### NEWS IN BRIEF

#### Texan testifies

ROME, Ga. (AP) — A Texas trucker testified Friday that he helped wire a pipe bomb into the van of a peep show operator whom the government contends was killed as part of a racketeering enterprise operated by pornographer Michael Thevis.

Fred Michael Bryson of Fort Worth told the jury that he and William Ross Mahar built the dynamite bomb in Mahar's Atlanta apartment on Sept. 13, 1973, and planted it the following night in the van of James Mayes.

Thevis, 47, is charged with having Mayes and three other men killed in a scheme to gain nationwide control of the pornography business through a pattern of racketeering activity. The multi-count federal indictment also charges Thevis and his two corporations with arson, extortion, mail fraud and obstruction of justice.

#### 'Reactors needed'

WASHINGTON (AP) — Rep. Morris K. Udall, a leading congressional skeptic of nuclear power, said Friday he has concluded that the nation's 70 existing commercial reactors and 96 others licensed to be built are all needed.

The Arizona Democrat said nuclear power will have to continue to play a major role in the nation's energy future, at least for the rest of the 20th century. He spoke as the House Interior Committee, which he chairs, began winding down its five-month inquiry into the Three Mile Island nuclear accident.

Udall began the investigation last spring by leading his panel on a tour of the crippled power plant, where he told reporters that the March 28 accident had seriously clouded the future — if any — of nuclear power in this country.

#### Vote postponed

WASHINGTON (AP) — The House on Friday postponed until next week a fourth vote on a proposal to raise the pay of congressmen and top bureaucrats.

Announcement that no votes would be taken until Tuesday on the pay proposal, which already has been defeated three times, came as the House was debating the ground rules that would govern the fight.

Majority Leader Jim Wright, D-Texas, said the vote on the newest pay proposal — to hike salaries 5.5 percent — was postponed because many members were not present for the debate. House attendance often drops sharply on Fridays as many members leave early for their home districts.

#### It's official

WASHINGTON (AP) — Neil Goldschmidt, former mayor of Portland, Ore., was confirmed by the Senate Friday to be secretary of transportation.

The vote was 83 to 0. Goldschmidt has been serving as acting secretary since President Carter appointed him to succeed Brock Adams, who resigned July 20.

## U.S. hasn't asked removal of brigade

WASHINGTON (AP) — The United States has not asked the Soviet Union to withdraw its combat brigade from Cuba because it would be "unrealistic" to expect the Russians to leave, Carter administration officials said Friday.

Instead, they said, the current negotiations between the United States and the Soviet Union are aimed at eliminating the combat capability of the Soviet troops.

The officials, who asked not to be named, said the administration feels that demanding withdrawal of the troops would be "unrealistic and unnecessary."

They refused to specify exactly what steps the administration feels would eliminate the combat capability of the Soviet troops.

But in the past weeks, the administration's definition of combat capability, while vague, has centered on the command structure of the troops and the equipment that allows them to perform combat roles.

The Soviets have insisted publicly that the troops are only advisers to Cuban forces, that they have been in Cuba since 1962 and that they have a right to be there.

The United States traditionally has accepted the presence of Soviet advisers in Cuba. The current uproar started last month when U.S. intelligence decided that the Soviet troops in Cuba had formed a combat brigade of 2,000 to 3,000 men.

Since the announcement of that finding, Secretary of State Cyrus Vance and Soviet Ambassador Anatoly Dobrynin have held five negotiating sessions in an effort to resolve the issue.

Officials said the initial negotiations were information-gathering exchanges in which Vance sought answers to specific questions that American intelligence officials raised about the troops.

With those answers in hand, the talks have shifted to a discussion of what can be done about the situation.

President Carter, who has said he will not accept the status quo in Cuba, was quoted by his chief spokesman Thursday as saying the United States will act on its own to alter the status quo if the negotiations with the Soviets are not fruitful.

White House press secretary Jody Powell said Carter would "be prepared to take whatever actions are appropriate," although he ruled out any direct military action.

Other administration officials have said the National Security Council is considering a number of options to apply economic pressure to the Soviets.

The dispute over the troops has stalled Senate consideration of SALT II, the new strategic arms treaty between the United States and the Soviet Union.

Sen. Frank Church, D-Idaho, who has been kept abreast of the negotiations, told reporters after a White House briefing Thursday that he thought the solution to the Cuban problem would require a presidential certification that Soviet combat forces are no longer deployed in Cuba.

Otherwise, said Church, who is chairman of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, the SALT II treaty will not be ratified.

That was a slight but significant shift from Church's earlier statement that the treaty could not be ratified unless the troops were removed. It left open the possibility that they would not have to physically leave the island for Senate concerns to be satisfied.

State Department spokesman Hodding Carter said Friday that there were still no firm plans for Vance to meet with Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko when the two are in New York next week for the United Nations General Assembly meeting.

## Sunrise, sunset: It signals summer's end

Summer is coming to an end faster than most Midlanders realize.

At 10:17 a.m. Sunday, the sun will journey south across the earth's equator, bringing the astronomical summer to an end in the northern hemisphere — and that includes the Tall City.

That moment — the autumnal equinox — marks the beginning of fall, one of four astronomical seasons resulting from the earth's elliptical orbit around the sun.

The equinox ("equal night" in Latin) results in equal segments of light and dark at the equator. In addition, the sun rises directly out of the east at the equator on that day.

Sunday's sunrise for Midlanders will occur at 7:37 a.m. with sunset that day following at 7:45 p.m.

Sunlight will not fall below the 12-hour mark in Midland until Thursday, when the sun rises at 7:40 a.m. and sets at 7:39 p.m.

The solar orb has quickened its pace southward across the earth as the planet careens along an elliptical orbit around the star. According to various reference books, the sun moves south at a rate approaching 2½ degrees each week at this particular time in the season, bringing a rapid end to the long daylight periods of summer.

According to reference material, the rapid motion of the sun sometimes results in violent storms known as equinoctial gales, caused when unequal heating of warm and cold air masses develops.

While Sunday marks the change in the astronomical season, the climatical season changes at different rates across the country.

Autumn traditionally is blessed with warm days and cool, crisp nights. Sound seems more clear during autumn evenings than at any other time of year. In addition, descending cool air clears the skies in the evening, making the autumnal months among the best for stargazing.

Autumn also is the time when birds, butterflies and other migratory animals go south in seeking the sun's warmth.

Climatically, summer is far from finished. Normally during autumn, sections of the United States experience a period of hot daily temperatures known as Indian Summer. Residents of equatorial regions experience a very short fall and spring.

Autumn also is the traditional time of harvest, though in Texas that harvest takes place in late autumn.

While farmers may miss the rapidly fading daylight in their agricultural chores, they are aided in October and November by a series of harvest moons.

The October harvest moon is due to rise at sunset on Oct. 5, according to various reference sources.

The autumnal equinox occupies a unique spot among the four astronomical seasons. The time between the spring and autumn equinoxes is about six days longer than from the autumn to spring equinoxes, according to various reference materials. That fact illustrates the earth's elliptical path around the sun, scientists say.

The time between the winter and summer solstices is about equal, according to reference materials.

Other cosmic events in the near future include the return of the moon to the evening sky next week as the lunar orb heads toward its first phases.

The moon will reach perigee, or its closest point to the earth, on Oct. 4, when the heavenly body will be a mere 223,253 miles away from the planet. The moon should appear larger than usual those days as it rises above the horizon.

Apogee will be attained Oct. 19 when the moon is 252,442 miles away.

Sept. 29 marks the return of the first quarter moon.

The next astronomical season will not occur until Dec. 22 when the winter solstice transpires. That event marks the arrival of the sun at the Tropic of Capricorn, south of the equator. While it will be winter here, residents of the southern hemisphere will just be entering the summer season.

And Midlanders — sitting in their heated homes — will begin making plans for next summer.

## Sadat maintaining arms link with Soviets, sources say

CAIRO, Egypt (AP) — While seeking more military aid from the United States, President Anwar Sadat's government is also maintaining its arms link with the Soviet Union, Western military sources say.

The sources, who insisted on not being identified, said 40 Soviet-made helicopter engines and some spare parts for trucks recently had been delivered by Moscow.

One source said the Egyptians apparently bought the spares on a cash-

and-carry basis in a deal arranged by the Soviet Embassy in Cairo.

But a Soviet diplomat said he "doubted" the report and a high-ranking Egyptian military source said he could not confirm it.

The Soviet Union, for 20 years Egypt's major source of military hardware, cut off shipments in 1975 as Sadat turned increasingly toward the West.

Sadat has repeatedly complained about the Soviet "arms embargo"

that has made it difficult for his army to obtain needed spare parts for missiles, tanks and aircraft that are the backbone of Egypt's military machine.

In late 1977, Sadat unilaterally slapped a moratorium on repaying \$10 billion in debts to the Soviets, but he has left the door open to a possible reconciliation.

The first U.S. arms — 16 F-4 Phantom jet fighters and 50 armored personnel carriers — arrived in Egypt

earlier this month as part of a \$1.5-billion arms deal that followed the signing of the Egyptian-Israeli peace treaty in March.

With these arms still in the pipeline, Egypt has sought still more military aid from the United States and contracted for about 40 Chinese-made MiG-19 jet fighters.

But Egyptian officials indicate they are concerned about the time lag in obtaining U.S. equipment and note that its value is still unproven to the

Egyptian military man.

"The Soviets have large numbers of tanks and planes stockpiled in depots and can deliver very quickly," the high-ranking Egyptian official said. "It takes a long time to get weapons from the United States because of the lack of stockpiles and the congressional process."

The Phantoms, rushed to Egypt in time for the Oct. 6 annual military parade, came from operational U.S. units.

# Dracula, pals readied for annual showing

BRISTOL, Conn. (AP) — As Halloween approaches this central Connecticut city, Cortland B. Hull assumes some of the characteristics of Doctor Frankenstein. Like the mad scientist in Mary Shelley's novel, Hull has created a monster — a number of them, in fact.

Hull is the originator of Bristol's "Witches Dungeon Museum," a collection of vampires, ghouls and other antisocial characters who can be glimpsed by the public only during the Halloween season. The museum is open from Oct. 26 to Oct. 28 and from Oct. 31

to Nov. 4. The rest of the year, it's sealed as tightly as Dracula's crypt. Hull has always been a horror film fan and many of the 13 characters in his museum bear striking resemblances to such movie villains as Boris Karloff, Lon Chaney, Bela Lugosi and Vincent Price.

The 26-year-old commercial artist designs and executes the life-size figures himself. Each takes about a month to complete, but planning takes much longer. Once he decides on a character to be immortalized, Hull begins scouring antique and thrift shops, searching

out the proper clothing to dress the figure. After the costume is assembled, Hull sculpts the character's head, working from movie stills. He then casts the finished head in latex for a lifelike effect.

"The eyes are the most expensive item in the whole process," Hull points out. "They cost between \$50 and \$125 a pair."

The falls of human hair Hull insists on using are also expensive. The plastic variety is cheaper, "but it's wavy and doesn't lie right. Human hair is far easier to control," he explains. Hull's mother con-

structs the wigs, tying each hair onto a net base, a technique she learned from a Hollywood make-up artist.

When he started his project 13 years ago, he had no idea it would become so fiendishly popular with the anything-for-a-shudder set, Hull admits. Every fall more and more visitors come to the museum on Battle Street, which is open, appropriately, from 7 p.m. to midnight. Last year 2,000 gooseflesh aficionados showed up for the eight-minute tour of the frightening world of Dracula, the Mummy and the Phantom of the Opera.

# Santa to ride Sooner unflying machine

HOMINY, Okla. (AP) — Hidden in a municipal barn in this northeastern Oklahoma community is a dust-covered, red, white and blue unflying machine some people would like to forget.

In 1966, an aviation engineer named Paul E. Ziegler flew into Hominy and proposed an industry for the community.

Ziegler told town fathers he would build a prototype of the 400-pound copters that would sell for \$12,500. A plant would be built, 400 persons would get jobs and Hominy would reap \$6 million a year.

The town council put a \$105,000 bond issue to the voters to finance the plan. Voters agreed to the idea. They had never seen the contraption fly and never would.

Chester Christian, veteran Hominy street superintendent, remembers the day Ziegler asked him to hold onto the brightly painted machine so it wouldn't become airborne while its engine was being tested.

"I really thought it might fly," Christian said. "Then he fired it up. The engine sounded like it was going a thou-

sand miles an hour, but the blade was just barely turning. I knew it wasn't going anywhere."

Mayor J.E. Sheppard recalls the machine lifted off the ground once, but the fuselage was rotating as rapidly as its blade was.

"I think that's why they had to have several men hang onto it," Sheppard said.

In 1967, Ziegler left town and was not heard from again.

"He just flat ran out of funds," Sheppard said. "I don't think the man left here with any cash. I think he left here a pauper."

Monday night, Jeanette Chapman representing the local Chamber of Commerce asked city fathers for permission to use the helicopter as a float in the Christmas parade.

"Our idea was for Santa Claus to ride in the helicopter on top of a trailer and throw out candy to the kids. After the parade, the kids would get to sit on his lap

in the helicopter and tell him what they wanted for Christmas," she said.

The council voted 3-2 that the children didn't need to see Santa Claus

in this particular helicopter.

"I think we would have had a good industry," said Betty Helm, town administrator.

### Salem, Massachusetts, jury convicts man of raping his estranged wife

SALEM, Mass. (AP) — A jury convicted a 32-year-old man on Friday of raping his estranged wife, a conviction that was believed to be the first of its kind in the state.

James J. Chretien was also convicted on a related burglary charge, but was acquitted on one charge of rape and one charge of burglary. He could face up to life in prison on the rape charge. The burglary charge carries a minimum mandatory sentence of 10 years.

Judge Thomas J. Morse Jr. scheduled sentencing for Monday. Chretien was led from the court-

room after the verdicts and taken to the Salem jail. His 32-year-old wife, Carmellina, and their 9-year-old son, James Jr., were not in the courtroom for the verdict.

The boy testified soberly for about 15 minutes Thursday as his parents watched and wept. He described an early-morning argument between his parents at his mother's Haverhill, Mass., home on Feb. 8.

At the time, the couple had been granted a divorce, but the decree was not final.

### Chrysler halves staff, closes plant

DETROIT (AP) — Chrysler Corp. dropped an entire shift Friday from its assembly plant making full-size cars and closed the plant for two weeks to reduce inventories.

About 2,000 of 4,100 production employees will be laid off indefinitely,

raising Chrysler's layoff total to 29,200. Last week, the total had declined from 28,300, the first decline in months.

The layoffs bring the industry's total to 88,900.

### 'Home study kits' big hit with parents

DETROIT (AP) — With no end in sight to a two-week-old teacher strike, parents in Detroit have been turning to home-study kits for their children in such numbers that the school district has run out of its supply of 12,000.

The first batch of the kits was exhausted by Friday — one day after officials started giving them out — as thousands of parents streamed into regional school offices to take up offer of free teaching materials.

The kits, mainly reading and mathematics materials, are designed as supplemental teaching aids under normal conditions. But with all the city's public schools shut and 189,000 students idled in the teacher walk-out, school officials decided to distribute the kits "to see that the education process continues for our students," Superintendent Arthur Jefferson said.

Detroit's teaching staff of about 12,000 has been on strike since Sept. 10, after the teachers narrowly voted down a tentative agreement between the school board and the Detroit Federation of Teachers. Under court order, bargaining resumed Friday on the key issues: teacher demands for cost-of-living protection and a wage-reopener clause. Robert Blackwell, a state mediator, has labeled the dispute, the largest teacher strike in the nation, a "classic stalemate."

With the talks stalled, about 1,500 of the homework packets, geared to different age levels, were sent to each of eight regional school centers, and school officials are now scrambling to reproduce thousands more.

"We got more people than we expected," said Louis Ellis, director of curriculum development and services. "We are in the midst of a massive reproduction, and supplies will be reinforced."

The new batch probably will not be ready until Monday, Yvonne Johnson, a schools spokeswo-

man, said Friday. One regional office manager, she said, promised to keep churning out the supplies, "until his copying machine broke down."

## New concept in housing explored

A representative of a California company Friday presented a concept for alternate moderate income housing to members of the Midland City Council, Planning and Zoning Commission, financial institution representatives and others involved in housing.

The informational meeting, held at 1:30 p.m. in Council Chambers, was conducted by Odessa mobile home park owner Mike Furman and Wayne Cruson, director of marketing for Immobile Home Co. of San Jose, Calif.

What the two men presented was a plan to develop subdivisions of manufactured housing. These houses would be offered to prospective homebuyers for about a 30 percent reduction from the price of a conventional, or site-built, home.

Although the basic dwellings are essentially mobile homes, Cruson noted, they are designed in such a manner as to provide private living in the mode of a "patio home."

The concept, Cruson said, was developed in California after developers realized that mobile home parks, in the contemporary sense, were not well-accepted by the public.

"The houses (mobile homes) are architecturally and aesthetically unacceptable," Cruson said, explaining

it is largely due to rectangular construction and the placement of mobile homes in contemporary mobile home parks.

But the homes manufactured and the subdivisions developed by Immobile Home Co., he said, don't fit the mold of most mobile homes or mobile home parks.

For example, Cruson said, the homes feature angled roofs complete with asphalt tile, skylights, cathedral beamed ceilings, eaves, fireplaces, atriums, hot tubs, garages and other attractive features.

The homes are situated on the lot in such a way that private patios can be provided for each home. Fences — usually of solid construction — also are recommended for such subdivisions, Cruson said.

He discouraged those at the meeting from using such housing in conjunction with an existing mobile home park, saying the existing park would detract from the concept of the new type of housing.

On price, neither Cruson nor Furman — who is president of Liberty Trust Co. in Odessa — could speak in specific terms. Cruson said the cost of a manufactured house would be about two-thirds the price of a conventional house.

They indicated cost of such a house might average \$27-\$30 a square foot, compared to \$40 a square foot for

conventional construction.

The housing is being manufactured in Waco, Cruson said. Furman added that a developer possibly could bring the manufactured housing concept to the Midland-Odessa area in the future.

Cruson said that if the housing is used in a "planned unit development," the value of the housing unit would "definitely appreciate."

Responding to a question about financing the purchase of such housing, Furman said that if a home is constructed on a permanent foundation it can be eligible for 30-year FHA financing.

## There may be hope in mortgage crunch

AUSTIN, Texas (AP) — The chairman of a Senate committee looking into the state's mortgage money crunch said Friday that Texans — those who can qualify for home financing — pay more for interest than for everything else in their homes.

But Carl Parker, D-Port Arthur, also predicted that a new state agency may be able to come up with \$200 million for Texans looking for home financing.

"It's abundantly clear to me that unless government takes a role in making money available, single-family housing may be a thing of the past in the not too distant future...unless you happen to be born rich," he said.

Parker is leading the Senate Interim Committee on Financial Institutions as it tries to figure out how to make home finance money more available to Texans. At Friday's session, the committee's first, the members said they want to hear from lending institutions, state agencies that deal with lending institutions and home-buyers who cannot find financing.

The committee chairman said he is confident that the new state housing authority will soon be able to make financing available at 7 or 8 percent.

## Midland's unemployment drops to 3.3 in August

Midland's unemployment rate took another dip in August to 3.3 percent, according to a spokesman with the Texas Employment Commission. This puts the Tall City fourth in the state, tying with Austin, in unemployment rates.

Leading the state was College Station with 2.8 percent; Abilene, 3 percent, and Wichita Falls, 3.2 percent.

The national rate is 5.9 percent and the state figure is 4.6 percent.

Midland's rate fell from 3.7 percent in July to 3.3 percent in August.

Primary reason for the drop, the spokesman said, is that temporary summer workers are returning to school or teaching.

The rate also was far better than the figure a year ago when there was 4.4 percent unemployed in August 1978, said the spokesman.

For November the figures should remain stable with the rate expected to be 3.4 percent.

Nonetheless, the number of people in the civilian labor force in the Tall City also dropped in August, according to the TEC spokesman. There were 47,070 in July and only 46,620 the

following month. It was higher, though, than the August 1978 figure of 45,520.

For November, the labor force should increase slightly to 46,800.

Nonmanufacturing was on the move with gains in many areas. Mining led the increases as the energy search continued, said the spokesman.

The fall school season gave wholesale and retail trade a boost while population demands pushed services ahead. Construction was slightly higher.

However, agriculture remained slow during August, according to the spokesman.

Forecast for November calls for an increase in manufacturing and non-manufacturing trades as the holiday season approaches.

The TEC spokesman said Midland employers are having trouble filling openings for geological drafter, oil and gas drafter, electronics technician, manager trainee, nurse, clerical, secretary, restaurant personnel, insurance sales agent, building maintenance repairman, heavy truck driver and combination welder.

# U.N. trying to reunite Beatles for benefit

UNITED NATIONS (AP) - The suffering of the "boat people" might do what pleading fans and show business promoters have failed to achieve in nearly 10 years: bring the Beatles back together.

A U.N. spokesman confirmed Friday that the four members of the Fabulous Four, who have not all played together in 10 years, are being urged to play a benefit for the refugees of southeast Asia and elsewhere. U.N. Secretary-General Kurt Waldheim would sponsor the event.

Dirk Summers, an independent Los Angeles concert producer who reportedly was handling negotiations, told Gar-

den City, N.Y., radio station WLIR that three of the four Beatles — Paul McCartney, George Harrison and Ringo Starr — had agreed to perform together on the same stage in Geneva, Switzerland. Summers said a four-hour concert was planned, and would include rock star Elton John as master of ceremonies, with Leonard Bernstein conducting the Vienna Philharmonic in an interpretation of Beatles tunes.

Summers said in the interview that the other

Beatle, John Lennon, had not yet responded to his concert proposal.

U.N. SPOKESMAN Francois Giuliani said Waldheim spoke personally with Harrison, adding that all of the Beatles had shown interest in the project and were considering it. Harrison organized and performed in a 1971 concert in New York to raise money for famine-struck Bangladesh.

Giuliani said U.N. officials were not informed on the status of negotiations being handled by Summers, but the Washington Post reported in Friday editions that the three have agreed to the idea.

But a spokesman in the office of New York lawyer John Eastman said Paul McCartney would not agree to perform in such a concert. Eastman is McCartney's brother-in-law.

The New York Post said in its Friday editions that Lennon had agreed only to working on the same bill as his three former partners, but not to performing with them.

THE BEATLES have made records separately since they split up in 1970. Last spring, three of them — minus Lennon

— played together at a private party.

Giuliani said the location and date of the proposed concert was undecided. Some reports put it probably in New York, but a U.N. source said the site would be Geneva, headquarters for the U.N. High Commissioner for Refugees.

The source said the commissioner's office has been the principal U.N. agency working on the concert, which would be televised by satellite around the world.

Giuliani said the success of last January's rock and disco benefit by the Bee Gees and other performers — which raised nearly \$4 million for the U.N. Children's Fund, UNICEF — had encouraged Waldheim to endorse the Beatles idea.

Giuliani was unable to say whether the Beatles project originated with the United Nations or with show business promoters. "Ever since last year's concert we have had many contacts with

U.N. sources said the talks with the Beatles had been going on for some months.

## Carson concedes drinking problem

NEW YORK (AP) — Johnny Carson concedes in an interview with CBS' Mike Wallace that drinking became a problem for him, and "I found that it was probably best for me to not really tangle with it."

"I used to have a little pop, I sure did," Carson says in an interview taped for CBS' "60 Minutes." "I don't handle it well."

"You and McMahon, really, you don't," Wallace asks, referring to Carson's longtime "Tonight" show sidekick, Ed McMahon.

"I don't handle alcohol well at all, no. Really, I don't," Carson says, adding: "Oh, Ed and I have had some wonderful times in the past."

The segment, to be aired Sunday evening, was taped at Carson's California home last spring. A portion of the interview, in which Carson proclaims he would like to leave "Tonight" after 17 years as host of the late-night show, was edited for broadcast in June.

The dispute with NBC over Carson's desired departure still has not been settled.

"Tonight" guests, Wallace says in the newly edited segment, often describe Carson as "a gentle man, a kind man." "Are you reluctant," the interviewer asks, "in putting together your monologue, to go 'hard' on a guy?"

It's at that point that Carson, in reply, men-

tions problems with drinking: "Wilbur Mills had his problems...it was amusing to most people, then you could do jokes about it," Carson says. "I stopped doing jokes immediately, as soon as the people found out that he was an alcoholic, and had emotional problems."

Wallace quotes McMahon as saying "that from time to time, you were going to take on the whole Russian army. And he — and you didn't have bazookas to do it." "That's right," Carson replies. "No, that's one reason I found that it was probably best for me to not really tangle with

it. "I just found out that I...I did not drink well, and...when I did drink, rather than a lot of people who become fun-loving, and gregarious, and love everybody, I would go the opposite. "And it would happen," he says, clapping.

Carson's wife, Joanna, remarks: "It came to a point in our marriage when we'd be out, I would see this...go out with one person, and come home with somebody who was completely different in temperament."

"It got to be very difficult," she says, "and we discussed it. We worked it out."


# Crane defeats Coahoma

The determined Bulldog defense held for three downs and on a fourth and five at the Monterey eight, punter Dwayne Smith tried to pick up a low snap from center and decided to take the safety, making it 21-16 with 1:32 left in the game.

Following the free kick by Monterey, Midland put the ball in play at its own 49 and quarterback Michael

Feldt then went to work. Faking pass, Feldt crossed up the Plainsmen by going for 12 yards on a keeper and added six more yards to the 27. Fullback Jeff Robnett took a pitch from Feldt and fought his way to the Plainsmen 19. Feldt then hit Hays with a nine-yard pass and on a fourth and one, Feldt again dialed Hays' number and the ball fell incomplete, but safety Larry Hallman was flagged for pass interference, giving the Pack the ball at the one with six seconds left. Zachery, a 183-pounder, then dove over for the score and a 22-21 lead with three ticks left on the clock.

On the extra point attempt, Feldt took the snap and didn't even try to run for the conversion, falling on the ball.

Midland drew first blood following a second fumble recovery, this time

by the Bulldogs Royce Cottrell at the Monterey 18. In four plays, the Bulldogs sent Billy Applin over from the five. Bobby Stovall's PAT made it 7-0 with 5:58 left in the opening period.

Midland went in front 14-0 in the second period when linebacker Rick Ankerholz picked off a Potts pass at the Midland 42. The Bulldogs scored in six plays as Feldt broke on a beautiful 43-yard run to make it 13-0 with 5:43 in the half. Stovall kicked the point.

Monterey took advantage of a Midland fumble with Monte McCright recovering at the Bulldogs 35. Ricky Pinkerton burst up the middle for 12 and Johnson, who had 145 yards on 25 carries, broke loose for 22 to the Bulldog one. Potts capped the drive with a one-yard plunge and added the point to make it 14-7 with 2:33 left in the half.

Monterey drove 80 yards in the third period to even the game as the drive took 12 plays. Johnson had runs of 18 and 22 yards and then scored from the one with Potts' kick tying it at 14 with 15 seconds left in the half.

Monterey went ahead with Potts hitting Joe Cockrell with a 34-yard pass to the Midland 26 and three plays later came the unusual touchdown with both Johnson and Potts handling the ball. Potts converted with 3:22 left in the game to set the stage for the dramatic finish.




## Three share LPGA tee lead

Detroit averted a shutout in the sixth as Alan Trammell reached first on an error by Butch Hobson, took second on a single by John Wockenfels and scored on a single by Lance Parrish.

Guy changes 'Hang Time' meaning

The Los Angeles Times Syndicate "Hang time" in the Old West was a time when the rustlers turned slowly, slowly in the wind under a cottonwood tree. For Kipling's Danny Deever, it was the morning. For Captain Kidd, it was high noon off the highest yard-arm in the British fleet. For Nathan Hale, it was the time just before the battle of Long Island.

But, for special teams in the NFL, it is the agonizing eternity when they wait, scanning the skies anxiously, like aircraft spotters in a war, waiting for a football which seems to be in orbit, to make its reentry and splash down, usually around their own 4-yard line. The guy who catches it knows exactly what Captain Kidd, Danny Deaver and the other felt like as they mounted the gibbet. By the time the ball arrives, so have the Oakland Raiders, the most ferocious 11-man boarding party this side of Morgan the Pirate's black-legged crew.

"Hang time" is the contribution to modern football Mr. Ray Guy, a man who has elevated the punting of a football to, a, you might say, a high art. "Hang time" is the — so it seems to the time a football leaves this Guy's foot and again becomes visible to the naked eye, descending. Sometimes, it comes down with snow on it.

ACTUALLY, THE football is in the air only a little over five seconds, or even a little under, but, since this is a league where even 280-pound linemen

run the 40 in 4.8 or less, it seems to the guy waiting under the football as if his whole life were flashing before his eyes, like a guy going down for the third time.

I don't know the physics involved, but years ago they made a big thing out of a guy catching a baseball dropped from the top of the Washington Monument. Compared to catching a Ray Guy punt, that's like snatching a pie off a window sill. Ray Guy's punts go far — 50 to 60 yards from the line of scrimmage — but that's not the point.

They go in a high, hyperbolic like a shell leaving a railroadgun, and, if they go 50 or 60 yards as the crowd flies, they are a menace to airline navigation where they reach their apogee. Ray is the only Guy to ever kick a football as high as the scoreboard in the Superdome in New Orleans, which he did in a Pro Bowl game. Teammates swear he kicked a ball in the first quarter in practice once that didn't come down till the fourth quarter. "It looks like a seed up there, it's so high," a punt returner once grumbled.

In the opening game of the season, against the Rams, Ray Guy punted six times for a 41-yard average. The Rams' punter punted five times for a 24-yard average, and two of them were blocked. In addition, one of Ray Guy's celestial punts took so long returning to earth that the Rams' Eddie Brown was hit as he caught it and fumbled it away. And that, sports fans, was the old ballgame. And maybe the old Super Bowl.

THE LATE Red Sanders, the wisest of football on the bulletin board before a season opened. Commandment No.7, as I recall it, read as follows: "Stress the kicking game, for it is here games are won or lost." To Sanders, the kick was not an offensive weapon. He frequently quick-kicked opponents into hopeless field position. He frequently kicked on third down, reasoning he could gain more yardage that way than any other.

But punting, as a weapon, has fallen into such disuse, of late, that when Ray Guy was drafted by Oakland as its No.1 draft choice in 1973, the league was baffled. Ray Guy was a quondam quarterback and free safety at Southern Mississippi University, and, at neither position, did the Raiders appear to need help.

Canny Al Davis, resident genius of the Oakland battlefronts, wanted Guy for defense, all right, but not the way Ray thought. A passing scout reported to Davis that Ray Guy had kicked one so high one day that three duck hunters four miles away had taken aim and tried to shoot it down.

IT MARKED the first time a punter had been drafted No.1 in the NFL. Guy was among those unimpressed. "He resented it," laughs Al Davis today. "But, at the time we drafted him, he was in the hospital with a broken leg. I had our doctor examine him, and when he said he was all right I knew our kicking situation was solved for 10 years."

Adds Davis: "The distance from scrimmage is nothing, it's the dis-

tance from earth that counts." Guy became reconciled to his specialist's role, but he is as unable to explain why he is able to kick higher, farther and more consistently than any punter in history as a bumble bee is to explain how it can fly. "It's repetition, I guess," he shrugs.

Closer students of the game say Ray Guy's form is like that of a crack golfer who has a repeating swing. The foot, like the clubhead, comes into the impact zone at precisely the right time, every time. The foot is fully extended and pointing skyward like that of a Radio City Music Hall Rockette. The velocity is maximum. Also, because he has such distance, Ray Guy is able, so to speak, to play from the blue tees.

What's the most important thing to have to be a successful punter? Guy was asked. "Confidence in your blockers," he laughs.

Punts are designed plays with Ray Guy, and not just kind of put in a bottle and thrown overboard. Like Minnesota Fats, he calls his shots. He all but diagrams the parabola of the kicks for his teammates. "I want them to know what kind of a kick I'm planning so they won't outrun their coverage," he explained. "You have to remember, they can't see the kick." Neither, of course, usually, can the opposition. Reportedly, in Texas Stadium one night, a punt-return team member shouted to another "Whether is it?!" on a Guy kick and the teammate answered "It's over Abilene but it's due here any minute!"

SAN DIEGO (AP) — The San Diego Clippers remained silent as the deadline arrived for their decision in the big Bill Walton payoff.

"We've got until the end of the working day," an executive of the National Basketball Association team said Friday. "We may work late."

Another person close to the Clippers guessed "maybe 9-10 o'clock tonight," which would be early Saturday in the office of NBA Commissioner Larry O'Brien.

The Portland Trail Blazers were awarded Kermit Washington, Kevin Kunnert and the Clippers' No.1 draft pick in 1980 as compensation for Walton's signing as a free agent with San Diego. O'Brien also gave the Clippers the choice of giving up Randy Smith or a No.1 pick in 1982 and \$350,000.

Although Smith left San Diego to meet with his attorney, friends in San Diego described the veteran guard as impatient not knowing where he was

going to play. Washington and Kunnert said they were advised against reporting to Portland, and Blazers' General Manager Harry Glickman agreed Thursday to the delay.

Attorney David Falk, who with another lawyer represents both Washington and Kunnert, said in Washington, D.C., that it's "a possibility" that neither player would leave San Diego.

"It all depends on what the Players Association does with the entire matter," Falk said in a telephone interview.

Larry Fleisher, executive director of the Players Association, said the Walton compensation decision was on the verge of being challenged in court.

Last year, O'Brien ordered the New York Knicks to send Lonnie Shelton, a first-round 1979 draft choice and \$450,000 to Seattle for signing SuperSonics center Marvin Webster to a five-year, \$3 million contract.

Pigeons set for race today

The Midland Racing Pigeon Club will hold its second race of the season today from Ozona, said racer Howard Abernathy. Ten races from sites, ranging from 102 to 349 miles from Midland, are scheduled to be conducted from Ozona, Juno, Del Rio, Catarina, and Laredo.

In last weekend's windy races from Ozona, two of Todd McKimmey's 27 birds came in first and second with averaged speeds of 736.77 and 736.67 yards per minute over the 105.527 miles. The top flier from Abernathy's 13 AAA Loft entries was third with a 735.07 average over 102.625 miles.

It was a relatively slow race by young, inexperienced pigeons, Abernathy said. "It was pretty rough wind (15 mph northeasterly). These are young birds and this was their first race."

The young birds flew low, 100-200 feet high, but none were lost to dove hunters or other mishaps. Older birds, Abernathy noted, fly higher, faster and generally farther, 500 to 600 miles.



John Miller one of newest ministers

John Miller is one of the city's newest ministers, having arrived in Midland only last month to assume the pastorate of the Church of God of Prophecy.

Miller and his family moved here from Big Spring where he had served as pastor of that city's Church of God of Prophecy for the last three years.

Before accepting the call to the Big Spring church in 1976, Miller was engaged in missionary work, with headquarters at Clyde, near Abilene. He also had served one year as state secretary of the Church of God of

Prophecy Marker Association.

Miller says he is "proud to represent the Church of God of Prophecy in Midland," and adds that "this is a vibrant city with lots of activity and many new residents — there is no reason why any church with an active program of outreach cannot grow rapidly and steadily here."

Miller studied at Adrian College, Hardin-Simmons University and Cisco Junior College. He was licensed as a deacon in 1972 and was set forth as a bishop in his church earlier this year.

He was ordained at ceremonies held Sept. 14 during the denomination's General Assembly in Cleve-

land, Tenn. He returned from the annual convocation this week.

In addition to his college training, Miller has attended classes of the Bible Training Institute for the Church of God of Prophecy.

Miller and his wife, Gloria, are the parents of two children. Jennifer, 16, attends Lee High School, and Jill, 12, is a 7th grader at Alamo Junior High School here. Mrs. Miller is a dealer here for Tupperware.

The Church of God of Prophecy, headquartered at Bible Place in Cleveland, Tenn., in the Smokey Mountains, is international in scope and considered one of the fastest-growing denominations in the world

today.

According to Miller, the church's growth is reflected in the spacious new 10,600-seat tabernacle at church headquarters, and the new administrative center and office complex there which was completed in 1978.

At the present time, the denomination is established in 75 countries around the world and is preparing to expand to several additional nations in the near future, Miller said.

The church's annual General Assembly at denominational headquarters each September draws approximately 25,000 delegates from the four corners of the world.

The Midland Church of God of Prophecy, which was established here a number of years ago, had a northeast Midland location before occupying its new home at 5301 Thomason Drive last year.

The present church structure represents only Phase One of the congregation's planned construction project. Phase Two, to provide additional classroom, office and utility space, will be undertaken in the near future, Miller said.

Much of the work on the first section of the church structure was done by church members, Miller said, and much of the labor on the upcoming Phase Two project also will be provided by members of the congregation.

"The congregation is extremely proud of the fine work its members have done on the building, and we invite all residents of the community to visit our church and see for themselves," the pastor said.

Minister wants pope to speak out on racism

BOSTON (AP) — A Lutheran minister has asked Pope John Paul II to call on Bostonians and all Americans to rid themselves of racism when he visits Boston on Oct. 1.

"I appeal to you because your voice will be strongly felt," the Rev. Vernon E. Carter said in a telegram to the pope on Tuesday.

"The holocaust experienced in Europe during World War II can happen in America to both Jews again and blacks," Carter told the pope. "The seed is here. Many Bostonians played a dramatic role in planting some of these seeds."

Carter said in an interview Thursday "There is no better time to appeal" to the pope because he is "coming to advocate peace."

After completion of his studies there, he returned to the Middle East. In 1966, after living several years in the Holy Land, Shorosh entered field of evangelism on a fulltime basis.

Don Bolin, minister of music for Gracepoint Baptist Church in Tulsa, Okla., will be song leader and music director during next week's revival. He is a graduate of Howard Payne University and holds a master's degree in music from North Texas State University. He and his wife, Jeanne, will present special vocal music at the revival services.

The government is attempting to revoke the U.S. citizenship of the 65-year-old Romanian.

Nuns, social activists file suit against coal company

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — A group of Roman Catholic nuns and social activists has filed suit against one of Kentucky's largest coal producers to force safety, environmental and labor reforms.

The Knoxville-based Blue Diamond Coal Co. company had no comment after the suit was filed Wednesday at Chancery Court in Wilmington, Del., where it is chartered.

The Sisters of Loretto, an order of nuns based in Nerinx, Ky., and 13 other plaintiffs said they have bought a total of 159 shares of Blue Diamond stock over the past 18 months. They charged the company has refused to list them as stockholders in an effort to keep the number of registered shareholders below 500.

Under the Securities Exchange Act, a firm with assets above \$1 million and more than 500 shareholders is required to register with the SEC, and disclose information about its operations and communications with stockholders.

Sister Marian McAvoy said the effort was aimed at forcing Blue Diamond to improve its record on mine safety, water pollution and labor relations.

With more than \$75 million in assets, Blue Diamond is one of Kentucky's largest coal producers, mining more than three million tons a year.

It also has had more than 4,600 federal safety violations since 1970. Twenty-six men were killed at its Scotia mine in two explosions in March 1976. Blue Diamond also was barred from getting federal contracts for three years because of its safety record.

Carter working to reinforce image of religious convictions

President Carter, whose strong religious convictions give him a ready-made appeal in that sphere of the populace, is working to reinforce the connection.

His recent speeches, among other things, radiated it. And the religious ranks reciprocated in some ways.

With rumblings of the 1980 presidential election in the air, Carter also has taken concrete steps lately to bolster his links to the religious constituency, including:

—A White House reception for clergy Tuesday, observing the 20th anniversary of the installation of American Greek Orthodox Archbishop Iakovos.

—A breakfast meeting last week with a big delegation of clergy, Protestants, Catholics and Jews, on hand to help persuade senators to approve SALT II accords on limiting strategic arms.

—Assignment of a White House staff member, a clergyman, to facilitate contacts and exchanges with the religious community.

—Efforts to soothe strains between blacks

Standard Oil Co. (Indiana) offered to buy Blue Diamond for \$140.7 million in an exchange-of-stock transaction in December. The deal was called off in March after Standard raised questions about Blue Diamond's reserves and pending litigation, including a suit by families of the men killed at Scotia.

The Sisters of Loretto, who purchased 81 shares of stock last November and December, also want to end Blue Diamond's status as a privately held corporation exempt from the scrutiny of the public and the Securities and Exchange Commission.

Ralph Dye, a Blue Diamond vice president and secretary and one of the defendants, said the firm would have no comment on the suit until its attorneys could go over it.

Blue Diamond President Gordon Bonnyman could not be reached for comment Wednesday. But he said earlier this month that the action appeared to be a continued effort at harassing his firm because of its successful resistance to efforts by the United Mine Workers union to organize miners at its Justus mine at Stearns, Ky.

Other plaintiffs in the suit include the Sisters of the Immaculate Heart of Mary in Monroe, Mich.; the Commission on Religion in Appalachia; the Council of the Southern Mountains, the Episcopal Church Publishing Co. and the Jesuit Appalachian Ministry.




