over two controwsial provisions in a proposed new code of ethics for the nation's lawyers. One would put a crack in the current wall of secrecy around an attorney's relation-
ship with his or her clients. The other encourages - but does not force - lawyers to ship with his or her clients. The other encourages - but does not force - lawyers to
provide more free public service each year. The secrecy proposal sparked immenediate and heated debate wh
at last week's American Bar Association winter meeting in Chicago.
Under the rule. if a ciient thraeatens serious bodily harm or or death to another person, a lawyer must disclose the information to "appropriate authorities.
