sewer division, street and sanitation crews, traffic engineering and parks personnel for field operations, Baker said.

Street sweepers are maintained and stored here, as is parks department equipment, he added.

No additions have been made to the metal frame building since it was built in the 1950s, he said.

With the landfill settling, the building's floors have two-inch cracks and have dropped more than a foot

in some places, according to the public works director.

He said concrete block walls inside the structure have three and four inch cracks, and at least one of the walls has fallen over.

And another danger exists at the present location.

"It is possible that methane gas could escape from the landfill into the building. This could be ignited by the gas heaters used in the winter and just blow that building away," Baker said.

The proposal calls for a new foundation to be constructed on solid land nearby with the metal frame to be moved on to the foundation. The walls and offices would be rebuilt.

"If relocated, this building should provide service for another 20 to 30 years," Baker said. "If it stays in the present location, it probably would become unusable in a few years and then we would have to build a new one."

The \$300,000 proposal is listed as Proposition No. 9 on the ballot.

## 284 absentee ballots cast in bond election

At the close of absentee voting Friday, 284 Midlanders had cast early ballots for the \$16.83 million city bond election.

City Secretary James McCullough termed the absentee turnout "light," but noted that might have little bearing on the number of voters who show up to cast ballots Tuesday.

Polls will be open from 7 a. m. to 7 p. m. Tuesday for Midlanders to vote on the nine proposals included in the election.

## \$26 billion in tax revenues lost annually, IRS study determines

WASHINGTON (AP) — The government may be losing \$26 billion or more each year in tax revenues because people fail to file returns or don't report the full amount of their income, according to a new study released Friday by the Internal Revenue Service.

The finding, said a high-ranking IRS official, represents the federal government's "first attempt to estimate the amount of unreported income comprehensively."

And it is coupled with a series of proposals to step up IRS vigilance over collections.

The 166-page report is the product of 18 months of research into tax reporting in 1976, the most recent year for which complete data was available, said the IRS official, who spoke under ground rules that prohibited his identification.

## Jimmy Carter claims he didn't beat, wasn't attacked by 'banzai bunny'

PLAINS, Ga. (AP) — President Carter says he did not beat the "banzai bunny." Nor was he attacked by the rabbit.

The president tried to clear the air Friday of reports and rumors about the rabbit, which he encountered while fishing on a small pond in nearby Webster County last April.

"It was a fairly robust-looking rabbit who was swimming, apparently with no difficulty," the president told reporters while walking through his hometown.

He chased it away from his boat with a paddle after he realized the rabbit was going to attempt to climb in.

On Thursday evening, he told Florida newspaper editors interviewing him in Tampa that he guessed the rabbit had been startled by some dogs or other animals "and had jumped in the pond and was just looking for a dry place to crawl."

In a transcript of his comments made available Friday, the president said, "I took the

boat paddle and hit water at the rabbit and he eventually and reluctantly turned away and went to the shore."



Foul-up admitted in Vlasova case

By RONALD J. OSTROW The Los Angeles Times. WASHINGTON — Leonel J. Castillo, commissioner of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, acknowledged Thursday that a foul-up involving federal agents and Pan American World Airways allowed the Soviets to slip ballerina Ludmila Vlasova aboard an Aeroflot jet last Friday, touching off an international incident. The immigration commissioner said airlines were notified 24 hours in advance that U.S. officials wanted to question Miss Vlasova before she boarded the plane. But a spokesman for Pan American, which serves as the "handling agent" for Aeroflot at JFK International Airport, said the airline lacked legal authority to stop anyone from boarding such a flight. AN AIRLINE source said an immigration official, J.C. Weber, and an FBI agent accompanied Miss Vlasova and 12 Soviet security agents as they climbed aboard the Aeroflot plane last Friday. Weber would not comment on the source's al-

legation, and Terrence B. Adamson, the Department of Justice's public information director, would neither confirm nor deny that an FBI agent went along with the party. There was no explanation of why Weber and the FBI agent would have failed to detain the dancer. U.S. OFFICIALS wanted to question Miss Vlasova about whether she was returning to the Soviet Union voluntarily. Her husband, ballet dancer Alexander Godunov, had defected earlier in the week. A week-end of tense negotiations occurred before the Soviets permitted the interview and U.S. officials, deciding she was willing to leave, allowed the plane to depart Monday. In disclosing the 24-hour notice to the airlines, Castillo told a National Press Club audience, "There was a slip," but he never mentioned Weber's presence at the airport. Castillo said the incident raised the question of whether his agency should have stationed its own agents at various airline ticket counters to try to prevent Miss Vlasova's departure. "I'm not ready to say we erred," he added, noting that the immigration service lacks the manpower to assign agents to all the airlines that the ballerina conceivably could have used. "But the important fact," he said, "is that everybody was acting with the assumption that the Soviet Union would undertake normal procedures of negotiation. Maybe Americans are too naive." Shenefield said a member of his staff was sent to New York Thursday to conduct a post mortem on the Department of Justice's handling of the Vlasova affair. "UNLIKE the Department of Justice, there was no move to shoulder any blame at the State Department, where officials professed to be pleased with the handling of Miss Vlasova." The State Department, however, was conducting a post mortem at White House request. This four-by-hour account is expected to include an analysis of why the Russians behaved as they did during the incident.

Modern theater to replace quaint 54-year-old playhouse in Tokyo

TOKYO (AP) — The Shimbashi Embujo, a major Tokyo playhouse where some of the prettiest geishas staged their annual "azuma odori" dances for almost a half century, is being torn down. But a new structure will replace the 54-year-old Embujo, which also featured theatrical troupes from the time-honored Kabuki to the turn-of-the-century Shimpa romantic tragedies and the modern comedies of Western Japan. The stately, three-story brick building, off Tokyo's Ginza, the Fifth Avenue of Japan, is being torn down because its pre-World War II facilities do not meet present-day standards, primarily fire and safety, and lack modern accommodations. The Embujo stood near the old Kabuki-za, the established house of traditional arts and cul-

White shoots down four Clements budget vetoes

AUSTIN, Texas (AP) — Attorney General Mark White shot down four of Gov. Bill Clements' state spending vetoes Friday...

White's opinion was issued one day before the start of the fiscal biennium for which the Legislature appropriated the money.

THE GOVERNOR'S lawyer, David Dean, said Clements' options include filing a suit to challenge the attorney general's opinion.

"We wouldn't preclude the possibility of going to court. All our options are open," said Dean.

White said Clements exceeded his authority in vetoing riders in the 1980-81 general appropriation bill that:

— Authorize construction with about \$40 million in federal funds of a new building to house the Texas Department of Human Resources and the Texas Youth Council.

Appropriate proceeds of the 10 cents per \$100 valuation state property tax for construction at 17 colleges and universities outside the University of Texas and Texas A&M systems. The amount is estimated at \$50 million.

Require the State Board of Control to raise state employee parking fees to between \$6 and \$16 instead of the present \$3 per month.

Permit the University of Texas system to spend earnings from its dedicated oil lands to improve the Sun Bowl on the campus of UT-El Paso.

subject to veto," White said.

In the case of the other three nullified vetoes, White said the Texas Supreme Court has held that our resources be devoted to effective service rather than bricks and mortar.

Jon Ford, Clements' press secretary, said White's opinion left intact other vetoes totaling \$162 million — "still by far the largest amount ever vetoed from a two-year budget."

THE PREVIOUS record, he said, was \$27 million cut from the fiscal 1976-77 budget by former Gov. Dolph Briscoe in 1975.

Dean said that before taking any action, such as filing a court case, the governor and his staff would "look at and examine" White's opinion.

"Obviously, we persist in our belief the governor's actions were proper and appropriate," he said.

Besides a court-test, Dean said Clements' options include requesting a new opinion from White and "visit with board members" of the Department of Human Resources and the colleges in an effort to persuade them not to spend the money he tried to veto.

CLEMENTS ISSUED a statement echoing Dean's remark that all options remain open, including a legal challenge to the opinion.

He referred to the proposed building for the Department of Human Resources and the Texas Youth Council as a "\$40 million Taj Mahal to house the welfare bureaucracy."

He said he hoped the three-member citizen board that sets policy for the human resources

Nugents granted no-fault divorce

AUSTIN, Texas (AP) — Luci Nugent, daughter of the late President Lyndon Johnson, was granted a divorce Friday from Patrick Nugent, ending a marriage that began 13 years ago.

State District Court Judge Hume Cofers signed the divorce decree after attorneys agreed on a property settlement, which was not disclosed.

The couple has four children. Patrick Lyndon, 12; Nicole, 9; Rebecca, 5; and Claudia Taylor, 3.

Mrs. Nugent, 32, issued a brief statement after the decree was signed. "After over a year and a half of separation, an amicable resolution was reached and divorce was granted for Luci and Pat Nugent. Those involved would like to express to friends within and without the media their appreciation for their consideration toward us during this time of personal pain," she said.

Mrs. Nugent filed for the divorce in January under Texas' no-fault divorce law that cites no grounds other than that the marriage had become "insupportable" because of discord.

Nugent, 36, and the younger of Johnson's two daughters were married Aug. 6, 1966, in a wedding attended by thousands of prominent persons in the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D.C., followed by a White House reception.

It was the first wedding in Washington of a president's daughter since Alice Longworth Roosevelt was married while her father, Theodore Roosevelt, was the

nation's chief executive. Anna Roosevelt, Franklin D. Roosevelt's daughter, was married inconspicuously on Jan. 18, 1935, while her father was president. That wedding, her second of three,

was held in New York.

The Nugents moved to Austin, bought a home, and he went to work for the Johnson family's radio and television interests.

# Homes less expensive in South Texas

WASHINGTON (AP) — South Texas home buyers apparently are paying less than their counterparts elsewhere in the state, new figures from the Department of Housing and Urban Development indicate.

The lower prices, however, may be offset by the smaller square footage the department found in the typical homes in that part of the state.

Prices in West Texas generally were next to the lowest.

**THE PROTOTYPE** housing cost figures researched by each HUD field office are being published for the first time this year as a congressional requirement.

HUD spokesman Andy Gasparich said the figures are intended to help consumers learn what kind of deal they are making.

"It's just supposed to be a guide to people," he said. "I think it's more like the EPA mileage thing — here's what you should expect, give or take."

The Environmental Protection Agency twice a year publishes estimated gasoline mileage for each make and model automobile.

Gasparich cautioned that the housing cost figures are six to eight months old, so inflation should be taken into account.

**EACH FIELD** office reported representative sales prices for three types of homes, rated low, medium or high range. The department said each area included urban and rural homes in the study. The low range home included three bedrooms

and one full bath; the medium range included three or four bedrooms and two full baths; and the high range contained three to five bedrooms and two or three full baths. The study included land and site improvements in the price.

The San Antonio field office said low range dwellings had 900 square feet, medium 1,140 square feet and high 1,680 square feet.

The lowest costs were in the San Antonio market area itself, where low range homes sold for \$27,500, medium range for \$38,400 and high range for \$50,000.

**HIGH RANGE** homes sold for slightly less in the Corpus Christi area, where the price was reported as \$49,400. Costs for other types of dwellings were higher in than San Antonio. The Corpus Christi figures were listed as \$28,800 for low range and \$38,500 for medium range homes.

Homes in the Austin area sold for \$28,000 in the low range, \$38,800 in the medium and \$50,500 in the high.

The Lubbock field office reported figures for low range homes with 1,060 square feet, medium range with 1,390 square feet and high range with 1,700 square feet.

The El Paso market area claimed the lowest prices, with low range homes reported at \$30,500, medium range at \$44,600 and high range at \$50,800.

Amarillo followed on the list. Low range homes in the Panhandle area sold for \$31,000 and

medium range for \$45,400. High range homes, however, at \$52,200 were listed for \$300 more than in Lubbock.

**PRICES FOR LOW** range homes in the Lubbock area were \$31,300. The medium range figure in Lubbock was \$45,800.

The prices in the Midland-Odessa area were the highest reported by the Lubbock office, with \$32,300 for low range homes, \$47,000 in the medium range and \$54,500 for high range dwellings.

The Fort Worth field office listed low range dwellings at 1,400 square feet, medium range at 1,600 square feet and high range at 2,200 square feet.

Homes in the Brownwood area sold for \$34,500 in the low range, \$40,200 in medium range and \$68,000 in high range.

The San Angelo area listings included low range homes for \$33,200, medium range for \$51,800 and high range for \$70,300.

In the Abilene area, the price for a low range home was \$36,400. Me-

diu range homes were listed as \$52,600 and high range as \$70,300.

**THE PRICE** for a low range home in the Wichita Falls area was \$44,300. Medium range homes sold for \$52,500 and high range for \$69,700.

In the Fort Worth area the figures were \$44,600 in the low range, \$52,400 in the medium and \$69,500 in the high.

The Dallas field office reported the top prices for high range homes in the state, but with 2,390 square feet in the category it also listed the greatest square footage.

The low range homes contained 1,090 square feet and medium range homes were listed at 1,600 square feet.

In the Dallas area the prices were \$36,000 for low range homes, \$56,500 for medium range and \$76,600 for high range.

**THE FIGURES** for the Waco area were \$36,500 for low range, \$51,400 for medium range and \$74,900 for high range.

The price for a low range home in the Tyler area was \$35,500. Medium range homes sold

for \$48,300 and high range for \$75,400.

The Sherman area figures included \$34,100 for low range, \$41,900 for medium range and \$61,700 for high range.

The Houston field office, reporting for six areas, listed square footage as 1,090 for low range, 1,620 for medium range and 2,150 for high range.

The most expensive homes in the Gulf Coast

and East Texas parts of the state were in the Beaumont area, where low range homes sold for \$41,900, medium range for \$55,800 and high range for \$70,000.

In the Houston area, figures were \$40,500 for the low range, \$53,500 for medium range and \$66,700 for high range.

**THE PRICE** for a low range home in the Texas City area was \$40,200.

The medium range figure was \$53,300 and a typical high range home sold for \$66,800.

The figures for the Lufkin area included \$38,000 for low range homes, \$51,700 for medium range and \$65,300 for high range.

The typical low range home in the El Campo area sold for \$38,600. The medium range figure was \$52,500 and the high range price was \$66,700.

Oak Creek shows slight water gain

The rains came at Oak Creek Lake near Sweetwater, but were so spotted only a slight gain in water level as recorded. The lake reached its low point in late March, but since has gained water throughout the summer.

This seems to be the year when more big bass have been lost than caught. Steve Williams of Abilene landed two and four pound bass, but only did battle with one he will remember for a while.

The catfish reportedly are biting in all areas of the lake. Fishing deep water, the fish will often have the bait before it reaches bottom.

find for the most part, but a few strings were caught about mid-week with the largest fish in the pound class.

MICHAEL GAINES of Wichita Falls is owner of one of Texas' most unusual fish records. Fishing Lake Nocona near the Texas-Oklahoma border May 27, he caught a nine-pound, one ounce Tiger Muskie, a hybrid between a muskellunge and northern pike.

Tiger muskies were stocked experimentally by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department in only seven reservoirs in 1976. In addition to Nocona, they were placed in Lake Alena, Mill Creek, Raven, Leon and Cooper, Breaks and Meridian State parks.

Gaines' record may stand for a long time, since there have been no additional stockings since 1976 and none is anticipated in the future, according to the TPWD. Tiger muskies are a popular game fish in northern states, because they grow larger than northern pike and are easier to catch than the larger but extremely wary muskellunge.

ANOTHER STATE record was jeopardized by Dudley Haas of Waco when he caught a 632-pound marlin off Port Aransas. It was the largest ever brought into that port, but was 60 pounds shy of the current state record, a 691-pounder caught off Freeport.

Canyon Lake between Austin and San Antonio is not one of the better known striped bass lakes, but one group last weekend found all the striper action they could handle. Erloy Krueger of Universal City brought in five which weighed a total of 54 pounds, three ounces, the largest 16 1/2 pounds.

GOOD CATCHES of crappie and channel catfish, as well as numerous reports of striped bass and a few blacks were reported at Lake Spence. Largest catch was a 12 1/2 pounder by Joe Garza, Midland, who also caught four channel cats to 1 1/2 pounds.

"Koenning and Sampleton give us two threats to go with Johnny 'Lam' Jones," said Akers. "If other teams just concentrate on Lam this year one of those other guys will become a star."

Akers said that Jones, a former Olympic Gold Medal winner, said, "Lam is in the best football condition I've ever seen him."

Akers said that overall "we expect to be good. Our offensive line is much improved and our defense has great potential."

"We have one of the toughest schedules in the country but if we do well against top grade people we will be recognized for it."

The Longhorns open the season at home against Iowa State and meet two more Big Eight opponents, Missouri on the road and Oklahoma at Dallas.

"Our first two off dates come before we play on Sept. 22 but maybe it's a good thing," Akers said.

He added, "I wouldn't have designed the schedule that way but with our injuries it could be an advantage."

Two Longhorn stars were injured in summer accidents but apparently will be ready to play in the opener.

Defensive tackle Steve McMichael stuck his hands in the fan of his automobile and suffered severe cuts. Doctors used 75 stitches in mending McMichael, who said "I'll never be a backyard mechanic again."

Sophomore running back A.J. "Jam" Jones, who suffered a separated shoulder when he fell three stories in a construction accident, said, "I expect to be ready for the opener. My shoulder is still tender."

## Poor Pat, he's just too short

It is a matter of public record that only one former collegiate football player ever got elected President. Dwight D. Eisenhower. Only one other ever made it to the White House at all. Gerald R. Ford.

It is also history that only one former professional football player ever made it to the U.S. Supreme Court, Byron (Whizzer) White.

The gridiron is not a fertile breeding ground for the corridors of future power.

Which is why a lot of us thought Patrick Capper Haden had put a serious crimp in his career when he signed with the Los Angeles Rams in the spring of 1976. "Well," we thought, "there goes the State Department, the White House, or maybe even chief justice."

Pro quarterbacks are not ordinarily thought of as candidates for Foggy Bottom, The Hill, or even a consular job in Peru.

But P.C. Haden, Esq., was not your run-of-the-mill pro quarterback. Pro quarterbacks come from Beaver Falls, Pa., East Canebroke U. or Louisiana Normal, not Oxford University. Most pro quarterbacks are not Rhodes Scholars. They not only couldn't get into Oxford University, they probably couldn't even get into Ohio State. Most can read defenses, but not William Faulkner. Most of them didn't require an education, just a football. Most pro quarterbacks thought the Thirty Years War was won by Al Davis.

Patrick Haden found nothing particularly difficult about throwing the football. Nothing to be compared to the difficulties of Ciceronian Latin, for example, or the logical thickets of Aristotle or even Alexander Pope.

But, quite clearly, he was destined for a career in a homburg hat and cutaway coat, not a helmet with an animal on it or a suit with a number on it.

ever thought of politics, kid?" they would ask. "Or how about Wall Street?" You would have thought Haden came from Harvard not USC.

When the World Football League came around with an offer, Pat Haden thought so little of it he only promised them half a season. He was just moonlighting at football. His real career lay in an English library. When the World Football League folded, Haden thought it was the end of his world, too. When the Rams made him an offer and agreed to building his training around his education, he probably should have been insulted. It was clear the Rams really needed a mop-up quarterback. They thought Haden had as much chance of getting in the House of Lords as the NFL.

Haden accepted the role as third-string quarterback. Until he saw the first and second-string quarterbacks. One of them got sacked 10 times in one night. When both of these quarterbacks got hurt, Haden took over, and came within one pass of putting the Rams in the Super Bowl that year.

The Rams were so impressed, they reacted by bringing in an average, over-publicized semi-invalid to play quarterback ahead of Haden the next year. Joe Namath not only couldn't run, he couldn't even walk. He had to exercise by swimming in a pool. He might have made it if the game had been water polo, but the coaches sighed and handed the ball over to Haden again by the fourth game.

SO, PAT Haden never really did unpack.

If size were that much of an equalizer, King Hill would have been the all-time professional quarterback and Bob Griese would be selling cars someplace. But while the Rams didn't change, Pat Haden subtly did. He suddenly began to come to camp and practice without that apologetic air of a guy who feels sorry he's completing all those passes and showing everybody else up, particularly those tall guys. He felt entitled to sit down and eat with the family. He stopped feeling guilty about running "Shack" Harris, Ron Jaworski and Joe Namath clear to San Diego, Philadelphia, Ft. Lauderdale and points east. He no longer keeps a fare well note typed in his pocket, and the bed sheets knotted and hanging out the window for a quick getaway. Only last season, when a television director approached him and suggested he pose with the Dallas Cowboys' "Too Tall" Jones, Haden indignantly refused. Since he's normally the most obliging of athletes, the television director was startled. "We just want to illustrate the problem," he explained to Haden. "What problem?" snapped Haden. "Mine or his? Or yours?"

RUIDOSO DOWNS (AP) — Don Farris was excited early Friday morning about his colt Streakin Six's chances of winning Monday's All-American Futurity. But by mid-morning the veteran trainer was shaking his head in disgust.

Farris was hoping his speedster would draw an outside post because the track at Ruidoso Downs tends to be a bit faster there and it's easier to stay out of trouble.

His hopes, however, were not fulfilled. His horse, expected to go off as a betting favorite, came up with the No. 3 hole.

"It couldn't have been worse," said Farris. "I don't like it at all."

While Farris was bemoaning his draw, the camps of his two top challengers were delighted with their spots in the 40-yard scramble that is billed as the world's richest horse race with a gross purse of \$1.28 million.

Pie In The Sky, the top qualifier, is a late charger like Streakin Six and the colt's trainer, Leo Wood, wanted him on the outside. He got his wish as Pie In The Sky will be as far outside as you can get in the tenth position.

Trainer Roger Fagan, who handles the quick-starting Sages Belle Star, was more concerned about where his filly would be in proximity to Streakin Six than about which post position he would draw.

Fagan said he just wanted to be close to Streakin Six, and his filly drew the No. 4 slot alongside the favorite.

Fagan, who like Wood is pointing at Streakin Six, as the horse to beat, said he wanted to be near the colt because his filly needs the competition to "keep her running. Sometimes she'll get a good break from the gate and be out front, then start looking around."

Farris, however, did get a break in that one of the three horses he has qualified for the final leg of quarter horse racing's Triple Crown, Denim N Diamonds, drew an outside spot at No. 8.

Farris' other entry, Pa Pa Wheeie, will be down on the end alongside Streakin Six in the No. 2 slot.

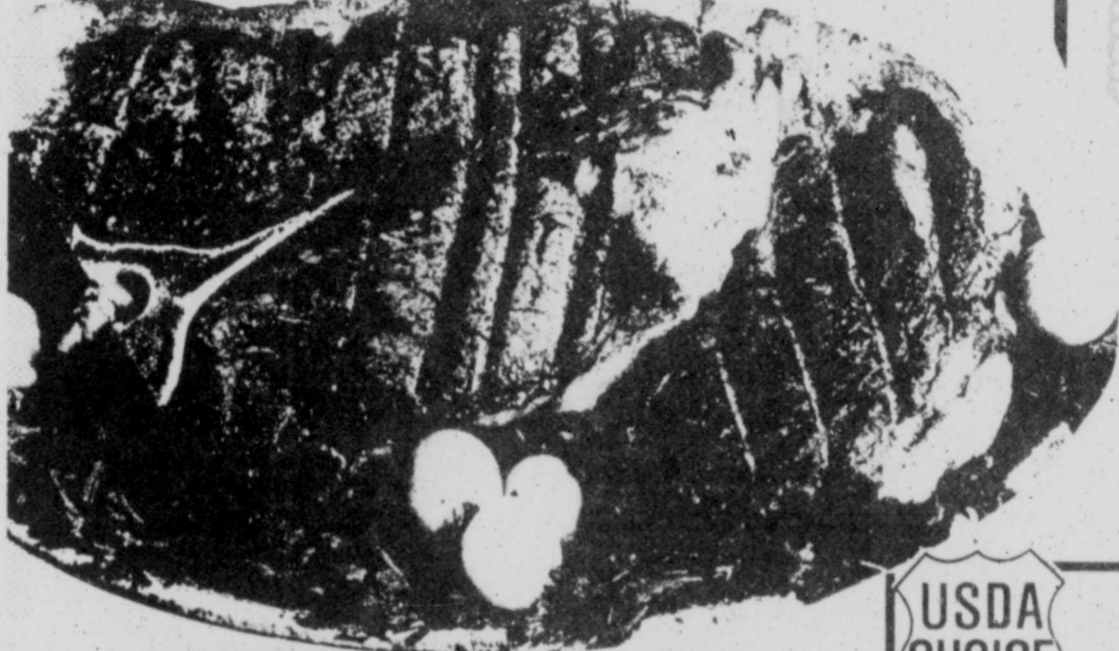
