| However, said Savings and Loan Commissioner Alvis Vandygriff, there is hope for a compromise with a more moderate measure passed by "I House. <br> I think the House bill is more realistic and palatable," Vandygriff said Friday, "but what will come out of the conference committee is anybody's guess." <br> The U.S. Senate passed Thursday night a bill that would override state laws that restrict the interest charged farm and business. The measure goes to a conference committee to be considered with a House-passed bill that would simply authorize interest-pay ing checking accounts nationwide. <br> It would flat preempt and usurp the usury provisions of our state law and constifution," Vandygriff said of the Senate version. <br> "There is not much we can do right now but if they do have more hearings we certainly will be contacting our we certainly will be contacting our congressmen." |  | "waive" Texas regulations on home mortgage loans and, business and farm loans over $\$ 25,000$. <br> The large business and farm loans are still under the constitutionally required 10 percent maximum interest rate. The Senate bill would have the federal unlimited rate take precedence only through July 1, 1980 and give Texas and other states a chance to exempt itself from the federal provision. <br> Home mortgage loans in Texas are under a 12 percent interest maxi- mum. During November the rate was $111 /$ percent, but will go up to the top 12 percent in December, Vandygriff said. <br> The Senate bill would permanently override any Texas ceiling on home mortgage interest rates unless the Texas legislature acted withtm two years to retain the limit. <br> State Banking Commissioner Ro- bert E. Stewart studying the bill and watching developments closely, "So far, as I can tell now, there would be no required changes in our state banking laws, unless it is the usury rates," he said. |
