use them." Montoya said. "We caught them by surprise. They didn't even put

Only three guards were still in the prison when the rebellion ended. Two were found safe in a gas chamber which is no longer used, the other was found unharmed hiding in a vault.

The prisoners had presented a list of 11 demands, asking better food, improved facilities and an end to overcrowding - demands often voiced in the past. King said the only one that was impossible to meet was amnesty for the pri-

An inmate lawsuit charging overcrowded conditions at the prison violated the rights of prisoners is to go to trial in federal court this year.

The weekend's violence was the second major incident at the prison in three months. On Dec. 9, 1979, 11 maximum security prisoners escaped; one is still at

In doing so, he said, "we will be cooperating in a variety of ways with different countries in this region."

Brzezinski, who is traveling with Deputy Secretary of State Warren Christopher, left a Pentagon team in Pakistan to assess the nation's military require-

The U.S. envoys had two days of talks with Pakistan's President Mohammed Zia ul-Haq, who earlier had shrugged off the U.S. aid offer as "peanuts." Pakista-ni officials say they need billions of dol-lars to build up their armed forces satis-

There was no indication whether Zia and Brzezinski had reached agreement on the amount of aid. A joint statement said they had a "full exchange of views."

Brzezinski visited a Pakistani camp for Afghan refugees about 100 miles south of the Afghan-Pakistan border.

"You will prevail ... because your cause is right. God is on your side," Brzezinski told the cheering refugees who re-sponded with chants of "Allah-o-akbar!" God is great.

Pointing north to the snow-clad mountain border, Brzezinski said, "The land over there is yours and you will go back there one day. Remember you are

Several elders told Brzezinski their nomes, mosques and villages had been destroyed by "the alien and atheist regime in Afghanistan," forcing them to

More than 500,000 refugees have sought shelter in Pakistan since the first communist regime came to power in Afghanistan 21 months ago, sparking a nationwide rebellion by anti-communist Moslem rebels. The Soviets began pouring troops into the country on Christmas Day to put down the rebellion and prop up the latest Marxist ruler, Babrak Karmal, installed in a Soviet-backed coup two days after Christmas. As many as 100,000 Soviet troops are reported in Af-

Meanwhile, three British reporters reported missing in northern Afghanistan made contact with the Reuters office in Kabul, the Afghan capital, and said they were safe and sound. Reuters said in a message to its Moscow bureau the three got snowed in in Mazdar Sharif and expected to return to Kabul today.

Teachers' Strike Closes Chicago School System

School officials kept buildings open for parents to collect study materials, but urged them not to send their children. 'It could be a long strike," said Rob-

ert Healey, president of the Chicago Teachers Union. "To parents, we say we're sorry, but this need not go on." The 7,717 to 2,506 vote to strike, an-

nounced Sunday night, came after a week-long teacher boycott of the schools when their paychecks failed to arrive on time. Though city officials scrambled to sell \$206 million in notes to meet the third delayed paycheck of the schools' financial crunch, teachers refused to return until other demands were met

The strike is the first in 41/2 years and the fifth in 12 years in the nation's thirdlargest school system.

Moments after the results were announced, school board president Catherine Rohter said schools would remain open, because she thought some of the 48,300 employees would want to work.

But she urged parents not to send their children to school because "the children will be in danger.

Chicago schools were open last week. but most of the 487,000 students did not show up as teachers stayed away from classes to demand a full 39-week school year, substantial restoration of teaching jobs cut last week in budget-tightening moves and assurances that the board would not alter the current contract which expirec Aug. 31, 1981.

Mrs. Rohter said it was impossible for the board to meet the teachers' demands because "we must reduce our expenditures by \$60 million."

French Flee Libyan Mob

PARIS (AP) - A mob of demonstrators shouting "popular revolution in Tunisia" today attacked the French Embassy in the Libyan capital of Tripoli, destroying the embassy interior and setting fire to cars parked in the diplomatic compound, French diplomats said. All embassy personnel escaped un-

harmed as the mob forced its way into the building and began destroying every-thing in sight, Ambassador Claude Malo said in an interview with French radio. Another embassy staff member,

Andre Laperrousaz, said in a telephone interview that the demonstrators set fire to a number of cars in the embassy courtvard during the attack.

It was the second attack on a Western embassy in Tripoli in about two months. On Dec. 2, about 2,000 Libyans chanting support for Iran stormed and ransacked the American Embassy. No embassy employees were hurt in that attack, but the first and second floors of the building suffered extensive fire damage.

The French Foreign Ministry said it was "reserving the right to demand appropriate reparations" and lodged a formal protest with the Libyan Foreign Ministry.

Malo interviewed at his residence. said at the time of the attack, the embassy was guarded by only two policemen in spite of a request for more protection.

"The demonstrators forced their way in the doors, entered the building and destroyed everything in their path. The walls are still standing, but the interior is

destroyed," he said. "I think that there is a close link between problems in Tunisia and the demonstration in front of our embassy," he said, referring to the aid France gave to Tunisia to help the army put down an attack Jan. 26 on the town of Gafsa.

The mining town was attacked by guerrillas allegedly trained in Libya. French sent military transport planes to carry troops to Gafsa and sent a naval squadron to patrol the Tunisian coast.





That message was heard loudly and often at the recent White House conference on small business.

The anger is founded on a set of imposing statistics. Women own less than 5 percent of U.S. businesses and earn a miniscule 0.3 percent of all gross receipts. But, they make up more than 50 percent of the workforce.

Women face the same obstacles as all small business owners, only it's worse for us," says Betty Orrell, president of a Houston insurance company.

The young executive talks firmly and slowly. "It's amazing how many bankers, subconsciously at least, still say a woman's place is in the home."

At many hearings across the country, prior to the White House conference, women entrepeneurs testified repeatedly about being discriminated against by government and bank loan officers. The Senate's select committee on



Two quickly drafted resolutions seeking to lay the blame for political corruption in Congress on the heads of Democratic leaders were approved by unanimous voice votes at the final session of the GOP gathering.

The conference is an informal policy forum attended by GOP members of Congress and elected state officials.

Until the ethics issue surfaced, the session had been marked by a few requisite blasts at Democrats along with approval of resolutions generally support-

ing President Carter's foreign and defense initiatives.

Those resolutions called for increased defense spending, revival of draft registration - although limited to males and loosening of some congressional reins on the CIA. All three had been advocated by Carter in his State of the Union address Jan. 23.

'It is ironic," the conference chairman, Sen. Bob Packwood, R-Ore., said in an interview at the conclusion of the conference.

But when it comes to foreign relations and national defense, Republicans have always acted in a bipartisan fashion and put the country first. I don't think we're quarelling with his (Carter's) objectives.

But the new reports of scandal touching a number of prominent Democratic committee chairmen in Congress seemed a ready-made issue to the Republican participants at the conference.

The House members and one senator became objects of the FBI "sting" operation, in which agents posed as representatives of an Arab oil sheik offering bribes for help in investing and settling in the United States, according to

Sen. Harrison A. Williams, D-N.J., and all the House members responding publicly to the allegations deny accepting bribes or any other misconduct.

Most say they were trying to help their districts by drawing in Arab money

"My feelings are, having read the newspapers, that I would be very wise to engage counsel, which I've done," Williams said Sunday.

done." Jenrette said Sunday night. "I know of no associate that would have picked up any funds from anyone, and certainly not on my telling them to

do so," he said. Murtha, a member of the House ethics committee, told the Tribune-Review of Greensburg. Pa., "They didn't offer

me any money and I didn't take any. Murtha said a man purporting to be a Philadelphia lawyer told him an Arab wanted to make investments in Murtha's district but needed help in establishing

permanent U.S. residence. Murtha said he agreed to help if he could. "What I was trying to do was make sure we didn't lose that investment for this district," he said.

Murtha said one of the representatives, who proved to be an FBI agent, said "it's worth \$50,000." The congressman said he thought that meant the lawyer was to be paid \$50,000.

FBI Planned Careful Strategy In Case

WASHINGTON (UPI) - Justice Department officials say authorities took painstaking care to avoid legal entrapment in their investigation of members of Congress under investigation for taking bribes in a major political corruption

The issue of entrapment - in which otherwise unwilling persons are lured into breaking the law - is likely to be a burning question at any criminal trials to result from the two-year probe, sources

Since the FBI allegedly has videotapes of officials receiving \$50,000 payoffs from bureau agents posing as Arab businessmen, those implicated may argue they were lured into taking payoffs by the elaborate FBI set-up.

But to argue entrapment would mean making a clear admission that they accepted payoffs - for which congressmen could be answerable on election day, and to the Internal Revenue Service if they fail to include the money on their tax re-

FBI officials said investigators were

extremely careful in avoiding legal en trapment, consulting regularly with lawyers for the Organized Crime Strike Force of the U.S. Attorney's Office in New York on provisions of the law.

One source, who has viewed the videotapes of nearly \$700,000 in payoffs to more than 25 public officials, including several members of Congress, said: "I think everyone was acting of their own free will.

Jury instructions used in the District of Columbia courts define entrapment as instances in which law enforcement officials have "induced or persuaded an unwilling person to commit an unlawful

But the instructions stress that where a person is predisposed to commit an offense - that is, ready and willing to violate the law - the fact that government officials or their agents merely afford an opportunity for him to do so, does not constitute entrapment."

The law says that even if undercover agents induced a defendant to commit a crime, a defendant may be convicted if a

jury finds he was predisposed to commit such an offense anyway. It permits law enforcement officals to

use undercover tactics and even to offer money to "afford opportunities" for suspects to break the law.

Sources say the government likely will be moving into new legal areas in attempting to prosecute the congressmen. Not only does the case raise the issue of entrapment, but it could bring court tests on whether the government can create a criminal enterprise through which it

In one test case, during an FBI undercover operation in Washington, assistant U.S. Attorney Donald Robinson was caught on film taking a payoff

The attack occurred Sunday night 80 miles southeast of Salisbury. The Rhode-sian military command blamed Robert Mugabe's guerrillas, who were operating in the area before the truce went into effect Dec. 29.

The force of the rockets and machine gun bullets sent bodies flying up to 30 yards. The victims were returning to Salisbury from visits to relatives and friends in the eastern garrison town of Umtali.

"It was awful," said one of the wounded. Baxter Machuana, a 31-yearold welder. "The driver was hit first. His head exploded from his body. There was blood all over. Then the bus crashed and people were screaming and rushing to get out the windows. And still there was shooting.

One black was killed and four were wounded earlier Sunday in a grenade attack on a bus carrying supporters of for-mer Prime Minister Abel Muzorewa, the major political rival of Mugabe and Joshua Nkomo, the co-leaders of the Patriotic Front guerrilla alliance.

Two others were crushed to death and 35 injured when thousands of blacks stampeded from a Mugabe rally in Gwelo, 100 miles south of Salisbury.

The worst previous cease-fire violation occurred three weeks ago when six blacks were killed in a cross-fire between security forces and supporters of Nkomo.

Nkomo and Mugabe split after the cease-fire to campaign separately, and Nkomo angered his wartime partner by registering his party as the Patriotic Front. 

Weizman Criticized For Carter Support

TEL AVIV, Israel (AP) - Ezer Weizman, Israel's popular but impetuous de-fense minister, is accused of meddling in American politics by praising President Carter and criticizing Sen. Edward Ken-

In the past six weeks Weizman has heaped praise on Carter, intimated that Kennedy's pledges of support for Israel were only campaign rhetoric and predicted Kennedy would lose his challenge for the Democratic presidential nomination.

The comments have provoked a barrage of criticism from Israeli and American Jews who say foreign leaders have no place on the U.S. political scene. Weizman touched off the controversy

after a meeting with Carter in late December to press Israel's case for more economic and military aid. He told reporters: "We have a friend in the White House, and I hope it will be that way during the next four years.

The remark, interpreted as an endorsement of Carter's candidacy, incensed Kennedy backers because of its possible effect on the Jewish vote. Jewish supporters of the senator protested to Prime Minister Menachem Begin, who in an effort to keep his cabinet from getting involved in the campaign has barred non-essential visits to the United States until after Election Day.

Israeli politicians and newspapers chastised the defense minister for undermining Begin's effort to avoid any appearance of interfering in U.S. affairs. Weizman defended his remark by cit-

ing Carter's key role in the Israeli-Egyptian peace treaty and the massive U.S. aid that has been channeled to Israel by his administration. Last week he compounded the controversy by belittling Kennedy's campaign statements expressing strong support for Israel and predicting he would lose.

In a interview with Israel Television he said: "I never heard one word about Israel from Senator Kennedy until he decided to run." During the difficult twoyear peace process with Egypt, he added,

Irish Youths Plant Bombs

BELFAST, Northern Ireland (UPI) -Armed youths who police said appeared to be Irish Republican Army terrorists burned down an auction salesroom today, holding up the staff at gunpoint and planting three fire bombs.

Police were able to evacuate the staff a few minutes before the time bombs exploded. Nobody was injured but the flames destroyed the single-story glassfront building that replaced an earlier salesroom burned down by the IRA in the mid-1970s.

The auctioneers - Kennedy and Wolfendon's - dealt mainly in antique furniture and the fire destroyed hundreds of valuable antiques. Police said about six teen-age youths

held up the staff at pistolpoint and planted the bombs. The youths then fled and the bombs exploded Police said nobody immediately

claimed responsibility for the attack, but

police said the circumstances left no doubt the youths were acting for the Provisional IRA. In recent years IRA attacks in major cities have concentrated mainly on hitand-run fire bomb attacks aimed at crip-

pling the province's economy.

The bombs used in the attack were explosive charges linked to gasolinefilled containers, police said. The flames spread rapidly and firemen were impeded by the fear of further explosions.

Despite the change in plans, he said, up to 150 international celebrities, social activists and politicians plan to spend three days near the border, visiting refugee camps and publicizing the problem

The group changed its plans because the Vietnamese-backed Cambodian government in Phnom Penh said they would not be allowed to cross the border and because of increased fighting between the Vietnamese army and the Khmer Rouge guerrillas just inside Cambodia near the Thai border.

Among participants who arrived are American singer Joan Baez, Norwegian actress Liv Ullman, Sir Winston Churchill's grandson and namesake, who is a member of the British Parliament, and U.S. civil rights activist Bayard Rustin.

On Tuesday they will visit the Sa Kaew refugee camp 109 miles east of Bangkok and 31 miles from the border. More than 25,000 refugees have been

Lebanese Leader Hopes Syrians Stay In Beirut

DAMASCUS, Syria (AP) - Lebanese Premier Salim el-Hoss traveled to Syria today seeking clarification of newspaper reports quoting unidentified Syrian officials as saying that country's 22,000- state radio reported. member force in Lebanon will be withdrawn, his aides said.

The aides said Hoss was meeting with Syrian President Hafez Assad and Premier Abdel-Raouf el-Kasm and would tell them the Lebanese army was not yet strong enough to take over responsibility for security in Beirut, the aides said. Hoss would ask for an indefinite postponement of the reported withdrawal. they said.

Sakharov Tells Of Threats On Life

MOSCOW (AP) - Exiled dissident Andrei Sakharov, in a statement issued in Moscow today by his wife, says his life has been threatened by two men armed with a pistol since he was banished to the city of Gorki last month.

Sakharov also said a Gorki public prosecutor warned him last week that if e issued any more statements through his wife, the site and conditions of his exile would be changed and his wife would also be restricted.

And he said the unidentified armed men who came to his apartment had told him a place was ready for him at a psychiatric hospital.

Sakharov's wife, Yelena Bonner, distributed the statement to newsmen shortly after her return from a weekend with her husband in Gorki, the Volga River city 250 miles east of Moscow to which the Nobel Peace Prize winner was confined Jan. 19. So far, no action has been taken against her. The situation in Gorki is very alarm-

Warrants Wanted For Spy Break-Ins

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Carter is ready to propose that U.S. intelligence agents, with the permission of a secret court, be allowed to burglarize the homes and offices and open the mail of

Americans suspected of spying.

Though Carter's proposal won't be unveiled before Friday, debate already has begun over whether such intrusions

should be regulated strictly or loosely. The first question is whether breakins and mail-openings should be permitted against any American believed to be acting for a foreign power or whether those tactics should be employed only when there is specific evidence of an American's criminal conduct.

If the standard requires evidence of a crime, the next question concerns how much evidence.

Civil libertarians are prepared to argue for the most restrictive standard, allowing break-ins and mail-openings only when the secret court finds hard evidence a crime has been or will be commit-

But conservatives in Congress seem likely to resist subjecting these tactics tocourt scrutiny, even in secret.

The controversy is developing as Carter polishes details of his proposed com-prehensive charter governing intellig-ence-gathering by the CIA, FBI and oth-

er agencies.

Carter, in his State of the Union message, said increased U.S.-Soviet tensions require loosening some of the restric-tions placed on these agencies after past abuses came to light in the 1970s.

Sen. Walter D. Huddleston, D-Ky., chairman of the Senate Intelligence Committee's charter subcommittee, said last week the charter would legalize some spying on Americans whenever the president ruled an investigation was "essential to the national security."

But Carter's proposal will require

court warrants for mail-openings of break-ins, known as "black bag jobs." said Huddleston, a participant in months of charter negotiations with the adminis-

The warrant responsibility would rest; with the seven-member court created two years ago to review government requests for permission to use wiretaps or other electronic surveillance in foreign intelligence cases. Those requests, the court's hearings and even its written decisions are all classified secret.

Government sources and outside critics involved in the negotiations confirm: Carter's charter will apply the same standards for break-ins and mail-openings against Americans as the 1978 law set for using electronic surveillance against Americans in foreign intelligence

Currently, a presidential order allows the FBI to carry out covert break-ins against Americans if the president has authorized the general investigation and if the attorney general approves the spe-cific break-in and finds probable cause to believe the American is a Toreign agent.

But the order allows mail-opening onwhen there is probable cause to believe a crime has been or will be committed. That is the same standard required for the warrants police use in such every-

for the warrants police use in such every-day cases as searches for stolen property.

Mail-opening warrants require that the suspect be told about the search, and sources said that requirement has effectively halted the see of mail-opening in foreign intelligence cases.

The 1978 law and Carter's new charter together would allow wiretapping, breakins and mail-openings against Americans whom the government believes are knowingly engaged in spying or other secret actions to benefit a foreign power. The government must at least suspect those actions may involve a crime.

Lance Bank Fraud Trial Continues At Slow Pace

ATLANTA (AP) - Former U.S. budget director Bert Lance was going back to court today for the fourth week of his bank fraud trial, which is still creeping along in a preliminary stage of the government's case.

By the end of last week, prosecutors had questioned only 15 of some 60 "cust-odial witnesses" — keepers of bank records who may or may not know anything about the case.

Three Countries Raise Prices For Crude Oil

Nigeria, Algeria and Indonesia, which together supply 11 percent of U.S oil needs, today joined the rapidly-growing number of Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries raising crude oil prices by from \$2 to more than \$4 a bar-The moves followed \$2-a-barrel in-

creases by Saudi Arabia, Iraq, Venezuela and most other OPEC members last Theodore R. Eck, chief economist of

Standard Oil Co. (Indiana) estimated the round of OPEC hikes would boost U.S. gasoline or heating oil prices by 2.5 to 3 cents a gallon. The United States imports half its oil. It gets about 30 percent of its petroleum

from OPEC members. Indonesia's state-owned oil company Pertamina announced a \$2 increase to \$29.50 per 42-gallon barrel for its basic grade. Algeria's price, including contin-uation of a \$3-a-barrel surcharge, climbed by \$4.21 to \$37.21 a barrel.

The Nigerian National Petroleum Corp. said it was raising prices by \$4, but U.S. industry sources said Nigeria also tacked on a 21-cents-a-barrel "retroactive compensation" fee to make its price \$34.21.

Earlier, Venezuela raised its base price by \$2 to \$28 a barrel, but raised prices on lower grades of oil by as little as 44 cents.

The impact of the Indonesian move was not immediately clear because the country reportedly has been adding surcharges of up to \$5 a barrel to posted prices in recent weeks. Indonesia increased its oil prices by \$1.45 to \$ 2.95 a barrel last month.

The new posted Algerian price is

\$34.21, but buyers also will have to continue paying a \$3-a-barrel "exploration" levy imposed since the beginning of the year. The levy brings Algeria's final price to \$37.21.

The official Algerian news agency APS warned against any confusion between the posted price and the exploration levy, and called the \$3 levy "an advance" pending the conclusion of exploration contracts between Algieria's clients and the state-owned Sonatrach oil com-

Dollar Rises In Europe

Treating Painful Heels

By LAWRENCE LAMB, M.D.

DEAR DR. LAMB - I've had pain in my heel about four months. When it started the pain was so bad I could hardly walk. It is greatly improved now but it's not completely

I went to a doctor who specializes in the treatment of bone disorders. He looked at my heel and said it was an inflammation of the tendon that stretches from the toe to the heel. He gave me a shot of cortisone in the heel and told me to return in two weeks if it was not well. If anything, it was worse, so he gave me another shot and again told me to come back in two weeks. I didn't improve any.

I canceled the third visit after hearing it was not good to take too much cortisone. The pain is on the bottom of the heel and spreads to the outer rim in a burning sensation. The most tender spot is in the center just where the arch meets the heel. I know this isn't much help but I hope you can enlighten me as to what I have.

DEAR READER - There's no way to be certain exactly what you have without examining your foot and

perhaps even looking at an X-ray. The disorder you complain of, pain in the heel, is similar to what many people call a heel spur.

That may be misleading because the little bony spur that develops on the bottom of the heel bone may or may not be associated with actual pain in that area. Some people do have the kind of pain you describe and don't have a bony spur at all. Other people have a bony spur and don't have any pain.

Your description suggests that your doctor was absolutely correct and that it's related to soreness and irritation in the area where the tendons and other tisues attach to the bottom of the heelbone. These spread across the arch of the foot. The irritation is often caused by a strain on the arch - the constant pulling at the point of attachment

It's no surprise then that one of the best forms of treatment is to get the weight off the foot so the pulling doesn't occur. From the foot's point of view, the best idea would be to stay off the foot entirely but, of course, that imposes other problems associated with inactivity

A good foot doctor will sometimes strap the heel to rotatate the foot a little and cause you to walk on the outside of the arch. By walking on the outside of the foot, you don't put all that strain across the center arch of the foot and you decrease the pulling effect. A similar approach is to put a little pad underneath the inside of the foot to change the weight bearing ef-

fect on the foot itself. Lumber Firm To Use 'Sawdust Power

HADDAM, Conn. (AP) - Sawdust. once a bothersome byproduct of the sawmill, soon will be used by a lumber prod-

ucer in this Connecticut river town as a

substitute for precious fuel oil. And in Saco, Maine, Gwido Swistun burns sawdust from a local mill. He hopes to begin marketing sawdust fur-

In Connecticut, Rossi Corp. plans to start burning its mountains of sawdust and wood chips next month in a new burner that produces steam to heat the company's new wood-drying kilns, says President Ted Rossi. The corporation might save as much as \$400,000 per year if the plan works out well.

And while Rossi's sawdust-burning unit is the first of its kind in Connecticut. there are an estimated 30 similar systems at lumber companies in the nation.

Rossi said "sawdust power" will provide the company with hundreds of thousands of dollars worth of heat per year to kiln-dry the 12 million board feet of lumber it produces annually.

Until recently the company has transported freshly cut lumber from its five mills to other companies to be dried and

About a year ago Rossi began thinking about using sawdust as an alternate source of energy to dry the company's lumber without relying on other firms.

Six kilns and a \$300,000 combination oil-sawdust burner to heat them have been installed at the plant. So far, the Pennsylvania-made burner has been operated only on oil - except for test runs.

But in Maine, Swistun's home has been heated this winter by sawdust. He packs the sawdust in a chamber around

lengths of pipe, then removes the pipes. The sawdust burns along the channels left when the pipes are taken out. Swistun figures his sawdust furnace

will heat his house for \$98 this winter, compared to the \$780 that the equivalent of fuel oil would cost. Rossi said that during cold weather,

his heating system burns about 6,000 gallons of oil per week. With the wholesale price at more than 80 cents, that costs more than \$4,800 per week.

His lumber operations produce about 200 tons of sawdust and wood chips per week. A ton of sawdust will produce as much heat as 50 gallons of fuel oil, Rossi said. Therefore, 200 tons of sawdust can replace 10,000 gallons of oil, more than the firm's weekly oil demand. Assuming all the sawdust and chips

are used, it could mean an annual saving of more than \$416,000 per year.

"It's the lumber industry's answer to saving fuel.

'Pokes Face Problems

THIS TIME OF YEAR should be all fun and games for Dallas Cowboy coaches and players. A long, difficult season finally is past, and it is two months until the club launches the off-season conditioning program that signals the start of another

It isn't that simple, though. Coach Tom Landry has a bundle of problems to solve and some crucial decisions to make. His actions will determine, to a large degree, the success or failure of the 'Pokes this autumn.

First on the agenda is the matter of Thomas "Hollywood" Henderson. Landry booted the talented but controversial linebacker off the squad late last season, after a seri of unpleasant incidents. Now Henderson is promising that he will be a good boy and begging Landry to let him return.

Henderson's new tactics really put Landry in a bind. "Hollywood" was accused of loafing and talking too much, not selling secrets to the enemy or shaving points, so it may be difficult for Landry to justify lifetime banishment. Henderson irritated his coaches and teammates, but he also made a lot of big plays and was a demon on the special teams.

Insiders are betting that Landry will not let him return to the team. Landry doesn't believe Henderson can change his ways, no matter how much he tries, and the mentor fears "Hollywood" would continue to set a bad example for the young-

PLAYERS WHO ARE NOT starters usually are unhappy, even at the high school or college level, so it was not surprising when wide receiver Butch Johnson recently asked Landry to trade him to a West Coast team. Johnson, who grew up in the Los Angeles area, would like to go home and play with a team where he has a chance to be No. 1.

Butch has been unhappy for a couple of years, actually. He is a fierce competifor and it galls him to sit on the bench while other guys get to catch the passes and make the blocks. The Cowboys traded Golden Richards to give Johnson a chance to play more, but then talented young Tony Hill took over the split end spot.

Johnson subbed for Drew Pearson at flanker late in the '79 season, when the veleran receiver hurt his knee showboating in the end zone, but Butch has little or no chance to beat out Pearson over the long haul. At least not until Drew gets more years and miles on his slender frame.

Landry agreed to try to trade Johnson, but he isn't going to give him away. The Chargers and Rams are fairly well stocked with wide receivers, leaving San Francisco and Oakland as the best bets. San Francisco, because of its high position on the draft list, would suit Cowboy officials just fine.

THAT INCIDENT AT DALLAS last week involving Ed "Too Tall" Jones didn't help his chances of returning to the Cowboys. Not that Jones had given any genuine indication of wanting to return to the pro grid ranks, understand. He has never wavered in his public declarations that he intends to be a boxer or, failing that, concentrate on his booking agency in the entertainment field.

Which is just as well, in the light of recent developments. Jones is an awesome physical specimen and made a considerable contribution to the Dallas defense for five seasons, but the Cowboy brass rates scandal and bad publicity right along with the bubonic plague. Club President Tex Schramm and Landry have traded away a lot of good football players because they were tavern brawlers off the field or made a habit of getting unfavorable headlines.

The Cowboys swapped Baltimore an arm and a leg for John Dutton, so chances are that Schramm and Landry will give the big guy a chance to play. Dutton was severely handicapped by reporting to the Cowboys at mid-season and having to get into condition while learning a new system.

This year, with the advantage of the off-season program and training camp, Dutton may eliminate any regrets about Jones' absence.

HERE AND THERE - Talk of realignment is growing in the National Football League. Huge increases in travel expenses, plus an obvious imbalance in divi-sion competition, make some changes possible. Rumors say that a realignment plan based on regional rivalry will be submitted to NFL owners at their next meet-

Sources in the South say that a Dixie division is under study, with Tampa Bay, Miami, New Orleans and Atlanta as charter members. But Tampa Bay officials are happy with the setup the way it is now, with the Bucs competing against Green

Bay, Minnesota, Chicago and Detroit. The Cowboys would be against realignment, for sure. Schramm and Landry like it in the NFC East, no matter how much airline fares go up. It would take years to replace the rivalries with the Redskins, Cardinals, Giants and Eagles.

A lot of the other clubs probably feel the same way. Logic seldom rules in professional sports, unless big money is involved.





Holmes, Gomez Pound Ring Challengers

LAS VEGAS, Nev. (AP) - Larry Holmes wants the world to realize he's the heavyweight boxing champion, a tough public relations job since Muhammad Ali ruled the sport for so long.

'John Tate just has a piece of the title that I deserve," said the 30-year-old Holmes Sunday after stopping Italy's Lorenzo Zanon in the sixth round of their scheduled 15-round bout for the World Boxing Council heavyweight share.

Tate holds the World Boxing Association part of the title having won an elimination series following the retirement of

"Tate would be just another opponent for me," said Holmes, of Easton, Pa. "He doesn't rate to be called champi-

Zanon became the fifth challenger to fall by knockout to Holmes, who won the WBC version by outpointing Ken Norton at the Caesars Palace Sports Pavilion, where Zanon was stopped by a left-right combination, the latter doing the big-

On March 31, a television audience gets to see both champions in action. Holmes fights big Leroy Jones in Las Vegas while Tate tangles with Mike Weaver in Knoxville, Tenn. Holmes al-

ready has stopped Weaver in a WBC title defense. The snarled mess in the heavyweight ranks came after Leon

Spinks beat Ali for the undisputed title and the WBC said the winner must fight Norton. Spinks refused, and signed instead for a rematch, which he lost to Ali in New Orleans. The WBC had stripped Spinks of his crown and named Norton as his successor while the WBA went along with a Spinks-Ali title fight, which the latter won.

Zanon, 28, and weighing 215 pounds, used the full ring in trying to avoid Holmes and actually won the third round. But he went down twice in the fourth and was given a standing eight-count respite in the same stanza by referee Ray Solis of Mexico City, who apparently didn't know you could not legally do that in Nevada.

But Solis ended the fight at 2:39 of the sixth after the right hand shot put the challenger down. Zanon was up by the count of eight but beaten and wobbly.

"Zanon was a good stepping stone toward Tate," said the unmarked Holmes, who put his record at 33-0 and earned a reported \$600,000 with his 24th kayo.

"I feel I don't have to fight anybody to prove I'm the undisputed champion of the world," said Holmes, who weighed 213

Zanon's record went to 25-5-2 as he fought for \$125,000 and simply did not have the artillery to stand off the champion.

Attorney Claims Jones' Innocence

DALLAS (AP) - It's not enough that a 25-year-old nurse has dropped rape charges against boxer Ed "Too Tall" Jones - she also must stop saying the rape took place, says an attorney for the former defensive end for the Dallas

Jones denied the accusation. He was released Thursday on \$2,500 bond and late Friday, the woman signed a document saying she did not wish to press the

"It did happen," the woman said this weekend. "But I just want to forget the whole thing.

Police investigators and county prosecutors had expressed reservations about the complaint.

A source at Parkland Memorial Hospital said tests taken there indicated there was no evidence of rape. The woman also told police she had cleansed

herself twice with a vinegar and water solution before calling officers. In the original complaint, she said she woke to find Jones on top of her in

bed. The woman said she and her roommate had met Jones and a Dallas physician at a northside disco earlier in the evening.

Raider Officials Threaten To Make Oakland 'Pay'

OAKLAND (AP) - The Oakland Raiders, deeply bitter toward the city they have called home for 20 years, are in no mood to listen to a new offer to keep them from moving to Los Angeles, according to the team's executive assistant.

"I can't imagine us expecting to do business with people who have no integrity and have lost their credibility with us and the community as well," Al LoCasale said Sunday.

LoCasale, assistant to managing general partner Al Davis, was sharply critical of Oakland Coliseum president Jack Maltester, Coliseum general manager Bill Cunningham and Alameda County supervisor Joseph Bort, whom he accused of undermining an \$8 million offer that was declared invalid on Friday.

The offer, by Mayor Lionel Wilson and Cornell Maier, chairman of Kaiser Aluminum and Chemical Corp., was designed to persuade Davis to sign a new lease with the Oakland Coliseum. It included a \$4 million loan for construction of luxury boxes and a \$2 million pledge

"It was a solid proposal by solid people who were working in the direction of a definitive proposal that warranted seri-

ous consideration," said LoCasale "It got shot down by a lot of little peodrawn "because people in the group the proposal represented, principally Bort, withdrew their support.

On Friday, Maier announced the offer was being revised. A new proposal which Bort said meets Davis' basic requirements was to be presented today, but the Raiders say they won't listen.

The Raiders reportedly have been offered a \$17 million package to move to Los Angeles.

And LoCasale sounded an ominous warning for Oakland by saying, "The group that's calling the shots here now will have to stand responsible for the consequences of their actions."

NBA Requests Dallas' Advance

WASHINGTON (AP) - Will pro basketball return to Dallas next fall following

The Dallas group seeking a National Basketball Association expansion franchise has been given 30 days to decide whether it's willing to meet new terms set forth by the league's Board of Governors Saturday at its annual midwinter meeting

in conjunction with the NBA All-Star Game. Foremost among the changes is the requirement that the 24 partners in the group headed by Norm Sonju come up with half the \$12 million entry fee as a down payment, instead of just \$3.5 million. The Governors also made the remainder of the payment schedule more stringent and decided to let each existing team

protect eight players from the expansion draft, instead of seven. If these terms are acceptable, the Dallas group will get the NBA's 23rd franchise and pro basketball will return to a city it left in 1973, when the Dallas Chaparrals of the old American Basketball Association moved to San Antonio.

In another major development, the NBA Governors voted to accept a new three-year working agreement with the Players Association, which had been competing this season without a contract. The pact, approved by the Association's executive committee, was scheduled to be voted on today by the 22 player represent-

"I think this contract is a major step forward," said Paul Silas, president of the Players Association. "We are delighted that we have come to this conclusion."

Under the agreement, the players would receive an increase in the minimum salary from the present level of \$30,000 to an unannounced figure, as well as raises in per diem expenses and playoff money. And in 1981-82, the final year of the contract, the league agreed to raise the roster limit from 11 players to 12.

In return, the players agreed to drop their demands for a share of the growing revenue from cable television, which had been a major point with the owners, and

the elimination of no-trade clauses from contracts. In another labor development, Richie Phillips, legal counsel for the National Association of Basketball Referees, called on the league to return to three-man officiating teams for this spring's playoffs. He also said a return to the three-referee system, which was tested last year but dropped by the Board in a cost-cutting move, would be a major point in negotiations for a new contract to replace the one which expires this summer.

We will not sign a contract for the 1980-81 season without the three-referee system being brought back," he declared. "It could become a strike issue.

campaign is to talk about quitting it, under any circumstances. The point of no return has to be top secret, or the candidate is virtually certain to reach it.

Early in his 1972 presidential camign, Sen. Edmund S. Muskie said he had to win big in the early primaries or he'd be dead as a candidate. He didn't, and he was, although he did not drop from the race until months later.

did in Iowa, the pressure mounts for him to set goals, to say this state or that state is the crucial one.

Kennedy already had done too much of that for the good of his own campaign. Outpolled in a pre-season straw vote in Florida, he said Iowa would be the first real test. Beaten there, he said New England victories were essential.

What really is essential is to keep the money coming. When it dries up, a cam-paign really is over. Kennedy has had problems in that department, but nothing a victory or two wouldn't cure.

In the competition for campaign dollars, it also is important that the candidate quash any suggestion that if he doesn't win next Tuesday, or the Tuesday after that, he'll no longer be a candidate. Set a specific contest as the makeor-break test, and the wavering donor will keep his checkbook in his pocket to await the return.

"I would certainly like to win the states of Maine and New Hampshire, but we're in this race and we'll continue,' Kennedy said the other day.

In a way, Kennedy's early misfortunes could be an asset in the coming New England primaries - if he can beat Carter. Any margin will do in New Hampshire where, a year ago, the precampaign pollsters said he was preferred over Carter by a 2-1 margin. Now polls give Carter the edge.

In those altered circumstances, Kennedy doesn't face the soaring expectations that turned a victory into a psychological setback for Muskie of Maine eight years ago. Muskie beat Sen. George McGovern in New Hampshire, 46 percent to 37 percent. But his own people had forecast a runaway, and when Muskie didn't score one, the victory was tar-

The Carter line is that while it would be difficult to defeat Kennedy in his own neighborhood, the president hopes to gain more delegates than his challengers Feb. 26, whatever the New Hampshire

That's because Minnesota will begin choosing its 75 delegates in caucuses while New Hampshire is awarding its 19 nominating votes by primary election. And in Minnesota, the home field advantage belongs to Vice President Walter F.

A week after New Hampshire, Kenne-dy's own Massachusetts holds its primary, with Vermont voting the same day. The Massachusetts vote is even more essential to Kennedy, and the presumption has to be that he'll win comfortably in the state that has elected him to the Senate four times. Still, Kennedy hasn't faced a really

formidable candidate in Massachusetts since his first Senate election, in 1962, when his brother was in the White House. He has some old political enemies waiting at home. In Washington a week ago, Kennedy

suggested that whatever happens in the month of New England primaries, he will keep up the challenge to President Carter in order to raise the issues dear to "I intend to stay the course," he said.

"I believe we must not permit the dream of social progress to be shattered by those whose promises have failed. "And for all these commitments, I

have only just begun to fight."

But for all those ringing words, the fact is that Kennedy is going to have to come out of New England a winner. A week after Massachusetts come the primaries in Carter's Georgia, and in neighboring Alabama and Florida.

Unless Kennedy succeeds in his own territory, his problems will go from serious to critical







ago South Vietnamese Air Force Lt. Tuan Tran was scrambling for a helicopter to escape the triumphant Viet Cong. A year ago Lang Phon and Hoa Phung, hating life in Communist Vietnam, joined the exodus of the boat people.

Today all three, and hundreds of fellow boat people and Indochinese refugees, are building computer components

They reflect a happy coincidence that is helping solve two California economic problems at once:

-Finding jobs for the Vietnamese refugees who have chosen to live in California in disproportionate numbers; -And filling a shortage of thousands

of workers in the state's booming computer and electronic manufacturing in-

Refugee-welfare workers and the electronics industry have discovered each other to mutual delight, sending hundreds of Southeast Asia refugees into the computer-building business.

They are fine workers, very initiative-oriented, and will learn anything required of them," said Jerry Ringer of Cubic Corporation of San Diego. Cubic has four Vietnamese women and a Laotian man, three of them boat people who escaped Southeast Asia last year, on just one project.

They're assembling a defense project, a training simulator system for missile recovery boat crews. Their supervisor says they are super good workers.

Among them are Mrs. Phon, 33, a former elementary school teacher who spent eight days in a boat that drifted to Thailand, and Miss Phung, 23, who was at sea for five days before reaching Ma-
