



One would hardly suspect the Texas flag, with all its simplicity of being a geometrical problem, but so it is. Its width must be equal to twothirds of its length, and the three stripes must be exact duplicates of each oher in size, with the blue at the side, the white at the top and the red at the bottom. The diameter of the circle passing through the five points of the star is equallto threefourths of the width of the blue stripe upon which it is placed.
