Texan Rescued By Soviet Ship In North Atl

HALIFAX, Nova Scotia (UPI) - An unexpected Christmas visitor, a pilot from Texas, dropped out of the sky for a stay on a Soviet weather ship stationed in the icy waters of the northern Atlantic Ocean.

Paul Goldstern of Austin was forced to ditch his small plane in the Atlantic while flying to Ireland. The Russian weather ship Georgy Ushakov picked him up. but since the ship was on stationary duty, Goldstern does not know when he

Unless a passing ship stops for him, the pilot will likely spend Christmas in the company of Soviet weathermen and sailors, 750 miles east of St. John's,

Canadian authorities said Sunday the Georgy Ushakov is assigned to take

else - for perhaps eight months.

"That ship just sits there," said Canadian Forces Capt. Don Robson. "He's just stuck there until a passing vessel might take him on board. Ships that pass in the night, shall we say. They'll have to contact one of them and wherever it

Goldstern's adventure began Saturday morning while he was on a solo flight to Ireland from Gander International Airport in Newfoundland.

With his oil pressure dropping and the single engine on his Mooney 20 aircraft failing, Goldstern radioed a "mayday" distress call and said he was ditch-

A short time later, a U.S. C-5 cargo plane en route from Travis Air Force Base, Calif. to England picked up the downed plane's emergency locater transmitter and spotted Goldstern floating in the frigid water.

The plane's crew dropped two life rafts, and a Canadian coast guard plane also in the area dropped a dinghy, small containers of food, water and flares.

About eight hours later the Soviet ship, the nearest vessel to the crash site. took Goldstern on board.

Capt. Mike Cox of the Military Airlift Command at Scott Air Force Base, Ill., said Sunday Goldstern was in good condition aboard the Russian ship. Airport officials said Goldstern often flew out of Gander as a ferry pilot taking aircraft to buyers in Europe.

Bombs Claimed Sent To Tehran

TEHRAN, Iran (AP) - Foreign Minister Sadegh Ghotbzadeh said today that explosives had been found in mail going to the 50 American hostages at the U.S. Embassy in Tehran, Tehran radio report-

Meanwhile, three U.S. clergymen were heading here from London to conduct Christmas services for the hostages. While quoting Ghotbzadeh as saying explosives had been discovered in mail

bombs were found. Earlier, the foreign minister had warned that some of the tens of thousands of Christmas cards and packages sent here might be boobytrapped with explosives intended to kill Islamic militants holding the Americans at the embassy for 51 days.

"This would produce an atmosphere much more poisonous than their (U.S.) propaganda against the Iranian revolution," Ghotbzadeh said in an open letter to the militants.

His warning was apparently an attempt to woo students angered by a local newspaper report quoting him as saying several hostages would be released on orders of Iranian strongman Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini to mark the anniversary of Christ's birth.

Ghotbzadeh immediately denied the newspaper report, which had provoked fresh student declarations that "only we, who are in direct contact with Imam Khomeini, will decide these matters."

Asked to comment on reports that some of the hostages might be freed soon, the militants' spokesman said: 'Our position remains that either the shah is returned for trial or the hostages are tried as spies."

The latest report came from French parliamentarian Brigitte Gros, who met with Khomeini and other officials in Iran and quoted them as saving three hostages will be freed within the next two or

three days. But Khomeini, in a message broadcast on Christmas Eve by Tehran Radio,

U.S. Policies Draw Attack

LONDON (AP) - The Rev. William Sloane Coffin, one of three U.S. clergymen heading to Tehran to celebrate Christmas with the American hostages, said today he was not afraid of the visit being used for Iranian propaganda purposes. But another of the churchmen said the group wanted to avoid politics.

"I'm delighted to be used, if it's for a good cause," Coffin said in response to a reporter's question during a plane switch in London. "I'm willing to be used at any time to conduct services for people who are in captivity.

"Beyond that, I hope we can be used to try to start the process of releasing the hostages.

Before leaving New York, Coffin said he and the other clergymen might listen to the grievances of Iranians born of decades of "pain and anger.

"We scream about the hostages, but few Americans heard the screams of tortured Iranians," said Coffin, a former CIA agent who became a minister and later spoke out against the Vietnam War.

Coffin questioned President Carter's handling of the crisis, saying the administration's request for U.N. economic sanctions might only stiffen the resolve of the

Coffin, Roman Catholic Auxiliary Bishop Thomas J. Gumbleton of Detroit and the Rev. William Howard of Princeton, N.J., president of the National

Council of Churches, were the first American delegation invited by the Iranian government to visit the hostages. Howard told reporters at London's

Heathrow Airport: "We are going as clergymen, not as diplomats. We will act as pastors to the hostages. We are very conscious of the various questions that must be answered in relation to the Iranian question, but we do not want to address ourselves to them.

Thousands Flock To Bethlehem

BETHLEHEM, Occupied West Bank (AP) - Christmas celebrations in the Holy Land opened today with a colorful procession from Jerusalem to the traditional site of Jesus' birth in Bethlehem.

Monsignor Giacomo Giuseppe Beltritti, the top Roman Catholic clergyman here, led a motorcade of church officials and pilgrims from the walled city of old Jerusalem to Manger Square, outside the Church of the Nativity. The motorcade route was heavily guarded by Israeli troops on the alert against possible Arab

The procession was greeted by drum rolls and a tremendous din of trumpets and bagpipes from a dozen bands assem-

bled in the square, which was decorated in pine boughs, pennants and colored lights. About 5.000 spectators lined up behind police barriers to witness the arrival of the procession.

The patriarch, wearing white and scarlet vestments, was greeted by Bethlehem Mayor Elias Freij and Israel's military governor of Bethlehem, Lt. Col. Yosef Ziv. The three men marched between two rows of priests and monks, who wore white, gold and crimson capes, and entered the basilica, where the patriarch will lead the pontifical high Mass at midnight.

Green-bereted Israeli border police linked hands and formed a protective

church, while troops watched over the proceedings from rooftop positions. Israeli army helicopters hovered above the town, and two Phantom jet fighters made slow turns just below the cloud cover in what appeared to be a salute.

Israeli security forces, taking no chances. Sunday made several preventive arrests of Palestinian residents suspected of plotting to disturb Christmas Eve celebrations, military sources said.

In his Christmas greeting, Prime Minister Menachem Begin said: "May the coming year be one of peace and understanding in our region and throughout the world.

New Rules May Hurt President

WASHINGTON (UPI) - New Democratic Party rules for selecting delegates to the 1980 convention — especially the abolition of "crossover" primaries may hurt President Carter in his bid to win renomination.

Ironically, Carter's people control the committee that wrote the new regula-

The Democratic National Committee has been able to get its own way with a few exceptions. It lost some battles over holding primaries and precinct caucuses before the March 11 starting date the committee wanted for such activity.

The new rules are the work of party reformers from the George McGovern generation of Democrats who began the process after the 1968 convention. Now Carter supporters run the DNC, but their concept of fairness has not greatly differed from that of the earlier reformers.

Since 1968, the number of primaries has increased dramatically and primaries in which the first-place finishers take all the delegates - have been virtually eliminated, as have Democratic primaries that allow Republicans to vote.

The increase in primaries - there were 12 in 1968, 31 in 1976 and 35 in 1980 further reduces the number of states in which delegates are picked in conventions where political machines favorable to incumbents once dominated the selec-

The abolition of "open" or "crossov-primaries — where Republicans could vote in the Democratic battle - also would appear to hurt Carter in his battle with Sen. Edward Kennedy. Carter came from nowhere to win the nomination, in part because he was able to mobilize large numbers of voters who had never taken a strong interest in politics

In the fall election, Carter did not do as well among traditional Democratic voters - especially Roman Catholics and Jews - as have other Democratic candidates in the past.

But he won greater numbers of voters who traditionally are independent or Republican. These people cannot vote in Democratic primaries unless they switch their party registration.

The polls say Carter has continued to do poorly among Catholics and Jews. Additionally, blacks - who were a significant part of his constituency — are thought in large numbers to be moving toward Kennedy because of his liberal voting record.

Five states, including powerful Michigan and Wisconsin where Carter won by razor-thin margins in 1976, had open pri-Neither state is allowed to have them

in 1980, although Wisconsin Democrats are asking the courts to intervene. In 1976, 246 of the 3,008 delegates were picked in open primaries. In 1980, none

The absence of winner-takeall primaries, except in Illinois and West Virginia where such a formula is allowed on a district basis, also should be a minus for Carter because such procedures tend to favor the local political leadership, which usually leans toward incumbents.





NEW YORK (UPI) - A Time magazine poll shows President Carter's handling of the Iran crisis has made him the solid favorite for renomination and reelection.

Time said most of 1.041 respondents in the Yankelovich, Skelly and White Inc., sampling said Carter has dealt with the crisis "just right

The telephone poll of voters, conducted between Dec. 10 and Dec. 12, shows Carter leads Sen. Edward Kennedy, D-Mass., among Democrats and independents by 53 percent to 33 percent.

Many respondents faulted Kennedy for his statements on Chappaquiddick and other issues, and his "misstep" of denouncing the deposed shah of Iran while Americans were being held hostage in Tehran.

A similar poll last August showed Kennedy leading Carter by 33 percentage

In the new Time poll, Carter led California Gov. Edmund G. Brown Jr., by 71 percent to 16 percent.

Matched against Republicans, Carter leads former California Gov. Ronald Reagan by 50 percent to 36 percent: former Texas Gov. John Connally by 53 percent to 23 percent, and Tennessee Sen. Howard Baker by 52 percent to 22 percent, the poll said

A Los Angeles Times nationwide poll released during the weekend said Reagan is at least a 3-1 favorite to win the GOP nomination. But it said he would be defeated soundly by Carter if he ran against the president.

Reagan would run about even with Kennedy, the poll said.

Unwelcome Mat Out For 'Santa'



SCRABBLE, VA.—Once again the Feds have us all agog in Rappahannock County. We have been handed a Christmas present, so to speak-a present we could as easily get along without. Officially, we are now "distressed.

Word of this dubious distinction came a few days ago from the Richmond office of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

It appears that the town of Washington, Va., our county seat, is doubly distressed. It is both physically and economically distressed.

"As a result of this designation," reports the Rappahannock News, "Washington may be eligible for an Urban Development Action Grant designed to assist severely distressed cities and urban counties in revitalizing their stagnating economies and reclaiming deteriorated neigh-

WELL! IT HAD not occurred to some of us that the town of Washington, Va., had any economy whatever, stagnating or otherwise

Since the days when George Washington slept there 200 years ago, our town has had but one claim to fame—a superlative restaurant that

opened in 1968. Apart from the Inn at Little Washington, the economy includes an antique shop, a potter, a cabinet maker, three lawyers and a fellow who makes

dulcimers when he feels in the mood. There's a general store, a real estate office and a small clinic. That's all the economy that comes to mind. It may be small, but it's not distressed.

The HUD official explained how we got in this sorry fix. He had it down to two decimal points. At least 33.77 percent of a community's housing must have been constructed prior to 1940.

Washington qualifies because 75 percent of its

houses were built before 1940. Fact is, most of them were built before 1840, and Peter Kramer is doing over one log house that was built before

IN ADDITION, AT least 11.07 percent of the inhabitants must be at or below the poverty level. In our town, we are told, 14.06 percent of the residents are so situated. We have only 192 human beings in our town.

It looks as if we have qualified by having 26.99 poor folks, which is 5.74 poor folks above the 21.25 poor folks the people at HUD require.

It is hard to know what to make of all this. The idea of an "action grant" makes most old-line

Rappahannockers acutely uneasy. We have not had much action around these

parts since Mosby's Rangers came and went.

Budget-Keeping's Back In Style For The '80s



WASHINGTON-If you don't have a budget, Jaunary 1980 is the right time to start one. If you do keep a budget, now is the right time to re-examine your priorities, perhaps thoroughly overhaul them, surely tighten your controls.

Personal budget-keeping is back in style-and for good reasons. Our total cost of living rose at an oppressively rapid rate throughout the 1970s; prices of many necessities and semi-luxuries sky-

Against this background, it is increasingly essential for you to get the maximum benefit from your income and to protect your savings.

Fewer and fewer of you can rely strictly on your instinctive sense of money management. Fewer and fewer of you should even try to get by with only a loose outline of your living expenses and anticipated earnings.

HOW TO FINANCE not only your day-to-day needs but also your aspirations-that's the objective of people everywhere, in every income group, in every circumstance.

And many of you are seeking help because you have an uncomfortable feeling that you ought to be able to manage better than you do.

If, therefore, you feel you want or need a budget, start one! And get this fundamental point straight now: Your family's budget will be radically different from that of families living near

And it will without question differ in many key respects from any "average" spending-saving pattern of any "average" American family. The average family exists only on paper and its average budget is a fiction, invented by statisticians for the convenience of statisticians.

THE SHAPE OF your own budget will depend directly on your own or your family's individual goals and priorities.

Would you prefer to spend \$6,500 on a new car or on a year of education? Would \$500 worth of color television mean more, or less, to you than \$500 worth of, say, guitar lessons?

There is no sense in attempting to fit into a ready-to-wear financial pattern which ignores your own personal wants and desires.

The budget you draw also will depend heavily on the composition of your family. If you are a young working couple without children you may have relatively low housing costs, relatively high entertainment and clothes costs and a good opportunity to save substantial amounts toward future family goals.

Drastically different will be the spending-savings blueprint of the young couple with growing children and a heavily-mortgaged house.

IN ESSENCE, there is no such thing as an average budget and you should not even look for a standardized format. Search instead for a simple, flexible financial outline to help you achieve the goals you truly want.

Take the trouble to think out your own philosophy of living and your ambitions for the future. Develop a plan of control over your spending Then you will make progress toward the kind of living which means most to you. Although no system in itself can completely

eliminate your money problems the following preliminary notes will certainly help: (1) You must work together if you are married. Your plan must be a joint project and you must talk about a wide variety of things before trying to

put down a single figure about income or outgo. (2) You must provide for personal allowances in your plan-and let each person decide what to do with his or her own allotment. None of you should have to account for every cent of your allowance:

tion of what happened to the food money. Never

permit a budget to become a straitjacket-or it will surely fail. And most important, I repeat, do not try to fit yourself into other people's budgets or try to make the spending averages of other families

solve your own problems. (3) You must keep your records simple. Then they will be fun to maintain as well as helpful. All that is required from your records is a blueprint for each month's spending, a history of where money goes each month and an overall picture to help you whenever a financial emergency arises.

Holiday Goods Swam

TEHRAN, Iran (UPI) - The be-seiged U.S. Embassy has been swamped by more than 1 million Christmas cards, trees, food packages and gifts for the 50 American hostages.

The militant students occupying the embassy said Sunday some of the estimated 1.1 million cards have already been distributed to the hostages, who are spending their 51st day in captivity to-

The students today posted several photographs outside the embassy, which they said, showed the hostages receiving Christmas cards.

Two Christmas trees were seen being carried into the embassy compound Sun-

One of the trees, about 10 feet tall, was wrapped in a piece of cloth and did not appear to be decorated. The other, a little smaller, was decorated with red ribbons, cotton, silver paper and pieces

The small tree was brought to a side gate of the embassy by a Catholic priest, Alfred Picchioni, along with dozens of wrapped gifts, cookies, cheeses and

The priest, accompanied by two women, one from the Italian embassy and an Austrian, was not allowed to personally deliver the gifts to the hostages.

Picchioni refused to talk to reporters. and as he argued with revolutionary guards in front of one of the numerous side gates of the embassy, about 5,000 angry Iranians stood in front of the main gate and burned effigies of President Carter and the former Shah Mohammed Reza Pahlavi. The cold weather did not seem to affect the demonstrators who continuously shouted, "Markbar America," and "Mark-bar Shah" - farsi for death to America" and "death to the

One elderly woman, about 70, pointed her finger at reporters gathering in front of the embassy and shouted, "You journalists stop lying and tell the truth to the

At least 100,000 cards loaded in 66 boxes were delivered to the captors.

Cards came from all parts of the United States and were signed by all sorts of people. Elderly women and men, child-ren, students, teachers, priests and nuns all hoping for the safe return of the hos-tages and wishing them a Merry Christ-mas and a Happy New Year.



Movie Producer Darryl Zanuck Dies At 77

PALM SPRINGS, Calif. (AP) - Movie mogul Darryl Zanuck, a force in American films from "Little Caesar" to "The Sound of Music," was remembered by one of his biggest stars, former child actress Shirley Temple Black, as "a fine

playmate and a good friend." Zanuck, one of the founders of 20th Century-Fox and the last of the major en Age, died Saturday of a stroke and complications from pneumonia. He was

He had been in and out of a coma since entering the hospital Oct. 29 after a heart attack.

Mrs. Black, who was one of 20th dentury-Fox's biggest box-office draws dur ing the 1930s, remembered Zanuck Sun day as a man who "made some very important benchmarks for the industry.

"It's silly to say money hasn't meant anything - but it has never been the primary consideration," he once said. "Actually, nothing has ever given me the genuine satisfaction of taking pictures. seeing them through and then getting wonderful reviews. I love what I'm doing.

Zanuck was born in Nebraska in 1902, a sickly child whose health prompted his parents to move to California.

In 1924, he was signed by Warner Brothers to supply stories for the studio's top star - Rin-Tin-Tin. But four years later, J.L. Warner gave

Zanuck the job of doing the first "talkie," the "The Jazz Singer." That film revolutionized the industry.

Zanuck left Warners in 1933 to form 20th Century Pictures, which merged with the veteran Fox company. For two decades he presided over studio, putting his personal imprint on such films as "Gentleman's Agreement" and "12 O'Clock High.







And now comes safety gear for the illions of boys, girls and grown-ups

who are into the roller skating boom. The National Safety Council is calling for it. Ditto dental authorities and Uncle Sam's accident prevention honchos.

The reason is simple: 92,835 skaters landed in hospital emergency rooms last year. For the first six months of this year, there's a 28 percent increase in severe roller skating accidents compared to a similar period in 1978.

Roller skating sales, estimated at 300,000 a month, are twice what they were last year, say industry spokesmen. And yet sales are running about 50 percent behind demand.

The continuing boom is the reason safety experts want to stem a possible increase in serious injuries.

First off, they recommend exercises in falling gracefully - "rolling when you fall." Next they prescribe safety gear. What kind?

Safety equpment includes helmet or a similar cranium protector, mouthpiece to save teeth, chin guard, knee and elbow pads, and gloves.

All this accident prevention may sound a little sissy and silly to skaters of yestergeneration. But such vintage types sport scars to accompany tales of nearlyfatal episodes while "rollering" on city streets and sidewalks.

The last time roller skating was a household word — dating from the Great Depression — skaters took their chances. The same for lumps, bruises, cuts, split lips, cracked teeth and such.

A skater's most elementary safety maneuver back then was simple. On collision course? Apply the emergency brake. Sit down. It was hard on rumps But what other part of the anatomy

comes with built-in padding? But now millions of young adults are taking up coller skating for the first time

and discovering the hard way skating and falling go together.

Grown-ups, says the American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons, tend to be less agile than youngsters, which isn't exactly bombshell news. They don't fall gracefully. Some, literally fall on their faces.

The adults not only are more likely to fall; but they are taller and have a higher center of gravity than kids. And their hand-to-eye reaction time is slower. As a result, they are less likely to put out their arms or hands in time to protect themselves from falling on their face.

Knocked out, chipped and cracked teeth and jawbone injuries are one result, say dental authorities. But there also are broken bones, torn ligaments, dislocated parts.

Dr. Edwin Joy, AAOMS Public Information Chairman, recommends skaters have custom-made mouthpieces fashioned by their dentist or oral surgeon, if

He put the cost at around \$30 and said such a guard "for the oral cavity and teeth" is more comfortable than other kinds.

The basic mouthpiece recomm by others is the kind worn by boxers. It is made of rubber as opposed to the silicon custom job Joy talked about. Joy, Chairman and Chief of Oral Sur-

gery at the School of Dentistry, Medical College of Georgia, said the custom mouthpiece is good insurance against the facial injuries - especially knockedout teeth. To prevent splintered jawbones au-

thorities recommended chinguards. The kind hockey players wear. Dr. James W. Gusfa, reporting at the

annual meeting of the Michigan Dental Association in Detroit, told about first aid when teeth are knocked out. He was talking about skateboard accidents but the advice applies to roller skates, too. Gusfa recommended a helmet and

mouthguard. Helmet, to protect head; mouthguard, to protect front teeth. He said most skateboard acceident cases involve teeth that are fractured, knocked out or displaced - lodged - in the jaw-The dentist from Henry Ford Hospi-

tal, Sairlane Center, Dearborn, said a knocked-out tooth should be held in the mouth, if the child or adult can do that without choking Otherwise, it should be wrapped in a

clean-wet cloth or placed in water. The idea is to touch it as little as possible Gusfa said time is critical in getting

For an injured jaw, experts suggest making a temporary splint. Place a tow-el or bandage around it and tie at the top of the head.

The National Injury Information Clearinghouse in Bethesda, Md., reports hospital emergency room records show 70,175 roller skating accidents during the first nine months of last year included:

24,084 cuts, scrapes and bruises; 20,719 strains, sprains and dislocations;

25,119 fractures and concussions. The Clearinghouse, run by the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, spots bad acceident trends from unsafe products. The agency said the largest umber of roller skating fractures involves arms.

In "Wheels," a free pamphlet, the CPSP recommended that shoeskates fit a child's present shoesize - not a pair he can grow into.

Skates that fit on regular shoes cost from around \$14 to \$19. The least expensive are all metal. The \$19 ones have plastic wheels. Shoe skates range from \$30 to the stratosphere - \$110 and up.

Roller skating industry spokesmen said supply cannot keep up with demand right now. Some waiting for skates in proper sizes may be necessary in some



 Many injuries come from inexperience, trick skating, horseplay, pushing, lack of attention and improper use. Going up and down stairs with skates on is a case of "improper use."

- Keep skate parts tightened. Replace broken straps at once. Check the skating surfaces carefully. Avoid uneven or broken cement, branches and rocks when skating on

Crashes

The holiday death toll from private plane crashes climbed during the weekend to at least 36, as a result of accidents involving 16 small aircraft in 11 states.

In Southern California, the bodies of three Air Force pilots, and the wife and infant daughter of one pilot, were recovered Sunday from the wreckage of a single-engine Cessna that went down in a storm the previous day.

In Georgia, rescue workers pulled the bodies of an Ohio woman and her three plane imbedded in a marsh and searched for the woman's husband, who was flying the family to a Christmas gathering in

Federal Aviation Administration officials blamed bad weather and poor flying conditions for both accidents and others in New Mexico, Kansas, Utah, Illinois, Wisconsin and Texas.

The Civil Air Patrol in California said the single-engine Cessna carrying three off-duty Air Force officers from Williams

Air Force Base near Phoenix to Fair Oaks, Calif., went down late Friday night near Lancaster, Calif., when the pilot was advised to change his course to avoid a thunderstorm.

The dead were identified as the pilot, Capt. William Martin, 27, Syracuse, N.Y.; his wife, Krista, 27, and their 10month-old daughter, Sarah; 1st Lt. John Graper, 25, San Mateo, Calif.; and 1st Lt. Ronald Sharpless, 26, Chinquapin, N.C.

The bodies of four members of the Marion, Ohio, family killed in Georgia an air search continued today for the father. Kenneth Mattix, who was piloting the plane.

The body of his wife Jeanine was found Sunday — a day after the bodies of her three children — Michael, 15. Ryan, 12, and Allen, 9 - were discovered in the

In Illinois, officials discovered the wreckage of a twin-engine Beechcraft Saturday morning and the bodies of a Wisconsin couple and their 9-year-old daughter. They were flying to spend Christmas with relatives in Taylorville, Ill. Two Madison County, Ill., men also were killed when their single-engine plane plunged to the ground in a heavy

Officials in Texas said a pilot whose . vision was apparently impaired by fog and mist crashed into a hillside near San Antonio. Two men were killed. Another man died in a Central Texas crash.

A woman and teen-age boy from Chicago died after their plane went down in fog south of Brown County, Wis.

Three private planes were reported missing after snowstorms in New Mexico over the weekend.

The wreckage of one plane was found Sunday in the mountainous Pecos Wilderness northeast of Santa Fe and an Air Force helicopter para-rescue unit recovered the body of Mathew Burke of Another plane was found - with its

two occupants alive - In central New Mexico. The search continued for the third aircraft, piloted by Jim Thompson, 50. of Jackson, Miss., in the southern part of the state.

Three Cessnas crashed in bad weather in Kansas during the weekend, killing all of the pilots. Authorities identified two of the pilots, Kalman Febert, 26, and Ronald Moeller, 23.

Florida authorities suspect a twin-engine Beechcraft that nose-dived into a lake in downtown Orlando may have been leaving on a drug smuggling mission. All four men on board were killed. Witnesses said the plane did not seem to be having any trouble before it crashed and sank in 18 feet of water.

Another plane lost altitude and lunged into a Louisiana bay Saturday. A fisherman spotted the wreckage of the plane, which had been reported missing. in Terrebonne Bay near Grand Isle. La. The aircraft, carrying two people en

route from Houston to Fort Myers, Fla. was last reported flying at 19,000 feet when it apparently dropped into the bay 10 miles east of Grand Isle. A pilot attempting to land in Provo.

Utah, during a snowstorm Friday crashed into Utah Lake. The pilot and Bradey E. Ragan, head of the nation's largest tire recapping firm, were killed. One person was killed in a single-en-

gine plane crash near Hot Springs, Ark.

Two men were killed Saturday when their single-engine Bellanca Super Decathlon lost power and crashed nose down on takeoff from San Fernando

clear Regulatory Commission has asked operators of all the nation's nuclear plants to determine whether they used faulty earthquake stress calculations that

have been reported at the Seabrook at-omic power plant.

"Until the problems at Seabrook are carefully evaluated, we won't know what the implications are for the other plants," Harold Denton, director of NRC's office of nuclear regulation, said Saturday.

On Dec. 13, the agency's office of inspection and enforcement issued a notice to the industry that Seabrook's builders, Public Service Co. of New Hampshire, had reported that incorrect "and plified response spectra," quake-proof-ing calculations, had been used in the According to the notice, the builders

"the wrong ARS were used for the design of some containment supports at their Seabrook units," and the NRC instructed all plants to examine their calcu-The order could result in the closing

for repairs of any plant where the prob-lem exists, NRC officials said.

"If, in fact, other plants have made errors in the spectra they used and they've underestimated seismic forces, they'd have to fix them. This would likely lead to shutdowns," said James Knight, the NRC's assistant director for engineering.

"Apparently, somebody made a mistake which turns out to be a significant error, and now we've got to determine how widespread it may be," said Roger

Mattson, director of the NRC's division of system safety. He said the request for review "has gone out to all operating nu-clear plants and to every plant under con-struction — more than 160 operations."

The problem deals with quake-proof-ing requirements determined by possibly faulty computer studies of what the vi-brations from earthquakes will do to the plant and its internal systems.

"This could be serious because of the possibility that inadequate construction and supports of the hundreds of pipes vital to the reactor's safety systems could break during an earthquake," Mattson said in a telephone interview from Wash-The problem surfaced earlier this

month when engineers at Seabrook were responding to an NRC bulletin warning that the published weights of valves used at Seabrook and other plants were incor-

earthquake stress tests based on the revised weights of the values and discovered original calculations were wrong.

Knight said every component in a power plant must be designed and con-structed to withstand the vibrations from an earthquake.

"When an earthquake shakes the power plant, it sets up a response, differ-ent frequencies of vibrations. These high frequencies vibrate pipes and equipment, and if the vibrations are great enough, equipment could react like a glass bombarded with high frequency

sound and crumble," Knight said.

Libel Suit Question Sent To High Court

to the Supreme Court, a syndicated newspaper columnist has raised the question of whether a judge can dismiss a libel suit involving a public figure without first submitting it to a jury.

Washington-based journalist Ralph de Toledano asked the Supreme Court to bar a \$1 million libel suit filed against him by consumer advocate Ralph Nader

from going to trial.

In a January 1975 column, de Toledano, whose work was syndicated by Copley Newspapers, wrote that Sen. Abraham Ribicoff, D-Conn., "not long ago devoted some 250 devastating columns of the Congressional Record to demonstrate conclusively that Nader falsified and distorted evidence to make his case against the automobile.

The auto he referred to was the Corvair. Nader had attacked 1960-63 models of the General Motors Car in his book "Unsafe At Any Seed," saying they were built with basic design flaws.

A committee headed by Ribicoff investigated and in March 1973 published a lengthy study in the Congressional Record. It said Nader's conclusions were based on the evidence available to him, but after reviewing the entire record the

WASHINGTON (UPI) - In a request committee concluded his accusations

were unfounded. De Toledano's column followed, and Nader filed a libel suit against the author and Copley Newspapers, seeking more

than \$1 million in damages. Nader is considered a public figure who, under a 1964 Supreme Court act would have to prove de Toledano and Copley acted with actual malice in printing the remarks about him in order to win the suit.

A trial judge ruled against him.
Th District of Columbia Court of Appeals upheld the judge's decision in the case against Copley, but cleared the way for a trial on Nader's suit against de To-

While the issue was being litigated, the Supreme Court last June issued a new libel ruling in a case involving Sen. William Proxmire, D-Wis.

It contained a footnote that libel lawyer Floyd Abrams said "could turn the world of libel inside out." In the footnote, the court expressed reservations about a current practice or rule that allows a judge to dismiss a libel case involving a public figure if he decides there is not enough proof of actual malice to send the case to a jury.

Fire Official's Vehicle **Bombed In Kansas City**

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) - A city car assigned to Kansas City Fire Chief John Waas was firebombed just hours after Waas, acting at the direction of city officials, fired 10 firefighters, officials

'It's revenge," said Waas, who said he had no doubt the Sunday incident was related to the firings of firefighters. He said the firebombing probably was the work of a radical element in the firefighters' union

However, John Germann, president of Local 42 of the International Association of Firefighters, said that he didn't believe a firefighter was responsible for the firebombing. "It's more likely to be someone trying to cast aspersions on the firefighters," he said.

The firings were the first under a directive issued by the city Saturday ordering fire department officials to dismiss any firefighter who, refused twice to work overtime.

In all, a dozen firemen were dismissed Sunday in the growing contract dispute. The firefighters had been given three-day deferred suspensions when they first refused to work overtime Saturday. When they refused overtime again Sunday, they were given immediate 10day suspensions to be followed by termi-

City officials said 16 more firefighters were given deferred three-day suspensions today for refusing to work overtime on the morning shift. That brought to about 100 the number of firefighters who had been given deferred suspensions since the job action started.

Deputy Fire Chief John Hamilton said today's suspensions would not severely impair the department's opera-

Waas said someone tossed a Molotov cocktail at his car when the auto was parked in the driveway of his home. He said he used a garden hose to put out the fire, estimating damage at about \$500. Police said they have no suspects in

the case. The firefighters have been working without a contract since May 1, when a three-year pact between the union and the city expired, the chief said.

Last week, the city offered the union a two-year, 15 percent pay increase, which would cost about \$5 million. The

union has requested a 20 percent raise to take effect next year, when firefighters are due to change from a 40-hour week to a 48-hour week.

Starting pay for firefighters currently is \$12,132 and top base pay is \$17,928.

City officials stood firm in their determination to continue the suspensions and firings although union officials and fire department supervisors warned that the city's strategy, if continued, could cripple fire protection in Kansas City.

"If the program of suspension continues for the next 24 hours, we will be without a fire department," said Battalion Chief Robert Cornell. "It will eventually catch everyone."

Bell Announces Tax Reduction

Reduced federal excise on telephone service in effect Jan. 1 will result in an estimated \$22.9 million savings during 1980 for customers in Texas, according to Bob McNamara, district manager for Southwestern Bell.

"The tax will drop from its present rate of three percent to two percent," he

McNamara said the reduction is a further step in the graduate phase-out of the telephone service excise tax instituted by Congress in 1973. The tax is scheduled to expire after 1981.


The tax was first imposed on a limited basis during World War I. Repealed briefly after the war, it was reinstated during the Depression. During the 1940s and 1950s the rate was as high as 15 percent on local service and 25 percent on long distance.

Tamale King Gears For Holiday Rush

Ybarra decided 13 years ago he was in the wrong business.

He quit his job at a Firestone tire dealership and started making tamales

Now, folks come from around the country to taste his spicy morsels. He has become known locally as the "Tamale King.

Ybarra and his seven employees work hardest during the Christmas season, since tamales are traditional holiday fare in Mexican-American homes.

Customers place orders earlier each year for Ybarra's five varieties. It's a lot easier than making them at home.

He's turned down an offer to open a Houston franchise. Ybarra says he couldn't bear to leave Brownsville and the two-story wooden structure that doubles as a tamale factory and his home.

"If I go big, there's going to be a lot of paperwork, extra people working and a lot of headaches," says Ybarra with an, ever-present smile

But I'm making my living here. I just want to take care of my place, my family here," he said.

Among his customers is Sen. John

Tower, R-Texas. "He's been buying from me about 21/2 years at 10 or 15 dozen at a time," Ybarra

The late Nelson Rockefeller discovered Ybarra's tamales during hunting trips to South Texas.

Yes, he was my customer for years. He really liked my tamales and every time he was in Brownsville he would get Ybarra said. A picture of the former vice president and Ybarra hangs on a wall above a freezer stuffed with his

specialities. Ybarra gets ready for the Christmas rush three months ahead of time, rolling out about 800 dozen tamales a day. During the rest of the year, he sells an average of 100 dozen a day.

On one side of his small kitchen, several women form tamales. They take softened corn husks; place some masa, or corn paste, on the husks; run it through a machine-powered roller for flattening; add the apropriate filling; and fold up the tamale.

Tamales can be frozen uncooked or immediately placed in large pots to steam cook

Ybarra makes regular tamales, extra

meat, a holiday speciality. The secret combination of masa, chiles, spices and meat came from his parents who sold tamales in the 1920s for 25 cents a dozen. A dozen of his regular orders go for \$2.63 including tax.

spicy, bean-filled, extra large and raisin-

When he still worked at the tire store, Ybarra started making tamales and selling them at night to policemen, hospital workers and at local nightclubs.

When he started selling 40 or 50 dozen nightly, he decided to plunge in fulltime. He's thought of increasing production but always nixed the idea.

"Just so I can make enough tamales for my regular customers. Then I'm always happy," he said.

Outgoing DPS Director Cites Increase In Drugs

AUSTIN (AP) - Outgoing Department of Public Safety Director Col. Wilson Speir says an increase in drug use and a decrease in the speed limit have been among the biggest changes during his 35 years with the department.

Speir, 62, is retiring at the end of this ear after a DPS career that began in 1941 when he left his job as principal of Harmony High School in East Texas. Speir spent three years in military service during World War II.

The long-time law enforcement official was interviewed on State Capitol Dateline, a public affairs Sunday by the Wendell Mayes radio sta-

I had some adventure in my heart, Speir said when asked why he made the switch from education to law enforcement. "And at that time troopers made more than teachers. That probably isn't true any more.

He recalled that drugs presented 'practically no problem' when he began his DPS career

"The greatest negative we have seen is the gain in the use of drugs, as widespread as it is," Speir said. "We have a society that is much more tolerant of wrongdoing than we had 40 years ago.

He said the crime rate has increased faster than the state's population growth.



America's Team

ED SABOL OF NFL Films didn't know how much grief he would cause the Dallas Cowboys when he put the title "America's Team" on their 1978 highlight film, which was released late last spring. He didn't know that he had given Dallas' foes the extra motivation they needed to knock off the glamor guys of pro football.

Really, it all started out as just another day at the office for Sabol. NFL Films glues together an annual highlights movie for every team in the league. They accentuate the positive, of course, and try to eliminate the negative. The objective is to make the fans of each club think their heroes are something special and to sell

That isn't easy to do for a team that has just finished 2-14 or 4-12, but Sabol and his pals at NFL Films rise to the occasion. They manage to give a boost where it is needed. After the Cowboys compiled their worst record in years in 1974, missing the playoffs with a mediocre 8-6 record, their highlights film came out with the ti tle "A Champion In Waiting.

That was a laugher all around the league. Dallas had not won anything significant in three years, since Super Bowl VI, and their great old players were bowing out. Chuck Howley and Bob Lilly were gone and Walt Garrison tore up his knee at

a rodeo and hung 'em up before the 1975 season ever got under way. The team didn't look like a champion, waiting or otherwise.

SOMETIMES SABOL GETS lucky, though, and a funny thing happened to the Cowboys in the weeks following the release of that highlights film. Coach Tom Landry came up with a dozen outstanding rookies and grabbed Preston Pearson

When all the shooting was over, the born-again Cowboys had gone all the way to Super Bowl X before losing to the Steelers 21-17. It was truly an amazing comeback and a pulse-pounder all the way, but the 'Pokes did wind up losing the Big

One. How could NFL Films gloss over that unpleasant fact? Sabol and his crew were equal to the task. When the highlights show made its debut a few months later, it carried the title "Against All Odds!" And after the final scene, you would have sworn that the Cowboys must have been All-World.

DALLAS PLAYERS AND coaches are properly indignant over the extra burden the "America's Team" slogan has placed on them this season. But when you get right down to it. don't the 'Pokes deserve the title? The fans across the country

made the choice, in the final analysis. It is a fact that the Cowboys draw the biggest TV audiences and have the largest radio network in the NFL. Merchandise with the Cowboys' emblem outsells the next three teams combined. Wherever they go, even in New York or Los Angeles. the Cowboys are mobbed by adoring fans.

When ABC and the NFL decided to see if there was a market for Thursday night football in 1978, officials insisted that the Cowboys be one of the competing teams. The Dallas moguls were reluctant, but relented when the video people said the 'Pokes were the only club that could assure a big audience for the inaugural.

So it is no wonder that most of the Cowboys' games are telecast nationally They have a reputation for entertaining the customers and have a vast following across the land.

Eat your hearts out, Steelers!

THIS HAS BEEN a tough season for the Cowboys, with a rash of crippling injuries and erratic performances, but they have set a bushel of records along the way. Their 11-5 record this season makes them the NFL's winningest team during the decade of the 1970s, with 105 victories and 39 defeats. Counting playoff games. their 10-year mark is 119-45.

The Cowbovs just finished their 14th winning season, which is just one short of the record set by the Chicago Bears and tied by Oakland this year. During that period the 'Pokes have won 11 division titles, five NFC crowns and two Super Bowl championships.

Roger Staubach won his fourth NFL passing title, which puts him second only to the six notched by the great Sammy Baugh. Staubach now is the NFL's all-time top passer, under the official rating system, ahead of Sonny Jurgensen and Otto Graham and Johnny Unitas.

Four times this season, and 16 times during his Cowboy career, Staubach has brought the 'Pokes from behind in the last two minutes to gain victory. He may be the best fourth-quarter field general in football history. Captain America leads America's Team!





# Wheat Germ, Manhood

By LAWRENCE LAMB, M.D.

DEAR DR. LAMB -- I read in my encyclopedia that wheat germ contains a male hormone. Since some people take wheat germ as a dietary supplement, is it possible that this hormone will further stimulate primary and secondary male sexual characteristics in these people? In other words, would it result in a deeper voice and an increase in body hair? If wheat germ does have this effect, are there some foods besides this that do?

DEAR READER - I think it might be stretching it a little bit to say that wheat germ contains a male hormone. It's true that the vitamin E which is abundant in wheat germ is essential to fertility in animals. That's how it was discovered: rats that were on a vitamin E deficient diet were unable to produce offspring. Similar effects have not been noted in primates which includes human beings.

Animals and man have different metabolic systems. Just as man cannot manufacture vitamin C, even though most animals can, it appears that many animals need vitamin E whereas man does not need large amounts. Possibly this is because hi metabolic system is able to use other

substances in place of vitamin E. I'm sending you The Health Letter number 4-12, Vitamin E: Miracle Or Myth, to give you more details about the common discussed virtues of vitamin E - if any. No, you can't expect to improve your male sexual capacity. If it does improve your sexual capacity, it will only be a psychological reaction be-

cause you believed it would. There are no foods that the male can eat in his diet that will improve his secondary sexual characteristics. It is true, though, that if a person is on a poor diet, one deficient in calories or essential vitamins and minerals, that such a diet can affect his

health to the point that it will indirectly affect his sexual capacity.

That's one of the explanations of why in many more primitive cultures certain foods were found to have a sexual benefit. The truth is that in such primitive societies food was a scarce commodity and a man who did not get a normal amount of protein in his diet and then started eating socalled sex foods which included adequate protein suddenly found his capacity to be improved. I'm afraid we're not going to find many examples of that in our overfed modern civilization.

The truth is our overfed males may have an increased amount of fatty-cholesterol deposits in their arteries and this can affect their sexual ability when the circulation to the reproductive organs is involved. That's one more good reason for men to stay on a relatively low-fat, low cholesterol diet and to avoid obesity.

## Government Reports Doubling Of Trade Between U.S., China was already China's fourth largest trad-

tween the United States and China has nearly doubled since normal relations were established last January, and could more than double again by 1985, the State Department says.

In a two-page fact sheet, the department said Sunday that two-way trade between the United States and China will reach between \$1.9 billion and \$2 billion in 1979 - compared to about \$1.3 billion

last year. U.S. exports to China could increase to \$3.5 billion to \$4 billion by 1985," the fact sheet said. Considering that the United States' imports from China are running at about 25 percent of its exports, total U.S.-China trade could reach \$5 billion by the mid-1980s, it said, Trade between the two nations in-

cludes crude oil and refined products which the United States buys from China. This year, more than 17 percent of America's purchases from China were in the form of oil imports. The fact sheet noted that "offshore oil opportunities are especially promising in China, where a large group of U.S. oil companies have been exploring in the

South China seas since mid-1979 for oil for the Peking government. Trade between the United States and China is expected to receive a further boost in early 1980 when Congress approves an agreement, signed in July 1979, extending reciprocal most favored nation status to each country's goods.

Key to growing trade between the two nations are agricultural sales, which have contributed to pushing U.S. exports to China to about \$1.4 billion this year. Trade between the United States and

the People's Republic of China began seven years ago when China turned to America for agricultural products grains, cotton and soybeans - as well as airplanes, ammonia plants and drilling

SUCCASUNNA, N.J. (UPI) - A oung Peace Corps volunteer who was held hostage in El Salvador returned to her New Jersey home over the weekend and quietly slipped away to an undis-closed hideaway, her family says. Deborah Loff, 25, has "gone away

now," her 17-year-old brother Gary said Sunday, "I can't say where, but it sure feels great having her back. "Having Debbie back is our Christmas present," said Miss Loff's mother.

Carol. Miss Loff returned to the United States Saturday night and, at a news conference at Newark International Airport. promptly announced her engagement to fellow Peace Coprs volunteer George Like of Portsmouth, Ohio, who returned from Central America with her.

A smiling and tanned Miss Loff told reporters at the airport that she was not bitter about her experience in El Salva-dor. She and 10 other people were taken hostage by leftist guerrillas Dec. 16 as they worked in the central marketplace of San Salvador, the nation's capital. The guerrillas released the hostages

last Friday after winning economic concessions for workers in the marketplace. Miss Loff, a health care advocate in the country for the last 14 months, said she was treated well during her captivity

and added she intended to return to El Salvador soon to "finish my work." "Once I knew no one was going to hurt me, no one was there to harass me .. I felt more at my ease," she told spectators, family members and Peace Corps

officials who greeted her at the airport. When Miss Loff arrived home for the first time since May, Christmas music was playing. Deborah's mother said the music reminded her of the youngsters from the Redeemer Lutheran Church in Roxbury Township who sang carols on the Loff's front lawn last Friday.


