Street Riots Linked To New Move

NEW DELHI, India (AP) - Soviet troops have blocked access to bridges over the river that dissects Kabul, splitting the Afghan capital in two in an apparent attempt to protect the Soviet Embassy and a Russian housing area after three days of street violence, reports from Kabul said Sunday.

In Bonn, West Germany, a magazine said President Carter asked former Chancellor Willy Brandt on Feb. 15 to act as a mediator between the Soviet Union and the West in the Afghan crisis. There was no immediate comment on the report in Der Spiegel from either Brandt or U.S. officials.

But a spokesman for Brandt's Social Democratic Party, which the Nobel Peace Prize winner still heads, said the report contained material that was more speculative than helpful or use-

Afghan sources in New Delhi said Vice President Sultan Ali Kishtmand. earlier reported wounded in a Kabul shooting incident Feb. 7, died following unsuccessful medical treatment in Moscow. The date of his death was not

Afghanistan's Marxist government has not confirmed the death of Kishtmand, a close associate of President Babrak Karmal. But government-run newspapers earlier reported Kishtmand, an economist-turned-politician, had beer flown to the Soviet Union for an undisclosed medical problem.

Youth Books Deal With Problems Of Today's Teen-Agers

NEW YORK (AP) - Nancy Drew has never faced an unwanted pregnancy. The Hardy Boys probably will never battle

Although the junior sleuths are still published, with updated plots, they escape the decisions and problems of other characters in today's books for young adults, who grapple with politics

and religion, discover sex and shake some very nasty habits alcoholism and drugs.

Realism has touched juvenile fiction, giving fantasy stiff competition.

What's called the new reality is just common respect for the child," said Charlotte Zolotow, vice president and associate publisher of Harper & Row Junior Books.

Young people today are a great deal more sophisticated," said MissZolotow, who has worked in juvenile literature for 18 years. "Books we used to publish for 14-year-olds are now being read by 10-year-olds. In picture books for younger readers there was a time when death or divorce were never treated and everything worked out well."

In Blossom Elfman's "A House for Johnnie O," pregnant unmarried teens search for a dream house where they can raise

Racism is treated in Ann Waldron's "The Integration of Mary Larkin Thornhill.

Both "Cages" and "Sticks and Stones" focus on homosexuality. And "After the First Death," by Robert Cormier, handles terrorism.

Other books deal with incest, abortion, rape and the changing roles of women and men.

There's a general implication now that publishers are looking for problem books," said Miss Zolotow. "We are not seeking controversial books. We're seeking good books.

G. Robert Carlsen, professor of English and Education at the University of Iowa, and former president of the National Council of Teachers of English, said what's being offered is "a pretty romanticized kind of reality" that's really wish fulfillment by the youngsters and not how situations actully are.

The question is, is the literature ever real?" he said. Realism is letting young people read about some feelings they have and coping with some problems they have," said Judy Blume, author of "Forever" and "Wifey" - books on early sexual experiences. "There is a need to let them know that they're not alone in the world and one way of doing that is

through their literature." Miss Blume is the mother of a 16-year-old and an 18-yearold. When she first started writing for young people, she drew from her own childhood experiences.

I didn't know anything about the market, but what I didn't find was what life was really like," she said. "I didn't set out to do anything great for kids. I just wanted to say this is what it was like for me. Now my son is urging me to write about what high school is like today — about the drugs and the booze in the trunk of the car.

Young Adults Books Turn Toward Realism

NEW YORK (AP) - "Forever" by Judy Blume is a love story, a story of the first awakenings of an adolescent's love. There is sex and it's descriptive.

The book has been hailed as a breakthrough in juvenile fiction. It's also been attacked.

"Forever' is quite popular," said Barbara Shew, librarian at Ithaca High School in Ithaca, N.Y. "But we don't have it here because a few librarians thought it too explicit."

Robert Cormier's "The Chocolate War," another book written for young adults, tells of mob violence in a prep school. It was strongly criticized for being too violent and having arrunhappy ending.

One parent in San Francisco called "Hard Feelings" by

Don Bredes a "guide for dirty language. The book, which made the 1977 "Best Books for Young Adults" list pushlished by the American Library Association, tells the story of a 16-year-old boy's confrontation with

the school bully and understanding of his sexuality. The new wave in juvenile literature toward realism has also brought criticism and in some instances book banning because of subject matter or language.

"I think there's a great deal of controversy," said G. Robert Carlsen, professor of English and Education at the University of Iowa and former president of the National Council of Teachers of English. "Censorship or would-be censors are a continuing problem. It's more severe in the present time than ever before."

The Rev. Donald Wildmon of the National Federation for Decency in Tupelo, Miss., said: "Probably what we have to say about them (today's young adult literature) you couldn't print in an AP story.
"Many adult writers think children are adults and face

adult problems. They have children's problems."

Wildmon criticized young adult literature as being "entirely humanistic in values with no absolutes. Children need

Miss Blume, the author of "Forever," said the book concerns the universal experience of first love and one's first sexual encounter

"Kids live in the same world we live in and there are those kids who have to find a reality in their books," she

Evelyn Shaevel, executive director of the young adult services division of the American Library Association, said "Gone With the Wind" is still one of the most popular books among teen-agers in certain parts of the country.

The biggest selling books in Scholastic Magazine's Teen-age Book Club are romances, followed closely by movie noveliza-tions and books on stars, the supernatural and humor.

Our market is largely a middle-class, suburban market concentrated in the middle of the country," said Dan Weiss, Book Club editor. "What 12-to 16-year-olds read is a reflection of the mass market in general."

The ALA publishes an annual best book list of works that have proven or potential appeal to young adults. It is compiled by librarians. The 1979 list includes adult fiction, such as Kurt Vonnegut's "Jailbird," and the adult fantasy, "The Flight of Dragons," by Peter Dickinson.

The 1978 list included "Steffie Can't Come Out to Play," the Fran Arrick story about a 14-year-old runaway who becomes a prostitute: "Where Pigeons Go to Die." a novel by Wright R. Campbell about a 10-year-old boy coping with the death of his grandfather, and "Killing Mr. Griffin," Lois Duncan's story of high school students who kidnap their English teacher.

But not all young people stick to the teen-age lists when selecting reading material.

Kim Chambers, 15, of Pikesville, Md., who just finished reading the works of James Baldwin, prefers reading adult fiction "because I think I'm too mature for adolescent books." "Usually, young adult books deal with adolescent life and

I'm living that right now," she said. "So I prefer reading other Elsa Arnett, 12, of New York also finds young adult books

too easy to read. "I read them in the fifth and sixth grades," she said. "But the adult section has more to offer.

"Children watch a lot of television and they're sophisticated in that sense, but not in a literary way because they haven't read the classics," said writer Ann Waldron. "You have to be very honest about what you write, so you can't pawn off something phony. They know.

Several police cars were parked in front of the Bavarian State Opera House during the Saturday night performance after directors reported receiving threatening telephone calls. There were no in-



HEARTLINE: I live in a very small town. My family doctor, who has been treating me since I was 13 years old, recently passed away. I am frightened to death of going to a doctor that I do not personally know and do not know enough about to trust. In the next town nearest us, there is an osteopath, I think he is called. I don't even know what an osteopath is. I might consider going to him if I knew enough about the study he had to have to be allowed to practice medicine. Can you tell me the difference between a regular medical doctor and an

ANSWER: Americans generally visit an M.D. for treatment of an illness, injury or to get a physical checkup. Basic education for all doctors of medicine is similar. Depending on the program, it may take 6 to 8 years after high school to complete necessary college and medical school courses to obtain an M.D.

About 1/5 of the M.D.'s who provide patient care are general practioners. Others are specialists who choose to limit their practice to allergies, arthritis, heart and circulatory disease, or some other area. To become certified specialists, M.D.'s must pass specialty board exams. To qualify for these exams, they must spend from 2 to 5 years (depending on the specialty) in advanced hospital training as residents, followed by 2 years or more of practice in the specialty.

Doctors of osteopathy diagnose, prescribe remedies for and treat diseases. They are particularly concerned with problems involving the muscles or bones.

One basic treatment or therapy used by osteopathic physicians includes manipulating these systems with the hands. D.O.'s also use surgery, drugs, and all other accepted methods of medical care. Training usually requires 4 years of college and 4 more year at an accredited school of osteopathy, followed by a oneyear rotating internship.

Personal Letter Disappearing, Says Postmaster

WASHINGTON (UPI) - The Postal Service worries that the personal letter the Dear Aunt Nellie type - is a fastdisappearing national treasure.

Postmaster General William Bolger estimates that the nation's mailmen and women delivered 100 billion letters last year, and a mere 3.5 billion of those were designed to cheer up a friend, say hello to a relative or pine in print for a lover.

With business mail clearly in command of America's typewriters and pens, Bolger decided to put in a plug for the old-fashioned friendly letter. He declared this coming week National Letter Writ-

People are writing fewer letters, and it's too bad," said Postal Service spokesvoman Jeanne O'Neill, is a very valuable tool.

'It's the most intimate form of correspondence we've got," she said. "Think of all the history that has been based on what people have found in letters. If we hadn't had letters, there never would have been a breakaway from the crown."

Bolger is such a strong advocate of letter-writing that the Postal Srvie has produced and distributed a 66-page booklet - All bout Letters - Outlining the

virtues of personal correspondence. The booklet, distributed to high schools and elementary schools across the country, has provoked bagfuls of letters in its own right - from grateful

Eglish teachers. The booklet notes that letters can help people get a job. file a complaint,

apply for college or obtain information. A letter, it adds, is "the best way to organize your thoughts ... provide a record of exactly what you said ... recall happily shared memories ... and (it) is one of the most economical ways to communicate.

The pamphlet quotes blind musician Stevie Wonder, who said reading a letter in Braille "puts me on a total one-to-one relationship with the person who the letter is from. Even though I am a telephone freak, I really enjoy letters

Abigail Van Buren, who responds to tens of thousands of letters from those seeking Dear Abby's advice, says in the booklet that once she married and left her Iowa home, she wrote a letter to her parents "every day of their lives as long

Mrs. O'Neill said the Postal Service turned over 36,000 complimentary copies of the booklet - to the National Council of Teachers of English in Urbana, Ill. Schools wanting copies can buy them from that organization.

Governors Consider Dump Sites Problem

WASHINGTON (AP) - The nation is in danger of being engulfed by problems from thousands of hazardous chemical dump sites, and the response by the federal government thus far has been inadequate, the country's governors were told

Colorado Gov. Richard D. Lamm told the opening meeting of the National Governors Association the control of toxic substances would be "the major environmental challenge facing this nation's leaders in the 1980s.

Lamm said that of the 700 million tous of toxic waste which had been produced in the United States since 1940. some 600 million tons are believed to have been disposed of in a manner that could threaten public health.

"A national program is urgently needed to address the problem of uncontrolled hazardous waste sites," Lamm said. "Hazardous wastes which were disposed of improperly in the past are today contaminating ground water and surface water, infiltrating neighborhoods, schools, homes and the very air we

The governors, opening a three-day winter meeting here, held a day-long session devoted not only to the disposal of chemical waste but also to the problems

A state planning council established by Carter earlier this month to work with the administration and Congress in developing a storage policy on nuclear

waste held its first meeting Sunday South Carolina Gov. Richard Riley, chairman of the council, said he did not expect his panel would make recommendations on which of 11 potential sites should be picked for the storage of highlevel waste

Instead, he said, the panel would merely advise on what procedures the government should follow in making the decision.

Carter created the 18-member commission, which includes eight governors, in hope it could defuse some of the political heat which will accompany picking a site to dispose of high-level nuclear

Riley, whose state already stores about 85 percent of the low-level waste generated annually, said the committee should not be expected to "do in a few months what the American nation has not been able to do in the last 25 years" as far as coming up with a comprehen-sive disposal plan for radioactive waste.

Lamm criticized the Environmental Protection Agency and said the federal government was "in danger of duplicating and obstructing state eforts to clean


Lamm said one estimate put the number of abandoned waste sites which the government will have to clean up at more than 600 with an accompanying cost to taxpayers of a minimum of \$1.5

Because of this cost, Lamm called on the governors to actively support some form of the "superfund" bill now being considered by Congress. President Carter has proposed a \$1.6 billion measure financed by fees levied on oil and chemical companies to pay for cleaning up the worst abandoned sites.

Lamm said that Love Canal in New York, where more than 200 families were forced to abandon their homes in 1978 because of leaking chamicals, was not an isolated incident.

Another speaker, Dr. Lawrence Fischbein of the National Center for Toxicological Research said, "we simply do not know how many potential Love Canal sitiations are in our midst."

But Charles Gosline, president of the Chemical Manufacturers Association, a trade group, cited a survey showing that 94 percent of the chemical dumps are on land owned by the chemical companies, meaning that "most of the worst problems are in the generator's back yard, where it can be controlled.

DONALD GRAFF: Ye Yeare Of Lepe

WASHINGTON-This is not to claim that you're hearing it here first, but just to remind that 1980 is a leap year.

And to recall that we have Julius Caesar to thank for it. It was 2,025 years ago, by best estimates, that he decided to straighten out the calendar much as he had the affairs of Rome.

Because the earth requires about six hours more than 365 days to complete an orbit of the sun, the year back then was not the precise measurement of one full circuit we know today.

There was a slippage of a quarter of a day per year which over the years amounted to quite a few days. Caesar brought the calendar into synch with earth and sun through the simple expedient of every fourth year dropping an extra day into the

shortest month. That, save for some fine tuning by Pope Gregory XIII in the 16th century, would be the end of the story had not the Scottish parliament had an impulse in the (leap) year of 1288, for the details of which we are in 1980 indebted to the National

Geographic Society. To wit, a decree declaring: "It is statut and ordaint that for ilk yeare known

as lepe yeare, ilk maiden ladie, of baith highe and lowe estait, shall hae libertie to bespeke ye man

BEFORE LONG, similar legislation was on the books in England, France, Italy and so on. And there you have it-one year in every four of reversed sexism in which woman has the liberty of pursuit of man, in case she prefers that to happi-

That is not, however, all there is to leap year. There is the matter of being born on that extra day, for example. Technically, such people have birthdays only once every four years. Which about half those affected may consider a greater boon than being authorized to pursue the other half.

As a matter of fact, this is the situation with any specific occasion falling on that extra day. All such are once-in-four-years affairs, which suggests that Caesar and the Scottish parliament didn't go near-

ly far enough. If they had really wanted to do us a favor, if not the Internal Revenue Service, they would have arranged to have April 15 fall on February 29.

To Defense Secretary Harold Brown and national security adviser Zbigniew Brzezinski, both cov-Mondale (plus the State and Commerce Departments) the transformation of Mondale is perceived as a miracle.

In the mid-'70s, Minnesota's Sen. Mondale defended the trading interests of a major Minnesota computer firm called Control Data.

Mondale blocked an overdue Senate amendment to give the Pentagon more discretion in barring exports of sophisticated U.S. technology to the Russians.

His sudden enthusiasm for cutting off sales by Hammer's Occidental Petroleum is matched by his Minnesota colleague, Agriculture Secretary Bob Bergland-for the same reason.

BOTH HAVE been singed by high-flying Republican presidential candidate George Bush, who publicly opposed the grain embargo.

To one farm audience recently, Bush ridiculed a policy that embargos feed grains "at the same time that we approve shipments of fertilizer, phosphates and super-phosphates to help the Soviet Union increase their grain production.

Farm belt political weight, reflected by Mondale and Bergland, when added to Brzezinski's new foreign policy clout is viewed by White House insiders as all but certain to carry the President

That is true despite the high cards held by the rich and mysterious Dr. Armand Hammer, at age 81 an insatiable promoter of U.S. Soviet trade.

His ties to the Kremlin extend from intimacy with Lenin 60 years ago to effusive praise for Brezhnev today.

HAMMER'S POLITICAL agility was shown by his jump from Richard Nixon (activities which led his guilty plea to a Watergate-connected misdemeanor) to Jimmy Carter. At the height of political attacks on Carter's

Panama Canal treaties, Hammer came to the President's rescue. Rising dramatically from his front-row seat at a

Nov. 2, 1977, briefing of a blue-ribbon committee backing the treaties, Hammer pledged \$50,000 "on behalf of myself and my company..." to finance a pro-ratification publicity campaign.

Hammer is described by insiders as too shrewd to try backdoor White House lobbying with Hamilton Jordan, Carter's chief of staff who became a Hammer enthusiast during their fight together for

Hammer's lobbying efforts to save his lucrative contract have been directed mainly at the Soviet Embassy in Washington.

HE HAS explained at length to Ambassador Anatoliy Dobrynin that if Moscow does not start pulling troops out of Afghanistan soon, U.S. Soviet trade may not recover in this century.

such a stunning Soviet reversal is completely ruled out in the foreseeable future, assuring a continuing U.S. trade clamipdown that unquestionably weakens the Soviet Union.

The irony is that when Dr. Hammer's phosphates are included in the clampdown, it will be not to show President Breshaev a grand strategy to deal with aggression. It will only show political expediency in the farm belt expediency in the farm belt.

FOR THOSE WHO think the Cold War will thaw any time in the near future, don't bet on it ...

Even if the American hostages are freed and the Soviets make a cosmetic withdrawal from Alghanistan, keeping enough troops on hand to keep things in hand, of course, there's still the matter of the U.S. boycott of the Summer Olympics.

If the U.S. Olympics Committee goes along, and it doesn't have much choice, and any number of other nations join in the Moscow shub, the Russians may get more upset than they have over the grain embargo and protests over the Asian inva-

After all, Pride-burgeois or Communist-still rates high in the national scheme of things. Moscow's minions, athletic or atomic, won't take the boycott lying down, or perhaps without retalia-

ACTUALLY, THE U.S. and that part of the Western World which also has pride, as well as the fortitude, to stand up against the Soviets, have no

Going to the Olympics in view of what has happened in Afghanistan would be like sitting at the table with some thug who has just mugged you. He could turn to the other guests and say, "Look, everything's okay. It must be or he wouldn't be

It is regretable that many hundreds of athletes, those who tried and didn't make it and those who finally did, now won't realize their long-held dream of shooting for the Olympic Gold.

But, then it is regretable that many thousands of young men, and older ones for that matter, many of them athletes, have fought and died on other fields of battle to assure that this nation still would have a choice of what it considers fair and

MUCH ADO has been made of the claim that Sports and Politics, especially world politics, should not be mixed.

Hogwash! Politics has been part and parcel of the Games almost from the moment they were started, lo, those many hundreds of years ago.

A quick look at history says something in that regard. Back in 392 A.D., there was a flap when the Romans, incensed by charges of professional wangling by the Greeks, took out their anger on the Olympic buildings and stadium.

A fellow by the name of Emperor Theodosius of Rome decided the controversial games were a nuisance and promptly abolished them. It was not until 1896 that the Olympic Games, as we know them, came back into being in Athens, Greece. It is interesting to note that although the U.S. did not have a team as such, a group of 10 Americans journeyed to the games, competed in 10 events

THE GAMES, with increasing splendor, increasing competitiveness, increasing political involvement and even violence—as witness the 1972 terrorist attack at Munich-have continued for the

past 84 years, with two exceptions.

That was in 1916 during World War I and 1944

during the height of World War II. Now, we are on the eve of another Summer Olympiad. Granted, there are few sports spectacles to compare with the pomp and pageantry, the joy and tears, the showmanship associated with the modern Games.

The NBC television network alone has millions of dollars invested in what happens or doesn't happen in Moscow. A worldwide audience was being prepared for "the biggest show of the year" as the Iron Curtain was raised for a few weeks. But, the curtain was to be opened only as wide as the Soviets wanted.

INSTEAD OF seeing Russia as it is, the world was to be given an Alice in Wonderland look...

Moscow has been gearing for four years or more. Not only has the capital been polished and primed but the dissidents and such have been long since shuttled out of the way. In brief, the Summer Olympics 1980 was to be

Soviet Russia's showcase, proof in living color that Communism and a Socialist order were legiti-But, with the U.S. boycotting the games, along

with perhaps West Germany, France, England, Japan among the biggies, there will be no way to hide the fact that Russia is being made to pay a price for what it does with its left hand while extending the right hand of "friendship."

And most telling of all, there will be no way for Moscow to keep the Russian people themselves from knowing what has happened and why.

AS FOR THE business of getting the games mixed up in politics, perish the thought. They have been that way all along ...

There are many who still argue, rightly, that the U.S. and the rest of the world should have boycotted the 1936 Berlin Olympics. And while those Olympics proved disastrous for Nazi Germany in the way of competition, and made a hero of America's Jesse Owens, they still gave legitimacy to Hitler's charade.

In more recent times, it will be recalled that terrorists killed 18 persons, including members of the Israeli team, at Munich in 1972. And in 1976 at Montreal, Taiwan was kept out of the games, as it was again at the Winter Contests in Lake Placid this year, all to placate the bloody regime of Red Also at the 1976 games, 31 nations, most of them

from black Africa, boycotted the event in protest against New Zealand, whose crime had been sending a rugby team on a tour of South Africa.

Not boycott the Summer Olympics? It would be a tragic travesty on all sports as well as all that freedom stands for to participate. History and honor demand that free men and free nations stand up and be counted. This is such a time.

·And it's a lousy barometer. "It's been very accurate," Tillotson said. "We've always been wrong."

The townsfolk did pick a winner - once. Richard Nixon took the majority of votes in 1972, but as Tillotson notes: "He didn't serve his term."

Tillotson thinks the hamlet is divided this year between Bush and Reagan. George Bush has been here twice. Howard Baker also paid a visit and complimented the hotel pianist for playing his favorite songs.

Tillotson thinks the GOP can capture the White House.

"The way this is shaping up," he said, with California Gov. Edmund Brown, Sen. Edward Kennedy and President Carter all in the running, "I just believe that the Democratic Party is going to be torn up to the point where if the Republicans can't win they are the stupidest people around."





Q. My husband is 74, receiving Social Security and working part time. I am 61, working full time and earning about \$15,-000 a year. Our home is paid for and we owe approximately \$8,000 on a summer place, which we are paying off at \$166 a month at 10.75 percent interest.

Roughly speaking, our other savings and investments total about \$81,000. Our biggest investment is in more than 2,500 shares of a closed-end investment company - now worth about \$17.50 a share. We initiated this investment in 1973, at a

higher price per share. I think we should sell these shares and put the money in a six-month savings certificate or a money market mutual fund - where the income would be higher and the price would not fluctuate.

My husband says the fluctuating price should not be considered. According to him, this investment is yielding 9.75 percent. I say it has been closer to 5 percent, if you average out the performance since 1973. Please give us your opinion, before we shatter 39 years of marriage.

A. Suppose we get the yield situation straightened out first.

That stock's "current yield" - annual dividends, divided by the current market price - is now 11 percent.

As I write this, you can get about 12 percent in six-month savings certificates and approximately 13 percent in some money market mutual funds. You are right about that - right now.

But, when interest rates in general come down, so will the yields on sixmonth certificates and money market mutual funds.

In most of the years you have owned it. that closed-end investment company stock has produced high yields. For a couple such as you, that should be the main consideration.

So, I have to go along with your husband's reasoning about not worrying about ups and downs in market price as long as you get a good yield. The market value of that stock has dropped, because that closed-end investment company invests in high-grade bonds. When interest rates go up, bond prices go down. The opposite will happen, when interest rates drop



By FLOYD NORRIS NEW YORK (AP) — No industry has been more alarmed by the rising price of silver than the photo industry. The alarm has stimulated new research into silverless-photography, but it will be a long time before your pocket camera can take advantage of the new techniques.

"Non-silver photgraphy is here to-day," proclaims Walter Fallon, the chairman of Eastman Kodak Co., citing two technologies offered by Kodak. But he goes on to virtually rule out their use in amateur and professional still photogra-

Silver is the major component of film It is prized because no substitute has been found that is as sensitive to light

and offers as clear an image as the silverhalide compounds used in film.

Unfortunately for the industry, silver also is a precious metal. In the last year speculators have descended on the metal with a fervor, driving the price from about \$6 an ounce at the beginning of 1979 to a peak of \$50 last month.

Recently, the price has settled down to below \$35 an ounce, but that is small comfort for the users of such products as X-ray film, where prices have risen 50 percent or more

The price increases have caused researchers to focus on a number of areas. including electronic applications and those using the same basic technique as

is used in office copiers.
"There is no ready-made overall technology to replace silver haloid," said Fred Nakamura, executive vice president of Fuji Photo Film U.S.A. "But alternate technologies are replacing it in some aspects of the business.

Xerox, the pioneer in the office-copier field, is now offering X-ray machines for limited uses that work on the same principal as the copier, which involves electric charges. The company says they provide adequate quality at lower prices.

Best of all they use no silver. Instead they use carbon black and some low-

quality plastics that are created as byproducts in petroleum refining.

Kodak uses similar technology in its new Extavolt non-silver film, which is being marketed for use in some industrial recording activities, such as seismic studies by oil companies.

But the disadvantage of those films is their low light sensitivity compared to silver-base films. About the best sensitivity achieved so far is only one-twentieth as great as that of fast color print film marketed by the major film makers. And fast color print film is 400 times as sensitive as Kodak's Extavolt.

That doesn't matter when the film is supposed to record light of very high intensity, such as a laser beam. But it rules out any use in normal photography.

Electronic images could be more useful. Rather than record an image at all. they record information about a light source, which can then be recreated. Video tape, using such technology, is widely used and costs less than movie film for home use, although the equipment is more expensive.

Fuji's Nakamura says electronics might play a role in the amateur photography market within five or ten years, although Kodak's Fallon disagrees.

No one has yet figured out how to get adequate quality for still prints, however. Stop-action video tape, such as is used in covering sporting events, produces a hazier image than viewers are willing to accept. Future developments in semicon ductor techonology could improve that.

One of the hardest-hit areas of photography has been graphics arts, where conventional films use relatively large amounts of silver. Kodak and Du Pont Co. are marketing what are called photopolymers, which substitute plastics for


The film is good only for limited uses. however. They are even less sensitive to light than the films based on copier technology. "They cannot be used to take original pictures," says C.H. Arringtonn Du Pont's director of photo research. But they can provide high quality.

Fortunately for most amateur photographers, the color films they need use less silver than black-and-white or x-ray films, because manufacturers have succeeded over the years in substituting dyes for some of the silver. As a result, prices of those films have risen at a slower rate.

The rising price of silver has renewed the search for a black dye that could reduce the amount of silver in black-andwhite films, but such a development is probably years away.

These kinds of ideas have been

looked at before," said Du Pont's Arrington. "Ten years ago they were too expensive. Now they're not. It's really changed the whole ball game when you're dealing with a \$40 or \$50 item instead of a \$2 or

Sunspot Activity May Cause Confusion, Alarms

Oceanic and Atmospheric Administra- tronics.

Sunspot activity has begun one of its 11-year peaks, with all the inconvenience that brings to the modern world of elec-

Government scientists report that over the coming months giant flares on These flares and peaks in sunspot activity occur about every 11 years and A solar flare is an eruption of hot gasses from the surface of the sun that sends high energy particles flying out into space at nearly the speed of light.

When these particles crash into the magnetic shield around Earth, they play havoc with electronic signals and equipment. In polar regions, where the the magnetic shield is weakest, the particles from the sun can even cause a radiation danger for passengers on high-flying air-

Many airlines fly over the North Pole because it is the shortest route between North America and Europe. In order to lessen the hazard, forecasts from the NOAA laboratory in Boulder, Colo., will be used by the airlines to warn pilots to avoid this area when radiation levels are

Indeed, the effects have already begun. according to Gary Heckman of the Boulder lab.

He said that in recent months there have been reports of airliners briefly losing high-frequency radio signals. Coast Guard ship-to-shore signals have gone out and there have been communication and control problems with satellites.

He explained that while flares occur nearly every year, they are more frequent and severe during the maximum. and this cycle is turning out to be among the most spectacular of the century.

While scientists won't be able to assess the severity of the cycle until it is completed, they report that it may be threatening records. The sunspot number for November, for example, was 164.8. That has been topped only once in this century, in 1958 with a sunspot number of 201.

And they point out that even if this weren't an unusually severe cycle its impact would still be unprecedented because the massive use of electronic equipment increases vulnerability to these disruptions.

There are a couple of benefits, however, the scientists add. Between flares. short-wave radio operators should have good reception because the flares strengthen the Earth's ionosphere. allowing better bouncing of such radio signals. And residents of the middle latitudes will have their best chance in years of viewing the aurora borealis.

Heckman says that no one knows why solar flares erupt from sunspots, but the most violent flares usually occur after the sunspot peak.

True to form, he said, following the heavy sunspot activity in November. December was relatively quiet. But he predicted that this lull would end soon, with flares erupting and affecting the Earth.

Exile Warns China Wants Domination

PARIS (AP) - Exiled Soviet writer Alexander Solzhenitsyn warns that by arming China, the West will defeat the Soviet Union, but then will be powerless "to contain Chinese communism and stop it on its way to world domination.

Writing in the Paris Russian-language weekly "Russian Thinking," Solzhenitsyn said the "free world" cannot resist communism "except by allying itself with the peoples under (communist) domination.

Solzhenitsyn accused liberals in the West of having backed Soviet communism in the 1920s



Fugitive Surrenders, Releases Hostages After 22-Hour Siege

BEREA, Ohio (AP) - A fugitive who ook six hostages at a suburban bank after being trapped during a robbery at-tempt surrendered peacefully Sunday after his girlfriend helped talk him into nding the 22-hour siege.

No shots were fired as Earl Ellery Vright, sought on a federal warrant harging him with a 1979 bank robbery, handed his gun through a drive-up tell-er's window and released his three renaining hostages, the FBI said. There

Wright, about 50 years old, embraced he woman identified as his girlfriend and, with head bowed, was taken into custody by a score of police and FBI

FBI agent John Dunn said Wright was charged with bank robbery and was eing held for an appearance Monday beore a U.S. magistrate in Cleveland.

The ordeal at a branch office of the BancOhio National Bank at a shopping enter in this Cleveland suburb began shortly after noon Saturday. The FBI said Wright was trapped after a silent alarm was tripped during a robbery and police raced to the bank.

Later, a woman teller was allowed to leave and fainted as she was being escorted away by police. Mayor Jack Kafer. who was at the scene, said the woman suffered some emotional trauma."

The bank manager, William Fletcher. vas released at 8 p.m. Saturday, and a third hostage, a woman, left the bank

None of the hostages were identified by the authorities.

However, it was learned that David Valentine and his wife, Bonnie, a bank employee, were among the captives. Contacted at their home Sunday, Valentine declined comment, saying, "We just want to forget the whole thing.

Throughout the siege, authorities negotiated with the gunman by telephone from a nearby beauty salon and later. with a bullhorn placed inside the drive-in

Marla Longworth of Louisville, Ky., identified as Wright's girlfriend, was brought to the bank Sunday morning to assist in the negotiations at the teller's

The FBI would not give details of the negotiations or Wright's demands, but it was reported that he demanded an escape car and two hostages to ride with

About 25 FBI agents and a score of policemen, including members of a special weapons unit from Cleveland's southwest suburbs, had kept vigil at the bank. Food was passed in through the teller's window.

Sharpshooters were posted atop stores lining the opposite side of the street, and a crowd of 300 gathered to watch. But by Sunday morning, police were hidden, and only a few spectators braved a chill wind to watch from a couple of hundred yards away.

Police and FBI agents watched the bank from across a parking area inside a McDonald's restaurant and set up a comused tractor-trailer rigs to block the

Wright, whose last known address was Parma, Ohio, also is charged with a Dec. 4, 1979 bank robbery in Kenosha, W.Va., and also has warrants out against him as a parole violator and for receiving stolen property, the FBI agent said.

Siamese Twins Separation Planned Soon

HOUSTON (UPI) - No new medical problems arose during the weekend for tiny Ivette and Ivonne Morales, making separation surgery for the critically ill Siamese twins more likely early this week, a hospital official said Sunday.

Surgery is becoming more of a possibility," said Texas Children's Hospital administrator Pat Kiley. "There's been nothing we've seen that has been a prob-

Kiley said the condition of the 21-dayold twins, who are joined at the chest. had not changed.

'They're still critical but stable," he

Doctors planned to confer early Monday to decide whether the twins had gained enough strength to withstand the rigors of the delicate separation surgery.

Physicians had ruled out surgery during the weekend in hopes that the twins. who weigh 7 pounds together, would build up enough strength to better cope with the operation. They have been monitored around the clock by pediatrics specialists in a new pediatrics intensive care unit at the hospital, Kiley said. Kiley said if doctors decide to attempt

surgery, the operation would be performed by a team of specialists composed primarily of cardiovascular experts. Abdominal specialists also would likely participate.

Hospital officials have refused to speculate on the twins' chances for survival, the complexity of the planned surgery or what organs the pair might share. An official statement said only that doctors had "determined that separation may be possible

Born by Caesarean section Feb 3. in San Juan, the twins soon began suffering lifethreatening heart and breathing difficulties. They were flown to Houston Thursday on an emergency jet flight arranged by Puerto Rico Gov. Carlos Rom-

Since their condition stabilized, the twins have spent most of the time in the hospital sleeping, which officials say is normal for infants that age.

Anonymous donors have been paying the twins' medical bills since their parents. Eladio. 38, and Evelyn, 21, are unemployed. Possible surgical costs alone have been reported as high as \$25,000.

Welsh Man Receives Heart Transplant

HILLINGDON, England (AP) - A 49-year-old Welsh man received a new heart in a transplant operation at Harefield Hospital in this west London suburb early Saturday, the hospital announced.

Derrick Morris, a Swansea docks foreman until he was disabled by heart disease, was given the heart of a 26-year-old woman in a four-hour operation performed by transplant specialist Dr. Mag-

di Yacoub. Morris was Britain's 11th transplant patient since the first such operation was performed in this country in 1968. It was the third transplant carried out at Hare-

"It's looking good," said a hospital spokesman. "Mr. Morris recovered consciousness soon after the operation and the new heart is beating well."

Hospital officials said the unidentified donor died in a British hospital late Friday "from head injuries" received in a road accident.

CAREERS By JOYCE LAIN KENNEDY

Dear Joyce; I'm very interested in being a travel agent. What's happening in -P.D. Calumet City, Ill.

Most days in the life of Denver agency owner Nancy Norris Hiner are nothing like the calm depictions on her posters of the South Pacific, an area in which she

specializes. With the acuity of an air traffic controller, Hiner juggles a barrage of tasks: talking on the phone; taking reservations; communing with computers; and arranging package rafting trips for European travelers, to name a few.

A 13-year veteran who is surviving the riptide of chaos and competion that travel work has become, Hiner mentions the changing requirements for agents her firm hires. No longer can she afford new agents who are merely smart, diligent, and eager to learn: they must have broad knowledge of the buinsess and - yes - a apport with electronic data banks.

Computerization and legislative changes have taken the industry by such storm that even seasoned agents are reeling. Larry Austin, longtime agency owner in Long Island, N.Y., predicts that 25 percent of existing travel agencies - the smalls - will close within three years. Among the recent waves battering the in-

The 1978 Federal Aviation Deregulatory Act and the soaring price of oil have resulted in air fares sliding and zooming so fast that not even computers can keep track of them.

These computers have become a travel agency essential. Smaller agencies that can't afford to automate or don't have the technical know-how risk going

The international airlines have

started basing their commission levels on volume of business, favoring the large travel firms. Open commissions - permission for agencies to freely negotiate commissions on domestic fares as well was approved by the Civil Aeronautics Board earlier this month.

What this trend toward larger, more technically able travel businesses means is there's little room in the field to 'sprout wings" on the job. To enter you must have directly related experience with the airlines, for example - or you need top-notch formal training, and the



DEAR HELOISE:

We are using a leftover piece of carpet as an area rug in the traffic lane in our living room

As a result, the four corners are curling up from feet tripping across them all

Do you have any suggestions as to how I might get the four corners of the rug to lie flat? - Mrs. Kathy Kern

Only one - and that's to simply bend down and reverse roll the edges everytime you see them curling. Crush the corners tightly in your hand

and hold them for a few seconds before releasing. In time, they will straighten back out and will lie flat for a few days.

You may have to repeat this process for some time but hopefully, eventually you will win

You see, as a result of the milling process and being rolled up, carpet has a built-in "memory." It simply wants to go back to a roll, whether feet trip over its edges or not. Hence, the edges or corners curl unless "nailed" down

Binding leftover carpet pieces won't help the curling either, even though binding may improve appearance. Here's

As the binding is stitched around the rug, it tends to be stretched, creating a certain amount of tension. In time, it shrinks back to its original shape and adds to the rug's natural tendency to

Even though it may be a little trouble to continually reverse roll the edges, please don't stop using them as walk-off mats in order to protect your carpet.

You may be spending a little more of

your time than you care to uncurling the edges, but you sure won't be spending as many of your dollars for a carpet replacement as you otherwise would. - Heloise

DEAR HELOISE:

I recently bought a sponge mop with a handle on it to squeeze out the water when mopping floors, but disliked it.

While defrosting our upright freezer, I discovered it was great for removing the water as it defrosted.

No cold hands! I just squeezed the water into a bucket. — Dorothy T.

DEAR HELOISE:

As everyone knows, it isn't pleasant to inhale the fumes when using hair spray. It may even be hazardous to your health.

Spray away, and then walk away from the immediate area where you were standing or sitting when you used the spray. Just hold your breath the few sec-

If more spray is needed, move to another area to apply it. Sure beats breathing in that stuff. - Anne Windmiller

A .- When you have a bid that shows both the strength and the shape of your hand exactly, use it. Jump to three no trump. That describes a hand of 16-18 points in high cards and, specifically, a 4-3-3-3 pattern.

Q.2 - Neither vulnerable, as South you hold: +6 ♥AJ752 ♦109 +AKQJ7 The bidding has proceeded:

South West North East Pass 1 + Pass Pass 3 0 Pass

What do you bid now? A .- Don't be fooled into making the "cheap" heart rebid "to see what partner will do." You must complete the description of your hand. Bid four clubs. By inference, that promises at least a fivecard heart suit-with five clubs and only four hearts. you would have opened one club, not one heart.

Q.3 - Both vulnerable, as South you hold: ◆J76 ♥Q962 ♦Q8 ◆KJ93 The bidding has proceeded: West North East South Dble. Pass

2 Pass Pass What action do you take? A-With a better than ex pected hand opposite a partner who has made a vulnerable takeout double in the immediate seat, you should not permit the opponents to buy the hand at the two-level. Bid three clubs, and allow partner to take the preference to one of your suits.

Q.4-As South, vulnerable, you hold:

♦8752 ♥63 OAKJ6 ♦AK10 The bidding has proceeded: West North East South 1 4 2 7 Pass

What do you bid now? A .- Partner cannot have much outside the heart suit, so he must have, at least, six good hearts to overcall vulnerable at the two-level. Since partner has promised six tricks with hearts as

SIDE STITCH

Side stitch is thought to be caused by the downward tug that running puts on internal organs. Pain, which usually occurs under the rib cage on the right side, may be due to the liver, which weighs about four pounds and holds one-quarter of the body's total blood supply. EXEC-UTIVE FITNESS NEWSLETTER, suggests these three ways to prevent it from handening to you. A.-Certainly you intend to play this hand in either a small or grand slam, and you should advise partner of the prospects immediately. Make a jump shift to three diamonds. Take a large demerit if you jumped to three spades - the hand is far too strong for that action. And a response of only two diamonds will result in your torturing partner for the rest of the auction.

Q.6 - Both vulnerable, as South you hold: ♦KJ98 ♥Q9 ♦732 ♣Q743 The bidding has proceeded: North East South West Pass 1 + Pass Pass What action do you take?

A .- This is close; you have a reasonable responding hand, with good cards in p suits, but we don't think you should raise to three clubs and look for an eleven-trick contract. Our choice would be to take a talse preference to two hearts. On this auction, partner almost surely has five hearts, so if he can't bid again, this should be a playable contract.








Use of the substance was stopped in 1971 - after some 11 million gallons had been sprayed over between 8.6 and 10 percent of the land mass of Vietnam when government scientists linked 2,4,5-T with stillbirths and birth deformities.

In recent years, some veterans have complained of symptoms that they blame on exposure to Agent Orange. The symptoms include nerve disorders, various cancers, numbness and tingling of the extremities, skin rashes, liver dysfunction, mood changes, a loss of sex drive, headaches and birth defects in their offspring.

Maj. Gen. William S. Augerson, deputy secretary of defense for health resources and programs, told the Senate Veterans Affairs Committee that the study proposed by GAO would not be worth the cost and effort and might not prove anything.

This differed from the account given by Tass, the official Soviet news agency, which said in a dispatch from Kabul that "stores and shops are opening" and that "many principal ministries and departments have returned to their normal functions."

The Soviet Communist Party newspaper Pravda said the Afghan Army dealt the leaders of the uprising a "crushing blow." But the account did not report the anti-Soviet nature of the disturbances or the involvement of Russian troops in quelling them.

Cause Of Collision Not Yet Determined

TAMPA, Fla. (AP) - The captain of the Coast Guard cutter Blackthorn swears he was safely within the outbound shipping lane as his vessel plied the narrow channel.

The pilot of the S.S. Capricorn swears he, too, was in his proper lane as the

loaded oil tanker churned into Tampa Bay. Yet somehow the ships collided Jan. 28 on a clear, moonlit night, killing 23 Coast Guardsmen in the worst peacetime accident in Coast Guard history.

The Blackthorn-Capricorn collision was about a quarter mile west of the Sunshine Skyway bridge, which soars across the mouth of Tampa Bay between

A Marine Board of Inquiry has been investigating the accident for three weeks, but a firm explanation of exactly what happened is not expected soon.

"It's going to take a matter of a few months," said Rear Adm. Norman

Venzke, president of the board.

He predicted another two or three weeks of testimony before the panel adourns to mull over what it has learned. Among key witnesses still to testify are experts now studying what could become a choice piece of evidence: an electronic readout of the Capricorn's course as recorded aboard the tanker as she sailed toward Tampa port.

What has surfaced since the probe began Jan. 31 has been conflicting, even contradictory testimony about the exact location of each ship.





Experts Paint Grim Financial Picture

Associated Press Writer

American families are losing the battle of the budget, according to representatives of the nation's more than 22,000 credit unions who say the problems cut across age and income lines.

"I think they're in over their heads," said Jim R. Williams, president of the Credit Union National Association. discussing the finances of the nearly 40 million people who are members of credit unions.

"The trends of delinquencies are upward," said Williams at a recent news conference in New York City. "The repayment ratios on loans are dropping.

Williams painted a gloomy picture, even though he was speaking before the announcement on Friday that the Consumer Price Index in January rose 1.4 percent, the biggest boost in more than 61/2 years.

He said he expected delinquency rates on loans would "at least double" in the next six months. He also said that the charge-off rate for credit unions on loans that are uncollectable traditionally ran at about one-fourth of 1 percent of all outstanding loans. Today, he said, the rate is a little over one-third of 1 percent. By the end of the year, it could hit three-fourths of a percent, he said.

Williams said the problems are striking young and old,

tion," he said.
Williams also said that "a lot" of credit unions have stopped making loans because they do not have the funds available. Others, he said, have put a ceiling on the amount they will lend any individual member or have imposed stricter credit limits. He said, however, he did not know the exact number of credit unions that had been forced to take

J. Alvin George of San Diego, chairman of the Credit Un-ion National Association, said his local credit union had put a \$3,000 limit on loans, down from \$10,000. He said the limit was forcing some credit union members to borrow from finance companies, particularly for automobile purchases, at interest rates that are higher than they can afford.

Credit unions — non-profit organizations whose mem-bers have a common bond like employment — traditionally have been allowed to pay higher interest rates on savings than commercial banks or other financial institutions and usually charge less interest on loans. Because they rely

largely on volunteers, their operating costs are lower.

Today, however, the availability of high-interest alternatives to the traditional savings account, including things like certificates of deposit, has caused many credit union members to put money elsewhere. That means the credit unions have less money to lend.

According to figures from the Federal Reserve Board, credit unions held almost 17 percent of all outstanding installment debt in December 1978. A year later, they held only 15.5 percent.

Williams expressed confidence that legislation would be approved by Congress to allow credit unions to charge higher interest rates - at least temporarily. Federally chartered credit unions — about half the total — currently are limited to a 12 percent annual charge. Williams said he expected a plan to be worked out whereby credit unions could charge 15 percent annual interest in certain circumstances. Raising the interest rate on loans would let credit unions increase the interest on savings to attract customers, credit union of-

In an effort to help people manage their money, the Credit Union National Association is launching a "Financial Fitness" program, designed to provide information libraries, workshops and counseling for members.

Jerry Lawrence, a spokesman for the association, said a preliminary evaluation of a soon-to-be-released study conducted by the Gallup organization for the credit unions indicated that people today do not think of financial fitness in terms of savings or investment. Instead, he said, they consider themselves in good shape financially if they can simply manage to pay the bills and not have to worry about day-today expenses.



Recovery Of Oil Shale May Soon Be Possible

being "just around the corner," the time may be coming for oil shale - the nonshale that does not yield oil but will probably be the first synthetic fuel produced in commercial quantities in this country.

Oil shale is, in fact, marlstone, a limestone-like rock, and when heated to about 900 degrees it releases kerogen or shale oil, an organic substance containing hydrocarbons that can be converted into an excellent refinery feedstock.

The technology for these processes is more advanced than the technologies for producing other synthetic fuels. But problems remain, some of them technical and some of them financial. In fact, nobody in the last century has produced shale oil in the United States in other than test quantities.

But several major energy companies have spent hundreds of millions of dollars over the past two decades, waiting for the time to be right, and they are predicting that by 1985 or 1986 they will be producing at least some of the 400,000 barrels a day that President Carter has set as the goal for shale-oil production by

expect that 400,000-barrel-a-day target to be reached - slightly less than 200,000 barrels seems more likely. And not much of anything is likely to happen without financial incentives from the federal government - a \$3-a-barrel tax credit and federal loan guarantees for building the \$1-billion-plus plants that would be needed for commercial production.

Those incentives - "government risk sharing" is the phrase used by energy company executives when the subject comes up - are now pending in Con-

And each day, while that debate goes on, buses and pickup trucks carry hundreds of men up dirts roads to the top of an 8,200-foot-high plateau in northwestern Colorado where names like Exxon, Standard, Shell, Union, Arco, Conoco. Chevron, Getty, Texaco and Sohio are written on fence-post signs over the richest oil-shale deposit in the world.

Oil shale is found in at least 30 states from Kentucky and Tennessee to the West Coast. Estimates of the amount of oil locked in those formations run into the trillions of barrels. A barrel contains

Most of that resource, however, is locked in formations that would yield less than 15 gallons a ton, and 25 gallons to ton is considered the minimum for economic recovery.


There is only one place in the nation where large deposits of high-grade oil shale have been confirmed - the 16,500square-mile Green River formation underlying the high plains in the corner where Colorado, Wyoming and Utah

The U.S. Geological Survey has estimated there are 600 billion barrels of recoverable shale oil in that area, a staggering quantity only slightly less than the total proved oil reserves of the entire However, how much of that is re-

coverable with current technology and at current prices is debatable. The figure most frequently used by people in the oilshale industry is 200 billion to 300 billion barrels, a not inconsequential quantity of oil for a country that has 35 billion barrels of proved reserves and uses 8 billion barrels of that a year.

Even within the Green River formation, the oil content of the shale varies. When the government sought bids for the development of test tracts in Wyoming, there were no takers.

There were bidders on tracts in Utah and Colorado, but the Utah leases became the subject of a legal battle between the state and the federal government and no work is being done on them. If oil shale is going to be exploited, it is going to happen in a small quadrant of

northwestern Colorado called the Piceance Basin.

Forty million years ago, at the bottom of a huge freshwater lake, layers of decaying vegetation accumulated there. The area was never subjected to the heat and pressure necessary to produce a pool of liquid oil. Instead, the Piceance (pronounced pea-ants) Basin contains layers of mahogany-colored shale the Indians called "the rock that burns.

There are two basic techniques for producing oil from shale - surface retorting and underground, or "modified in situ," retorting.

In surface retorting, the rock is mined, brought to the surface and crushed. The shale is heated in metal kettles called retorts, and the oil drawn off.

In the underground retorting, a small portion of rock is removed and the rest rubblized" by explosives and then burned in place. The oil is collected at the bottom of the natural retort and pumped to the surface.

The shale oil produced from either process contains too much nitrogen for refinery use, but that nitrogen can be removed at the mining site before ship-Major energy companies say they are

Again, there is the task of scaling operations up to commercial production. It will take 40 underground retorts, with-a new one being ignited each week, to produce the 50,000 barrels a day Occidental says it can be turning out by 1987.

There are almost a score of other en ergy companies with holdings in the Piceance Basin, some ready to proceed and some waiting to see the results of the Union, Colony and Occidental up-scaling.

The estimates now most commonly used for the cost of oil from shale range from \$25 to \$40 a barrel. At least at the low end of that range, shale oil would be economically competitive with crude oil especially with a \$3-a-barrel tax credit. Aside from simply making a new

tions to be answered about oil shale pro-The surface retorts of a commercial plant would produce 20 million tons 4 year of spent shale. On a small scale, Col ony has demonstrated that spent shale can be revegetated, but the long-term effects of leaching from spent shale are unknown. The same question arises concerning the movement of ground water

through underground retorts. Water itself could be a problem - it is precious and scarce in northwestern Colorado, a semi-arid region that gets less than 20 inches of rain a year. At the very least, it will take a barrel of water to produce a barrel of oil, and ranchers and farmers in the area look upon the energy

boom with considerable distrust. Air quality and other questions remain to be answered, too, but the prevailing attitude of federal and state regulators seems to be that at least some commercial development can be accomodated within existing standards and restraints.

He hit the road in 1971 when his knees gave out and he could no longer work in the cement-finishing business. In the winter, Graham, 62, lives on the south side of town with his wife Wanda, a physical therapy technician.

BATON ROUGE, La. (AP) - The Incredible Hulk. Superman. Wonder Woman. And now Crawfish-Man.

He's Mr. Bonin, the mild-mannered fisherman from the Atchafalaya Swamp, until one of his Cajun friends gets into trouble. Then he grabs some Spanish moss, mumbles an incantation and - boom! - Crawfish-Man, half-human halfcrustacean, super heraux (hero).

Get Political, Mayor Says

CAMBRIDGE, Mass. (AP) - Miami Mayor Maurice Ferre says it's time for Hispanics in the United States to become active in politics.

"We will make no progress until we start to do things ourselves," said Ferre, a native of Puerto Rico. "Things don't just happen because they're right or wrong.

"Rather than concentrating on Puerto Rican independence, we should get more involved in the politics of this

country," Ferre said Saturday. He spoke at a conference on "Hispanics and the Political Issues of the '80s," sponsored by the student advisory committee of the Institute of Politics at Harvard's Kennedy School of Government.

Governments Refusing To End Smallpox Vaccine Requirement

month old boy is vaccinated against smallpox in Kuwait. A month later he is admitted to a hospital and soon develops large, ugly ulcers. His condition deteriorates and by summer he is dead.

In Australia, a woman - eight weeks pregnant - receives a smallpox vaccination. Her baby, born almost three months prematurely, lives only an hour.

These are illustrations of the fatal side-effects that can result from the smallpox vaccination, according to the World Health Organization here. In both cases, it maintains, death could have been avoided.

Four months after the organization. a United Nations agency, declared the deadly smallpox virus eradicated from the face of the earth, scores of governments continue to vaccinate their citizens before they travel abroad.

"It's a two-sided problem." said James Magee, smallpox information spokesman for the World Health Organization, commonly known as WHO.

"On the one hand, you have those governments which refuse to change their own national laws concerning vaccination. Then you have the states which still require presentation of a vaccination certificate at their borders, whether or not the traveller has come from a country that has abolished the requirement. It's a viciuos circle."

As of the beginning of this month, only 53 of the WHO's 152 member states had changed national laws, no longer making smallpox vaccinations obligatory for their own travellers.

On the other side of the problem, 22 countries still required vaccination certificates from incoming foreigners.

The United States discarded the requirements long ago, but routine vaccination of active and reserve U.S. military personnel is continuing, according to

Magee says most states that have maintained the legal requirement are waiting for the declaration of eradication to be formally approved by WHO's General Assembly in May. Governments may

But why the long delay by the majority of countries to apply the organization's recommendation for abolishing compulsory vaccinations? You have to remember that for the

first time in history a fearsome killer disease has been cleared up." Magee replied. "Up until recently, public health officials had been brainwashed about the necessity of vaccinating."

Magee said WHO was particularly concerned about certain "discrepancies" that have apparently arisen in communications between indvidual states and their representatives abroad.

"Frequently a government will claim that under national law, travellers to that country no longer need to be vaccinated. But in practice, what happens is often very different: officials in that country's embassies abroad insist on exactly the opposite and refuse to issue visas until the applicant is vaccinated."

To illustrate this point, Magee referred to a WHO report of a recent case in Britain where the parents of a 4-year-

old boy were informed by the embassy of "a North African country" that vaccina-tion was necessary before travelling there, even though it did not appear on the WHO list of countries which still re-

quired vaccination. A few days after receiving the vaccination, the boy developed a blood infection. Fortunately, in this case, the boy

Magee said WHO, concerned about situations such as the two fatal cases it has citedn is stepping up its contacts with government health services.

"There is now absolutely no reason why any country should require its citizens to be vaccinated, or why it should demand a certificate of vaccination," he

The actual incidence of accidents resulting from smallpox vaccinations is difficult to estimate, said Magee. Some reports, however, say that the number of serious complications is as high as 75 per million cases.

Brain damage and fetal infection are two of the most dangerous side-effects. while skin rashes and weight problems can also develop.

Finland, with the defeat, lost any chance of a medal.

Trailing 2-1 entering its final period together as a team, the Americans responded to the beseeching sellout crowd that included Vice President Walter

They pulled even on Verchota's 15foot goal at 2:25 of the period and went ahead for good on McClanahan's fivefoot shot from the left of Finnish goalie Jorma Valtonen at 6:05.

The outburst lent a dramatic finish to this astonishing performance by a club that includes 10 players with college eligibility remaining.

Johnson, whose father, Bob, coached the 1976 American Olympic entry, added insurance with 3:25 remaining, scoring a shorthanded goal while the United States was killing a penalty to Verchota.

The boisterous crowd, sensing the

triumph finally had been taken, bellowed "We're No. 1."

U.S. Hockey Team Claims Gold

And goalie Jim Craig, a standout throughout this dream tournament, raised his gloved hands over his head to assure them they were right.

'We're going to wear that gold," said Craig. "The price of gold keeps going up. Just remember that.

When the final buzzer sounded, after hugging his teammates and a number of flag-waving well-wishers who rushed onto the ice, Craig skated to the sideboards and searched the stands - apparently to share the joy of a moment with his family, which included 19 nieces and nephews

The Americans came back from three one-goal deficits to upset the Soviets winners of the last four Olympic hockey golds - and send goalie Vladislav Tretiak to the bench in disgrace Friday

They beat a Czechoslovakia team 7-3 in the second game of the tournament ... and nobody had expected them to do

But now, there is nothing left for the team to achieve except fame in the National Hockey League. for 15 of the 20 players have been drafted by NHL clubs and many are expected to sign professional contracts soon. The same is true for Brooks, who molded this squad into a world power in the sixth months since first they gathered for training last Au-

Following the game Sunday, team captains Mike Eruzione and McClanahan took an American flag and displayed it proudly before the ceremonial handshake with the Finnish team.

After that, the Americans lined up across the ice punching the air with their fists and waving to the fans whose rallying cry of "USA, USA" had characterized their support from the start of this histor-

The Americans had pulled even at 1-1 at 4:39 of that middle period when Neal Broten forced a giveaway by a Finnish defenseman and Steve Christoff captured

The Americans, appearing tense for the first time this tournament, also continued their pattern of missing excellent scoring opportunities. Though their pace was inconsistent in that opening session. the times the Americans put on the pressure, Valtonen was equal to the task.

THAT'S THE NEGATIVE WAY to look at it. But if you believe in the good things of life, and you believe there's a special place up there for Raiders of the

Red persuasion - you can look at it another way. And ever since the Raiders scooped up that bounce-pass in the end zone last fall to give Tech a 21-20 victory over the Texas A&M Aggies, I've felt like somebody's

So look at Arkansas' 84-60 win - televised in Texas, Oklahoma, Arkansas, New Mexico and parts of Jamaica - over Tech like this:

LOS ANGELES (AP) - Tom Watson won the \$250,000 Los Angeles Open Sunday in an ending that even surprised him. "I felt I'd be playing in a playoff and never thought that both Don January and

Bob Gilder would bogey the last hole." said Watson. The three were tied after 17 holes, with Watson in the next-to-last group in

front of January and Gilder. Watson parred the 18th. Gilder, threeputting, missed an 8-foot putt and January hit a tree with his second shot, putting both one-over-par on the final hole.

Watson shot only an even-par 71 Sun-day after being one stroke behind Gilder at the end of the third round and finished with an 8-under-par 276 for the tournament. Both the 50-year-old January and Gilder were at 277, the former with a 71 and the latter at 73.

"I wasn't swinging too well and I had no confidence in my irons," said Watson who became the only double winner on the PGA winter circuit this year.

But I was playing at the pins and not conservatively. I felt the pressure all day. "If I had a four or five stroke lead, I might have played conservatively."

Watson dedicated the tournament to a friend's wife who was gravely ill. He did not identify the woman and said he wanted to talk no more about it.

But most of the time, the University Park police chief dresses up and acts like a cop.

Of course, it may be hard to tell when he's on duty and when he's on camera, since many of the amateur actor's roles put him back in uniform.

In what he laughingly calls his "spare time," Beidelman makes commercials, magazine ads and, occasionally, slips ecross our television screens in a series or movie.

"I do it more for the fun of getting away to a different atmosphere," said the angular-jawed police chief. The pay, he says, is "not bad. It helps. But I don't really rely on it as much as I did as a patrolman.

He does commercials for Six Flags Over Texas, Western Auto, Rodeway Inn, E Systems and Dallas realtor, Ebby Halliday. He now has an agent, and says he hasn't undergone any kind of physical metamorphisis, although "My one problem is that I

His bosses in this wealthy island city say they don't mind Beidelman's extra work, as long as he doesn't do anything that

would reflect poorly on the department. 'Like a beer commercial," he says.

Sometimes, Beidelman gets involved in more than just onthe-screen film efforts. During his stint in Dallas, he coordinated security for the network crews filming a made-for-television movie called "The Trial of Lee Harvey Oswald."

The crew wanted to recreate the Kennedy assassination downtown Dallas, so Beidelman finagled around and arranged

The most fun I've ever had was coordinating security. The thing I enjoyed most of all was blocking off half of downtown and shifting the crowds around." The producer then offered Beidelman a part in the fictional movie, which was based on the premise that Oswald was not killed and went on trial for the murder of President Kennedy.

"I was an FBI agent. That was when I wore glasses.

But I guess bank spots are my favorites. I always wear a suit anyway and I like that feeling...that certain sense of having accomplished something. That successful feeling," he said, perhaps unconsciously adjusting his suit lapels.

"Maybe that is one reason I like it out here...the thing that made me choose this city over any other department.

A hefty increase in salary didn't hurt much, either, he said. And that is one reason he has cut the number of on-camera appearances in the last nine months or so. A smooth, snappy dresser, Beidelman is perfectly at home in this ultra-rich island where home burglaries are a major problem and a murder is a

But he's done a lot of "house cleaning," he said, changing the focus of the department from almost a security patrol agency to a serious criminal investigative unit.

And he's got a couple of irons in other fires. Beidelman and a retired Dallas officer run a company that leases mobile dressing rooms to film crews shooting on loca-




