## ANNOUNCING <br> Service Charge EFFECTIVE FEBRUARY 1st

In order to defray actual costs for banking services and charges made for Federal Deposit Insurance, the following service charge schedule will become effective Saturday, February 1st.

Against the makers of all checks which are returned for insufficient funds, there shall be assessed a charge of 25 cents. NEW ACCOUNTS-
A charge of 50 cents will be made for opening a new account with an initial deposit of less than $\$ 50.00$. This charge is to be waived where the account is interrelated with a profitable account, or where the account proves profitable over a period of time.
FLOAT or EXCHANGE CHARGE-

On larger amounts 17 cents per $\$ 1000$ per day until collected. This charge will be waived where the customer depositing or cashing such checks maintains a balance sufficient to cover cost to bank of absorbing float or exchange charge.

Cream checks and cotton checks issued by companies that have made arrangements to absorb this float or exchange charge.
