City of Lubbock may draw more water from **Bailey County field By MARSHALL STINNETT** Journal writer

According to a story in the October 8 edition of the Lubbock Avalanche-Journal, Lubbock may be planning to draw more water from its field in Bailey County.

The story by John Fuquay about possible future sources of water quotes Lubbock Mayor Marc McDougal as having said, "We have wells to the east and west of the city that haven't even been tapped yet . . . and there's the Bailey County well field; we haven't developed half of that field, yet."

The story goes on, "McDougal said the city already owns rights to the Bailey County water, but a new pipeline would have to be built to deliver additional water to Lubbock."

Triple homicide occurs south of Muleshoe

A feud between former friends erupted last Friday night resulting in a triple homicide south of Muleshoe. Larry Kitchens,

51, entered a side entrance of Vince Simnacher's home

Kitchens at approximately 11:45 p.m.

He immediately shot Simnacher, 61,

in the head, Kitchens' ex-wife, Rhonda Kitchens, 48, in the chest and a guest, Derwin Wyn Beauchamp, 43.

When authorities arrived Simnacher was lying face down in a room used for entertaining. Rhonda Kitchens was in a hallway nearby. Beauchamp was lying just outside in a flower bed.

All but Beauchamp are believed to have died instantly. All three bodies were taken to Lubbock for autopsies.

District Attorney Johnny Actkinson told the Journal the autopsy reports would be available in few days.

After the shootings, Kitchens left the house and went home a few miles away.



The Simnacher home is located a few miles east of State Highway 214 south on Farm to Market road 746. Kitchens lived a few miles east of 214 on Highway 746.

There were several other people in the room and the house but no others were injured.

Sheriff Richard Wills put in a call to Texas Ranger Dusty McCord for assistance on the way to the scene.

New computer system to keep track of symptoms

Muleshoe Area Medical Center (MAMC) has received a new computer system that will be maintained by Sandia National Laboratories of Albuquerque, who developed the system. Texas Department of Health (TDH) will monitor the system for increases in activity for certain symptoms rather than specific diseases or diagnoses, according to Barry Wilson, regional manager for TDH of Lubbock.

Wilson visited MAMC on

the hospital on how to use the symptoms of all patients who

are seen in the emergency "The doctors will enter the room," said Wilson, "then we will monitor the incoming information on a daily basis . For example, if we see an increase in activity for "flu-like" symptoms in the area, then we may start checking on possible causes of these symptoms other than the flu."

The system is still in the testing phase and MAMC, along with 23 other hospitals in the Panhandle and South Plains area, will participate in the testing.

listrict opener to Wildcats **Iuleshoe** loses



The Mules began the game against the Littlefield Wildcats with Juan Reyes returning the opening kick 45 yards. A holding penalty called back a fiveyard touchdown run by Brady Black.

The Mule defense held the Wildcats to three-and-out. Daniel Campolla fielded the punt and handed off to Reyes on a reverse and Reyes returned the ball to the Mule 43.

Following a motion penalty, Black broke a draw play 64 yards for a TD with 3:27 remaining in the first period. Black would not be denied on the run and broke two tackles on his way to pay dirt.

The opening two drives by the Mules provided most of the offensive excitement for the Mules. The Wildcats answered with a TD of their own with

8:18 remaining before intermission to take a 7-6 lead and added a second tally with 4:02 left in the game to down the Mules 14-6.

Brady Black had four carries for 81 yards and Brant Hamilton connected on four passes for 29 yards. The Mules

had 148 total yards of offense but Reyes returned three kickoffs for a total of 136 yards and had a punt return for 10 more.


Littlefield rushed for 244 yards with Tyson Reed running for 102 yards and Jonas Comacho picking up 93. Aaron Hobratschk connected on two

of seven passing attempts for 17 yards that including an eight-yard TD toss to Matthew Bussanmus.

"Littlefield did a good job of executing their game play tonight," said Mule Coach David Wood. "We did not anticipate them being able to hang on to the ball all night. They had been throwing the ball a lot and only completed two passes against us.

"Their scoring drive in the first half went 70 yards in 14 plays. At the end of the third and beginning of the fourth quarter, they strung together a 19-play scoring drive that took a lot of time off the clock. We just got bogged down in the second half and didn't execute well," concluded Wood.

The Mules travel to Brownfield to tangle with last year's district champs Friday night.

Mules to tangle Cubs

One week into district, Littlefield, Lubbock Cooper and Slaton remain undefeated. Cooper dropped Brownfield 42-19, Slaton ran over Dimmitt 23-6 and Littlefield out lasted the Mules 14-6.

This week, Cooper plays host to the Slaton Tigers and Littlefield travels to Dimmitt. The Mules travel to Brownfield to tangle with the Cubs on Friday.

That game shapes up to be a battle of the defenses. Neither team has been able to mount much offense the last three games but both defenses are playing well.

"We can not dwell on our loss to Littlefield last week," said Mule coach David Wood. "Remember last year, Brownfield lost their opening game and went on to win the district championship."

"There is still a lot of football to be played this season and we have to go forward. We know our backs are against the wall and this is a very important game coming up. We can not look back; we have got to go and go hard this week," added Wood.

The Cubs return 10 letterman from their championship team with six back on defense and four on offense. They run the I formation on offense and a 50 defense. The weak side veer is their play of choice and prefers the run to the pass.

"We feel after they see the Littlefield film, they will try to just run at us and keep moving the chains. They have some big strong linemen that can move people around. We have to be ready for something like that."

"Defensively, they are as good as anyone in the district.

They held Cooper down in the first half and only trailed by one point."

"We have to find a scheme to be able to move the ball and keep it moving. We are still looking for that spark and will be making changes in our line up this week," concluded Wood.

Players to watch for the Cubs on offense are Andrew Sides at quarterback and Trent Sellers at wide receiver. Daniel Garcia goes both ways and they use him at several positions on defense. Also, watch for Colby Jenkins on defense. Garcia and Jenkins are both big strong boys and can do a lot of things well.

First year head coach, Kevin Pittman, was the defensive coordinator last year. "This is our fourth season in the same system," said Pittman. "We plan on being in the playoffs again."

Friday night is a very important game for the Mules and a win will keep their playoff hopes alive.



PCCA also announced



I can't make myself one second younger, a fact I noticed as I walked through the doors of the funeral home today and looked at the gray-headed guy staring back out of the reflective glass-as if the funeral home wasn't itself reminder enough of coming attractions!

I can't manufacture one sunset, or blanket even an acre of this world's real estate in white snow. I don't have any idea how long the proper gestation period is for mountain goats, or what kind of food a three-toed sloth likes best. Given about two minutes in charge, I'd make a mess out of running this world.

Sometimes I think I can run my own life, and during those times I make a mess out of that, too. Why, I can't even make all of my family's various vehicles run right all at the same time, much less my own life.

And in front of my chair is another example of pretty

much the same sort of thing. My wife and I are leaving on a trip tomorrow, so we're in the obligatory panic before we get everything packed, finished, delegated, set to go, arranged, and planned for, today. And now I'm sitting in my office writing this column.

But before I could even get started, I had to find the desk. I've been running even faster than usual lately, and I seemed to have lost my desk. I knew it was here in this room. Somewhere. But stuff was piled everywhere. Pretty much still is. I've tossed, filed, and arranged a bunch of it. It still looks very bad to someone who is of an orderly nature, but it looks a lot better than it did.

From past experience, I know that this attempt at order will last about ten minutes. In my two-week absence, late at night when no one is here in the church, gremlins-or maybe, more appropriately, church mice-will appear in this room and throw paper everywhere. I know they do that because the paper avalanche seems to happen whether I'm here or not. Those mice multiply the stuff already on the desk. They throw some kind of chemical in the trash baskets to set off the reaction which causes paper to start bubbling over the edges. And the worst thing they do is that they hide stuff. They're particularly bad about that. These mice are maddening!

So, delusions of divinity? Forget it! It's a full-time job just to keep my desk clean, and I've failed miserably. So I'm trying to remember that keeping this world spinning, and keeping my life running as it should, is work for Someone far bigger than me.





Bailey County Judge Marilyn Cox officially declared the victims dead at the scene at 1:45 a.m.

After some discussion, Kitchens surrendered to the officers without incident.

They recovered an assault rifle believed to be the murder weapon.

Kitchens is charged with capital murder and is being held without bond in the Lamb County Detention Center because the Bailey County Jail is full.

Sheriff Wills said he may leave Kitchens in the Lamb facility because it is better equipped to handle this type of prisoner.

before we can determine if there are increases," said Wilson. Apparently, since the system is new, there is no current information on what is normal for the area.

When asked if this system would help solve the problem with confirming the West Nile Virus cases in the area, Wilson said, "It won't help to confirm the cases, but that information from the hospitals will be put into the system and doctors can check the feedback screen to see if the virus is in their area or in surrounding areas," he continued, "This will give the doctors a clue that if there are confirmed cases close by, then maybe their patients with "flu-like" symptoms should be tested for West Nile."


"This system is a diagnostic tool which provides information that makes the medical professionals aware of the possibilities," said Wilson. "For some of those diseases, it is important to catch it early in order to begin treatment as quick as possible." "This system will improve

communication of health information to the providers out in the field," he said.




