





# Census Bureau Report Shows Taxes Gobbling Up More Money

WASHINGTON (AP) — If you have the feeling that taxes are gobbling up more and more of your money, a new Census Bureau report shows vividly that you are right.

The 643-page "Compendium of Government Finances," released Sunday, discloses that between 1971 and 1977, taxes collected by all forms of government in this country increased by 59.4 percent.

And collections from income taxes — individual and corporate — climbed an enormous 70.8 percent.

The income tax collections were pushed upward primarily by the jump in Americans' personal income over the same period.

With income rising 78 percent, Americans paid taxes on more money and also edged into higher tax brackets, meaning they paid a larger share of their increased income.

During the same period, the Consumer Price Index, measuring the price of the goods and services you buy, increased 45.4 percent, about the same as the increase in sales tax receipts (45.5 percent) and property tax income (45.8 percent).

During the past two years the inflation rate has increased sharply to where it now

stands at more than 13 percent a year.

Overall, income taxes in 1977 contributed \$250 billion toward government operations, compared to \$146.5 billion in fiscal 1971.

The total income of all governments was \$657.5 billion in 1977, up 72 percent from the \$382.8 billion of five years earlier.

During the same period, expenditures of all governments in the United States grew 71 percent from \$399.1 billion to \$682.5 billion. Government debt jumped 61 percent, from \$602.4 billion to \$968.8 billion.

Spending for public welfare and education were two of the most costly areas of state spending.

The states were divided into groups according to how much they spend on education and welfare for every \$1,000 of income earned by residents of the state.

Eight states, for example, had the lowest rates of spending for welfare programs, at less than \$15 for every \$1,000 of personal income. These were Alaska, Nevada, Arizona, Wyoming, Nebraska, Indiana, North Carolina and Florida.

Spending more than \$25 on welfare for every \$1,000 of personal income were California, Wisconsin, Minnesota, Michigan, Illinois, Kentucky, the District of Colum-

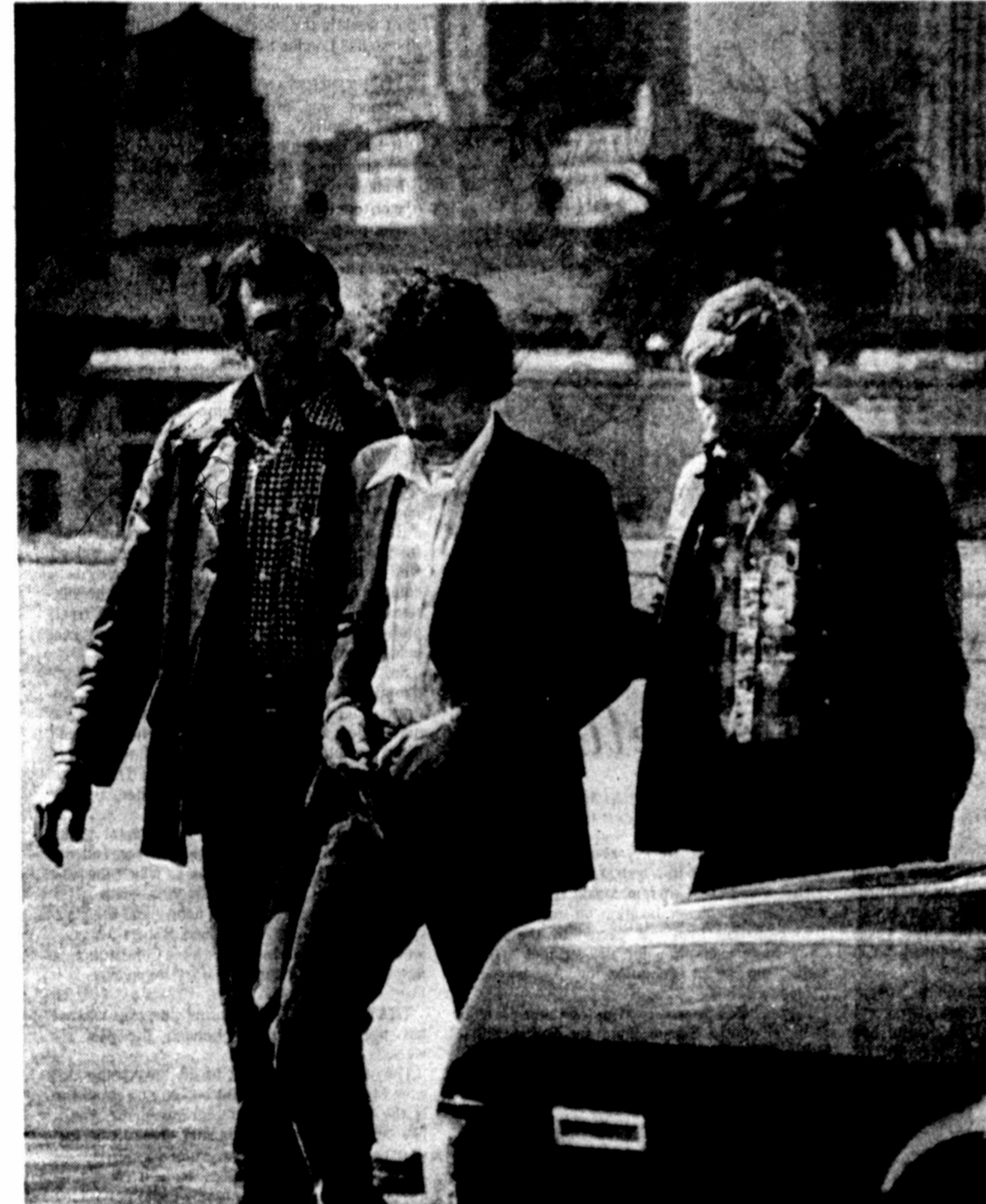
bia, Pennsylvania, New York, Vermont, Massachusetts, Rhode Island and Maine. The rest of the states fell in between those two figures.

## First Lady's Letters Reveal Bond

NEW YORK (UPI) — A 30-year correspondence between Eleanor Roosevelt and Lorena Hickok, author and reporter who at one time covered her, reveals a deep love that the two women had for each other, the New York Times reported Sunday.

The newspaper said the letters between the two women started in October, 1932, just before Franklin Roosevelt's election, and continued until Mrs. Roosevelt's death in 1962. The women wrote each other almost daily and in some cases twice a day.

"Hick, my dearest," began one from Mrs. Roosevelt dated March 5, 1933, a few days after moving into the White House. "I cannot go to bed tonight without a word to you... You have grown so much to be a part of my life that it is empty without you even though I'm busy every minute."

And the next day: "Hick, darling. Ah how good it was to hear your voice. It was so inadequate to try and tell you what it meant."

And the following day: "Hick darling... Oh, I want to put my arms around you. I ache to hold you close. Your ring is a great comfort. I look at it and think she does love me, or I wouldn't be wearing it."

On another occasion, Miss Hickok wrote the First Lady. "Most clearly I remember your eyes, with a kind of reassuring smile in them and the feeling of that soft spot just northeast of the corner of your mouth against my lips. I wonder what we'll do when we meet — what we'll say. Well, I'm rather proud of us, aren't you? I think we've done rather well."

At the time of this exchange, in 1933 when the Times said the correspondence was most intense, Mrs. Roosevelt was 48 and Miss Hickok 40.

The two women knew each other from 1928 through Miss Hickok's political reporting dovetailing with Mrs. Roosevelt's campaigning for her husband.

Miss Hickok was the daughter of an itinerant butter maker and moved to Battle Creek, Mich., at the age of 16, after her mother died. She finished high school in three years and went to work for the Battle Creek Evening News.

Later she worked for the Minneapolis Tribune, becoming the Sunday editor and also reporting on politics and football — even touring with the University of Minnesota football team. Afterwards she worked for the New York Mirror and in 1928 joined the Associated Press.

She reported on Mrs. Roosevelt from October, 1932, until the inauguration in March, 1933, and resigned the following June.

The letters were donated by Miss Hickok to the Franklin Roosevelt Library in Hyde Park, N.Y., in 1958 with the proviso that they be closed until 10 years after her death. She died in 1968 and last year the letters became accessible but attracted little attention.

Now they are to be published by William Morrow & Company in a book called "The Life of Lorena Hickok" by Doris Faber.

Franklin Roosevelt Jr., literary executor of his mother's estate, said he has not seen the correspondence and his request to see the book was denied even though he retains publishing rights to all of his mother's writings.

He said his mother wrote incessantly and with great ardor to both men and women and called her style "very effusive, very loving."

## Republican Senators Want Tax Cut

WASHINGTON (AP) — Republicans on the Senate Finance Committee are launching a new effort to coax Congress into passing a tax cut this year, despite the objections of the Carter administration.

The committee, on a 10-10 tie vote last week, rejected a GOP plan to block the Social Security tax increase due to go into effect for workers and their employers in 1981.

Sen. William V. Roth, R-Del., chief author of that plan, will renew the effort this week. Aides say he isn't sure whether he will try to win one more Democrat for the \$11-billion Social Security tax cut or try to pass a \$30-billion reduction in income taxes.

In either case, the tax cut would be attached to the committee's watered-down "windfall-profits" tax on the oil industry, on which a final review is scheduled Wednesday.

Either type of tax reduction would be financed not from the windfall tax but out of the hundreds of billions of dollars in higher income taxes that the oil industry will pay because of Carter's decision to phase out federal price controls on U.S.-produced oil.

President Carter and most of the Democratic leadership in Congress agree that approval of any kind of tax cut at

this time would worsen inflation. However, Carter has not ruled out support for a tax reduction later if the economy slides toward a deep recession, and Republicans complain that Democrats, who control Congress, want to delay voting a tax cut until 1980 — an election year.

The committee has given approval to virtually all essential parts of the windfall-tax bill but scheduled one last review for Wednesday.

Final committee action on the windfall-tax bill, which would finance most of Carter's energy program, would send the House-passed measure to the full Senate for debate early in November. The tax, other elements of Carter's energy plan and Senate consideration of a U.S.-Soviet arms limitation treaty are the major obstacles standing in the way

of congressional adjournment for the year.

Several major bills will be considered by the House this week, including one to give the president standby authority to ration gasoline in an emergency. The compromise passed the Senate last week.

The measure is not all that Carter asked for, but it would allow him to ration gasoline or diesel fuel if supplies are 20 percent short of demand.

CHALK UP another one for the Marxist forces seeking to take over Africa. Another vital chunk of real estate may be ready to go down the drain, with good old Uncle Sam's help.

# Durango Alarmed Over Rate Of Cancer

DURANGO, Colo. (UPI) — A 1.5 million-ton mountain of leftovers from an old uranium mill — a glaring sign of a once flourishing industry — now has residents of southwestern Colorado wondering what price they might have paid for the radioactive ore.

A local physician, using his spare time to check records at one of the town's two hospitals, says it appears the community's cancer rate might be four times the national average. He and others wonder whether the uranium operations might be to blame.

The only visible sign of the once booming uranium industry is a giant hill of mill tailings on the south side of town. The mill itself has been closed for more than two decades.

Dr. Scott McCaffrey, who alerted local officials to his finding, admits his data is "very raw," but said he believes it is sufficient for a full-scale investigation. He said he found 237 cases of lung cancer in the past 15 years, while a city of Durango's size should have only 60.

Hospital officials say McCaffrey has misinterpreted the statistics, compiling the total number of cancer treatments rather than the actual number of cases. He admits his figures need refining, but says they are sufficient to warrant further investigation.

He has support in his effort from Dr. Stan Ferguson, director of the Disease Control and Epidemiology Division with the Colorado Health Department. Ferguson said studies have been underway for more than two years on similar problems in the Grand Junction area. Similar studies are in progress near the Rocky Flats nuclear weapons plant near Denver and at the Cotter Corp. uranium mill in Canon City.

The problem with the tailings, Ferguson said, is that they emit low-yield radon emissions which could cause health problems to anyone exposed to them over a long enough period of time.

"I think we have to give him (McCaffrey) credit for what he has done," the state health official said. "Working essentially in his spare time — and doctors in private practice don't have a great deal of spare time, working with limited resources and only a couple of people to help him, he has given us some general and rough numbers."

Ferguson said it might be described as a "quick and dirty approach," but he said it was the necessary first step in looking at the problem. He said the initial effort involves simply counting cases and comparing that with how many normally would be expected.

"He has done this," Ferguson said. "Even though a number of potential problems exist with the way he has done it, he had no choice. Now we must put a trained epidemiologist with some resources on the scene and scientifically try to unravel the scene."

Ferguson said the study would take a long time because the problems are so complicated and the work so expensive. He noted the study in Grand Junction, where radioactive mill tailings were used as land fill before authorities realized they posed a health problem, has been going on for more than two years.

Ferguson said a major problem is no one knows exactly what radiation levels are acceptable from the uranium mill wastes. He said there now is a major philosophical and scientific debate over the issue.

Earlier this year, more than 30 radioactive sites were discovered throughout Colorado, including many in Denver. A congressional subcommittee recently released a report saying there were more than 4,000 radioactive sites across the nation.

McCaffrey said he revealed the results of his survey only to bring attention to a potential problem, not to hurt his community. He said both Mercy Medical Center and the La Plata Community Hospital should take part in a Colorado Central Cancer Registry.

"One of the last things I wanted to do is hurt this community's reputation," he said. "Right now, there is no conclusive evidence that Durango's cancer rate is elevated. We have a jewel in southwestern Colorado, and it's still a very safe, beautiful place to come to."

## State Finds Oil Workers Hard To Get

WILLISTON, N.D. (AP) — Laborers from the oil-producing Sun Belt state of Texas are finding jobs in western North Dakota, where an oil boom has dried up the labor pool.

Like many other employers in Williston, Tom Morse needed workers. The area's traditional work force has gravitated to the oil fields.

So the president and general manager of Williston Packing Inc. found the solution to his problem in Texas. "We want steady employees that know how to work, and we will pay to get 'em up here," Morse said.

The company recently brought seven Mexican-Americans from Austin and Laredo to the Williston plant. On Monday there will be three more Mexican-Americans on the job and Morse plans to hire more Texans.

Morse said there are many Mexican-Americans in Texas looking for work. With the help of the North Dakota Job Service and Texas State Employment Commission, he is giving them jobs in Williston.

"We had no alternative but to do this; the labor force in Williston is nil," Morse said.

"If it wasn't for oil, we'd have them (local residents) standing in line 50 deep," he said.

## Army Fraud Trial Begins This Week

CHARLOTTE, N.C. (AP) — The first trial begins this week in an Army recruiting fraud investigation that has led to the suspension of more than 160 recruiters in two dozen states.

So far, the Army has pressed charges only in the Charlotte district, where nine soldiers face court-martial and four others less severe administrative charges.

Maj. Jeff Cook, an Army spokesman at the Pentagon, has termed the Charlotte district "one of the worst." The district covers about half of North Carolina and four counties in South Carolina.

Some families of recruiters in the district are embittered by the Army's handling of the investigation.

Nancy Lloyd, wife of Sgt. 1st Class Harvey Lloyd, recalls when her husband started recruiting in the Charlotte area three years ago.

"He really wanted to put the Army out in the limelight and say this is the Army and I'm proud of it," she said. "This is what he'd stood for, for 15 years in the Army. But of course, it didn't quite work out that way."

Mrs. Lloyd calls the charges "humiliating," but is sure her husband is innocent.

Lloyd, 35, will be tried Nov. 1 at Fort Bragg on charges of covering up recruiter fraud, illegally using bootleg entrance exams and threatening to fire another recruiter if he, too, did not cheat.

Two other former recruiters, Sgt. 1st Class Marshall Jackson and Sgt. 1st Class Clyde Waltman, will be tried Thursday and on Oct. 30 on other fraud charges.

Lloyd, a highly decorated sergeant, once was cleared for work with atomic weapons. Jackson is a former "top recruiter" and Waltman has been decorated for heroism in combat.

# Dayan's Resignation May Hurt Begin

TEL AVIV, Israel (AP) — Moshe Dayan, the eye-patched war hero and political maverick, too often for his liking found himself the lone voice for pragmatism and compromise in the Ben-Gurion government.

But he had an answer for his critics: "I have a contribution to make, and one can do it better."

It was that self-confidence that made Dayan seem the quintessential Israeli, the kibbutznik and daring fighter who led the Jewish state in military victories over the Arabs.

In the roughhouse of Israeli politics, he was equally daring, bolting from the dominant Labor Party once in the 1960s

and again in 1977 to become foreign minister.

With his resignation on Sunday, Dayan may have dealt a fatal blow to Prime Minister Menachem Begin's shaky coalition government. But his statement that he "can't be their mouthpiece," reaffirmed in a most emphatic way what he had been saying for months — that he didn't agree with many of the headline policies of Begin's right-of-center government.

In recent months he found himself alone — or in a minority of two with Defense Minister Ezer Weizman — when Begin's Cabinet voted on Jewish settlements in the occupied West Bank of the Jordan River or on policy in the Palestinian autonomy negotiations.

He was convinced that the Palestinians must be included in autonomy talks and that they should coexist on an equal level with Israel.

His reputation was that of the unorthodox loner. But being frozen out of Israel's main foreign policy concern — the autonomy negotiations — was too much for Dayan.

Dayan's image as a dashing general was enhanced by the eyepatch covering the wound left when he lost his left eye in 1943 fighting for the British in Lebanon.

During the Arab war of 1948, Dayan was a battalion commander who could do wonders with a column of Jeeps, and in the 1956 war with Egypt he was chief of staff when Israel conquered the Sinai Peninsula in 100 hours.

Dayan was made defense minister three days before the outbreak of the 1967 war in which Israel captured vast Arab territories from Egypt, Jordan and Syria in six days. For the next seven years he had almost exclusive control of how the territories and the one million Palestinians were governed.

The early setbacks in the 1973 war, which caught Israel unprepared on the holy day of Yom Kippur, irreparably tarnished Dayan's reputation. He left the government in 1974 when Prime Minister Golda Meir's government fell.

Begin, head of the Likud Party, lured Dayan from the Labor Party into his Cabinet after the 1977 upset elections. From the first day Dayan was a moderating influence on Begin's nationalism. He made his acceptance conditional on Begin's agreement not to annex the occupied areas.

Within weeks Dayan made a secret trip to Morocco to meet Egyptian Vice President Hassan Tohami. The meeting may have set the stage for Egyptian President Anwar Sadat's dramatic visit to Jerusalem in November 1977.

Dayan was chief negotiator through the arduous peace talks with Egypt, often dragging a reluctant Cabinet into concessions that culminated with the treaty signed last March.

The hardliners in Begin's coalition never were happy with Dayan, and he needed them incessantly with statements hinting that Israel would have to deal with the Palestine Liberation Organization in the future.

This summer he revealed that he had held a series of meetings with Arabs in the West Bank and Gaza Strip who support the PLO. When his critics screamed that he was upsetting government policy, Dayan replied, "You can't learn what the Arabs are thinking by talking to Jews."

With Dayan's departure, it is not clear who in the government can take up the role which he carved out for himself: leading Israel to a new form of co-existence with the Arabs of the West Bank and Gaza.

**HEARTLINE:** I am 19 years old and my father recently retired on Social Security. I am going to be receiving dependent children's benefits because I am going to college. I am also receiving the Basic Equal Opportunity Grant and a state grant. Both of these grants combined are nearly \$4,000 per year.

One of my friends said that there is an income requirement attached to this Social Security benefit and that these grants give me too much money to receive the benefit. My father says they will not affect the benefit. But I want to hear it from someone I'm sure knows the real answer. I am now preparing my budget for clothing, food, housing costs and gasoline for the spring semester. I do not want to count on more money than I'll be receiving. What do you say? — M.D.

The grants you receive for the purpose of paying college costs will not affect the amount of your Social Security dependent children's benefits. There is an income requirement for this benefit, but it is based on earned income; in other words, income from a job or other service for which you are paid wages. That requirement for next year, which will affect you if you plan to work, is expected to be \$3,720, but you will have to check with your Social Security office in December to be sure this amount is correct.

If you should work at any time during 1980 and your total earnings are below the amount confirmed by Social Security as your earnings limit, then you will continue to receive the full amount

of your Social Security benefit with no effect, as long as you continue as a full-time student during the year.

**HEARTLINE:** Under Medicare, what is meant by a carry-over deductible? — C.S.

This is a bonus feature of Medicare and relieves you of the responsibility of meeting two \$60 deductibles within a short period of time. The carry-over occurs when a beneficiary's deductible is not met in the first nine months of the year because little or no medical services were received. If medical services are received in the last three months of a year and any of the claim payment is used to satisfy the current year's deductible, that same amount can be applied against the following year's deductible.

Example: Mrs. R. has met \$40 of her annual \$60 deductible by August. In November, she meets the remaining \$20 of the deductible. That \$20, since the expenses were met in the last three months of the year, is then carried over to ply to the deductible for the following year. So she begins the next year with \$20 toward the deductible.

**HEARTLINE:** I am trying to establish a service-connected disability for the purpose of benefits from the VA. My last application was denied and I have already filed notice of appeal. I plan to submit new and material evidence related to the case for consideration by a regional office rating board. Must I first withdraw the appeal before I submit the new evidence? — F.S.

No. New and material evidence may be submitted for consideration to the regional office rating board at any time prior to certification of the appeal and transfer of the claims file to the Board of Veterans Appeals.

## U.S. Mum On Departure

WASHINGTON (UPI) — In a bid to avoid being drawn into a political storm in Israel, the United States adopted a hands-off policy Sunday toward the resignation of Foreign Minister Moshe Dayan.

But the United States warmly praised the 64-year-old soldier-statesman's contributions to the American-inspired search for peace in the Middle East.

Secretary of State Cyrus Vance described Dayan's resignation as "an internal affair of Israel in which, of course, we are not involved."

"Therefore, we have no comment on the reasons for the resignation," Vance said in a statement.

U.S. officials said the administration wants to avoid being drawn into the Israeli crisis. The officials said any intervention — no matter how well-intentioned — could backfire and complicate the situation.

Vance went on to praise Dayan's work, saying "every one of us in our government who has worked with him has the highest regard for Moshe both personally and professionally."

"He is a man whose talents and long experience we greatly respect and admire," he said. "He has made an outstanding contribution, not only to the peace process in the Middle East but al-

so to U.S.-Israeli relations."

An advocate of more Israeli flexibility in the peace process, Dayan read his letter of resignation at Sunday's weekly Cabinet meeting in Jerusalem and then walked out.

Dayan, who wanted a greater role for himself in the Israeli-Egyptian talks on Palestinian self-rule, had threatened to resign before last week's Cabinet session.

News of the resignation brought U.S. Middle East experts to the State Department Sunday, but little more than the bare details were known in Washington hours after the resignation.

"All we have here is what was said on the record in Jerusalem," one official said. "It's really difficult to make an analysis from that. We'll just have to wait and see."

Pressed for a comment on U.S. concerns about the resignation's impact on the peace talks, he said: "It would not be helpful to say any more."

What about the thousands of people who live with mentally ill relatives — not balmy enough to be in an institution,

yet not balanced enough to live alone?

I refer to gas stove burners left on and cigaret burns in the carpets, on furniture and window sills. It's a constant struggle to get the sick one to take his medication and go to the clinic for required check-ups.

It's plenty nerve-racking to live like this year after year. What about THESE people — of whom I am one? — Plenty Stuck In Fairfield, Conn.

**Dear Stuck:** It won't help much to tell you you have lots of company. People are living longer, and many prefer to live with relatives rather than in health care facilities for the aged.

You can insist that the burden be shared by sisters and brothers. You can also contact volunteer organizations who will give you some relief. Call Community Referral Service or the Family Service Association. Explain your problem. There IS help for people like you, but you must aggressively seek it.

**Is alcoholism ruining your life?** Know the danger signals and what to do. Read the booklet, "Alcoholism — Hope and Help," by Ann Landers. Enclose 50 cents with your request and a long, stamped, self-addressed envelope to Ann Landers, P.O. Box 11995, Chicago, Illinois 60611.

## To Your Good Health

**By PAUL G. DONOHUE, M.D.**

**Dear Dr. Donohue:** My son-in-law's brother has Bright's disease. He is 19, and it was recently discovered through a routine physical exam. He understood it to be hereditary, hitting every other generation. Did he understand this correctly?

His mother was from a large family and three of her nephews also have it. It seems to be only the boys. What are the symptoms of Bright's disease? — Mrs. A.T.

"Bright's disease" has an ominous ring, doesn't it?

Yet it is a very general term that means little, really. It's almost like saying "kidney disease." It's necessary to find out what kind of kidney disease one is speaking of. Your letter offers little to go on.

You mention heredity. This idea can be confusing. Medically, one thinks of heredity as the passing on of certain traits (good or bad) to offspring. Some kidney diseases are inherited. That is called "hereditary nephritis." Alport's syndrome is one form, and males are more severely affected than are females. Sometimes persons with Alport's syndrome have cataracts and are deaf. Often red blood cells are found in the urine.

Now, I'm not suggesting your son-in-law's brother has Alport's syndrome. I just use it to give you an example of a hereditary kidney problem.

There are other kidney problems that seem to run in families. That's different than saying they are hereditary (caused by faulty genes). Polycystic disease of the kidneys runs in families. The important point is that kidney problems cannot be diagnosed with 100 percent accuracy from a physical examination alone, although doctors may be able to feel a polycystic kidney, for example.

More detailed tests, such as x-rays or even biopsy, are needed to pinpoint kidney diseases.

**Dear Dr. Donohue:** Can you help me with my ingrown toenail? I cut it too short. It is now growing in and won't grow over the top of my toe — Mrs. A.C.

A surgeon friend of mine, who has his own problem of ingrown toenails, suggested these guides. In cutting toenails, it is important to cut them straight across. Do not try to cut down around the edges. This may be the mistake you are making.

To correct the resulting problem of a nail growing into the skin at the nail bed end, soak your feet in warm, soapy water twice a day. This softens the nail. Then wedge a tiny bit of cotton under the nail at the corners. Leave the cotton in place between soaks. In time, the nail will grow properly (he assures me).

**Dear Dr. Donohue:** Please tell me about adhesions. I have had several operations, and after the last one I was told I was filled with adhesions. I have been having some intestinal trouble and

am wondering if they have anything to do with this. — Ms. E.L.

caused by sexual intercourse. Can you comment? — Mrs. S.M.

Adhesions are nothing more than scar tissue. They form after any abdominal surgery. After all, you have been cut. If the scar forms at a point where it interferes with an organ's function, trouble can arise. For instance, in your case it is possible that scar tissue is encircling your bowel, interfering with its emptying. Bothersome adhesions can be removed surgically if they don't cause trouble they are best left alone.

Bladder infection (cystitis) has been associated with, but not been proven to be caused by, sexual intercourse in young women. One reason for this is that the passageway from the female urinary bladder to the outside is much shorter than the male's. During the activity of intercourse bacteria may ascend the shorter passageway.

If you can relate bladder infection to intercourse, there are specific antibiotics that can be used on a trial basis. They are taken in single doses after intercourse. One example of this kind of bladder infection is called "honeymoon cystitis."

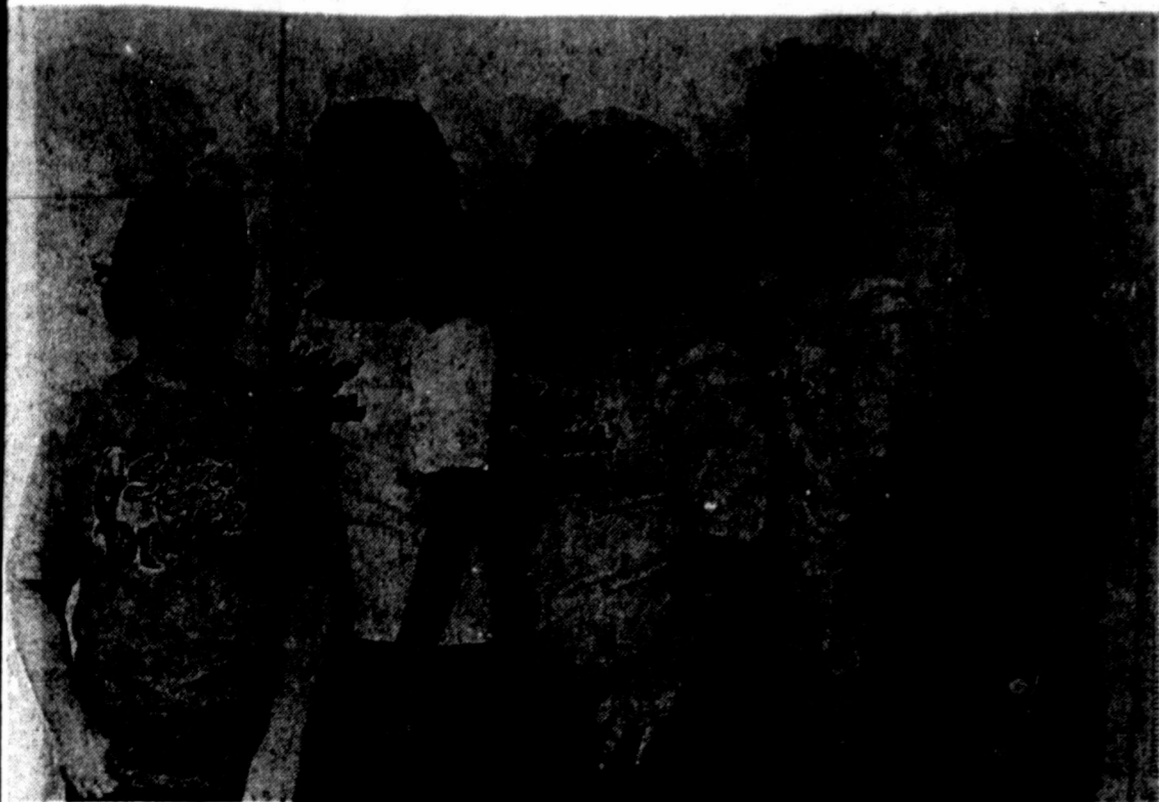

## GOREN ON BRIDGE

Q.1—Both vulnerable, as South you hold:

♠QJ3 ♥93 ♦A754 ♣KQ106

The bidding has proceeded: South West North East Pass Pass 1 ♦ Pass ?

What do you bid now?

A.—The problem is that you are passed hand. If you were not, you could make a waiting bid of two clubs and then raise spades at your next turn. Now, however, a bid of two clubs wouldn't be forcing, and you can't risk partner leaving you there. The practical solution is to jump to three spades. We prefer having four trumps for this action, but there is no other good bid available.

Q.2—Neither vulnerable, as South you hold:

♠954 ♥Q72 ♦K1082 ♣KJ5

The bidding has proceeded: West North East South 1 ♦ Dble. Pass ?

What action do you take?

A.—Facing a takeout double, you have a reasonable hand, and you should make some effort to express your strength to partner. One diamond is inadequate, and two diamonds misdescribes your distribution. The only bid worth contemplating is one no trump—opposite a minor-suit takeout double, this shows about 8-11 HCP's, values in the opponent's suit and balanced distribution.

Q.3—As South, vulnerable, you hold:

♠Q63 ♥753 ♦KJ62 ♣532

The bidding has proceeded: North East South West 1 ♦ Pass 1 ♦ Pass 1 ♦ Pass ?

What action do you take?

A.—You have done your duty by giving partner one chance. Since you are prepared to play one spade, there is no point in giving preference to a higher level.

Note that opener's bid of a new suit at the one level is not forcing. If partner wanted to insist on hearing from you again, he could have jumped to two spades.

Q.4—Both vulnerable, as South you hold:

♠73 ♥AK1074 A93 ♣KQJ

Your right-hand opponent opens the bidding with three spades. What action do you take?

A.—The preempt has achieved its purpose—it has placed you in a difficult spot. The one bid you should not consider is four hearts—your suit is not good enough. That was the action taken by the person who submitted this problem and it cost 1100 points. We would show our strength with a takeout double. That gives us all sorts of additional options. Partner can pass for penalties, or remove to a minor suit at the appropriate level.

Q.5—As South, vulnerable, you hold:

♠A4 ♥AQ74 ♦A85 ♣AQ76

The bidding has proceeded: West North East South Pass Pass 1 ♦ Dble. 1 NT 2 ♥ Pass ?

What action do you take?

A.—It sounds as if you are playing with a pinhole deck. Apparently, the opposition is taking advantage of the vulnerability to attempt a bit of highway robbery. Don't let them get away with it. Since you have excellent support for partner's suit and extra values, jump to four hearts to clarify matters for partner.

Q.6—Neither vulnerable, as South you hold:

♠J ♥KQ93 ♦765 ♣AQ965

The bidding has proceeded: North East South West 1 ♥ Pass 2 ♦ Pass 1 ♦ Pass ?

What do you bid now?

A.—Partner has shown a very strong hand with his jump shift to three diamonds. Your hand has the playing value of a full opening bid, so slam is sure. Jump to six hearts. If there is a grand slam in the hand, partner should now be able to bid it. Your action must show excellent trumps, the ace of clubs and only one loser in spades. With any other distribution, your leap to slam wouldn't be justified.

Q.7—As South, vulnerable, you hold:

♠104 ♥81006 ♦AKJ9 ♣K99

The bidding has proceeded: North East South West 1 ♦ Pass 1 ♦ Pass 1 NT Pass ?

What action do you take?

A.—In terms of high cards, you have only 12 points, but that is not an accurate measure of the value of your hand. Your king in partner's suit should be upgraded. In addition, the placement of tens and nines that you hold give your hand excellent "body" and should combine well with honors in partner's hand. Take the pressure off partner by jumping to three no trump.

Q.8—Neither vulnerable, as South you hold:

♠KQJ2 ♥5 ♦AJ097 ♣KQ75

The bidding has proceeded: North East South West 1 ♥ 2 ♦ Dble. Pass Pass Pass ?

What is your opening lead?

A.—This is not the sort of hand where you want to score ruffs with your low trumps. Instead, you should try to force declarer to ruff once or twice and lose control of the hand. Therefore, do not lead your singleton heart. Lead the king of spades. You will have plenty of time to shift to a heart if it seems expedient to do so.

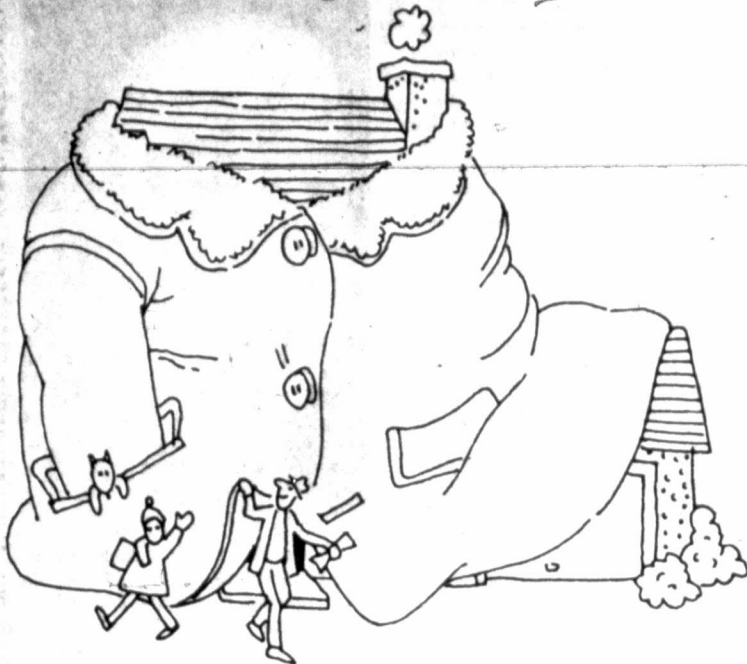

# Insulating Homes Saves Money, Energy



**COAT FOR A HOME** — The family may have to make due with last winter's coats if you buy your home a coat of insulation this year. But that investment will be repaid within five years by lower heating and air-conditioning bills, says the Energy Department.

Don't wait to insulate if you can possibly afford to do it now.

The Energy Department calculates that the cost of insulating the average home will be repaid within three-to-five years by reduced heating and air-conditioning costs.

You can deduct from your income tax 15 percent of the first \$2,000 spent to insulate your "principal residence." That means a tax credit of up to \$300. (Consult the Internal Revenue Service for more information on tax incentives for insulation and other energy-saving home improvements.)

Make a top-to-bottom survey of your home to determine how much insulation

Begin with the attic if you can only afford to do part of the job now. Next in importance is exterior walls, followed by floors over unheated areas and basement, crawlspace and foundation walls.

You can insulate the attic and other unfinished surfaces yourself if you are reasonably handy. But proceed slowly and carefully.

Insulation can irritate skin and lungs, so wear long pants, a long-sleeve shirt, gloves and a face mask. Be sure the area you are insulating is well-lighted; watch out for those nails!

Do not place insulation over or within 3 inches of heat-producing equipment. In the attic, lay boards over joists for a walkway; otherwise you might fall through the ceiling of the room below.

You can insulate the attic by spreading batts, blankets or loose fill between joists. For ceilings of basements and crawl spaces, the recommended method is to attach wire mesh or chicken wire to the bottom of beams; then slide batts or blankets between the wire and the ceiling.

Damp insulation does your home no good and can even cause structural damage. That's why a vapor barrier is placed between the insulation and the surface insulated.

Batts and blankets can be purchased with barriers attached. The barrier should always face the inside of the home. Remove the barrier from any batt or blanket you are adding on top of existing insulation. If you are using loose fill, you can make a vapor barrier from plastic sheeting.

Also make sure the insulation is adequately ventilated; never block vents with insulation material. And make sure there are no leaks in your roof before you insulate.

Most libraries and bookstores offer publications on do-it-yourself insulation. One good manual is "How To Keep Your Home Warm in Winter, Cool in Summer" (Cornerstone Library), originally prepared for the Housing and Urban Development Department.

Do you have finished walls to insulate? Or do you just prefer to have a professional do your insulating?

Select your contractor carefully. Ask recommendations from homeowners, local chapters of home builders' association and government or non-profit home-improvement assistance centers.

Check an insulation firm's references as well as how long it has been in business. Find out if any complaints have been filed against it with the Better Business Bureau. Get estimates on your job from several contractors.

When you decide on a firm, make sure you agree on how much and what kind of material is to be used and what R-values are to be achieved. Insist on a written contract spelling out everything you expect the contractor to do.

Can't afford to insulate? Don't give up without checking with the local anti-poverty agencies to see if they offer free or low-cost winterization programs.

## First In A Series

— if any — you already have. Check the attic, exterior walls and floors above unheated basements, garages and crawl spaces.

These are the types of insulation you may find in your survey:

Batts and blankets are sheets of rock and wool or glass fiber. Batts come in 4- and 8-foot lengths; blankets come in continuous rolls that are cut length. They are used most often in unfinished attics, basements and crawl spaces.

Loose fill is poured into place, primarily on unfinished attic floors. It is made of such materials as rock wool, glass fiber, cellulose fiber, vermiculite and perlite.

Brown fill is the only insulation that can be added to finished areas such as walls. Made of loose fibers or plastic foam, it is blown into place by professionals using special pneumatic machinery.

Rigid boards made of plastics or fibers are used on basement masonry walls and exterior walls under construction. The boards must be covered by gypsum board or other finishing material for fire safety.

Measure the depth of any existing insulation. For finished walls, remove the light switch and shine a flashlight into the opening to check for insulation; don't forget to turn off the electricity to the switch first.

Chances are you need more insulation if you have less than 6 inches in the attic and less than 3 inches in exterior walls and under floors above unheated areas.

Contact an insulation contractor, building-supply dealer or utility company for the precise R-values of insulation recommended for your community. R-values refer to the insulation's resistance to heat passage. The higher the R-value, the better the insulation guards against heat loss in winter and heat gain in summer.

R-value and thickness are not the same; for example, a 4-inch glass-fiber blanket has the same R-value as 6 inches of loose glass-fiber fill.

Now determine the total square footage of the surfaces to be insulated.

## Bureaucrats Blamed For Lack Of Funds

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — Tennessee's crime victim compensation fund, the only one in the nation collected strictly from the pockets of felons, is almost as empty as the wallet of a man who has been mugged.

This week, the ledger shows \$13,676.11 available to pay approved claims of \$56,820.36. But bureaucrats, not deadbeat jailbirds, are to blame — they have not enforced the law.

At last count, 26 states had victim compensation funds of some sort. Tennessee's, the only one without access to the general fund, is the only one in trouble.

Established by the Criminal Injuries Compensation Act of 1976, the Tennessee fund is supposed to pay people up to \$10,000 for losses and personal injuries suffered at the hands of robbers, rapists, murderers and the like. If the victims die, their heirs collect.

The money comes from two sources: a \$21 court fee tacked on to each conviction for a crime

have not. Since the law went into effect in 1977, they have gathered a scant \$160,000. "They just flat out ignored the law," Cobb said.

The Department of Correction was supposed to take up some slack, beginning July 1, by picking up the \$5. But for three months, no one has paid a dime.

Clerk collections have been so thin that claims could not even be accepted for two years. Only about \$7,500 a month has come in since February when the first claim — \$4,071.80 to a man mugged in McMinnville — was finally paid. There was \$84,000 in the kitty then — there should have been about \$2 million.

"I knew it would take time for the general public to catch on to the law," Cobb said. "But what I didn't think is that it would take state officials or local officials so long to catch on to the law."

He blames the problems on bureaucratic inertia. But he said things are improving — of 29 claims submitted since February, 21 have finally been paid.

Court clerks are supposed to collect the \$21 court fee. Most

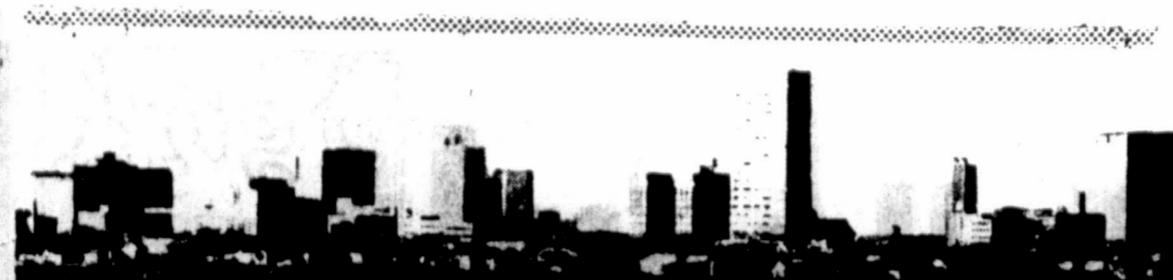

# THE HUNDRED GUNMEN

Fearsome horns curve up over replica samurai helmet worn by member of "Hundred Gunmen."



Modern "samurai" wears lion kabuto, or helmet, designed to intimidate enemies with its ferocity.

Tokyo's "Hundred Gunmen" bring the past to life—with their fearsome displays of samurai armor, swords and guns. The group, beliving its name, now has about four hundred members whose nostalgia for ancient traditions has inspired them to equip themselves with replicas of the impressive regalia of feudal warriors, which they bring out and parade for public events and celebrations. The members of the group seen in these photographs were taking part in a Tokyo street festival.

The word samurai in Japanese means warrior, basically. It was used specifically to designate the hereditary military aristocracy from the 11th century up to about a hundred years ago, although use of the term for a social group continued until it was officially abolished after World War II.

Finely crafted swords were a perennial mark of the samurai class. But they did take up guns with alacrity soon after firearms first appeared in Japan, introduced by the Portuguese in 1543. Hence the name "Gunmen" used by these latterday warriors, who also sport armor, swords and helmets. The armor and helmets may be replicas, but their guns are more often genuine antiques, some of them dating back to the 16th century. Photographed by Tsugafumi Matsumoto.

Grogan, Pats Turn Tables On Dolphins

Coach Ron Erhardt of the New England Patriots was pleased with "a great team effort," but paid a special salute to veteran quarterback Steve Grogan, often the target of hometown critics.

"That's got to be his best game this year — real good," Erhardt said after Grogan set up two touchdowns with long passes and then fired a strike for an insurance score in rallying the Patriots to a 28-13 victory over the Miami Dolphins.

"It was a battle for first place, and they won," said Miami coach Don Shula. "I'm disappointed and embarrassed by the way we played. We were taking it to them, both offensively and defensively, but then we blew a couple of great opportunities.

"In the second half, they just dominated us, and I'm disappointed that we didn't rise to the occasion."
The sole ownership of first place in the National Football League's American Conference East at stake, the Dolphins charged to a 13-0 lead. However, Grogan rallied New England late in the first half and the Pats went on to hike their record to 6-2, one game ahead of Miami.

"Over all, we put the whole thing together against a good football team," Erhardt said. "The defense was slow starting, but after it got settled down, it played super. And offensively, we started to move the ball the way we can.
New England took command after Miami had moved in front 13-0 on a 40-yard field goal by Uwe von Schamann at 9:38 of the second period.

The Patriots moved right back to get on the board, marching 69 yards in seven plays. Grogan passed to Stanley Morgan for 41 yards and a first down at the Miami six, and four plays later, Horace Ivory went off his right tackle for one yard and the score.
New England, given a big lift by an aroused defense, went in front to stay early in the second half after George Roberts' 30-yard punt went out of bounds at the New England 41.

The Patriot moved to a first down at the Miami 47, and Grogan hit Harold Jackson with a pass for 35 yards and a first down at the 12. Three plays later, Sam Cunningham plunged into the end zone from one yard out.

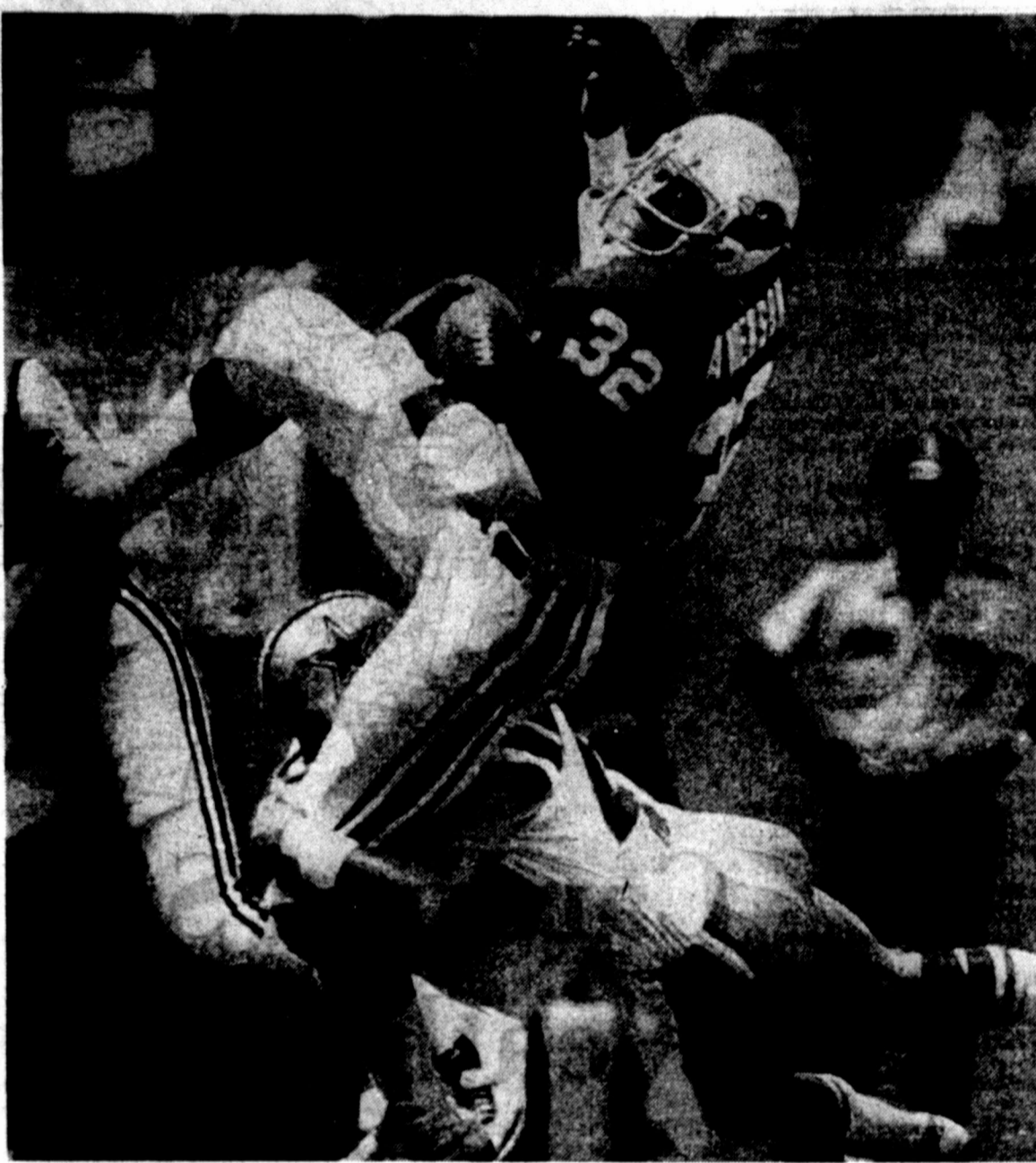

 Another fast gun from Texas tries its luck this Saturday in Arkansas in what is fast becoming a series of shootouts against Razorback Coach Lou Holtz's saucy crew for Southwest Conference football supremacy.

This time Houston must motor to the Ozark for a showdown in Fayetteville with the same unbeaten and untied credentials the Texas Longhorns possessed only a week ago.

You may have heard that Arkansas shot the Longhorns down 17-14 over the weekend. At least if you were in Little Rock you would have heard about it as fans celebrated far into the night.

Hundreds of miles away Houston Coach Bill Yeoman could scarcely enjoy the Cougars' 37-10 rout of Southern Methodist without thinking about the unbeaten Hogs.

"We have got to get tougher mentally, tougher in the head," said Yeoman. "Can we beat Arkansas? Naw, not as tender as we are on offense."

"The whole season we haven't been tough enough. By that I mean by not scoring when we get inside the five. It's a tone, an edge, a frame of mind. Something is missing, and whatever is missing we need to get it."

Yeoman said starting quarterback Delrick Brown "has to get tougher mentally. If you are going to compete, you have got to have a tough head on your shoulders."

"The second half we played with more intensity but we haven't jelled yet, and it gets frustrating. There's a lot of work to be done."

Holtz also warned his players to temper their celebration.

"This was not a pardon," said Holtz. "This was merely a reprieve. Next week we have to play the Houston Cougars and I don't have to tell you about them. We are not a great football team."

In other games Saturday, Baylor mauled Army 59-0. Texas Tech ripped Rice 30-7, and Texas Christian downed Tulsa.

The Southwest Conference is now 17-8-1 against outside competition — one of its finest non-conference records in years.

This week, the Houston-Arkansas game will be televised with the time to be set by ABC-TV. TCU is at Baylor, Texas A&M is at Rice, and Texas is at SMU.

Actually it wasn't the S.G. who determined that — it was the ol' H.C. (Head Coach) who decided newspaper could be harmful for the Matadors' district championship chances.

The scene was Lowrey Field, Saturday night and the Matadors had just disposed of the Dumas Demons 26-6 in the district 1-AAA opener for both schools. EHS coach Louis Kelley was asked just what was wrong with the Mats. A strange question, you say.

Not really, considering the Demons are 1-5 on the year and crippled by injuries. Yet, as they did the week before against Lamesa, the Mats were hardly awesome in their victory.

"I don't know what's wrong with us," said Kelley after the game. "But one problem is that these kids read the newspaper just like everybody else."

"They keep reading about how good they are and they start believing it," he added with a smile.

The theory is that too much praise can be as bad for morale as not enough ink.

Although it's possible that all the attention may have slowed the EHS offense, it hasn't done much to dampen

the Mat defense. Estacado is allowing only 118.8 yards an outing after six games and has given up a scant 20 points all year.

But before the Mats start letting their heads swell out of their helmets, let's get to the bad news. Estacado's kicking game is weak. Against the Demons, the Mats punted five times for a 26-yard average and were two-of-three in the PAT department.

That 26-yard punting average included a four-yarder that gave the Demons their best field position of the night.

"James Rose's ankle has been sore," explained Kelley. "So he really hasn't been able to work on his punting."

But as long as Rose continues to play well on offense and defense — no one is going to say anything about his punting average. Rose caught a six-yard touchdown pass against the Demons Saturday on a crucial third-and-six situation.

The Mats also came up with yet another running back Saturday as sophomore Greg Drones stepped in for injured Alvin Davis and provided 63 yards of total offense and scored a touchdown.

"I think Alvin's going to start getting well pretty fast after he saw the way Drones played," commented Kelley.

Other 1-AAA winners in the first week were Levelland (a 42-6 whipping of Dunbar) and Canyon (20-7 over Borger). And if the Mats have had too much publicity, maybe the Lobos haven't had enough.

Levelland is now 3-3 on the year, and with its 42-point explosion against Dunbar nearly doubled its scoring total for the year.

Although Estacado took a 20-point win against Dumas, the Mats dropped out of first place in the Avalanche-Journal's Class AAA Top Five.

The Pecos Eagles (7-0) moved into the top spot with a 14-3 decision over Andrews. The Eagles are the only remaining unbeaten team in the South Plains and, along with Odessa Ector, are in the drivers seat in the 2-AAA race.

Ector defeated Fort Stockton 27-7 Friday night to stay in the picture. Pecos will travel to Odessa this Friday to meet Ector in a battle that should decide the district 2-AAA champion.

The Eagles will take the No. 1 AAA

offense into the contest while Ector isn't far behind. Pecos has piled up an incredible 324.2 yards an outing and scored 169 points.

Meanwhile in district 3-AAA play, San Angelo Lake View took a big step towards a loop title by defeating Snyder 6-3 in a defensive struggle.

But guess who's tied with Lake View for the loop lead? It's none other than the much-maligned Lamesa Golden Tors, who defeated Sweetwater 7-2. Lamesa is 1-6 on the year, but, more importantly, 1-0 in loop play.

The Tors face Snyder this week so the party may be over. But for seven glorious days, Lamesa will be tied for the district lead. And that's nothing to laugh at.

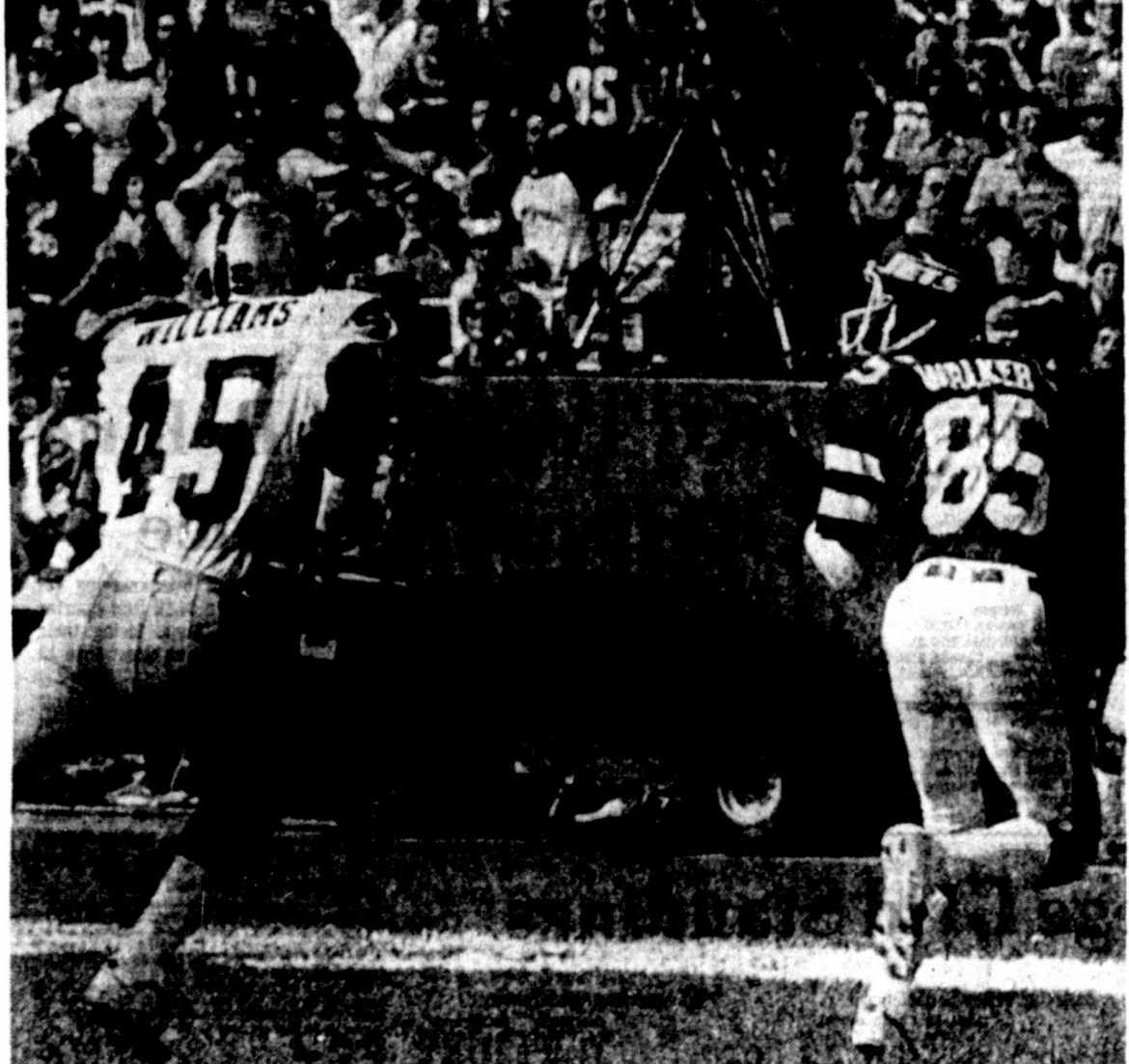

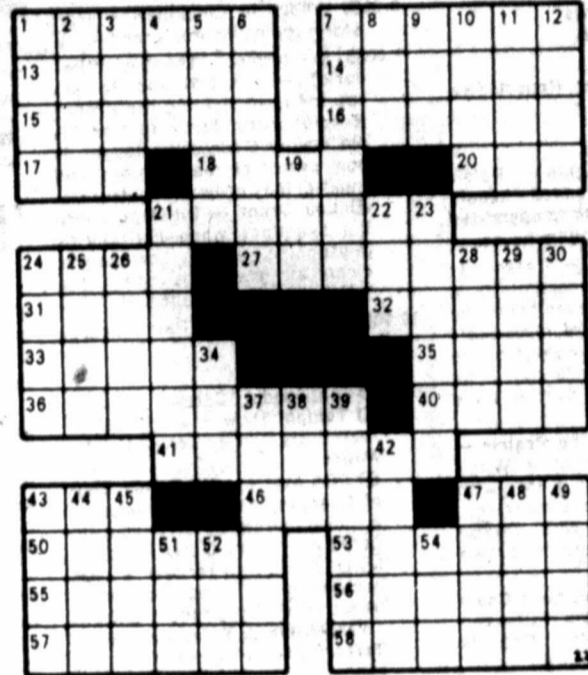

## Sesame Street Project To Operate In Prison

HARTFORD, Conn. (AP) — Inmates at the maximum-security prison in Somers will soon be teaching numbers and letters with the help of Big Bird, Oscar the Grouch and Grover.

Late next month the Board of Parole room at the state prison will be turned into the Sesame Street Play Group Project on weekends providing entertainment and education for the children of inmates visiting their fathers. The teachers will be seven inmates.

The Children's Television Workshop, creators of Sesame Street and The Electric Company for public television, now run similar programs at 15 correctional institutions around the country, but Somers is the first maximum-security prison to have such a program.

Women in Crisis, a Hartford-based group helping the wives of prison inmates, worked with the Connecticut Corrections Department, the television workshop and the Hartford Junior League to bring the program to the prison.

Susan Fishman of the women's program said the playroom is not just a baby-sitting service but is designed "to give the children the chance for a positive experience at the institution and to give the inmates a chance to understand children more and have better parenting skills."

She said children are often frightened and confused when they go to the prison to see their fathers, especially in its maximum-security atmosphere.

Having the Sesame Street project available also gives parents needed time alone together, Miss Fishman said.

Inmates at Somers are allowed only one-hour visits every other weekend and one two-hour period during the week, she said.

"The parents will have a good, quiet time together," Miss Fishman said.

Andrew Guidry of the television workshop in New York City said that the lack of facilities for children is one reason why the program was begun five years ago at two prisons in Texas.

"That frees the parents to talk to each other. They may have pressing issues and because of incarceration they haven't been able to talk," Guidry said in a telephone interview.

## Kennedy Library Expects Million Visitors Yearly

BOSTON (AP) — The John F. Kennedy Library opens to the public today following dedication ceremonies that featured President Carter and members of the Kennedy family. Officials said they expect 1 million visitors in the first year.

The \$21 million glass and concrete triangle, cube and circle overlooking Boston Harbor was dedicated Saturday by Carter, Sen. Edward M. Kennedy and other members of the senator's family.

In addition to a display of Kennedy memorabilia and a film about the 1,000-day administration of the late president, the library contains 28 million pages of documents.

These include Kennedy's papers from his days as a Harvard student through his years as 35th president of the United States.

They also include the papers of Sen. Robert F. Kennedy, assassinated as was his older brother, and papers of others identified with the same period. Ernest Hemingway's family donated some handwritten manuscripts of some of the author's major works.

Admission is free to senior citizens and those younger than 18. Others pay 75 cents. The library will be open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily, except Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Year's.

Built with private funds, the library

is part of the National Archives system and is operated by the General Services Administration.

The keys to it were presented to Carter by John F. Kennedy Jr., son of the late president.

John Jr. was three days short of his third birthday when his father was killed on Nov. 22, 1963. He substituted for his grandmother, Rose Kennedy, 89, who was in Hyannis recovering from recent surgery.

A tour of the library includes a 30-minute film and opportunities to see the Kennedy rocking chair, the flag from PT-109, the gown Jacqueline Kennedy wore to the inauguration, the family Bible and Robert Kennedy's Harvard letter sweater.

There are campaign buttons, slogans exchanged by Kennedy and Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev during the Cuban missile crisis, and a glass-enclosed replica of the Oval Office as it looked when Kennedy was president.

Tapes of presidential news conferences and scenes from a typical White House day are shown in mini-theaters.

There are six other presidential libraries: Hoover, Roosevelt, Truman, Eisenhower, Johnson and Ford.

## Physicist To Lecture At Tech

"Comets" will be the subject for a Texas Tech University public lecture Wednesday by Dr. Ray H. Garstang, internationally known astrophysicist and professor of physics and astro-geophysics at the University of Colorado.

Garstang will be a guest lecturer in the Texas Tech department of Physics as a part of a Harlow Shapley Visiting Lectureship Program sponsored by the American Astronomical Society.

His public lecture will be at 7:30 p.m. in Room 57 of the Texas Tech Science Building. There is no charge and the lecture will be non-technical.

Garstang will also give a technical lecture, "Atoms in High Magnetic Fields and White Dwarf Stars," in Room 60 of the Science Building at 3 p.m. Thursday. This lecture is one of the Physics Colloquium Series of special interest to scientists.

A native of England, Garstang earned the doctoral degree at the University of Cambridge.

## Writers' Chairman Dies

KIEL, West Germany (AP) — Author Richard Friedenthal, honorary chairman of the West German center of PEN, the international writers' organization, died Friday after suffering an embolism in his lungs, it was announced Sunday. He was 83.

A hospital spokesman said Friedenthal, who had resided in London since fleeing the Nazis in 1938, was visiting friends in Kiel when he was stricken. An embolism is a blood-vessel blockage.
