## Mathis jurors impose 99-year sentence

> Raymond Wesley Mathis, described by his defense attorney as a victim of
circumstances. Friday affernoon was found guilty of murder in the July 18
shooting death of Army Sgt: J.B. England and handed a 99 -year prison sentence Th eight-man, four-woman jury deliberated little more than an hour
The before returning the guilty verdict against the 20-year-old defendant,
who in a statement to deputies entered as evidence in the trial had said
it was the co-defendant in the trial, Kelly Joe Chamblis, who shot England. Jurors began deliberations at $10: 50 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. and returned the guilty verdict
about 1 p.m. They began deliberating a sentence about $3: 30$ p.m.
The courtroom was hushed when the jury returned about $4: 10$ p. m. to give its sentence in the case.
Mathis sat emotionless as 238 th District Court Judge Vann Culp read the
99 -year prison term, but some members of his family burst into tears. Midland attorney Rusty Wall, who headed the defense for Mathis, de-
clined a comment initially on whether the verdict will be appealed, but he did note that. Mathis had taken a 10 -day option in which he can file an
appeal.
During final arguments, District Attorney Vern Martin told the jury.
